CITY MANAGER

- **Recruitments:** Staff launched a recruitment for an Assistant Engineer position in the Public Works Department. Completed application packets are due Thursday, August 20th. Staff continues the recruitment for Deputy City Manager, with application packets due by 4:00 p.m. on Friday, August 14, 2015. Recruitments continue for Recreation Leaders and Recreation Specialists. Please visit <http://www.rpvca.gov/Jobs.aspx> for more information or to download a City employment application, job bulletin, and supplemental application questions.
- **Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities:** Staff recently received the attached letter from the Los Angeles County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) regarding disadvantaged unincorporated communities (DUCs). New State legislation requires the consideration of contiguous DUCs as a part of Municipal Service Reviews and amendments to cities' spheres of influence (SOIs). However, there are no DUCs contiguous to Rancho Palos Verdes.
- As noted earlier in the summer, the City Clerk's Office has begun the scanning of current contracts and agreements into Laserfiche. To date, the Clerk's Office has scanned into the database contracts from the following four areas: Finance, Recreation and Parks, Public Safety, and Information Technology. The project is proceeding smoothly and we are diligently working on the scanning of the remainder of the current contracts, with future plans to provide a public portal on the City's website for the review of these and other documents in the database. We appreciate the continued support in our efforts from the Information Technology Department.
- Additional documents that have been scanned by the City Clerk's Office into the Laserfiche database include the following: City Council Agendas (from 2000 to present); City Council Minutes, Ordinances and Resolutions (1973-to present); Redevelopment Agency (RDA) Agendas (2001-2012); RDA Minutes and Resolutions (1984-2012); Successor Agency to the RDA Agendas, Minutes and Resolutions (2012-present); Improvement Authority (IA) Agendas (2000-present); IA Minutes and Resolutions (1996-present); and, Planning Commission Minutes and Resolutions (1976-present).

FINANCE

- Cal Card Process Change: Finance has implemented a new Purchasing Card Transaction Log and Missing Receipt Transaction Certificate. The new forms will be completed and signed each month by the Cal Card holder. This addition to the reconciliation process will help to streamline the month-end reporting process performed by the account clerk and ensure that items purchased are coded and charged to the correct accounts.
- CalPERS Webinar on Risk Mitigation Strategies: CalPERS is hosting a webinar on fund risk and volatility on Thursday, July 30th and the City's finance management team will be joining the webinar. CalPERS staff will be briefing the audience on options the CalPERS Board of Administration is studying to reduce risk and volatility in the CalPERS Fund. The CalPERS staff has been conducting these webinars over the past several months to solicit feedback on staff proposals currently under review by the Board to reduce the "volatility" of its investments and the risk of steep employer/employee contribution rate increases caused by investment losses. Staff will share information from the webinar in the next weekly report.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Maintenance: Removed graffiti and repaired holes under fence at Ocean Front Estates. Responded to report of broken water line in Ocean Front Estates. Irrigation line was hit by contractor installing new sign post. Replaced section of leaking stainless steel flex-pipe at 26 Narcissa. Repaired clog affecting two sinks at Hesse Park. An additional cleanout port was installed to allow access to the site of the clog. Fuel Modification at Ladera Linda Lower slope being scheduled with LACC. Fuel Modification at Del Cerro/Burma Trail area being scheduled with LACC.
- Certified Stormwater Inspectors: Two members of the Public Works Department attended a two-day course offered by the National Stormwater Center to become Certified Stormwater Inspectors. This certification, which is valid for five years, mainly focused on the small MS4 permit, pollution prevention, public education and participation, construction inspections, post construction and illicit discharge detection.
- Peninsula WMG Meeting: The Peninsula Watershed Management Group met this week to discuss next steps in the implementation of watershed management on the Peninsula. Important upcoming items include developing an RFP for stormwater and dry weather outfall monitoring, analysis and reporting and development of a Memorandum of Understanding between the agencies for implementation of the monitoring program.

