Parks Master Plan Update Overview

- The City's Parks Master Plan was last updated in 1989
 - The City Council directed Staff to update the Master Plan at its July 29, 2014 Meeting

A Solid Base To Build On

- **Recreation and Parks Department coordinates a comprehensive park system**
- **Over 1400 acres of open space**
- **17 parks and community centers**
- **Hundreds of special events, classes, programs and activities including Whale of a Day and Fourth of July Celebration**
- **Community partnerships**
- **Volunteer opportunities**



An Update Not a Do-Over

A number of significant park sites and open space areas have undergone public outreach and planning designs.

Some of these changes have been implemented, while some are still in design phases.

These areas and projects include Lower Hesse Park, Point Vicente Interpretive Center, Grandview Park, the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve, the Trails Network Plan and Abalone Cove.

The Updated Master Plan will include all of those projects.
