Helopod Unveiling Ceremony and Demonstration May 4

A fire-fighting helopod will be unveiled at a ceremony at the Ken Dyda Civic Center on May 4 at 11 am. Los Angeles County Fire Department (LACOFD), California Water Service (Cal Water), and the City of Rancho Palos Verdes have worked together to help improve firefighting capabilities. With the installation of the helopod, helicopters do not have to land to fill up their tanks with water; filling up a helicopter with a helopod is four times faster than filling up by landing. In addition, helicopters will be able to fill up with water at the helopod and existing Civic Center helipad simultaneously. Cal Water provided a \$38,000 grant to the LACOFD, and the City approved placing the helopod at the Civic Center on January 17, 2023, following a recommendation by the Civic Center Advisory Committee. The ceremony on May 4 will include remarks from LACOFD, Cal Water, and City officials, as well as a live helicopter demonstration.



Know the Difference: What Evacuation Warnings and Orders Mean

Residents are reminded of the importance of being prepared as a significant storm continues to impact portions of the state. In addition, extreme weather conditions, such as heavy precipitation and snowfall, contribute to hazardous conditions. To keep people safe, law enforcement frequently issues evacuation warnings or orders before major emergencies, such as severe weather, so it is crucial that all residents understand what it means and how to respond to law enforcement guidance.

Evacuation Warning vs. Evacuation Order

- An EVACUATION WARNING means there's an impending danger to your life or property. If a warning is given, assume an evacuation order will follow. Start gathering important items for your family and pets. Individuals needing extra time to evacuate, or anyone with large animals, should pack up and leave when a warning is issued.
- An EVACUATION ORDER means an immediate threat to your life, and you must leave now! It's critical to follow all directions from law enforcement to ensure you and your family evacuate safely.

When to Evacuate

- Leave as soon as evacuation is recommended to avoid being caught in flood waters or road congestion. In some emergencies, officials may not have time to knock on every door. If you are advised to leave, don't hesitate!
- Officials will determine the evacuation areas and escape routes based on the danger's location, behavior, terrain, etc.
- You will be advised of potential evacuations as early as possible. So take the initiative to stay informed and aware.
- Do not return to your home until officials determine it's safe. Notifications will be given as soon as possible and will consider safety and accessibility.

Pack a Go-Bag

When a disaster hits, you might need more time to gather the necessary supplies. Be sure to Pack a [Go Bag](#) so it's ready to grab in an emergency. Think about the items you'd take if you only had two minutes to leave your home:

- Important Documents
- Cash
- Medicine & important medical information
- Phone charger & backup battery

Pet Preparedness Kit

Plan for your pets and know where you will take or leave them during an emergency. Local animal rescue organizations work with law enforcement and fire departments to

rescue as many animals as possible during a crisis. It would be best if you also had a go-bag packed for your animals:

- Pet carrier for each pet
- Two-week supply of food and water
- Pet first aid kit
- Identification tags
- Vaccination information
- Medications and dosing instructions
- Plastic bags for waste disposal
- Leashes/collars/harnesses

FY 2023-24 Master Schedule of Fees

On May 2, the City Council will hold a public hearing to conduct its annual review of the City's Master Schedule of Fees. The items under consideration include:

- Adjusting the FY 2023-24 fee schedule based on the March 2023 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U)
- Establishing three new fees and changing the calculation for Retaining Walls
- Adjusting Fully Burdened Hourly Rates based on the March 2023 CPI-U
- Adopting the FY 2023-24 Master Schedule of Fees

On April 6 and 20, 2023, Staff published a public notice in the Peninsula News. An explanation of the contents of this staff report and details on how to view the public hearing were provided. The Draft Master Schedule of Fees was also made available to the public and can be viewed at <https://rpvca.gov/1012/Taxes-and-Fees>. This was posted on the City's website on April 19, after the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) published the March CPI-U.

The Regular Meeting of May 2, 2023 will take place in accordance with the requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act, Section 54950 et seq. of the Government Code. Remote participation by any Councilmember shall be in accordance with Subdivisions (b)(3) or (f) of Government Code Section 54953. The meetings are held at Hesse Park, McTaggart Hall, 29301 Hawthorne Boulevard, and via teleconference for staff / consultants / participants using the Zoom platform and broadcast live on the City's website at rpvca.gov/agendas and on RVPtv channels Cox 35 and Frontier FiberOptic 39. Ladera Linda Community Park Project Update

Last week, crews continued waterproofing the building exterior, installing interior drywall, installing electrical wiring, and grading the driveway. In addition, crews completed concrete work on the last accessible ramp wall, placed the concrete slab for the utility enclosure, and continued work on the parking lot. The export of surplus spoils was temporarily suspended last Tuesday until additional information requested by the City is provided by the Contractor.

This week, crews are scheduled to continue work on the building exterior waterproofing, interior drywall, electrical wiring, parking lot, and the stepped terrace and accessible ramp waterproofing.

The City and contractor continue to work on a plan for managing the use of the lower gate during the construction of the driveway and parking lot areas, during which the ability to use the main gate will be restricted. Additionally, Staff continue to work with the contractor on measures to stop early arrives and/or idling on Forrestal Drive. Finally, staff are in communication with the neighbors who have

Repair of Sinkhole on Hawthorne Boulevard

Work to repair the sinkhole on Hawthorne Boulevard just south of the intersection of Seamount Drive and Eddinghill Drive is complete. The work included repairing a failed corrugated metal pipe by installing a new pipe within the old pipe, rebuilding the roadbed, and restoring the project area. All construction-related equipment and materials have been removed, and traffic lanes have been reopened.



Goats Are Back for the 2023 Fuel Modification Season!



Goats are back to perform the important job of helping reduce fire loads and protect homes. Although we understand many people enjoy seeing the goats, please refrain from going to see them out of respect for residents living near where the goats work.

A temporary electrified fence is used to contain the goats while they are working, and attempting to approach them puts you, as well as the goats, at risk. Please avoid attempting to take selfies/pictures or

trying to touch the goats, especially if you have dogs or pets with you. This will prevent stress and/or injury to you and the goats.

In addition to the goats, you may see Stay Green crews performing brush clearance in various areas of the City as part of the City's 2023 fuel modification program.

Prepare for the Citywide Brush Clearing





Palos Verdes Peninsula Association of Realtors (PVPAR) Presentation

On April 19, Staff in the Community Development Department provided an informational presentation to representatives of the PVPAR. The presentation provided background and resource information about the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, including development applications and processes that are of interest to realtors and their clients. As part of the presentation, Code Enforcement Division Staff outlined code requirements related to the posting of real estate signs both on private and public property.

This outreach effort provides an opportunity to educate and inform local realtors about the importance of code compliant signs and practices throughout the City. As part of this action, the City Council will also consider adopting an addendum to a previously approved Mitigated Negative Declaration related to the environmental review and analysis of the proposed project. The project involves a proposed 1,181 ft² addition to an existing single-family residence along with ancillary site improvements.
