Shooting Death Investigation

Los Angeles County Sheriff's Homicide investigators are continuing to investigate the circumstances surrounding the shooting death of an adult male and adult female found in a vehicle parked in the Pelican Cove parking lot on July 24, 2023, at approximately 6:50 a.m.

The victims have been identified as 36-year-old, Jorge Ramos, of Los Angeles and 26-year-old, Taylorraven Whittaker, of Carson.



On July 26, the Pasadena Police Department held a press conference [announcing six arrests](#) in connection with a fatal shooting that occurred in that city in the early morning hours of July 22, which they believe may be connected to Monday's incident in Rancho Palos Verdes.

Jessie Munoz, 32, was shot and killed in a vehicle parked at an overlook along Angeles Crest Highway during what police said was a robbery. A female passenger was uninjured.

Police did not release the names of the suspects, but said they are male and female adults and are believed to be part of a street gang. Charges have not yet been filed.

No additional information about the suspects' connection to the incident in Rancho Palos Verdes has been made available. The City of Rancho Palos Verdes is monitoring developments in the investigation and is in contact with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. Questions about this incident should be directed to the Sheriff's Department.

The City extends its condolences to the families of all the victims.



Letter to FEMA Regarding Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Project Grant Application

On July 25, City Manager Ara Mihranian sent a letter to Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Administrator Deanne Criswell in support of the City's application for a \$23.3 million FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) grant for the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Project (see attached letter). The letter noted land movement that destroyed homes in neighboring Rolling Hills Estates and accelerated land movement in Portuguese Bend due to record winter rainfall have heightened the City's concerns about the risk of a catastrophic event. The BRIC grant will be critical to slowing land movement, as the City lacks funds to complete the project. The letter was also sent to U.S. Senators Dianne Feinstein and Alex Padilla, Rep. Ted Lieu, FEMA Region 9 Administrator Robert J. Fenton, Jr., and Ryan Buras, Deputy Director of Recovery Operations, CalOES. Staff will share updates on the City's grant application status as they become available.

- In the event of an emergency, visit PVReady.gov to check if your zone is under evacuation. Remember, cellphone and internet service may be unreliable during these times, so keep a battery-operated radio handy to access news updates.

Finance Advisory Committee Meeting

The special meeting of the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) will be held on July 27 at 6:30 p.m. The agenda for this meeting includes:

- Consideration and possible action to receive and file a report on the preliminary conceptual design, budget, and schedule for the Civic Center Master Plan Project, and provide recommendations on potential funding options (continuation of the July 20, 2023 meeting).
- Consideration and possible action to review and discuss:
 - Setting aside an initial payment amount based on the current estimated available resources.
 - Funding sources to further evaluate the identified funding gap including:
 - Financing Approaches Available: traditional loan, issue securities, direct lease (Public-Private Partnership ((P3)), and/or general obligation bond.
 - Other Potential Revenue Sources: philanthropy/local fundraising grants, public/private operating partnerships, and on-site revenues.
- Consideration and possible action to select three FAC members to serve on a Subcommittee for the Civic Center Master Plan Project;
- Consideration and possible action to recommend that the City Council consider hiring a financial consultant to develop a Business Plan to analyze and assess the Project's potential revenue opportunity streams and Return on Investment (ROI); and,
- Consideration and possible action to continue the meeting to a joint meeting with the Civic Center Advisory Committee on August 3, 2023.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Klondike Canyon Landslide Movement

Last week, Public Works continued roadway repairs in the area of Dauntless Drive and Exultant Drive. Work is continuing this week, and road closures will remain in effect until the roadway repairs are completed.

Public Works has been conducting detailed surveys of land movement from the Klondike Canyon Landslide, especially at the intersection of Dauntless Drive and Exultant Drive. Public Works began conducting detailed surveys of land movement associated with the Klondike Canyon Landslide to quantify the rate and direction of movement and began inspecting utilities for damage. This work will continue over the coming weeks and will be used to determine possible steps that can be taken to reduce the rate of land movement and increase water and sewer infrastructure resiliency to land movement.

The City is proactively filming and inspecting the underground sewer line to ensure no active leaks or breaks exist, and to determine if repairs are warranted. This is an ongoing effort as part of the City's response to the land movement in the area.

Avenida Classica Traffic Calming

Staff presented recommendations to the Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) for traffic calming on Avenida Classica, affecting the surrounding roadways, including Avenida Esplendida, Los Verdes Drive, and Hawthorne Boulevard.

Staff recommended a turn diverter prohibiting southbound right-turns and northbound left-turns at the intersection of Avenida Classica and Los Verdes Drive, as well as Avenida Esplendida and Los Verdes Drive in conjunction with a traffic signal at the intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard and Los Verdes Drive, and additional wayfinding signage.

Staff provided information on traffic circles at the intersection of Avenida Classica and Avenida Celestial and Avenida Classica and Avenida Esplendida as an alternative traffic calming measure.

TSC passed a motion supporting traffic circles.

Staff will present traffic calming measures recommendations and the TSC recommendation to the City Council for its consideration which is tentatively set for September 5 meeting. Notices will be sent to all residents within 500 feet of the affected roadways.



Repairs to the Landslide Area

Work on Palos Verdes Drive South to repair the asphalt roadway surface in the landslide area is underway this week. This work will address needed repairs between Narcissa Drive and Peppertree Drive. Repairs to the roadway are anticipated to be complete by August 4.

