

Upcoming - Helopod Unveiling Ceremony and Demonstration

A fire-fighting helopod will be unveiled at a ceremony at the Ken Dyda Civic Center on June 20 at 11 am. Los Angeles County Fire Department (LACOFD), California Water Service (Cal Water), and the City of Rancho Palos Verdes have worked together to help improve firefighting capabilities. With the installation of the helopod, helicopters do not have to land to fill up their tanks with water; filling up a helicopter with a helopod is four times faster than filling up by landing. Helicopters will be able to fill up with water at the helopod and existing Civic Center helipad simultaneously. Cal Water provided a \$38,000 grant to the LACOFD, and the City approved placing the helopod at the Civic Center on January 17, 2023, following a recommendation by the Civic Center Advisory Committee. The ceremony on June 20 will include remarks from LACOFD, Cal Water and City officials as well as a live helicopter demonstration.



RPV EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE TIPS

After an emergency, you may need to survive on your own for several days. Being prepared means having your own [food](#), [water](#) and other [supplies](#) to last for several days. A disaster supplies kit is a collection of basic items your household may need in the event of an emergency.



Make sure your emergency kit is stocked with the items on the checklist below. [Download a printable version](#) to take with you to the store. Once you take a look at the basic items, consider what [unique needs](#) your family might have, such as supplies for [pets](#) or [seniors](#).

Basic Disaster Supplies Kit

To assemble your kit, store items in airtight plastic bags and put your entire disaster supplies kit in one or two easy-to-carry containers such as plastic bins, duffel bag, or backpack.

A basic emergency supply kit could include the following recommended items:

- [Water](#) (one gallon per person per day for several days, for drinking and sanitation)
- [Food](#) (at least a several-day supply of non-perishable food)
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle (to signal for help)
- Dust mask (to help filter contaminated air)
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to [shelter in place](#))
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)
- Wrench or pliers (to [turn off utilities](#))
- Manual can opener (for food)
- Local maps
- Cell phone with chargers and a backup battery

Additional Emergency Supplies

Consider adding the following items to your emergency supply kit:

- [Masks](#), soap, hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes to disinfect surfaces
- [Prescription medications](#) and non-prescription medications such as pain relievers, anti-diarrhea medication, antacids or laxatives
- Prescription eyeglasses and contact lens solution
- Infant formula, bottles, diapers, wipes and diaper rash cream
- Pet food and extra water for your pet
- Cash or traveler's checks
- Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records saved electronically or in a waterproof, portable container
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
- Complete change of clothing appropriate and sturdy shoes
- Fire extinguisher
- Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items
- Mess kits, paper cups, plates, paper towels and plastic utensils
- Paper and pencil
- Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children

PLAN. PREPARE. EVACUATE – Wildfire Preparedness

The June 13 brushfire in Rolling Hills Estates serves as a reminder that wildfire preparedness is essential for our community. With this in mind, the four Peninsula cities, in collaboration with our public safety partners, have launched an evacuation readiness website, PVPReady.gov. This platform is designed to equip Peninsula residents and businesses with the tools necessary for an efficient evacuation during emergencies.

PVPReady.gov incorporates, a cloud-based evacuation platform. It offers pre-established, Peninsula-wide evacuation zone maps, thus serving as a comprehensive source of verified emergency information. These zones are not only beneficial for residents but also aid fire, police, and other emergency service agencies in their preparedness efforts, streamlining the evacuation process and reducing confusion during emergencies.

As Southern California enters its peak fire season, it's crucial for Peninsula residents to be vigilant and proactive. It's now more important than ever to prioritize wildfire prevention and preparedness.