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- Refugio Oil Spill Update: Staff notes that recent testing of oil globules on beaches in 4 Southern California counties showed that samples taken on only one beach, Las Varas Beach in Santa Barbara County, were consistent with the oil product spilled at the May 19 incident. More news and details of this testing can be found at www.refugioresponse.com.
- FEMA Webinar on Open Pacific Coast Study: Staff attended this FEMA webinar meant to help coastal communities understand how the recent coastal analysis results translate into floodplain mapping and to discuss FEMA guidelines and standards regarding mapping decisions, e.g. primary frontal dunes, beach nourishment, bluff erosion, and structures. The Open Pacific Study is one of two coastal studies underway in Region IX as part of the California Coastal Analysis and Mapping Projects (CCAMP) and FEMA's Risk Mapping, Assessment, and Planning (Risk MAP) program.
- Water Conservation Update: As can be observed on the attached water consumption graph provided by California Water Service Company, RPV resident's efforts to reduce the quantity of treated water used to irrigate landscaping and for domestic purposes for the month of June 2015 was 35% lower than June 2013, which is the baseline year for comparison purposes. The state mandate for the Peninsula is a 36% reduction for the entire water year, and with a 10% cumulative reduction since January 2015, RPV residents seem to be on-course to accomplish that state mandate by fall.
- Public Works met with the City Council Subcommittee to discuss the Recognition Wall project this week. The conceptual design was presented which was endorsed by the Subcommittee; accordingly, the project will proceed and refined drawings will be prepared and presented to the City Council at a September meeting.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- Promotions of Tom DeFazio and Leza Mikhail: The Community Development Department is pleased to announce the promotion of Tom Defazio to Inspector II and Leza Mikhail to Senior Planner. Please join us in congratulating them.
- The Terraces Shopping Center: Building plans for upgrades at the Terraces shopping center have been approved by the Building and Safety Division, and related construction is likely to commence shortly. The center will undergo several cosmetic upgrades including new signage, path of travel improvements, and a new elevator. The shopping center will remain open during the renovations.
- Abalone Cove Pumping Plant: The Los Angeles County Sanitation District informed Staff that they will begin work shortly at the Abalone Cove Pumping Plant as approved by the Planning Commission in 2013. More specifically, they will be replacing and relocating the existing back-up generator and installing other minor equipment on the

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site. Additionally, grading will be conducted to construct and replace perimeter walls which will be painted an earth-tone color. Landscaping will be installed around the perimeter of the new walls to screen and soften its appearance.

- View Impairing Foliage at Oceanfront Estates: Over the past several weeks the City's Code Enforcement Division has sent a series of notices to the Oceanfront Estates Homeowners Association requiring the vegetation in the HOA-owned common areas adjacent to Palos Verdes Drive West be trimmed and maintained to a height no taller than the adjacent perimeter fencing per the Development Agreement. The Development Agreement states that the common area landscaping will be maintained to the City's satisfaction. Some trimming has been done, however the majority of the foliage remains untrimmed and out of compliance. On July 22, 2015, the HOA was issued a final notice to bring the foliage in compliance to the City's satisfaction by July 29, 2015 otherwise the case would be forwarded to the City Attorney's office. Based on an inspection today, the foliage remains out of compliance and Code Enforcement Staff is now forwarding this case to the City Attorney's office.
- View Impairing Foliage at Seabreeze Tract: The Conditional Use Permit (CUP) for this tract requires HOA landscaping within the common areas to be maintained so that views from adjacent properties and the public right-of-way are not obstructed, and that trees be maintained not to exceed 16 feet in height. In addition, the individual private properties have approved Landscape Plans that are intended to control the height of private landscaping. Given that Staff found the HOA's foliage and several private property's foliage to be blocking views from Crest Road, Staff embarked on a plan to get the HOA's foliage in compliance first, followed by individual property owners starting with the properties closest to Crest Road, as they create the most view impairment. At this time, the HOA common area landscaping is now in compliance with the CUP. As for the private properties, many of the home abutting Crest Road are out of compliance with the CUP and letters were sent to the view impairing property owners informing them that their landscaping must be maintained per the approved Landscape Plan on file with the City. Thus, the City has requested these homeowners either bring their view impairing foliage into compliance with their approved Landscape Plan or submit a revised Landscape Plan for the City to review. To date, all notified homeowners, with the exception of one, have submitted a revised Landscape Plan to the Planning Department for review.
- Coast Vision Plan Update: Pursuant to the Council's adopted motions at the June 30th and July 7th meetings, Staff is working with Melendrez (the City's project landscape architect) to update the Coast Vision Plan by: 1) removing Gateway Park from the listed key sites in the Plan 2) removing the Phase 2 improvements from Lower Point Vicente; and, 3) locating a recognition wall at Upper Point Vicente. The updated Coast Vision Plan should be completed within the coming month and will be posted on the City's website followed by a list-serve announcement.
- 2902 Vista Del Mar Update: Over the past several months, the City has received numerous complaints from surrounding neighbors about people trespassing on the

