Weekly Activity Report for April 17, 2005 to April 23, 2005

**CRIME SUMMARY**

Crimes reported during this time period in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes included one commercial burglary, one residential burglary, two vehicle burglaries, one attempt other structure burglary, one felonious assault, three grand thefts, one mail theft and two acts of vandalism.

**ARRESTS**

April 17

Felonious Assault (daytime) - A male victim was kicked on the stomach and back of his neck with the cleated shoe of several suspects during an altercation at a soccer game in the 30800 block of Palos Verdes Drive East.

April 18

Attempt Other Structure Burglary (nighttime) - Three male suspects were arrested while attempting to force a door open at a church in the 5700 block of Palos Verdes Drive South.

Residential Burglary (daytime) - Person(s) unknown removed a screen, climbed in a window, and ransacked several rooms in a home in the 27900 block of Alvarez Drive. A handgun and sunglasses were taken.
