Notice of Tax-Defaulted Property Sale 2017A: On August 21st, Staff received notice (attached) that three (3) parcels in the City will be offered by the County on October 23rd and 24th as a part of Tax-Defaulted Property Sale 2017A. If the City determines that any of these properties are needed for public purposes, the City must file a written statement setting forth the purpose of the acquisition(s) and the necessary Chapter 8 Agreement forms on or before September 22nd.

The three (3) parcels offered are single-family homes in the Grandview, Ridgecrest and Rolling Hills Riviera neighborhoods. The home in the Grandview neighborhood abuts the southernmost end of the City's Montemalaga Canyon property, but there is no identified need for a trail connection or other public access in this area. The other two (2) homes are not located near or adjacent to City properties. Since purchasing these properties would appear to serve no public purpose, Staff does not intend to pursue their acquisition.

State Lands Commission Meeting Follow-Up: Staff attended the remote session of the State Lands Commission's August 17th meeting in San Pedro (click [here](#) to review the Staff report). Nearly two dozen speakers addressed the Commission from San Pedro, all of them opposed to the continued operation of the Rancho LPG facility and urging the Commission to take whatever action it could to shut it down and/or relocate it. The Commission also received testimony from three (3) facility opponents and a representative of Rancho LPG at the meeting site in San Diego (representatives of the City and Port of Los Angeles were present in San Diego but did not address the Commission). At the conclusion of public testimony, the Commission agreed with its Staff's suggestion to seek further guidance from the State Attorney General's office regarding the Commission's jurisdiction over matters related to Rancho LPG's facility and operations.

Highpark Project Modifications Follow-Up: In the August 9th Weekly Administrative Report, Staff reported on proposed modifications to the specific plan for the *Highpark* (formerly Ponte Vista) project in San Pedro. Staff contacted the Northwest San Pedro Neighborhood Council, who in turn reached out to the developer and the project planner with the City of Los Angeles. The developer indicates that they submitted a project permit compliance request for minor adjustments to the subarea boundaries that were necessitated by the final engineering of the retaining walls, park space and the Mary Star High School access road. Based upon a comparison of the approved 2013 subarea plan and the proposed 2017 subarea plan (attached), it appears that these modifications have had no significant effect upon the required 3-acre public park to be developed at the southwesterly corner of the project. Therefore, Staff believes that there is no need to comment or take any action regarding these modifications.

FINANCE

Tutorial Series (County Departments that manage property taxes): Contrary to popular belief, the County Assessor does not handle every aspect of the property tax process. Property tax assessment, collection and revenue distribution is actually handled by three different departments at the County.

- **Assessor** – appraises property, enrolls new construction, determines market value of sales, and administers appeals.
- **Auditor-Controller** – extends the property tax roll, applies the 1% base levy of property's assesses value, manages any voter approved debt and direct assessments levies and distributes revenues to the Cities and agencies after taxes are paid.
- **Treasurer-Tax Collector** – prints and mails the tax bills and collects taxes based on the information provided by the Auditor Controller.

PUBLIC WORKS

Pedestrian Safe Bus Stop Linkage on Hawthorne Blvd. Project: California Landscape & Design continues placing new sidewalk along northbound Hawthorne Blvd. The improvements on this side of the road will face some challenges as there are many utilities and other infrastructure such as light poles, guardrails, water backflow valve, among others that need to be relocated. SCE Night Work on Crestridge Rd. by Highridge Rd.: SCE submitted a request to conduct night work to replace a power pole along Crestridge Rd. on August 28, 2017 from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. There will be one lane opened in both directions at all times. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Trump National 9th Annual Wine and Beer Festival Follow-up: On August 20, 2017, Staff attended the annual Wine & Beer Festival at the Trump Golf Course to monitor the operation's compliance with the Conditions of Approval. The event proceeded without any reported traffic, on-site security, signage, and trail access issues.

Golden Cove Special Use Permit: On August 18, 2017, a Notice of Decision was issued by the Director (see attachment), conditionally approving the temporary installation of a Soil Vapor Extraction (SVE) system and related equipment to remediate subsurface chemical impacts at the Golden Cove Shopping Center. The SVE system and supportive equipment will be installed for one year at the rear of the shopping center. The SVE system installation and operation will be performed under the environmental regulatory oversight of the Los Angeles County Fire Department - Site Mitigation Unit and under permitting through the South-Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD).