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subject vacant lot. Motorcyclists have entered the adjacent Preserve through this property, the surrounding walls have been tagged with graffiti, litter has been found throughout the property, and most recently an abandoned sofa was dumped in the canyon. In response, the property owner cleaned the site, removed the graffiti, and at the City's request installed a temporary security fence along the front property line to prevent trespassers from entering the property (see attached photos). The City's Code Enforcement division will continue to monitor the condition of the property. (See photo).

- Potential Improvements at Salvation Army: The Planning Department recently received an inquiry from the Salvation Army's architect on adding more residences to the lower slope above Palos Verdes Drive South. At this time, no formal application has been submitted, but Staff anticipates that at a minimum, a Conditional Use Permit (Revision), Grading Permit, and Environmental Assessment will be needed.
- Potential Improvements at Wayfarers Chapel: Staff recently met with the architects for Wayfarers Chapel who are looking at possibly repairing or rebuilding a new office building that is deteriorating, expanding the visitor's center, and site improvements to the surrounding grounds and parking area. Since a majority of the site is within the Landslide Moratorium, a Landslide Moratorium Exception (LME) permit will be required prior to submitting the required planning entitlements, which will include a Conditional Use Permit (revision).

RECREATION & PARKS

- The Volunteer Event held last Saturday morning at Abalone Cove was a big success! Over fifty volunteers showed up and assisted with a variety of tasks; they pulled weeds, swept picnic areas, cleaned picnic tables, picked up litter in the upper part of the park and along the beach, and lined trails with rocks. Melissa Carnehl, Program Coordinator for the local chapter of the California Native Plant Society's Native Plant Garden at PVIC, was onsite to educate staff and volunteers about native plants and to ensure they could distinguish the native plants from the weeds. Although the volunteers were tired from a morning of hard work in the hot sun, they left knowing they had made a difference in one of their local parks. The next volunteer event at Abalone Cove will be California Coastal Cleanup Day on Saturday morning, September 19th.

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- The monthly Preserve Management Meeting was held at City Hall on July 9th. Staff from the PVPLC, City, and MRCA Rangers attended. Minutes are attached.
- The Department is hosting its inaugural Drive-In Movie at Point Vicente Park/Civic Center this Saturday, August 1st. The fun gets underway at 4:00 pm, with a classic and oldies car show, a visit from the Greasy Weiner food truck, and pre-movie activities for the whole family led by San Pedro & Peninsula YMCA staff. The feature film, Disney's original 1969 movie, *The Love Bug*, will begin at sunset. Attendees can watch the show from their car (space permitting) or from their blankets and beach chairs! Admission and parking are free; bring money if you want to purchase food.
- Hesse Park facilities are rented this week for soccer camp, ten indoor recreation classes, two outdoor recreation classes, two Peninsula Seniors activities, and two non-profit group meetings. The Department's Coed Adult Softball League competition continues on Sunday afternoon at the park.
- Ladera Linda facilities are rented this week for three indoor recreation classes. The San Pedro Peninsula YMCA summer camp continues this week at the park. Seven people attended last Thursday's free *Yoga in the Park* class.
- The PVIC Sunset Room is rented this weekend for two private rentals.
- Ryan Park facilities are rented this week for three outdoor recreation classes, two youth sports league practices, and two private rentals this weekend. Twenty people attended the Monday's free *Yoga in the Park* class.
- REACH, the Department's Therapeutic Recreation Program, is offering two activities this week for young adults with developmental disabilities. On Monday evening, July 27th, REACH participants and staff will meet at the picnic tables at Hesse Park and enjoy a healthy meal of grilled kabobs and salad, followed by a nature-themed scavenger hunt. On Saturday, August 1st, REACH participants and staff will head to the LA Convention Center to cheer for the Special Olympics athletes participating in World Games.
- The San Pedro & Peninsula YMCA summer swim program, offering group and private lessons, as well as lap swim, continues through August 14th at the Peninsula High School pool. This program is a partnership between the cities of Rancho Palos Verdes