To help safeguard your home and prepare your family, please consider the following recommendations:


- Visit PVPReady.gov to identify and memorize your zone. It's vital to #KnowYourZone before an emergency strikes. Save this information in your smartphone or write it down and place it somewhere easily accessible, such as on your refrigerator or near your front door.
- Familiarize yourself with low-cost and no-cost measures to protect your home from wildfire using these tip sheets:

- Download the L.A. County Fire Department's "Ready! Set! Go!" Personal Wildfire Action Plan from fire.lacounty.gov/rsg. This guide will assist you in creating an effective emergency kit.
- Create an [evacuation plan](#) and regularly rehearse it with your family, ensuring everyone knows what to do and where to go during an emergency.
- Register for Alert SouthBay emergency notifications by texting "alertsrb" to 888-777, visiting alertsouthbay.com, or downloading the Everbridge app. These alerts will keep you informed during emergencies.
- In the event of an emergency, visit PVPReady.gov to check if your zone is under evacuation. Remember, cellphone and internet service may be unreliable during these times, so keep a battery-operated radio handy to access news updates.
- Go to PVPReady.gov to learn more.

Is Your Home Prepared for a Wildfire?

Hardening your home, including your garage, helps defend your home against dangerous embers spread by wildfire. Installing weather stripping between garage doors and door frames helps keep water, dirt, and unwanted pests out, as well as makes your home more fire safe.

- Have a fire extinguisher and tools such as a shovel, rake, bucket, and hose available for fire emergencies.
- Add a battery back-up to the garage door motor so that the garage can easily be operated if power is out.
- Install weather-stripping to gaps greater than 1/8-inch between garage doors and door frames.
- Store all combustible and flammable liquids away from ignition sources.
- Treat windows and vents in the garage as if they were part of the house.

- Unattended bags or packages in public places
- Individuals behaving in a nervous or erratic manner.
- Someone attempting unauthorized access to restricted areas.

Or if you wish to remain Anonymous, call "LA Crime Stoppers" by dialing (800) 222-TIPS (8477), texting the letters TIPLA plus your tip to CRIMES (274637), or using the website <http://lacrimestoppers.org> systems for quick and easy information sharing.

Emergency services like 9-1-1 are always available for immediate threats or emergencies. Remember, everyone has the right to feel safe, and your voice matters. Through this campaign, we can build stronger, safer communities together. So, let's

Fiscal Year 2023-24 Budget Hearing & Adoption

The City Council will conduct a public hearing on June 20, 2023, at 7 p.m. for consideration and possible action to adopt the FY 2023-24 Budget. This hearing comes following the budget workshops held in March and April and after a thorough review of the Preliminary Budget presented at the May 16 meeting.



The budget report presented during the public hearing will provide a comprehensive overview covering the following:

- FY 2023-24 Draft Budget for (General Fund)
- FY 2023-24 Fund Balance Summary (General Fund)

- FY 2023-24 Fund Balance Summary (Capital Improvement Program, Other Funds)



Consumer Price Index – May 2023

Consumer Price Index (U.S.)

Nationally, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose by 0.1% in May on a seasonally adjusted basis. Over the last 12 months, the all items index (headline inflation) increased by 4.0% before seasonal adjustment. The index for all items less food and energy (core inflation) rose by 0.4% in May, the same as it did in both April and March. Core inflation increased by 5.3% over the last 12 months. Chart 1 provides a five-year overview of the trend for percent changes in CPI based on the U.S. city average.

Chart 1. U.S. 12-month Percent Change in CPI, January 2019-May 2023



The shelter index largely contributed to the monthly CPI increase, further bolstered by an increase in the index for used cars and trucks. Food increased by 0.2% in May after remaining unchanged over the past two months. More specifically, the index for food at home rose by 0.1% in May, coupled with a 0.5% increase to the index for food away from home. In contrast, the energy index fell by 3.6% in May due to price changes to major energy components such as gasoline and piped natural gas.



A 0.4% rise in core inflation was also impacted due to increases in shelter, used cars and trucks, motor vehicle insurance, apparel, and personal care indexes. However, the index for household furnishings and operations and for airline fares were among those that decreased over the month. Chart 2 illustrates the increase or decrease in CPI for various selected indexes over the last 12 months.

