Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project Update

On Tuesday, Staff learned that work is scheduled to resume on the Palos Verdes Reef Restoration Project on August 27. According to California Coastal Commission staff, the barge that appeared off the coast near Trump National Golf Club in May is expected to

return by the middle of next week to complete the remaining half of the reef. Construction will take place six days a week (Monday-Saturday, excluding Labor Day) for approximately 11 hours each day. The remaining work is expected to take approximately three weeks and wrap by the end of September.

As a reminder, this project by the Southern California Marine Institute involves dropping tens of thousands of tons of quarry rock into the ocean to build 18 reef modules on the seafloor to restore fishing resources destroyed by decades of chemical dumping off the coast.

Be Counted. Complete the Census.

Have you completed your 2020 census? Responses to the census shape decisions about how billions of dollars in federal funds flow into communities each year for the next 10 years for critical services, including health care, emergency response, schools and

education programs, and roads and bridges. The COVID-19 pandemic underscores the importance of census data and census participation.

As of August 17, Rancho Palos Verdes had a self-response rate of **76.8%**, above state and national averages, but behind our goal of 100% participation. The U.S. Census Bureau, however, has extended the official deadline to participate in the census to September 30 in response to the evolving COVID-19 crisis. Cal Water August Construction and Progress Update

On August 14, Cal Water shared the following construction and progress update on the Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project:

Dear Residents,

We're reaching out to provide you with an update on California Water Service's (Cal Water) Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Reliability Project.

As project work winds down, crews are continuing minor restoration and finishing work along the drinking water pipeline route. All work is taking place from Monday to Friday, with some intermittent Saturday work. There may be small, temporary closures when needed for safety, but there will always be at least one lane open in all directions.

Below is an overview of the areas where you may see this work taking place:

- Crenshaw Boulevard, between Crest Road and the Rolling Hills United Methodist Church (between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.)
- Crenshaw Boulevard, at the new pump station, north of Silver Spur Road (between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.)
- Palos Verdes Drive North, between Dapplegray Elementary School and Palos Verdes Drive East (between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m.)
- South Coast Botanic Garden property at the Rolling Hills United Methodist Church (between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.)
- Lariat Lane and along the Botanic Garden Trail (between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.)
- Dapplegray Elementary School parking lot (between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.)

Letter Opposing AB 3182

Following last night's authorization by the City Council, today, Staff sent Assemblymember Phil Ting of San Francisco a letter opposing AB 3182, which aims to increase the state's rental housing supply by barring homeowners associations (HOAs) from prohibiting members from renting out their homes or accessory dwelling units (ADUs). The letter noted the legislation would infringe on private property owners' rights and negatively impact tens of thousands of HOA neighborhoods across the state. AB 3182 passed the Assembly in June and is now in the Senate. Staff will continue to monitor this bill.

COVID-19 Cases

As of August 18, there were 224,031 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across Los Angeles County (population 10.17 million), including the South Bay, so the public should not think one location is safer than another and everyone should be aware and practice physical distancing. The total includes 250 cases in Rancho Palos Verdes (population 41,731), 77 in Palos Verdes Estates (population 13,190), 34 in Rolling Hills Estates (population 8,066), five in Rolling Hills (population 1,874), and seven in the unincorporated areas of the Peninsula. Countywide, 5,335 people have died.

According to the Department of Public Health, 12 deaths have been reported in Rancho Palos Verdes. The City extends its deepest condolences to the families of these residents.

New Temporary Special Use Permit for RPV Businesses

The Community Development Department has developed a new Temporary Special Use Permit (TSUP) to assist Rancho Palos Verdes businesses with the opportunity to provide limited outdoor operations during the COVID-19 pandemic. A TSUP will allow for outdoor operations on sidewalks and parking lots for:

- Restaurants
- Fitness centers
- Hair salons and barbershops
- Personal care services, such as nail salons, massage, and tattoo parlors



A TSUP will be processed administratively without a filing fee, public notification, or appeal process that is typically required for a standard Special Use Permit. 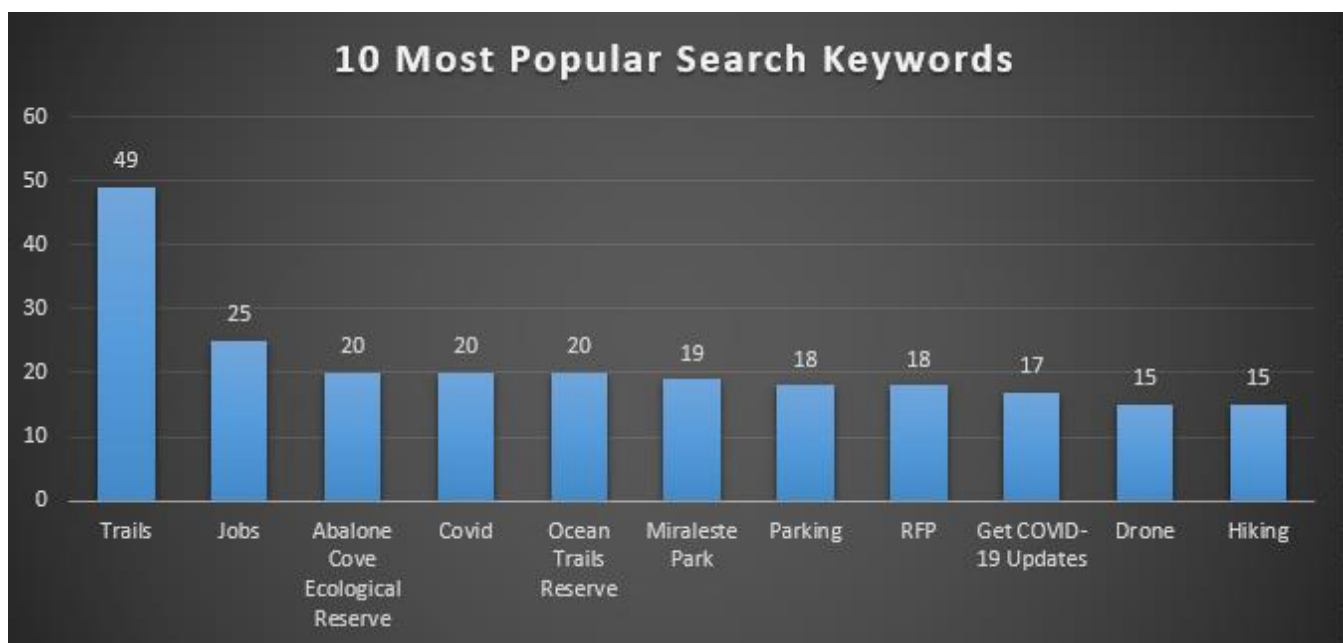

As you can see, 49 guests searched the word "Trails", 25 guests searched for "Jobs" and 20 searched for "Abalone Cove Ecological Reserve. This information can help determine the areas of interest for our guest but also if our website is user friendly, and monitor trends.

Wildfire Preparedness Webinar – Postponed

Due to increased wildfire activity, the speakers for the "Working with Cal FIRE" wildfire preparedness webinar were called into action to help protect our communities and thus were unavailable to participate in today's. The League of California Cities has postponed today's webinar to a later date. These webinars provide city staff with helpful information on successful approaches cities have used to respond to wildfires and how city staff can be prepared to lead their communities through emergencies. Staff will continue to attend these webinars.

Sign up for Alert SouthBay

Alert SouthBay is a multi-jurisdictional emergency notification system used by 13 South Bay cities – including Rancho Palos Verdes -- to keep our communities informed about disasters and emergencies with uniform, expeditious alerts.

Alert SouthBay is an opt-in system using the Everbridge software application. Similar to Nixle alerts, Everbridge sends notifications via email, text message, cellular and landline phones. Users can subscribe to receive alerts from multiple South Bay cities. If you live in Rancho Palos Verdes, for example, but work in Torrance, you can subscribe to alerts from both cities.

Everbridge is the City's primary vehicle for emergency communication. Users can sign up by:

- Texting "alertsb" to 888-777, which returns a link to register for Everbridge (for COVID-19-related alerts, text the keyword "cv19rpv")
- Registering online at alertsouthbay.com
- Downloading the free [Everbridge app](#) on an iOS or Android device from the [App Store](#) or [Google Play](#)

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TIPS

Power Outages

Extended power outages may impact the whole community and the economy. A power outage is when the electrical power goes out unexpectedly. A power outage may:

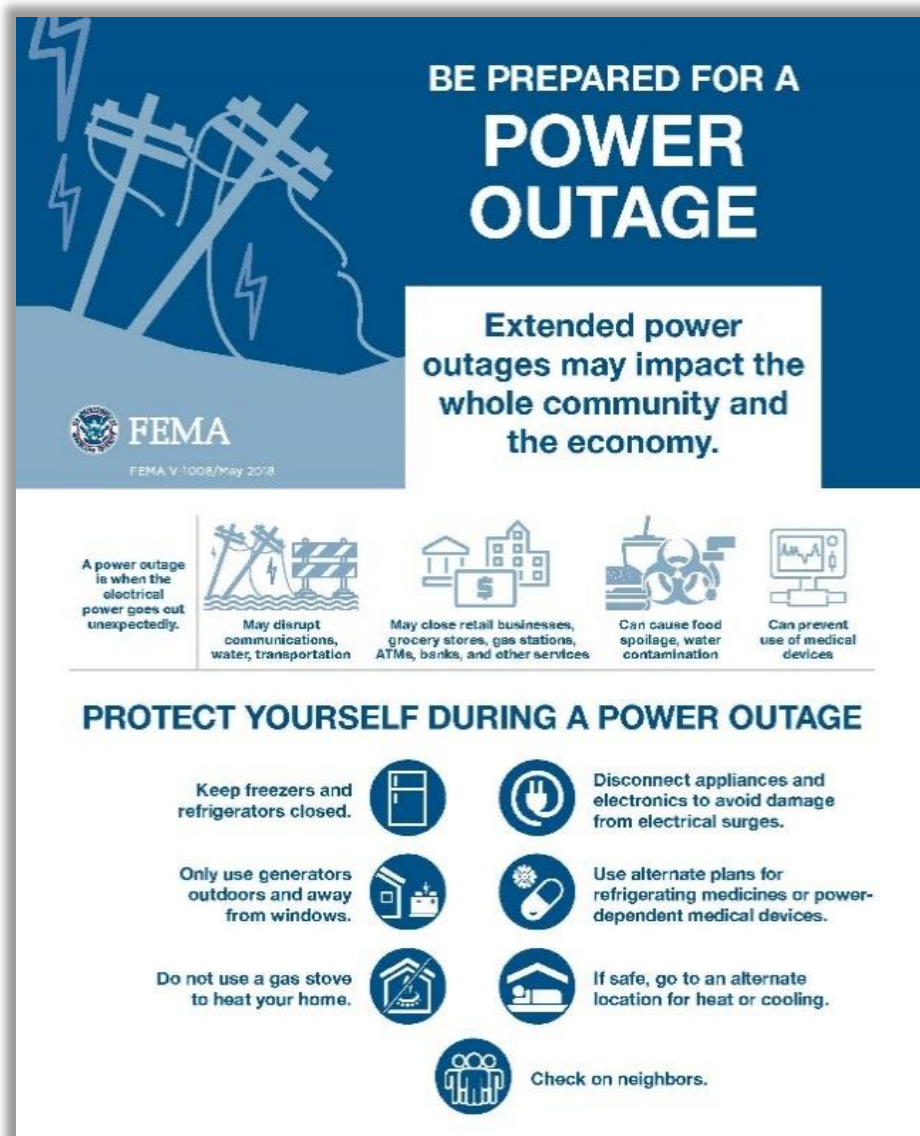
- Disrupt communications, water, and transportation.
- Nearby retail businesses, grocery stores, gas stations, ATMs, banks, and other services.
- Cause food spoilage and water contamination.
- Prevent use of medical devices.

Prepare BEFORE a Power Outage:

- Take an inventory of the items you need that rely on electricity.
- Talk to your medical provider about a power outage plan for medical devices powered by electricity and refrigerated medicines. Find out how long medication can be stored at higher temperatures and get specific guidance for any medications that are critical for life.
- Plan for batteries and other alternatives to meet your needs when the power goes out.
- Install carbon monoxide detectors with battery backup in central locations on every level of your home.
- Determine whether your home phone will work in a power outage and how long battery backup will last.
- Review the supplies that are available in case of a power outage. Have flashlights with extra batteries for every household member. Have enough nonperishable food and water.
- Use a thermometer in the refrigerator and freezer so that you can know the temperature when the power is restored. Throw out food if the temperature is 40 degrees or higher.
- Keep mobile phones and other electric equipment charged and gas tanks full.

Protect Yourself DURING a Power Outage:

- Keep freezers and refrigerators closed. The refrigerator will keep food cold for about four hours. A full freezer will keep the temperature for about 48 hours. Use coolers with ice if necessary. Monitor temperatures with a thermometer.
- Generators, camp stoves, or charcoal grills should always be used outdoors and at least 20 feet away from windows. Never use a gas stovetop or oven to heat your home.
- Disconnect appliances and electronics to avoid damage from electrical surges.
- Have alternate plans for refrigerating medicines or using power-dependent medical devices.
- If safe, go to an alternate location for heat or cooling.
- Check on your neighbors. Older adults and young children are especially vulnerable to extreme temperatures.



Be Safe AFTER a Power Outage:

- When in doubt, throw it out! Throw away any food that has been exposed to temperatures 40 degrees or higher for two hours or more, or that has an unusual odor, color, or texture.
- If the power is out for more than a day, discard any medication that should be refrigerated, unless the drug's label says otherwise. If a life depends on the refrigerated drugs, consult a doctor or pharmacist and use medicine only until a new supply is available.

Safety Tips and Precautions

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes is dedicated to the safety and well-being of its residents and community members. The City encourages residents to participate in neighborhood safety and remain vigilant in protecting personal property. There are many ways individuals can reduce the chance of becoming a victim and to contribute to community safety. Please see below for crime prevention tips for you and your loved ones:

Tips to Avoid Vehicle Burglaries:

- Always lock your vehicles whenever not in use
- Close and lock all windows
- Keep your valuables, such as your purse, wallet, or bag, with you or secure them out of sight and stored away
- Do not display items of value in your vehicle: place them in your trunk or keep them covered
- Remove valuables, packages, garage openers, mail, or other devices from sight

Tips to Prevent Residential Burglaries:

- Lock all windows and doors, including backyard, side, and garage doors
- Keep all curtains closed at night or when no one is home
- If you are away and you are capable, leave house lights on or set them to turn on at intervals
- Set up a security camera system with video and audio
- Notify trusted neighbors if you will be away for an extended period of time

If you see something, say something! We encourage you to call the Lomita Sheriff's Station at 310-539-1661 if you see any suspicious persons or activities.

Please note: Please be aware that many of the burglaries that have occurred are carried out because of unlocked or open entryways such as doors, windows, or garages. Please be sure to check that these entryways are closed and locked, and valuables are stored and out of sight.



Vacation Security Camera Loaner

The City encourages the use of video/audio recording devices with security footage capabilities as additional measure of home protection. For RPV residents who may be away from home for an extended period, the City offers a Vacation Security Camera Loaner program. Taxpayers Should Be On the Lookout for These Scams

All tax scams put taxpayers at risk. This is the first of two tips taking a closer look at the [IRS Dirty Dozen](#) tax scam list. This year, taxpayers should be especially watchful for aggressive schemes related to COVID-19 relief, including Economic Impact Payments.

Here is a recap of the first six scams in this year's Dirty Dozen.

[Phishing](#): Taxpayers should be alert to potential fake emails or websites looking to steal personal information. The IRS will never initiate contact with taxpayers through email about a tax bill, refund or Economic Impact Payment. Don't click on links claiming to be from the IRS. Be wary of emails and websites – they may be nothing more than scams to steal personal information.



[Fake charities](#): Criminals frequently target natural disasters and other situations, such as COVID-19, by setting up fake charities to steal from well-intentioned people trying to help in times of need. Fraudulent schemes normally start with unsolicited contact by phone, text, social media, email or in-person using a variety of tactics.

[Threatening impersonator phone calls](#): IRS impersonation scams come in many forms. A common one remains fake threatening phone calls from a criminal claiming to be with the IRS. The agency will never threaten a taxpayer or surprise them with a demand for immediate payment. Scam phone calls include those threatening arrest, deportation or license revocation if the victim doesn't pay a fake tax bill.

[Social media scams](#): Taxpayers need to protect themselves against social media scams, which frequently use events such as COVID-19 to try tricking people. Social media enables anyone to share information with anyone else on the Internet. Scammers use this information as ammunition for a wide variety of scams. These include emails where

scammers impersonate someone's family, friends or co-workers.