Traffic control will be in place. Therefore, expect

delays when driving in this area. Please slow down, drive cautiously, and obey all signs and instructions when driving through the work zones.

UCLA South Bay: New Signs at the Intersection of Palos Verdes Drive East and Crest Road

Last week, the street name signs at the intersection of Palos Verdes Drive East and Crest Road East were replaced to reflect UCLA moving into the old Marymount California University site. The new signs indicate both “UCLA South Bay” and Crest Road East, with directional arrows, whereas the previous signs indicated only Crest Road East or Marymount California University. The new signs are temporary, in time for UCLA’s inaugural leadership academy in August, while the traditional illuminated signs are on order.



Ladera Linda Community Park Project Update

Last week, construction crews continued installing exterior tiles and the aluminum framing for the building’s exterior glazing system. Crews installed bollards in front of the building, installed the roof access ladder, and completed wiring for emergency lighting. Crews also continued placing reinforcing steel bars for the concrete walkway around the building, installing irrigation systems on all three site tiers, final grading of the site’s low tier, and installing decomposed granite pathways on the site’s upper and lower tiers.



This week, crews will continue installing the building’s exterior glazing system and exterior tiles, installing irrigation and decomposed granite pathways, placing the remaining concrete for the walkway around the building, and begin installing parking lot lights and ramp wall lighting.

The updated design concept is based on the most popular layout as evidenced by community input previously received, and it incorporates native trees and shrubs that are Caltrans approved.

Supporting the policies of the Circulation Element of the General Plan, Public Works Staff hosted the latest quarterly Palos Verdes Peninsula Projects Coordination Meeting on July 19. The meeting was well attended by 17 people representing other Peninsula cities and various utility companies that serve the Peninsula. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss current, upcoming, and potential projects so that unnecessary traffic congestion can be averted, as well as identify and resolve any current delays caused by ineffective communication.

Public Works will host the next meeting in October of this year.





Emergency Response

Public Works Staff and the Los Angeles Fire Department determined that the smell was caused by a sewage leak. LA County Public Works inspected and jetted the sewer line to clear any blockage. The City dispatched a cleanup crew, and the area was cleaned and sanitized.

July 19, 2023 Lax Community Noise Roundtable Meeting Summary

On July 19, 2023, the LAX Community Noise Roundtable held a regularly scheduled meeting to discuss a range of agenda items (attached) involving noise concerns caused by passenger jets arriving and departing from LAX (Los Angeles International Airport). The highlight of the meeting involved a discussion to prepare a draft Roundtable comment letter to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) concerning the FAA's Aviation Noise Policy review. There was additional discussion on drafting letters of support to House and Senate representatives for those House and Senate Bills that contain aircraft noise mitigation provisions. The Roundtable will review drafts of the letters at the next Roundtable meeting, and any approved Roundtable letters will be included in a forthcoming Weekly Admin Report.



Lastly, the Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) staff distributed routine passenger jet data for those aircraft that overflew the PV Peninsula during May-June 2023 (attached). Residential Care Facilities Update

On July 13, 2023, Code Enforcement Division Staff, in coordination with the City's Public Safety team, met with representatives from the California Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing for Children Residential Care Facilities. The purpose of the meeting was to inform State representatives of public safety concerns related to residential care facilities in the community and to understand State licensing requirements for such establishments. As part of the meeting, State representatives outlined various informational resources, including a [complaint hotline](#), whereby interested parties can report public safety concerns directly to the Department of Social Services for further investigation. Overall, State representatives expressed an interest in

working closely with City Staff to monitor and address concerns.

As a follow up, on July 20, 2023, City Staff met with local HOA representatives to share highlights of the meeting with the Department of Social Services and to provide feedback on the public safety concerns in the community. HOA representatives were thankful and pleased with the City's proactive approach in meeting with State representatives and taking the time to educate and raise awareness on the issue. 

Dear Administrator Criswell,

I am writing you regarding the Portuguese Bend Landslide and its imminent threat to property and lives in the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, California.

The Portuguese Bend Landslide was triggered in 1956 and hasn't stopped moving since. The landslide moves at an average annual rate of 6 to 15 feet horizontally and 0.5 to 1.5 feet vertically, depending on the specific location. However, over the past few months the rate of movement has significantly accelerated primarily due to this past winter's record rainfall. The recent rate of movement, in combination with the recent land movement in the neighboring City of Rolling Hills Estates and the loss of 12 homes, has many people in Rancho Palos Verdes, including City officials, feeling uneasy and anxious about what may be imminent in the Portuguese Bend neighborhood.

Since 2017, the City has been developing an engineering project to remediate the landslide. The landslide remediation project consists of three features intended to remove water which is the culprit to the land movement. This is achieved by filling fissures, constructing lined and vegetated drainage swales to convey water to the ocean and preventing it from entering the ground, and extracting ground water through the use of hydraulers also known as horizontal dewatering wells.

The project has an estimated price tag of \$33 million which the City is unable to afford. To that point, on January 16, 2023, the City submitted FEMA's BRIC grant application requesting \$23.3 million to assist the City with its remediation project. Without the BRIC grant funds, this critical capital remediation project cannot happen, which leaves the City, its residents, and the surrounding sensitive environment, including the protected marine ecology, vulnerable to a potential catastrophic outcome. Awarding FEMA's BRIC grant to






Palos Verdes Peninsula – Jet Overflights