Hesse Park View Restoration Plan: On April 12, 2017, a View Restoration Plan was agreed upon by the Pacific View Homeowners Association, Verde Ridge Road residents, and the Recreation and Parks Department to trim or remove over 100 view impairing trees within and surrounding Hesse Park in four phases. Phase one, consisting of the trimming of pine trees on Locklenna Lane, was completed in April 2017. Phases two and three will

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begin on August 28, 2017, consisting of extensive tree trimming and tree removal throughout Hesse Park, including areas surrounding the community center building. This work is expected to be completed by the end of September. Phase four consists of extensive pine tree trimming and is scheduled to occur during the winter months when pine tree trimming is most suitable. Staff anticipates all tree trimming and removal to be completed by the end of winter 2017, restoring views to neighboring residents and park visitors.

Green Hills – Director Approved Addition to the Information Booth: On August 22, 2017, pursuant to Council-adopted Condition No. 2a (2), the Director of Community Development approved a Site Plan Review allowing the expansion of an existing information booth at the entrance from 72.5ft² to 123.25ft² in size (50.75ft² increase) and an increase to the structure height from 9.5' to 11' (1.5' increase). The Notice of Decision (see attachment) was mailed to all property owners within a 500' radius of the cemetery, interested parties, and the applicant. Additionally, a list-serve message was sent announcing the Director's decision and the availability of the related documents on the City's Green Hills webpage <http://www.rpvca.gov/376/Green-Hills-Memorial-Park-Master-Plan>. The Director's decision is appealable to the Planning Commission within 15 days.

RECREATION & PARKS

The Treasurer and Tax Collector (TTC) has posted the list of properties for the 2017A Public Auction on its website at <https://ttc.lacounty.gov/Proptax/docs/AuctionList2017A.pdf>. These properties are tax defaulted and Subject to the Tax Collector's Power to Sell. The TTC will offer these properties for sale at public auction on Monday, October 23, and Tuesday, October 24, 2017.

Some of the properties on the list may be located within your entity's jurisdiction and suitable for a public purpose, e.g., streets, parks, conservation sites, low-income housing, etc. If the authorizing officers of your entity determine that any of the parcels scheduled for this auction should be set aside for a public purpose, your entity may be able to acquire title to such properties through a Chapter 8 Agreement Sale (Agreement Sale) pursuant to Division I, Part 6, Chapter 8 of the Revenue and Taxation Code (R&TC).

Public agencies and nonprofit organizations, with the intent to purchase one or more parcels through an Agreement Sale, must submit both an objection to the public auction of such parcel(s) on the entity's respective letterhead (Objection) and a completed Application to Purchase Tax-Defaulted Property from the County, Form SCO 8-16 (Application), attached. The Application must identify the parcel(s) and describe, in detail, the public purpose for acquisition of **EACH** parcel.

In addition to the Objection and Application, a public agency or nonprofit must provide documentation as indicated in the attached Chapter 8 Agreement Sale Pre-qualification Requirements Sheet. Please carefully review the requirements, as the TTC will not process incomplete submissions. **Even if an entity submits its Objection and Application timely, the TTC will not withdraw the parcel(s) from the auction until it has received all required documentation.**

Interested public agencies and nonprofit organizations must submit the Objection, Application, and applicable required documentation on or before 5:00 p.m.

(Pacific Time), Friday, September 22, 2017, either in person or by mail at the address listed above. The TTC will reject any purchase request that is incomplete or submitted after the deadline.

The TTC also requires a preliminary research fee of \$100 **per property**, which the entity must submit in the form of a check or money order along with the required materials mentioned above. Please note that, pursuant to R&TC Section 3800, the TTC must also recover the notification costs associated with an Agreement Sale, which is \$300 **per property**. Accordingly, the TTC will add this cost to the purchase price of the property for any Agreement Sale that becomes final. State, public agencies and nonprofit organizations may remit payment for processing fees on the entity's respective official form of payment. County departments may remit the processing fees on a County Warrant or a Journal Voucher Cash Transfer (JVCT).

Upon receipt of the Objection, Application, and required documentation, and the preliminary research fee, the TTC will review and either approve or deny the purchase request. If approved, the TTC will designate the public agency or nonprofit as "Pre-qualified" and forward an Agreement Sale packet to the entity, along with instructions on how to complete the forms and a checklist of requirements. If denied, the TTC will return the purchase request with an explanation of the denial and any information/documentation needed for resubmission, if applicable.

Please be advised that once pre-qualified, the Agreement Sale process is set into motion. Accordingly, if an entity fails to complete the process, either by not providing any additional required documentation or by not paying the purchase price upon finalization of the Agreement Sale, the TTC may ban that entity from future purchases through the Agreement Sale process. Additionally, the entity may be required to pay for any costs incurred by the TTC.

Please also be aware that, pursuant to R&TC Section 3793.1, the purchase price includes the \$300 per-parcel fee indicated above, and the amount of outstanding taxes and penalties accrued up to the submission of the application and beyond, until the month in which the Agreement Sale is finalized. This process may take approximately six to eight months.

The list of properties available for purchase is subject to change due to factors, such as redemption of properties, i.e., property taxes paid in full, or a legal process that requires withdrawal of the parcel from the sale, e.g., bankruptcy. The TTC will inform your entity accordingly of any changes affecting its purchase request.

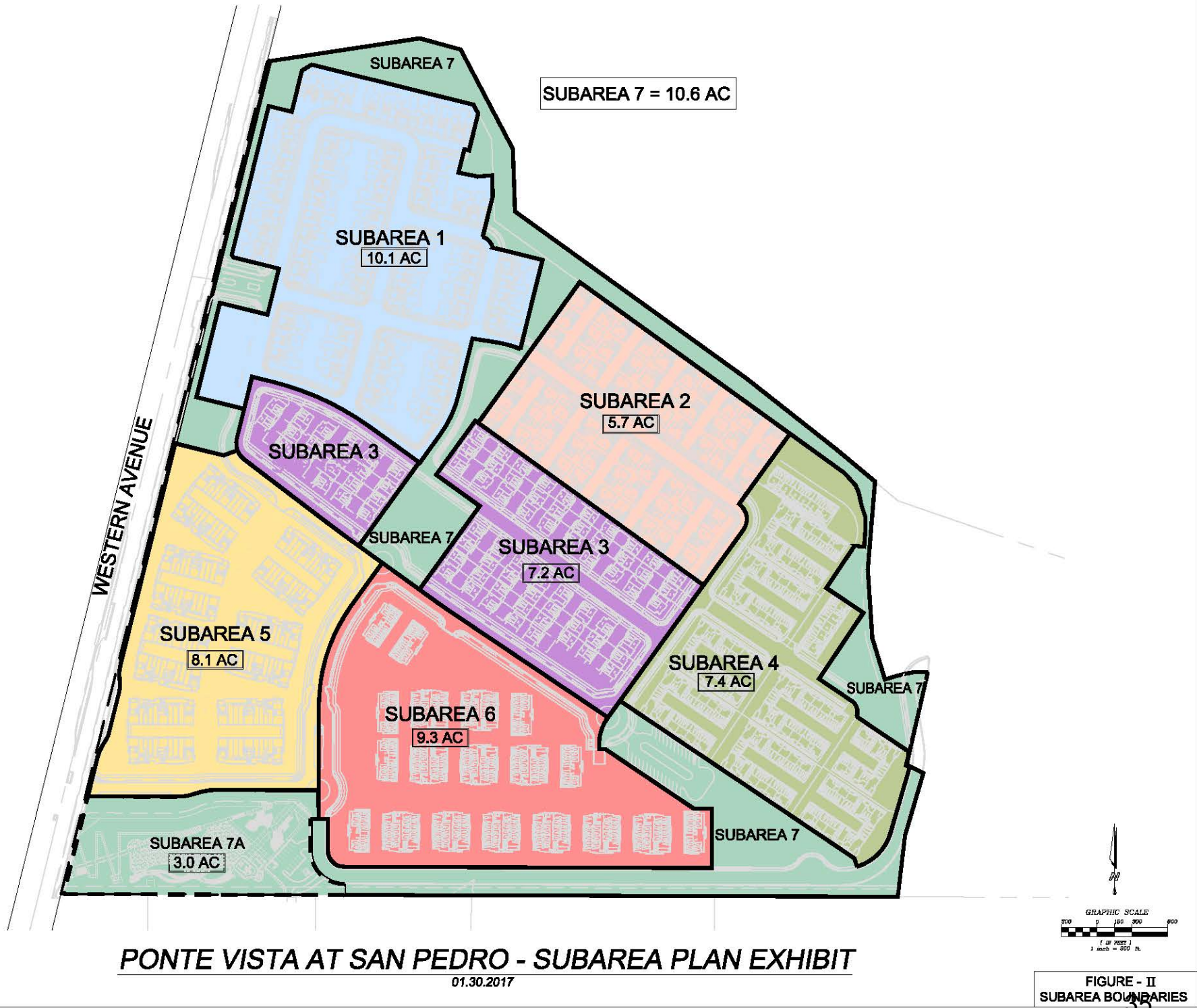

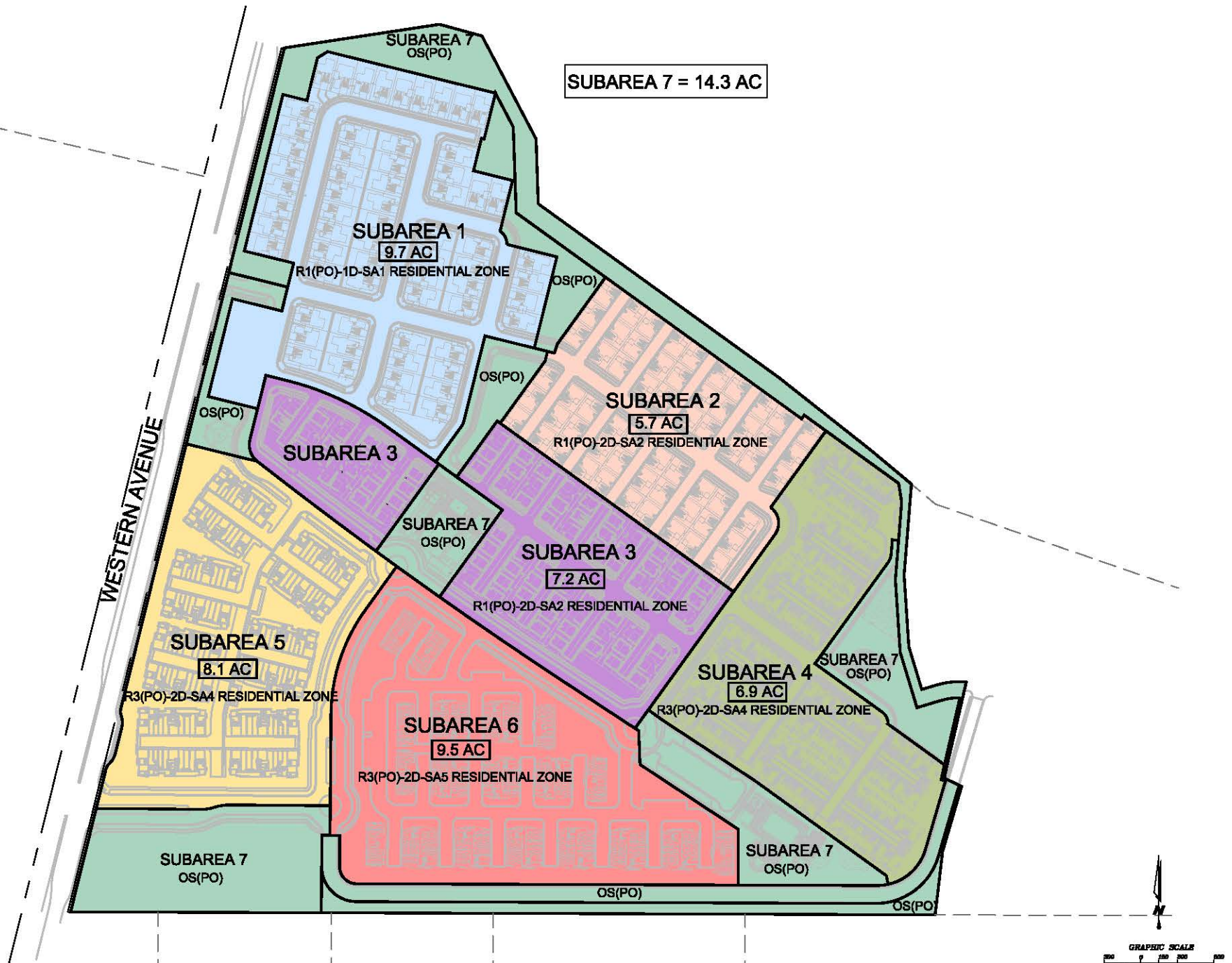