Consumer Price Index (Los Angeles)


Prices in the Los Angeles area, as measured by CPI, were up by 0.1% in May. An on annual basis, the CPI advanced by 3.2% over the 12-month period. Core inflation also increased by 0.2% in May and by 4.3% on an annual basis. The May increase was mostly influenced by higher prices for shelter in the area.

Food prices declined by 0.2% on a monthly basis, with food at home decreasing by 0.3% and food away from home rising by 0.1% through May. Despite the monthly decline, food prices remain 5% higher than prices from a year ago.

Energy was unchanged between April and May due to higher natural gas and energy prices being offset by the lower cost of gasoline. Energy prices have decreased 11.5% over the year, largely due to lower prices for gasoline (-18.8 %). Prices for natural gas service declined 14.6 % annually, but electricity costs have grown by 5.9% over the past year.

An overview of the 12-month percent change in CPI for the Los Angeles area is illustrated in Chart 3 below.

Ladera Linda Community Park Project Update

Last week, crews continued applying the exterior plaster wall finish on the main building, continued installing light fixtures, and began installing the security roll up doors that protect all glass storefronts of the building.

Crews also installed concrete for the accessibility ramp and main driveway sidewalk, parking lot signs, and flagpole. Crews continued installing fencing at the paddle tennis courts and began installing fencing at the driveway entrance. Crews also continued applying the exterior plaster finish on the storage shed and began soil preparation for new landscaping at the upper tier.

This week, crews are scheduled to continue installing the security roll up doors, light fixtures and exterior plaster wall finish for the main building. Crews are also scheduled to continue installing fencing at the paddle tennis court, main entrance, continue landscaping and the irrigation work on the upper tier.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Movement and Damage to PVDS and Seaview Roads

Due to recent rains, movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide area has been occurring at a greater rate than the previous few years. Damage has been observed on Palos Verdes Drive South in the area of Wayfarer's Chapel as well as other areas. Additionally, extensive roadway damage has been observed in the Seaview Neighborhood.

Repair work is scheduled from June 14 to 16. Traffic control will be in place, therefore, expect delays when driving in this area. Please slow down, drive cautiously, and obey all signs and instructions when driving through the work zones.

Rehabilitation of Silver Spur Road North of Hawthorne Boulevard

This week, crews began work on rehabilitating Silver Spur Road north of Hawthorne Boulevard. The work includes the repair or replacement of damaged sidewalk and curb, upgrading of certain curb ramps, replacement of the top layer of asphalt, and replacement of street signs and pavement markings.

Staff coordinated the construction schedule with the Palos Verdes Peninsula High School (PVPHS) administration to minimize impacts on school operations during construction. Accordingly, summer school is not being held at PVPHS this year, and sports activities will be limited to practices only. Construction is planned to conclude by July 16, 2023 to allow regular school activities to resume as scheduled.

On June 20, 2023, Staff will ask the City Council to continue the public hearing for the Citywide Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District until July 18, 2023, to allow for advertising. This hearing will be conducted during the City Council meeting at 7:00 p.m., at Fred Hesse Community Park, 29301 Hawthorne Boulevard.

On June 6, 2023, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2023-25 declaring its intention not to levy and collect assessments within the Citywide Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District for Fiscal Year 2023-24. The Goats are Here for Fuel Modification Season



Goats are in the City to perform the important job of helping reduce fire loads and protect homes. Although we understand many people enjoy seeing the goats, please refrain from going to see them out of respect for residents living near where the goats work.

A temporary electrified fence is used to contain the goats while they are working, and attempting to approach them puts you as well as the goats at risk.

Please avoid attempting to take selfies/pictures or trying to touch the goats, especially if you have dogs or pets with you. This will prevent stress and/or injury to you and the goats.

In addition to the goats, you may see Stay Green crews performing brush clearance in various areas of the City as part of the City's 2023 fuel modification program.

