

Filming at the Point Vicente Lighthouse



The Point Vicente Lighthouse was completed and put into service in 1926. It was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1980.

The lighthouse and grounds are Federal property under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Coast Guard. They are not generally open to the public, with the exception of monthly tours conducted by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary (<http://vicentelight.org>) on the second Saturday of each month, as well as during the City's annual "Whale of a Day" festival on the first Saturday in April.

Commercial filming activity (i.e., feature film, TV, video, still photography) on the grounds of the Point Vicente Lighthouse requires the approval of the U.S. Coast Guard. You may contact the U.S. Coast Guard for questions about filming activity at:
