

COVID-19 Vaccine Appointments Now Available for Residents 65+, Supply Extremely Limited

On Tuesday, the County of Los Angeles announced that residents 65 years and older are now eligible for a free COVID-19 vaccination.

Visit VaccinateLACounty.com to schedule an appointment or call (833) 540-0473 for assistance between 8 a.m. and 8:30 p.m.

Please be patient if there are no available appointments when you first visit the county's website. Appointments are continually being added and more vaccination sites are scheduled to open in the coming weeks.

The vaccine supply is still **extremely limited**, and the L.A. County Department of Public Health urges patience as it works urgently with our federal and state partners to expand capacity and supply in the weeks ahead.

The Department of Public Health continues ramping up capacity to complete vaccinations for eligible priority groups identified by the CDC with more specific guidance provided by the state. This includes the launch of five new large-scale vaccination sites that began operation on Tuesday and adding several more pharmacies and health care clinics.

The five sites, which were chosen for their regional accessibility and their ability to handle large capacities of people, are:

- Pomona Fairplex, 1101 W McKinley Ave, Pomona, CA 91768
- The Forum, 3900 W Manchester Blvd, Inglewood, CA 90305
- California State University, Northridge, 18111 Nordhoff St, Northridge, CA 91330
- L.A. County Office of Education, 12830 Columbia Way, Downey, CA 90242
- Six Flags Magic Mountain, 26101 Magic Mountain Pkwy, Valencia, CA 91355

At this time, the L.A. County Department of Public Health has not identified a vaccination location in the City or on the Palos Verdes Peninsula. Staff continues to monitor potential locations that can better serve the community.

The **Beach Cities Health District** has shared the following **tips to make your vaccine appointment:**

- Check the county's website early in the morning as it seems like appointments are released sometime during the night or check periodically throughout the day.
- Appointments are continually being added, so be vigilant, especially if you are hoping to get vaccinated at a specific location.
- You do not need to go back to the same location to receive your second dose. Just make sure you are receiving the same type of vaccine (Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna).
- Some locations have phone numbers to call if you have specific questions about disability parking or any other needs. You should make the appointment and confirm it, then call to see if you can get your questions answered.

Tips for vaccination locations:

- The closest county megapod is The Forum, 3900 W Manchester Blvd, Inglewood, CA 90305.
- Crenshaw Clinic: Parking is not available on W 79th (it is blocked off). Drive-up Normandie and park on the street (Vermont has testing site traffic; this location is testing and vaccinations).

Dodger Stadium: This is a drive-through location where you remain in your vehicle. There are usually lots of appointments available here.





Safe in the South Bay: State of COVID-19 Vaccine

The **Beach Cities Health District's Safe in the South Bay Series** brings health experts, cities, chambers, schools, and community members together around this fast-moving pandemic. The live-streamed series #4 on **February 4 at 5 p.m.** will focus on **COVID-19 vaccinations** and the psychology and resilience of living during a pandemic. COVID-19 Cases

As of January 19, there are 1,031,874 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across Los Angeles County (population 10.17 million). The total includes 1,025 cases in Rancho Palos Verdes (population 41,731), 288 in Palos Verdes Estates (population 13,190), 192 in Rolling Hills Estates (population 8,066), 34 in Rolling Hills (population 1,874), and 42 in the unincorporated areas of the Peninsula. Countywide, 14,122 people have died.

According to the Department of Public Health, 34 deaths have been reported in Rancho Palos Verdes. The City extends its deepest condolences to the families of these residents.

Protecting Your City from Wildfire – Virtual Conference

On February 2-3, City Staff will attend a virtual conference hosted by Infocast, where first responders, technical experts, and authorities from multiple agencies will be providing an in-depth recap on lessons learned from the 2020 fire season, and future plans for wildfire prevention and mitigation.

This unique summit gathers participants from every separate piece of the wildfire mitigation puzzle, enabling attendees to hear multiple viewpoints and lessons learned, best practices in responding to the risk of wildfires, and expert advice on actionable steps to take now in engaging residents, attaining funding, and hardening resources.

City staff will be attending this virtual conference to glean the most up-to-date information about successful strategies and cost-effective approaches to risk mitigation and to facilitate coordination with state and federal agencies, local authorities, and other critical players in the effort to protect our community.

Preparing an Emergency Kit Tips- Courtesy of the RPV Emergency Preparedness Committee

After an emergency, you may need to survive on your own for several days. Being prepared means having your food, water, and other supplies last for several days. A disaster supplies kit is a collection of basic items your household may need in the event of an emergency.

To ensure you and your family are prepared for a disaster or emergency, the City's Emergency Preparedness Committee has provided information on preparing an emergency kit for the January monthly preparedness emailing messaging to residents.

Wildfire Preparedness

With recent extreme Santa Ana wind events resulting in elevated high fire danger, Peninsula residents are reminded to be on heightened alert and be prepared for wildfire.

- If you see something, say something. Report any sign of smoke or fire immediately to your local fire department by dialing 9-1-1. If you dial 9-1-1 from your cellphone, be sure to know your location.
- Have your Ready! Set! Go! Wildfire Action Plan in place. It is critical for residents to be familiar with the Ready! Set! Go! program that provides important preplanning and evacuation information.
- Sign up for Alert SouthBay emergency alerts by texting "alertsrb" to 888-777 Stay connected and get updates from the City by following RPV on [Nextdoor](#), [Facebook](#), [Twitter](#) and [Instagram](#).



EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TIPS

Severe Weather Preparedness

Severe weather can happen anytime, in any part of the country. Severe weather can include hazardous conditions produced by thunderstorms, including damaging winds, large hail, flooding, and flash flooding. Severe weather events can cause downed trees and power lines and flying debris, leading to power outages, transportation disruptions, damage to buildings and vehicles, and injury or death. Proper planning and understanding of the risks may help save your family from injury and inconvenience when severe weather strikes.

Understanding Severe Weather Alerts:

The National Weather Service issues a number of Watches, Warnings, and other products to alert the public about severe weather events. Be prepared for severe

weather by educating yourself on the differences between Warnings, Watches, and Advisories how the warning process works.

- **High Wind Warning: Take Action!** Sustained, strong winds with even stronger gusts are happening. Seek shelter. If you are driving, keep both hands on the wheels and slow down.
- **High Wind Watch: Be Prepared!** Sustained, strong winds are possible. Secure loose outdoor items and adjust plans as necessary so you're not caught outside.
- **Wind Advisory: Take Action!** Strong winds are occurring but are not so strong as to warrant a High Wind Warning. Objects that are outdoors should be secured and caution should be taken if driving.
- **Severe Thunderstorm Watch: Be Prepared!** A Severe Thunderstorm Watch are issued when severe thunderstorms are possible in and near the watch area. Winds 58 mph or higher and/or hail 1inch or larger are possible in a severe thunderstorm. Secure items outdoors that may blow around in high winds. Stay informed and be ready to take action.
- **Severe Thunderstorm Warning: Take Action!** A Severe Thunderstorm Warning is issued when severe thunderstorms is happening or is imminent in the warning area. Severe thunderstorms have wind 58 mph or higher and/or hail 1 inch or larger. Seek shelter inside a sturdy building, away from windows.

Preparing for Severe Weather Events:

In advance of any storm, be sure your property is secure. Make a list of items outside your home you will need to tie down or put away so that they don't blow away or fly through a window.

- **Be Weather-Ready:** Check the forecast regularly to see if you're at risk for severe weather. Listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay informed about severe weather watches and warnings.
- **Prepare Your Home:** Keep trees and branches trimmed near your house. If you have time before severe weather hits, secure loose objects, close windows and doors, and move any valuable objects inside or under a sturdy structure.
- **If a severe weather alert is issued, consider the following:**
 - Bring in unsecured objects from patios and balconies and secure outdoor objects such as lawn furniture or garbage cans that could blow away and cause damage or injury.
- **Update your emergency kit** and be sure to include enough food and water to last for 3 days for each person in your home.

Staying Safe during Severe Weather:

During any severe storm, whether at home or work, you should take shelter as quickly as possible, the safest place to during high winds is indoors. Postpone outdoor activities if a severe weather advisory or warning has been issued.

- **Monitor Weather Conditions:** Listen to the local news or NOAA Weather Radio to keep abreast of approaching storms, their severity, and reported severe weather. A NOAA Weather Radio will alert you if any watches or warnings are in effect or issued for your area.
 - If a WATCH is issued, pay special attention to changing weather conditions and be ready to take action if a WARNING is issued or severe weather strikes.
- **If Caught Outside or Driving:**
 - Immediately go inside a sturdy building during a high wind warning or severe thunderstorm warning and move to an interior room or basement.
 - Listen to the local news or NOAA Weather Radio for updates.
 - Take shelter in your car if you are not near a sturdy building. If possible, drive to a nearby sturdy building. Otherwise, move your car to a location where it is less likely to be hit by falling trees or power lines.
 - If no shelter is available avoid trees, power lines, and the side of the road. Keep in mind that power lines that are laying on the ground may be live.
 - If you are driving and aren't near a sturdy building, hold the steering wheel with both hands and slow down.
 - Keep a distance from high profile vehicles such as trucks, buses and vehicles towing trailers. One strong gust of wind can be enough to flip one of these trailers onto its side.

Staying Safe after Severe Weather:

- Continue listening to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio for updated information and instructions. Access to some parts of the community may be limited or roads may be blocked.
- Do not go near downed power lines. Report downed lines to your local utility emergency center and to the police. Do not try to free lines or to remove debris yourself.
- Help people who require special assistance—infants, elderly people, those without transportation, large families who may need additional help in an emergency situation, people with disabilities, and the people who care for them.
- Avoid driving and other travel until conditions have improved.

- If you are using a portable generator, take precautions against carbon monoxide poisoning, electrocution and fire.
- Exercise caution when handling debris that may have blown into your yard.





Practice Your 9PM Routine

Every night at 9:00PM, the community is encouraged to lock up property, turn on lights, and bring in valuables to reduce the likelihood of falling victim to property crimes.



Lock all doors and windows, including garage doors, turn on lights or set them on a timer if you plan to be away, and avoid leaving valuables in visible areas. These actions help deter burglars and may help prevent residential burglaries.

Be aware, and if you see something suspicious, say something! The City encourages you to call the Lomita Sheriff's Station at 310-539-1661 if you see suspicious persons or activities.




Monthly Statistics for City's Website for December 2020

Millions of Taxpayers Will Receive Their Second Economic Impact Payments by Debit Card

The Treasury Department and the IRS are issuing millions of second Economic Impact Payments by prepaid debit card to speed delivery of the payments to as many people as possible.

If the Get My Payment tool on IRS.gov shows a date that a recipient's payment was mailed, they should watch their mail for either a paper check or debit card. The

debit cards arrive in a white envelope that prominently displays the U.S. Department of the Treasury seal.

The prepaid debit card, called the Economic Impact Payment card, is issued by Treasury's financial agent, MetaBank®, N.A. The IRS does not determine who receives a card.

The form of payment for the second mailed EIP may be different than the first mailed EIP. Some people who received a paper check last time might receive a prepaid debit card this time, and some people who received a prepaid debit card last time may receive a paper check.

EIP Cards are safe, convenient, and secure

These cards provide certain protections against fraud, loss and other errors. They can be used to make purchases online or in stores anywhere Visa® Debit Cards are accepted.

Cardholders can also use the cards to do any of the following without paying a fee:

- Transfer funds to a personal bank account
- Make signature or PIN-debit purchases anywhere Visa Debit
- Cards are accepted — in stores, online, or over the phone
- Get cashback with a PIN debit purchase where available
- Get cash from in-network ATMs
- Get a replacement EIP Card, if needed
- Check their card balance online, through a mobile app or by phone

People should watch their mail carefully

EIP Cards are being sent in a white envelope that prominently displays the U.S. Department of the Treasury seal. The envelope also states, "Not a bill or an advertisement. Important information about your Economic Impact Payment." The EIP Card has the Visa name on the front of the card and the issuing bank name, MetaBank®, N.A., on the back. Each mailing will include instructions on how to securely activate and use the EIP Card. These cards are being issued to eligible recipients across all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Residents of the western United States are generally more likely to receive an EIP Card.

People can check the status of their payment using the [Get My Payment](#) tool on IRS.gov.

Business License Renewal 2021

On December 1, 2020, the City Council approved extending the Small Business Financial Assistance Plan to provide relief and promote the general welfare of the City's small business community experiencing negative financial impacts stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic. The approved extension waives the 2021 business license tax for eligible small businesses, as defined by Resolution No. 2020-34.



In addition to the Small Business Financial Assistance Plan, the City Council unanimously voted not to increase the 2021 business license tax for all 1,887 registered businesses. The business categories include in-city consultants, contractors, residential rentals, commercial or delivery vehicles, and refuse haulers.

Lastly, the City Council also approved to continue to assist over 430 home businesses by waiving their business license taxes in 2021.

During the week of December 14, 2020, the Finance Department mailed business license renewal notices to all registered businesses. Business licenses may be renewed through the City's website at www.rpvca.gov under the Finance Department's Online Business License Application & Payment. The renewal form and business license tax (if applicable) are due no later than January 31, 2021.







City Manager Letter to FAA Requesting Flight Test Area Relocation

On January 20, 2021, the City Manager sent a letter on behalf of RPV residents and the City Council to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) expressing concern at the noise impacts caused by general aviation planes along the City's southerly shoreline over the ocean, which the FAA-designated as an Intensive Flight and Aerobatic Training Area. As a solution, the City Manager requested that the FAA relocate the Training Area at least five miles from the City's southerly shoreline over the ocean. The City has a long history of expressing concern to the FAA regarding airspace noise impact on the City's quality of life. Attached is the City Manager's letter.

Ladera Linda Park and Community Center Project Planning Commission Hearing

On January 26th, the Planning Commission will consider a Major Grading Permit, Site Plan Review, Variance and Conditional Use Permit for the Ladera Linda Park and Community Center Project. The proposed project includes the demolition of existing buildings, the construction of a new, 7,017-square-foot community center, patio areas, outdoor seating, a playground and athletic courts, 54 parking spaces, a small storage facility, walking paths, lawn areas, landscaping, and grading.

The virtual meeting will take place at 7 p.m. and will be live streamed on the City website and televised on RPVtv Cox 33/Frontier FiOS 38.

New Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Ordinance Adopted

On January 19, 2021, the City Council adopted a new ADU Ordinance. This ordinance amends Chapters 17.02 (Single-Family Residential (RS) Districts), 17.04 (Multiple-Family Residential (RM) Districts), and 17.96 (Definitions), and repeals and replaces chapter 17.10 (Accessory Dwelling Unit Development Standards) of Title 17 (zoning) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code to update the development standards for accessory dwelling units and to create development standards for junior accessory dwelling units. Updates include, but are not limited to:

- New ADU & JADU development standards (allowable floor areas, height, parking, lot coverage, and setbacks);
- Streamline of ADU & JADU development proposals (120 days to 60 days);
- Conditional Use Permit requirement for ADU proposals on properties located within the City's Very High Fire Severity Zone that do not have two-distinct means of access;
- New objective architectural standards to replace neighborhood compatibility requirements; and
- Elimination of owner-occupancy requirements.

This Ordinance will go into effect on February 18, 2021, which is 30 days from adoption.

Rancho Palos Verdes Estates HOA Coyote Update

Code Enforcement Staff met with numerous residents from the Rancho Palos Verdes Estates HOA in the past week regarding their concerns with coyote sightings in the area. Staff continues to work collectively with LA County Agricultural Weights & Measures to canvass the neighborhood for coyote attractants. In addition, Code Enforcement Staff mailed out several swale maintenance letters for brush abatement to assist with deterring coyotes.

Overall, residents were thankful and pleased with our proactive approach in taking the



Palos Verdes Nature Preserve Parking and Access Report

On January 19, 2021, the Rancho Palos Verdes City Council took the following actions to help mitigate traffic and congestion impacts associated with the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve:

1. Entered into an agreement with Park Mobile to establish an app-based reservation system for Del Cerro Park and the Portuguese Bend Reserve.
2. Approved Contract with ParkMobile for an amount not to exceed \$26,912.
3. Approved the establishment of one parking zone on Crenshaw Blvd. and approved parking fees of \$10 per 3-hour block of time and establishment of a standard City-wide \$110 citation amount for the following:
 - Park by Permit (applies to Residential Recreational Permit at Del Cerro Park and Residential Permit by Neighborhoods)
 - Failure to Obey
 - Passenger Loading Zone
4. Approved free parking times Monday-Friday from 7am-9am on Crenshaw Blvd. South of Crest
5. Approved Alta Vicente trailhead improvements and directed Staff to include additional funds for wayfinding signs.
6. Directed Staff to bring back, at a later time, a report on the total costs associated with the parking mitigation measures.
7. Directed Staff to collaborate with the PVPLC to explore potential parking benefits for its volunteers and/or members for City Council consideration at a future meeting.
8. Directed Staff to work with traffic engineer to look at possible changes in the number of spaces in Zone B and Zone F.
9. Directed staff to follow-up with the organizations listed in the Coastal Conservancy letter to explore how to best handle neighborhood impacts.

The hotline service is available from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Friday, and 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. weekends. Callers can speak with a hotline operator who takes down concerns and questions and forwards them directly to Open Space Management staff and law enforcement personnel. Callers may request a callback, or if calling outside of normal hours, may leave a message and request a call back the following day.

While the Preserve Information and Reporting Line is a service to Preserve users, it will also serve as a helpful tool to increase the City's awareness of activity taking place in the Preserve.

Current Safety Measures for Outdoor Recreation and Private Gatherings

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health recently issued a *Targeted Temporary Safer at Home Order* with updated guidance on attending private group gatherings and participating in outdoor recreation activities. Public parks and outdoor spaces are ideal places to gather with your household and participate in recreation activities, as they can help reduce the spread of the virus from one person to another. When participating in a gathering or other activity, all park rules must be followed.

Parks and Trails Open

Parks and trails remain open for recreation use, including running, walking, and playing outdoors with members of the same household. All activities where individuals will be or can be in contact with non-household members require an appropriate face-covering unless medically exempt.

Playgrounds Open

Playgrounds are currently open.

Group Gatherings Prohibited

While gathering and participating in recreation activities with your household is allowed, all public and private gatherings and events with people from more than one household are not permitted

The updated order is effective December 30, 2020, and will remain in effect for as long as the State Public Health Officer's Regional Stay At Home Order remains in effect in the Southern California region.



Staff continues to monitor use at Abalone Cove, with high attendance numbers. The parking lot was closed intermittently throughout the day when it reached capacity. Remember to plan accordingly, call ahead, and avoid peak use hours.

Filiorum Reserve:

On Monday, January 18th, Rangers observed an unauthorized vehicle in the Preserve. Rangers asked the Crew to cease all work and leave the Preserve. The vehicle was left unattended for several hours until it could safely be driven out.



Ocean Trails Reserve:

Rangers continue to receive reports of increased dog use at Rancho Palos Verdes Beach. Animals are not allowed on any beach in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. Dogs are allowed on the trails if they are on a leash no longer than 6 feet in length. The City is working with Trump National Staff to ensure compliance.



A deceased coyote was reported by staff along PVDS near Ocean Trails Reserve. Staff coordinated with Animal Control for safe removal and disposal.

Portuguese Bend Reserve:

Crews began erosion control improvement work on Burma Road on January 4, 2021. The repairs will include adding a drainage swale on the side of a segment of the trail, and drainage dips at numerous locations. All work has been coordinated with the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy to minimize impacts to native habitat. City staff

expects that this work will greatly reduce erosion on the trails that regularly occur after heavy rains.



The project is expected to take 1-2 weeks with intermittent closures as crews work on Burma Road Trail and Water Tank Trail. Consequently, to allow connectivity in the Portuguese Bend Reserve, Ishibashi Trail will allow two-way traffic. One-way signage has been removed. Patrons are asked to wear a face-covering /mask when maintaining a 6-foot distance among other hikers is not possible and to plan accordingly to avoid crowds. Trail closure signage remain in place along Burma Road Trail while the crews work. 



SUBJECT: Request for Relocation of Intensive Flight and Aerobatic Training Area

Dear Mr. Dickson,

I am writing you on behalf of the residents and City Council of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes located in Los Angeles County on the Palos Verdes Peninsula (Peninsula). The City has had a long history of expressing citizen concerns to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regarding airspace noise impacts. There is an FAA-designated Intensive Flight and Aerobatic Training Area offshore to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes (RPV). This flight training area is specifically located offshore, along the City's southerly shoreline. Due to the training site's close proximity to the City's residential and resort developments, City officials receive airspace noise complaints from its residents and visitors.

Understandably, there is a need to have pilots train over the skies of the Los Angeles County region. However, the offshore designated flight training area was established by the FAA at a time when the coastal area adjacent to RPV did not have the intensive residential and recreational developments it has today.

The City Council of Rancho Palos Verdes identifies this noise as a nuisance affecting our community and recommends a course of action to the FAA that would reduce noise over our affected community without concentrating an undue noise burden on any other community. In an effort to reduce the aircraft noise complaints the City of Rancho Palos Verdes receives that are directly attributed to pilot training off the City's coastline, I request

on behalf of the City Council that the FAA relocate the Intensive Flight and Aerobatic Training Area that is adjacent to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes shoreline to a distance further over the Pacific Ocean. A relocation of the practice area to an over-the-ocean area between the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and Catalina Island should be considered by the FAA. Specifically, it is requested that the northerly boundary of the Intensive Flight and Aerobatic Training Area be shifted so as not to be closer than five miles of the City's southerly shoreline. This area does not have commercial turbo propeller traffic nor would it interfere with passenger jets on the OSHNN departure schedule, as that jet traffic is at a higher altitude for the safe spacing between passenger jets and general aviation aircraft.