Economic Impact Payment or refund theft: This year, criminals turned their attention to stealing Economic Impact Payments. Many of these scams are identity theft-related. Criminals file false tax returns or supply false information to the IRS to divert refunds to wrong addresses or bank accounts.

Senior fraud: Senior citizens, their friends and family need to be on alert for tax scams targeting older taxpayers. Their growing comfort with technology, including social media, gives scammers another means of taking advantage of them. Phishing scams linked to COVID-19 have been a major threat this year. Seniors should be on alert for a continuing surge of fake emails, text messages, websites and social media attempts to steal personal information.

Small Business Financial Assistance Plan Update

On April 8, 2020, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes implemented the Small Business Financial Assistance Plan in an effort to provide relief and promote the general welfare of the City's small business community experiencing negative financial impacts stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic. The Small Business Financial Assistance Plan provides a one-time refund of the 2020 business license.

On June 2, 2020, the City Council received a status report on the Small Business Financial Assistance Plan. As a result of the low response, the City Council expressed a desire to increase the number of eligible small businesses by removing the limitation that a small business must have a "brick-and-mortar" location in order to be eligible to receive a refund.

Since the implementation on April 8:

- the City has received 20 requests for business license tax refunds
- 6 of the 20 requests were not eligible for the program
- 13 refunds totaling \$4,313 have been issued to date

Businesses that apply will receive a confirmation email from staff. If an application is approved a check will be mailed directly to the business at the address on file.

