City Hall will be closed to the public on November 10 in observance of Veterans Day, but parks will be open for their regular hours. There will be no change in regularly-scheduled trash collection or street sweeping.

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes is pleased to introduce newly named Lomita Sheriff's Station Capt. Kimberly Guerrero to the community!

Capt. Guerrero began leading the station on October 29 following her appointment by Sheriff Robert Luna. She was voted the top choice by an interview panel comprised of officials from the cities of Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, Lomita, and the office of Los Angeles County Supervisor Janice Hahn.

Capt. Guerrero is a 26-year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department, having started her career as a deputy assigned to Men's Central Jail in 1997. She went on to serve in the Court Services Division and at the Carson Station before she was promoted to Sergeant at the Norwalk Station in 2006. Capt. Guerrero was assigned to the Century Regional Detention Facility in 2016 and was promoted to Lieutenant with the Countywide Services Division in 2020. Since then, she served as Operations Lieutenant

As she moved up the ranks, Capt. Guerrero has been responsible for handling assignments that involve major crime scenes, investigations, personnel issues, officer training, community outreach, and public speaking.

She holds a bachelor's degree in applied psychology from Cal State Dominguez Hills and is completing a master's degree in emergency services administration from Cal State Long Beach. She is a graduate of the Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute.

In her free time, Capt. Guerrero enjoys mentoring staff across ranks, volunteering as a youth sports coach, spending time with her family, staying active, and traveling. Peninsula Residents Learn How to Use Landscaping to Protect Their Homes from Wildfire

On November 1, several dozen Peninsula residents learned about fire-resistant landscaping at a workshop at Hesse Park hosted by the West Basin Municipal Water District in partnership with the City, Cal Water, and the L.A. County Fire Department. Instructor Douglas Kent gave an overview of landscaping techniques and native plants residents can use to protect their home from wildfires. These practices combined with smart irrigation systems can help safeguard your home, use less water, and save money on your water bill.

L.A. County Fire Department Battalion Chief Mike Lewis provided information about annual brush clearance requirements — notices are scheduled to go out in February 2024 — and City Manager Ara Mihranian shared the City's emergency preparedness resources.

Cal Cities Water Loss Roundtable

This week, Staff joined the Water Loss Discussion Round Table hosted by Cal Cities. Staff heard about a case from the City of Sacramento on water loss and leak detection, with the presenter sharing useful technical guidance and resources.

Brian Sanders, representing the City of Sacramento, discussed ways to make water conservation more doable. He pointed out the high costs of water loss and leak detection and suggested tweaks to the State Water Resources Control Board's model to cut down on the needed investment. Concerns were raised about the state water board's economic model, emphasizing the importance of existing water infrastructure. Sanders explained the process of asking for changes in water board regulations, focusing on key data and providing detailed support to speed up the review process.

The presentation also touched on managing water loss, funding opportunities, and solutions for aging infrastructure. For Rancho Palos Verdes, where Cal Water supplies the City's water, responsibility for water loss reporting and conservation through leak detection falls on Cal Water. The City understands the significance of water loss in our community, especially with the water delivery system impacting the greater Portuguese Bend Landslide complex area. We are committed to learning more and addressing concerns about water loss in our community.

Weekly Schedule for Overnight Closures of the Vincent Thomas Bridge

Caltrans advises motorists that the Vincent Thomas Bridge on State Route 47 (SR 47) will close overnight in the northbound direction tonight, November 8. Closures will begin as soon as 8 p.m. and end by 6 a.m. the following morning.

These closures will allow crews to continue safety upgrades on the bridge cables. Work on this project began in October and is anticipated to continue through early January. Throughout this time, overnight closures are planned in both directions of travel, excepting on weekends and during holiday travel.

For this week's closure, motorists traveling on northbound SR 47 should follow one of the following detour routes:



- From southbound I-110 exit at SR 1 (Exit 4), turn left on SR 1 and take either Harry Bridges Boulevard or SR 103 to SR 47.
- From northbound SR 47 Exit at Harbor Boulevard (Exit 1C), turn left to go northbound on Harbor Boulevard, turn right on Pacific Avenue, turn right on Harry Bridges Boulevard, which turns into Alameda Street, and then continue to SR 47.
- From southbound Harbor Boulevard, take the northbound I-110 on-ramp then exit at SR 1 (Exit 4), turn right on SR 1 and take either Harry Bridges Boulevard or SR 103 to SR 47.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Local Emergency Update

Land Movement Update: November 14 City Council Meeting

On November 14, 2023, the City Council will consider renewing the [local emergency declaration and building moratorium](#) that were put in place on October 3, 2023 to bolster the City's response to accelerated movement in the landslide complex.

The Council will consider extending the local emergency declaration to January 13, 2024, and extending the moratorium in the landslide complex to October 2, 2024. The moratorium was approved by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) on November 6 and is now enforceable (see attached letter from HCD).

Staff will also provide an update on various activities and solutions to address the land movement since the local state of emergency was declared. A staff report with more information is available on the City website.