Dear Mr. Willmore:

As you may know, a state law known as SB 44 (Wolk), relative to Disadvantaged Unincorporated Communities (DUCs), took effect on January 1, 2012. SB 44 is now codified within the body of State law which governs Local Agency Formation Commissions, or LAFCOs (Government Code Section 56000 *et seq*).

A DUC is defined as an area of "inhabited territory" in which the annual median household income is less than 80 percent of the statewide median household income. Government Code Section 56046 defines "inhabited territory" as an area with 12 or more registered voters.

The adoption of SB 44 requires that LAFCOs consider DUCs when adopting Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs) and when amending Spheres of Influence (SOIs) involving sewers, municipal and industrial water, or structural fire protection. Additionally, the law requires that a LAFCO shall not approve a proposed city annexation over 10 acres contiguous to a DUC unless a proposal to annex the DUC has been filed with LAFCO.

In 2012, utilizing data obtained from the 2005-2009 American Communities Survey (ACS) prepared by the Bureau of the Census, staff of Los Angeles LAFCO prepared maps for all DUCs in Los Angeles County. In November of 2014, the Bureau of the Census released its 2009-2013 ACS. Utilizing the new data, new maps were prepared and the DUCs have changed significantly in many areas of the county. **Prior to considering annexations or SOI amendments, I encourage you to review the DUCs maps to determine if there are any DUCs that are contiguous to your jurisdictional boundary or SOI boundary.** Please note that all DUCs maps can be found on LAFCO's website (www.lalafco.org).



2. OUTDOOR LIGHTING ORDINANCE (CASE NO. ZON2014-00320): City / (LM)

Request: A City Council initiated amendment to Chapter 17.56.030 (Outdoor Lighting for Residential Uses) and Chapter 17.56.040 (Outdoor Lighting for Non-residential Uses) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Zoning Code (Title 17) to improve the City's existing regulations for exterior lighting, including, but not limited to codifying the following changes: 1) Specifying that light fixtures are to be fully shielded so that the light source is not visible; and, 2) Establishing acceptable color temperatures for exterior lights; 3) Imposing restrictions on exterior light emissions based on lumens instead of wattage; and, 4) Addressing the glare of exterior lights to neighboring properties and vehicles in the public right-of-way.

Minutes to the July 9, 2015 Preserve Management Meeting

Attending: Recreation & Parks Director Cory Linder, Maintenance Superintendent Sean Larvenz, Sr. Administrative Analyst Matt Watters, Conservation Director Danielle Lefer, MRCA Supervising Park Ranger Jewel Johnson and Recreation Specialist David Pearce

Preserve Maintenance

Review of Active Habitat / Trail Projects:

- Conservation Director Lefer reported that PVPLC continues to monitor and address spur trails on an ongoing basis.
- The Three Sisters / Filiorum connection status is still in progress; Kurt Loheit is working on this project.
- Toyon / Peppertree grading project -- Director Linder reported that he will be meeting soon with PW staff about the status of this project.
- Conservation Director Lefer reported that she is still working on arranging a meeting with the Portuguese Bend Community Association and other interested parties. She's hoping to schedule an early September mtg.