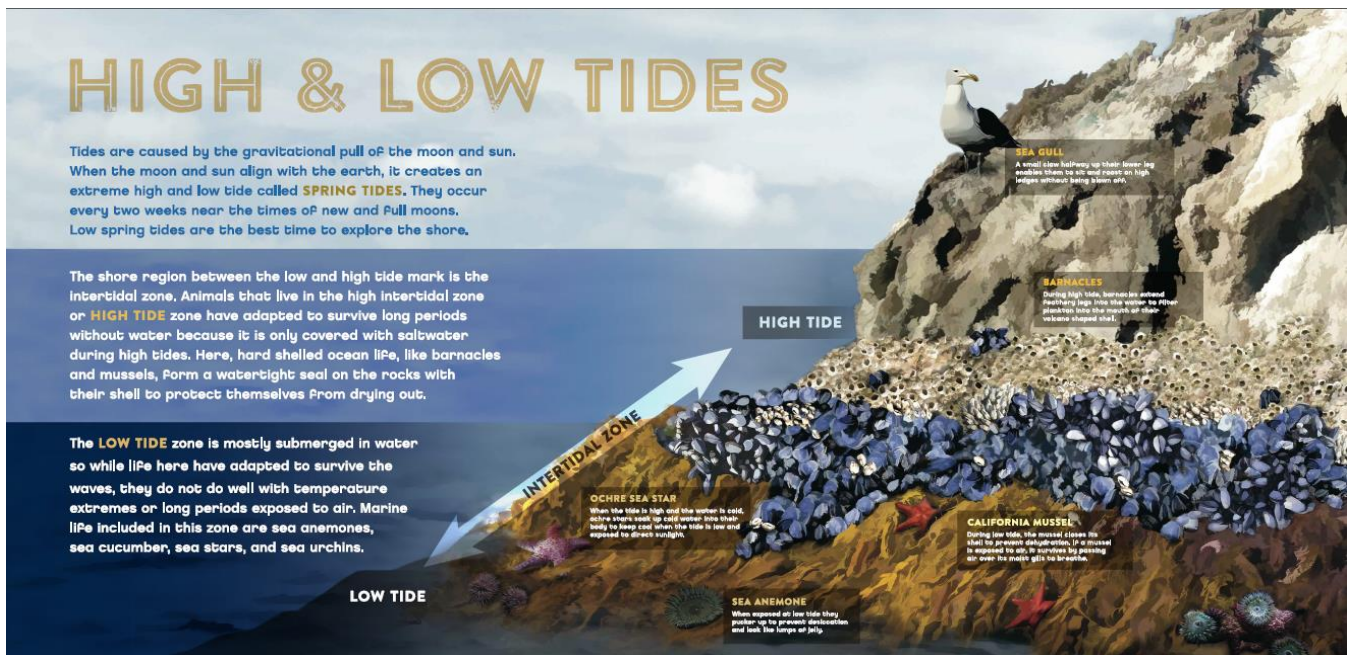
More Abalone Cove Sign Replacements

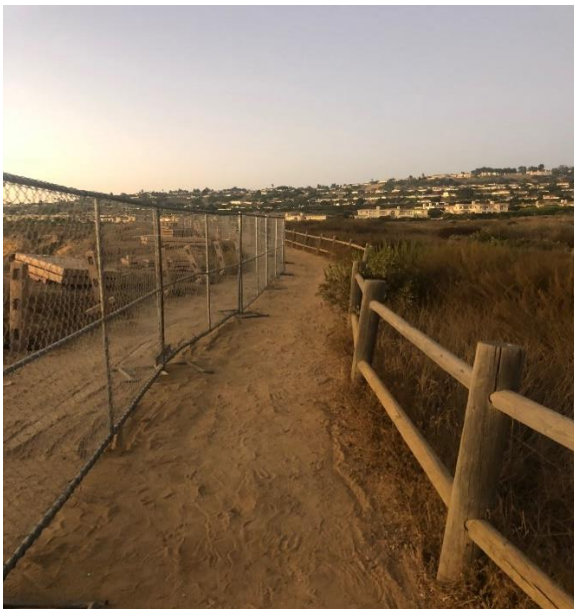

Coastal Bluff Fence Replacement Project Update

The third phase of the Coastal Bluff Fence Replacement project along the Vicente Bluffs Reserve is currently underway. The project includes replacing old and deteriorated wooded and/or metal fence with pre-cast concrete fencing that looks like wood but is significantly more durable and sturdy. The project limits begin at the Seascapes and Terrace Trails junction, and will move north along Seascapes Trail towards the north parking lot along Calle Entradero. Temporary trail closures will be in place along Seascapes Trail, as well as intermittent closures of Terrace Trail on weekdays. Chain link fencing has been installed along the active work site's perimeter, which allows for one-way directional walking traffic access to the trail over the weekend. Shipment of the fence poles and rails has been received. Construction is expected to be completed by mid-November. Courtesy notices of this project were mailed to residences within a 500' radius of the project area and published in the PV News.