Successful Red Cross Shelters Fundamentals Training for City Staff

In light of the recent local emergency declaration by the City due to the increased land movement in the greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex, a collaboration has been formed with the Red Cross to provide shelter fundamentals training to our personnel. This training is aimed at preparing our team with the essential competencies to offer effective support to those potentially displaced by these adverse events.



The City is pleased to report the successful completion of our inaugural mass care workshop tailored for city employees. Conducted on November 3, the workshop was facilitated by two adept Red Cross instructors, Vesta Sung and Manny Sanchez, whose contributions were outstanding. Feedback from City Staff who attended indicates that the workshop was immensely beneficial. The training encompassed classroom-based learning on the core aspects of shelter management and was augmented by a hands-on shelter simulation exercise. Efforts are underway to organize a subsequent session to broaden the reach of this crucial training to more staff members.

The PPSC consists of two Council Members from all four Peninsula cities of Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, and Palos Verdes Estates. The PPSC meets quarterly on the same day as the RCLC to discuss collaborative efforts on ensuring Peninsula-wide emergency preparedness and public safety. The PPSC combines emergency preparedness initiatives and public safety trends and topics about the Peninsula.

The RCLC consists of two Council Members from the cities of Rancho Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, and Rolling Hills Estates, who share municipal law enforcement services provided by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. The RCLC meets quarterly to review the Sheriff's performance, make policy recommendations regarding the joint contract, and review statistics for the preceding quarter concerning crime incidents, traffic enforcement, response times, false alarm rates, and the distribution of the Sheriff's patrol time throughout the region.

10 Tips to Help You Prepare Your Pets for Wildfire Season:

Pet owners are reminded to prepare for wildfire. Preparing in advance and making an emergency plan can make all the difference when faced with evacuation during a wildfire incident.

The following are some basic tips that will help ensure you and your pets are prepared in the face of an emergency:



- 1. Have an Emergency Plan for Each Pet:** where will you go, who will take care of them, and how you will transport them. Make a list with contact information, transportation routes, and backup plans.
- 2. Research Pet-Friendly Hotels and Lodging and Keep the List Current:** Reach out to friends and family outside the area to find out if you can stay with them during an emergency.
- 3. Engage With Your Community:** network with neighbors on community websites and apps to make connections with other pet owners. This can help you share resources and make a unified plan.
- 4. Get Your Animals Microchipped With Up-To-Date Contact Information:** in the registry, an important step that many people forget. Have visible identification such as collars and tags whenever possible, and safe to do so.
- 5. Prepare a Minimum of a Three-Day Supply of Food and Water for Each Animal.**

6. **Have an Assembled Emergency “Go-Kit” Ready at All Times:** Include medications, medical records, licensing records, a photo of the animal, collar, leash, carrier, and any comfort items that will help your pet. Make sure exotics and birds have appropriate housing and food.
7. **For Large Animals, Train Them to Load Into Trailers Prior to an Emergency:** Practice loading and unloading them. Gather any records, documents, and special items they may need.
8. **Have Proper Transportation to Transport Your Animals.** This is especially important for large animals. Make sure you know how you will transport your animals and that all information is current. Conduct safety checks on horse and livestock trailers to ensure they are fully operational and ready for use in an emergency.
9. **Practice Your Plan.** Make sure all family members and pets are familiar with the plan and what's expected of them.
10. **Evacuate Early!** Don't wait until the last minute; activate your plan while roads are still open to avoid traffic delays.

Alongside personnel from three Peninsula cities including Rolling Hills Assistant City Manager Alexa Davis, Senior Management Analyst Jessica Slawson, Palos Verdes Estates Acting Police Chief Luke Hellinga, L.A. County Assistant Fire Chief Brian Bennett, and Soraya Sutherlin, the Regional Emergency Communications Manager for Alert SouthBay. Jesse and the team delivered an insightful presentation. First-time attendees and presenters, this talented group effectively showcased the regional cooperation model implemented on the Peninsula. The session not only offered valuable insights but provided a practical framework for fellow government employees to bring back to their respective organizations. It emphasized the importance of collaborative problem-solving in the realms of emergency services and project management.



The Employment Situation – October 2023


Last week, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) released data from the household and establishment monthly surveys. The household survey measures labor force status, including unemployment, by demographic characteristics. The establishment survey measures nonfarm employment, hours, and earnings by industry. Notable highlights from each survey are summarized below.

Household Survey Data

- The unemployment rate rose from 3.8% last month to 3.9% in October.
- The number of unemployed persons rose from 6.4 million to 6.5 million.
- Both measures have increased since their April lows.

Establishment Survey Data

- Total nonfarm payroll employment increased by 150,000 in October.
- The monthly change is well below the average monthly gain of 258,000.
- Considerable job gains occurred in health care, government, and social assistance.


Ladera Linda Community Park Project Update



Swale Maintenance Reminder

As the rainy season approaches with the El Nino forecast, it's time to clean drainage swales. Swales tend to become filled with leaves, overgrown vegetation, and debris over the course of the year. As a reminder, it is a property owner's responsibility to maintain a drainage swale so that it functions properly. Improperly maintained drainage swales interfere with proper drainage flows that can result in property damage caused by slope failure, erosion, or excess stormwater runoff.



As an additional reminder, the City's Municipal Code does not permit the construction

of any structure within or above a drainage swale, or on a slope on or equal to 35% or greater. This includes decks, stairs, or structures of any kind.

Rainwater Harvesting

Harvesting the rain is a simple, low-cost way to save money on water bills, provide fresh soft water for plants, and protect the local watershed. More specifically, rainwater from roofs, paved patios and walkways around a home can be intercepted onsite and used to water plants, gardens, and landscapes. Harvesting options include installing a rain barrel, designing a rain garden, and utilizing permeable paving for hardscape improvements. The REACH program serves the social and recreational needs of youths and adults with developmental disabilities and is back at Hesse Park for in-person activities.




RE: Approval of Urgency Ordinance – Moratorium on Construction within the Greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex

The purpose of this letter is to provide a determination to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes (City) regarding the request to approve the adoption of Interim Urgency Ordinance No. 674U (Ordinance), prohibiting any construction within the geographic boundaries of the Greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex). The California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) is statutorily required to provide determination regarding proposed moratoria (Gov. Code, § 66300, subd. (b)(1)(B)(ii)). HCD received a request for approval for the proposed Ordinance, met with the City staff, and reviewed relevant materials (e.g., staff letter, resolution declaring a local emergency, Interim Ordinance No. 674U, land movement monitoring surveys, etc.). Upon review of the written materials and discussion with the local jurisdiction, HCD has determined that the current conditions of the Landslide Complex pose an imminent threat to the health and safety of persons residing in the area subject to the Ordinance.

Background

Since the 1950s to 1970s, three large landslides have been active in the City, including Portuguese Bend Landslide (PBL), Abalone Cove Landslide (ACL), and the Klondike Canyon Landslide (KCL). The Greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex or Landslide Complex encompasses these three active landslides. Beginning in May of 2023, land movement has increased in the PBL and KCL complexes. Based on a surveying report of PBL in October 2022 and revised assessment in June 2023, “movement velocities have accelerated over the average velocity for the previous four years, which saw an acceleration over the previous 15-20 years”.¹ The accelerating

land movement has destroyed homes, impacted the Portuguese Bend Reserve, increased water main breaks, and caused roadway and utility line distress.

The City established Landslide Moratorium Area in 1978, imposing development restrictions in response to the Landslide Complex. Since then, the City has adopted a series of Interim Urgency Ordinances (Nos. 108U, 139U, 427U, 459U, 526, etc.) to temporarily halt permit processing and construction, and make amendments to enforce appropriate landslide mitigations measures in designated areas (Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code sections 15.20.040 and 15.20.050).

The proposed Ordinance No. 674U is to encompass the entire Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex (including ACL and KCL). The Ordinance would address an imminent threat to public health and safety and prevent the exacerbation of existing unstable geologic conditions caused by activities related to new construction within the Landslide Complex. During the effective period of this Ordinance, the City will not accept or consider any permit applications, nor issue any permits for construction on any property within the Landslide Complex. This Ordinance also applies to any pending applications and to any permits or entitlements that have issued but upon which construction has not commenced.

The City has confirmed that no sites included in its housing element site inventory are within the Landslide Complex. As a result, no such sites are subject to the proposed Ordinance. Pursuant to Government Code section 65858, the City seeks to adopt and enforce the proposed Ordinance that will begin with a 45-day period, following its date of adoption, and if necessary extended for up to 22 months and 15 days.

The City is in the process of implementing a large-scale remediation project to stabilize the Landslide Complex. The project will proceed in three phases: (1) repairing existing fractures, (2) improving surface drainage of stormwater, and (3) installing a network of hydraulers. Staff anticipates that 90 percent of the planning and Environmental Impact Report certification will be complete by September 2024, and final engineering and permitting will be complete by September 2025.

Local Moratorium Regulations Under the Housing Crisis Act (HCA)

Pursuant to Government Code section 66300, subdivision (b)(1)(B)(ii), a city cannot enforce a moratorium that would limit housing development until it has submitted the ordinance to and received approval from HCD. Conditions for imposing a moratorium, or similar restrictions on housing development, must demonstrate “an imminent threat to the health and safety of persons residing in, or within the immediate vicinity of, the area subject to the moratorium” (Gov. Code, § 66300, subd. (b)(1)(B)(i)).

HCD acknowledges the severity of the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex's condition and the potential harm to public health and safety, and the environment, and anticipates that the Ordinance will need to be extended beyond the 45-day period, pursuant to Government Code section 65858. HCD hereby approves the adoption and enforcement of Interim Urgency Ordinance No. 674U during the effective period of 45 days from its adoption and its planned extension for up to 22 months and 15 days by the City of Rancho Palos Verdes.

Conclusion

In summary, HCD approves the adoption and enforcement of the Ordinance and hopes for a speedy resolution of this matter.