Review of Trail Crew Activities: Conservation Director Lefer reported that the crew is going to work on Sea Dahlia trail this weekend.

Signage issues:

- Monument signage update -- Conservation Director Lefer reported that a couple of designs are in progress.
- Conservation Director Lefer reports yield signage is starting to be put up today.
- There is no update on the Coastal Trail markers for Ocean Trails Reserve. There is general discussion of the problem of vandalism on Coastal Trail markers. Supervisor Larvenz suggested transitioning from tiles to a metal marker because they would be harder to detach.
- Conservation Director Lefer and Ranger Johnson set a site meeting to see first hand the signage problem at McCarrel Canyon & McBride Trails.
- Specialist Pearce pointed out an "Unstable Trails" sign along Flying Mane Trail might be suggesting that hikers may use spur trails.

City Preserve Maintenance Logs: They were passed out and Superintendent Larvenz gave notes on those work orders completed.

Project Improvement Form feedback: There was none other than some notes given by Specialist Pearce.

Grant Contracts / Agreements or Upcoming Grant Opportunities: There is nothing new.

Preserve Operations

Ranger Report: Ranger Johnson reported that Assembly Bill 298 passed making a violation of *Title 14 – Fishing in a No-take Area* a “wobbler” and subject to a fine.

City Preserve Public Use Logs: They were passed out with no comments.

Closing the Preserve after Rain: There was no update. It will be brought up for City Council review at a date TBD.

Preserve Projects:

- The Natural Resources Conservation Service is conducting a soil survey in Palos Verdes. PVPLC is working with them so that their digging sites will not damage habitat or interfere with bird nesting in the Preserve. Specialist Pearce has communicated with a Mr. Riddle with the NRCS to guide him in obtaining a permit with the City.
- A Dr. Jayson Smith, a marine biologist with Cal Poly, is requesting permission to conduct research on the impact of weather on tide pools at Abalone Cove & Pelican Cove. Director Linder informs us that the City Manager gave permission to Dr. Smith. Specialist Pearce will continue coordinating with Dr. Smith.
- Conservation Director Lefer announced a proposed reptile research project conducted by an outside expert that will involve a low key capture & release. The PVPLC will draft a letter of approval.

Review of Volunteer Trail Watch Reports: There is no need to do a review at this time. The next Quarterly VTW meeting is set for August 26, 2015 at 6pm at City Hall’s community room.

Abalone Cove Safety Task Force: Director Linder states that the final report of the Safety Task Force is still pending. The Task Force will meet again as needed. Beach patrols by Rec. & Parks staff are still a possibility for the summer.

Enforcement Priorities: Portuguese Bend Reserve remains the priority according to Ranger Johnson.

Targeting Focused Areas for Team Solutions: Abalone Cove is the focus for this summer. The VTW is talking to lots of visitors that they meet. Conservation Director Lefer suggests better signage is needed to guide visitors to the beach.

Volunteer Trail Watch & Rapid Response Team Priorities: Nothing new reported.

Field Visit with MRCA Chief Ranger: Director Linder states this no longer seems necessary, so without objection, this will be removed as a regular agenda item.

Additional Items

Quarterly Reserve Public Forums: Sept. 23rd & Dec. 16th.

User Group “Share the Trails” Brochure Update: Senior Administrative Analyst Watters stated the brochure is still in development but will be ready in advance of the July VTW meeting.

Conservation Director Lefer inquired about fuel modification plans in Portuguese Bend. Superintendent Larvenz stated that only areas delineated on the fire department map will be done if within budget. Current areas shown on the map have been completed.

Conservation Director Lefer requested after-hours PW emergency contact information for Preserve maintenance issues. Superintendent Larvenz states he will be the primary contact person.

Specialist Pearce passed around a first draft brochure for public, authorized beach access. Feedback seemed positive.

- Specialist Pearce will conduct a site visit to Flying Mane Trail to inspect the “Unstable Trails” sign that might be confusing trail users.