Maintenance Activities

In addition to regularly scheduled maintenance and repairs, Public Works performed the following:

- Repaired concrete from railing supports in the amphitheater at Point Vicente Interpretative Center
- Repaired a clogged urinal and leaking faucet at Hesse Park.
- Completed weed abatement at lower Hesse Park.
- Installed a new barbecue at Ryan Park.





Street Median and Public Right of Way Landscape Maintenance

Public Works is working to secure additional landscape crews through various vendors to assist with controlling weeds resulting from the unprecedented rainfall during this rainy season. Public Works expects to deploy additional resources in the coming weeks.

- Weed removal, brush clearance, and debris removal continued this week at the following median and right of way locations:
 - Palos Verdes Drive West from Hawthorne Boulevard to Terranea Way.
 - Crest Road between Highridge Road and Crenshaw Boulevard.
 - Highridge Road from Hawthorne Boulevard to Peacock Ridge Road.
 - Calle Entradero from Via Del Cielo to Palos Verdes Drive West.
- Next week, crews are expected to complete trimming and de-weeding on Forrestal Drive and Montemalaga Drive.






Public Right of Way/Roadway Repairs

- Painted “yield” pavement markings, installed two new “yield to pedestrians” signs in the right-of-way, and painted turn pocket arrows on Crest Road at Whitley Collins.
- Performed sidewalk grinding to remove deviations in the area surrounding Point Vicente School.
- Filled potholes on Palos Verdes Drive East at Rockinghorse Road, and in front of 1325 Mount Rainier.
- Made initial asphalt repair on Palos Verdes Drive South adjacent to Wayfarer’s Chapel, in advance of more extensive repairs forthcoming this week.
- Repaired the advance warning street sign for Roan Road.
- Replaced faded stop signs with new signs at Vallon and Via La Cresta.

Graffiti Removal

- Twenty-One cases of graffiti were reported and removed this week.

EMERGENCY ISSUES

Emergency Response

This week, Public Works responded to several emergencies throughout the city at the following locations:

- Staff responded to an emergency near 30714 Ganado Drive, several tree branches fell into the right-of-way. Within an hour, the branches were removed.
- Public Works responded to an emergency call about a loose, low-hanging tree branch at 39 Sail View Drive. The team removed the branch within an hour as well.
- On June 7, Public Works discovered a leaking manhole cover in the Agua Amarga Canyon area (off Faircove Drive). Staff worked with LA County Public Works (who maintain most of the City's sewer lines) to contain the area and make repairs. The final repairs took place on June 10.

There were no interruptions to services during this time. The department continues to work with LA County Public Works to ensure proper operations of sewer line.

Illegal Sign Sweep

Over the weekend of June 10-11, the City's Code Enforcement Division canvassed the City as part of an effort to address illegal sign throughout the community. City Staff identified illegal signs placed in the public right-of-way, including but not limited to, center medians, sidewalks, street curbsides, and bike lanes. These illegally placed signs are a concern for public safety and the signs also detract from the aesthetics and quality of life in the area. The sign sweep resulted in the confiscation of several signs observed in violation of code provisions. The City's Code Enforcement Division will continue to conduct random sweeps in order to confiscate illegal signs. Confiscated signs can be retrieved from the Community Development Department located at City Hall, 30940 Hawthorne Blvd., RPV CA 90275, during normal business hours.

For more information, please contact the City's Code Enforcement Division at (310) 544-5281 or via email at CodeEnforcement@rpvca.gov. As a reminder, requirements for signs on public property include:

- **SIGNS MAY ONLY BE PLACED IN PARKWAYS.** In the absence of parkways, signs may be placed on unimproved public property within the right-of-way, provided the signs do not obstruct the passage of pedestrians or vehicles, and do not interfere with traffic visibility, and are a minimum of 2-feet from vehicular travel lanes.
- Signs are prohibited on street medians.
- Only a-frame signs are permitted.



- No flags, balloons, pennants, or any other attachments permitted.
- Sign placement hours:
 - Signs may be placed on weekdays between 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
 - Signs may be placed on weekends between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
 - **All signs shall be removed by 6:00 p.m. daily**