Via Rivera and Hawthorne Boulevard Signalization Project Update

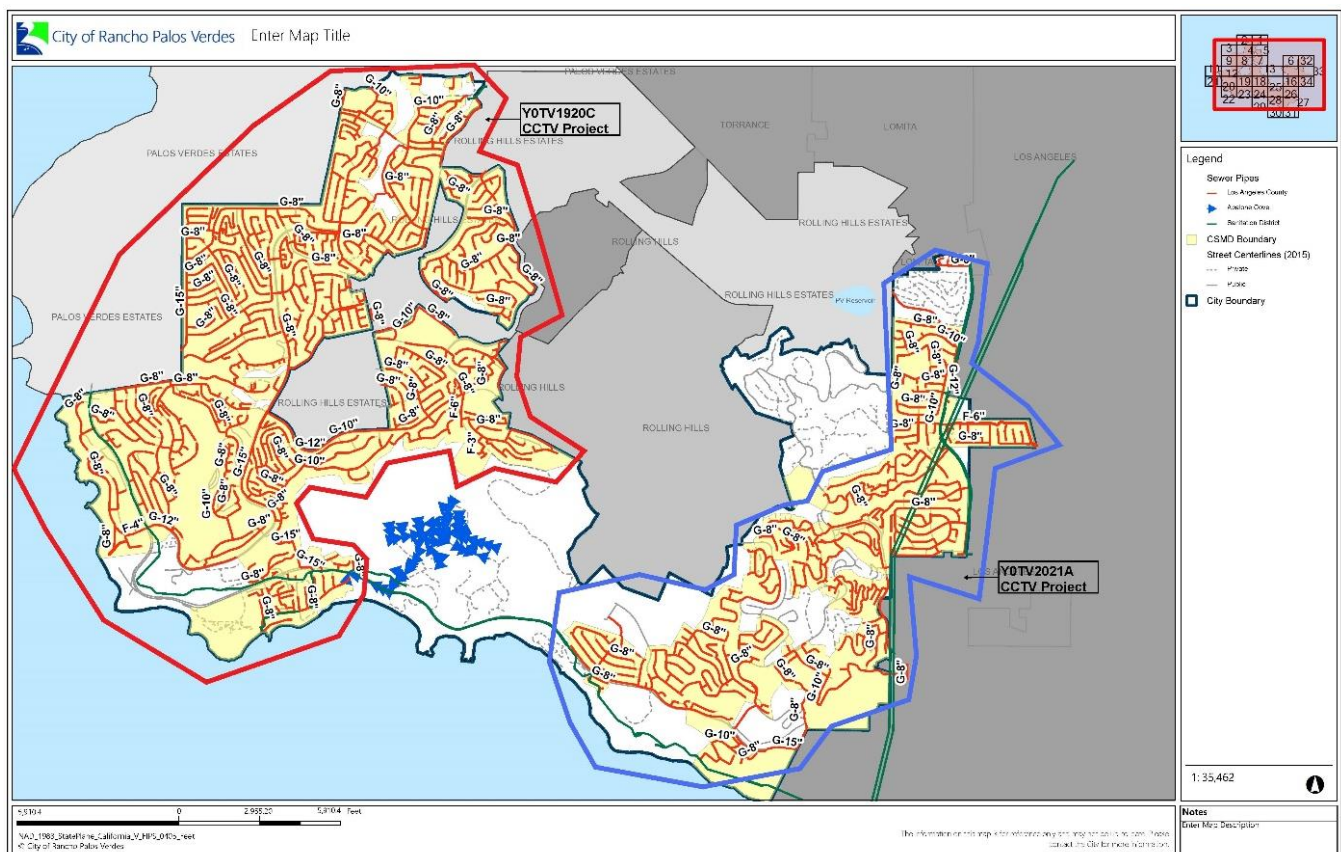
The design of the Via Rivera and Hawthorne Boulevard Signalization project is well underway. The poles and mast arms needed for this signal are scheduled to be shipped to the City in late November 2020. The project is currently out to bid as the design engineering is complete, and plans and specifications have been finalized. Contractors have been notified of this project and their cost proposals to construct the project will be opened on August 25, 2020. The bids received will be qualified and contractor's references checked. Currently this project's construction contract is on the City Council's October 6, 2020 agenda for consideration. Once the construction contract is awarded, the successful contractor will be given a Notice to Procure to allow the contractor to order additional equipment needed for the installation of the signal light. When the poles and mast arms are received, the City will issue the contractor his/her Notice to Proceed so the equipment's installation can begin. Accordingly, construction of this project is anticipated to begin in early December. Due to the holidays and possible inclement weather, we anticipate the project to be completed the week of January 25, 2021.

Maintenance Activities

This week, Public Works continued its regularly maintenance, trash pickup, and general repairs at all City parks and facilities. Irrigation repairs were made at Eastview Park, Hesse Park, and Calle Entradero.

Median and right-of-way team cleared the Salvation Army trail and Palos Verdes Drive South of weeds.

The Los Angeles Public Works Department, who services and maintains the City of Rancho Palos Verdes Sewer System, has begun its citywide inspection of that system. Inspections consist of checking sewer lines for faults and the clearing of stoppages when possible. The inspections will also help identify potential problems. Currently, inspections are scheduled for the west side of the City for the remaining calendar year and will occur on the east side of the City in 2021.



The Public Works Department responded to emergency requests this week that included:

- City Hall, PVIC, and Hesse Park are running on generator power this week as requested by So Cal Edison to lessen power consumption and allow more electricity available to its residents during this week's heatwave.
- Responded to and repaired a major water leak at Eastview Park.
- Responded to large water overflow leaking on Corinna Drive.
- Seven graffiti removals cases were addressed during this week.

Marymount California University's 2020-21 Special Use Permit

On August 18, 2020, Staff mailed a public notice to property owners within a 500' radius and listserv subscribers regarding Marymount California University's annual Special Use Permit (SUP) to allow amplified sound for certain outdoor events during the 2020-21 academic year. Please click [here](#) to view a copy of the public notice. This year's request consists of 14 date and time-specific events, and 10 additional events that will be determined later, for a total of 24 events. The City will accept public comments during a 15-day period, which begins today. The Community Development Director will render a decision soon after the public comment period has concluded, which is appealable to the Planning Commission.

2020 Palos Verdes Half Marathon, 10K and 5K Update

This week staff was in communication with Dragonfli Media Technologies, event managers for the Palos Verdes Half Marathon, to discern their plans for this event given impacts of Covid-19. They have not yet determined if they will hold the event this year, as this will be based on the Los Angeles County Health Department requirements for large gatherings. They will advise staff by mid-September whether they will be able to move forward with some sort of event, which would likely be modified from previous years' events. If it is determined that the event can occur, a Special Use Permit will be applied for and processed for the portion of the event on the Terranea Resort's property. The Public Works Department would process a Special Event Permit for the remainder of the event that takes place on public roads and City-owned property. Staff will continue to track and monitor this event and provide updates as more information becomes available.

LA-RICS Land Mobile Radio (LMR) Network Update

On June 12, 2018, the Planning Commission approved a General Plan Consistency Review for the Los Angeles County Antenna Farm at 5741 Crestridge Road proposed by the Los Angeles Regional Interoperable Communications System (LA-RICS) Authority. The project includes construction of a new 150' tall lattice tower to accommodate the

LMR wireless facility, a 400ft² single-story masonry equipment structure measuring 12'-6" in height, and installation a 100KW generator and 2,000-gallon diesel fuel tank within an 8' tall enclosure. As of last week, construction commenced on this new lattice tower and is anticipated to be completed by October 2020. The existing antenna tower is planned to be demolished in the second quarter of 2021. Open Space Management Report for Saturday-Sunday, August 15-16

Over the weekend, the National Weather Service issued an Excessive Heat Warning, with coastal temperatures reaching the low 90s. As most patrons avoided the heat, we had lower than usual crowds. OSM staff monitored trails and provided 87 bottles of water to patrons who were in distress or requested water. In total, we had 17 people and one (1) dog transported for heat exhaustion-related symptoms (including vomiting, dizziness, difficulty walking, and hot body temperature), and one (1) individual for possible sprained ankle. Many admitted that they did not bring any water or enough

water. Additionally, there were two 911 calls (both heat exhaustion related). Rangers assisted the Los Angeles County Fire Department in transporting patrons.

Abalone Cove Reserve:

Violations observed and enforced involved fishermen, most corrected and complied. OSM staff assisted in litter abatement, and filled three (3) large trash bags and additional large items at the beach.

Forrestal Reserve:

Los Angeles County Fire Department Station 53 responded to a 911 call for a patron suffering from heat exhaustion on Pirate trail. The patron was escorted out by the Fire Department and taken to the hospital.

Ocean Trails Reserve:

OSM staff observed a group of approximately 50 individuals peacefully protesting in front of the Trump Golf Course on Trump National Drive.

Portuguese Bend Reserve:

Rangers observed continued LA County Deputy presence in the Del Cerro Park area, educating and enforcing parking-related matters. OSM staff assisted 8 individuals for heat exhaustion-related symptoms. LA County Sheriff's Deputies were present and cited vehicles at Del Cerro Park. No issues to report. OSM staff assisted and transported 8 individuals and 1 dog for heat exhaustion-related symptoms, 1 individual refused transport, but staff was available to assist in ensuring she was well, and 1 additional individual was transported due to possible sprained ankle. OSM staff found approximately 20 discarded fish (some koi) along Watertank trail adjacent to Narcissa Drive. The fish had been discarded on the side of the hill, and a smell was noticeable from the adjacent trails. Staff retrieved more than 20 pounds of fish. Staff has no other information.

Vicente Bluffs Reserve:

Due to construction and replacement of the bluff top fence, a portion of Seascape trail was closed to one-way direction only as trail had significantly narrowed.

Dear Assemblymember Ting:

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes opposes AB 3182, which would bar homeowners associations (HOAs) from prohibiting home rentals, including rentals of accessory dwelling units (ADUs).

This legislation would not only infringe on the rights of private property owners, but invalidate the voices of voting HOA members. AB 3182 would impose a "one size fits all" approach on tens of thousands of HOA neighborhoods, taking away decision-making that is best left to homeowners and governing board members. The bill is also problematic because it leaves unclear what exactly would "unreasonably" restrict rental prohibitions.

For these reasons, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes opposes AB 3182.
