

November 12-18 is LA vs Hate Week

November 12-18 is LA vs Hate United Against Hate Week, which aims to inspire people to stand up to hate and to build understanding among Los Angeles County residents about what constitutes hate acts and how to report them.

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes joins L.A. County in not only celebrating the legacy and culture of the diverse populations that make up



the county, but in acknowledging the challenges they have faced and continue to face.

November 14, 2023, City Council Meeting Highlights

Highlights from the November 14 City Council meeting:

- The Council voted to extend both the local emergency declaration and the building moratorium that were put in place last month to bolster the City's response to accelerated movement in the landslide complex.
- The local emergency declaration is now in place through January 13, 2024. Because the first meeting in 2024 is likely to be canceled, the Council will consider extending it again at the final City Council meeting of 2023 on December 19. The building moratorium will be in place through October 2, 2024 and could be extended in the future.
- The City's geologist provided an overview of historical and recent landslide activity.

- City Staff gave updates on short-term mitigation measures, including dewatering wells, filling fissures, Cal Water's installation of temporary, above-ground water pipes in a portion of Seaview, and other infrastructure repairs and upgrades.
- The Council also adopted an ordinance increasing the allowable height limit for antennas in the public right-of-way from 4 to 6 feet to improve telecommunications services in the City.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Local Emergency Update

Land Movement Update: November 14 City Council Meeting

At last night's meeting, the City Council voted to extend both the local emergency declaration and the building moratorium that were put in place on October 3 to bolster the City's response to accelerated movement in the landslide complex. Both require renewal to stay in effect long-term.

The moratorium on new construction in the landslide complex has been approved by the California Department of Housing and Community Development and is now enforceable. It will be in place through October 2, 2024. The maximum the moratorium could be in effect if it were to be extended multiple times would be 2.5 years.

The local emergency declaration goes up for renewal every 60 days, so it is now in place through January 13, 2024. Because the first meeting in 2024 is likely to be canceled, the Council will consider extending it at the final City Council meeting of 2023 on December 19. Meeting information will be shared in a future update.

Last night's discussion included a presentation from the City's geologist on historical and recent activity in the landslide complex. City Staff also gave updates on short-term mitigation measures, including dewatering wells, filling fissures, Cal Water's installation of temporary, above-ground water pipes in a portion of Seaview, and other infrastructure repairs and upgrades.


In addition to extending the local emergency declaration and the building moratorium, the Council directed the City Manager to send a letter to the Klondike Canyon Landslide

Abatement District (KCLAD) stressing the importance to expedite mitigation measures and voted to send a follow-up letter to the California State Controller's Office regarding KCLAD to help expedite response efforts.



New GIS Map

The City has created new interactive geographic information system (GIS) map with the boundaries of the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex, the ACLAD, and the KCLAD.

When viewing the map, click on the Map Layers icon in the upper right-hand corner, then click on the triangle symbol next to the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex layer to expand a dropdown menu with additional layers for the ACLAD and KCLAD.

Enter an address in the search bar in the upper left-hand corner of the map to see if it falls within the boundaries of the landslide complex, the ACLAD, or KCLAD.

Please note that you may be erroneously prompted to log in to view the map. If this happens, simply refresh the browser page and the prompt should go away. Our GIS vendor is working to resolve this issue.

Unfilled sandbags are located at the City Hall info desk and are available during regular business hours (7:30 a.m.-5:30 p.m. Monday-Thursday, and 7:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Friday). There is a limit of 10 sandbags per household with valid ID or proof of residency. Fill sand is located at City Hall in a designated area for residents to use. Please bring your shovels and tools as they are not provided.

Goat Vegetation Management Project – FEMA HMGP Site Visit

FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) provides funding to state, local, tribal, and territorial governments to mitigate future disaster losses in their communities. Administered by the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), the program sets aside a portion of funds when a Federal Disaster Declaration is issued in California to provide funding for hazard mitigation projects through the HMGP.

In June 2021, the City submitted a sub application to secure HMGP funding to continue using grazing goats to consume hazardous vegetation and reduce the amount or density of fuel available to burn in a wildfire. The City has been utilizing goat grazing as a method of fuel modification since 2008, which has proven to be a more efficient and cost-effective approach compared to traditional methods, especially in areas of steep and difficult terrain where human-operated machinery is not practical. Goats are effective in creating and maintaining fuel breaks in grass, shrub, and timber fuel types, which allows for better defensible space for structures and enables firefighters to suppress wildland fires using ground and air resources more effectively.

The City recently took crucial steps in advancing this project under HMGP. In response to a FEMA request for information as a part of the Environmental and Historic Preservation (EHP) review process, the City meticulously documented the project's Environmental compliance measures in a detailed letter. [The letter \(PDF\)](#), accessible on the City's website, provided a thorough outline of the city's commitment to adhering to FEMA's requirements and the City's dedication to this eco-friendly fuel modification strategy. The city remains optimistic that its innovative approach to fuel modification will ultimately receive the necessary funding to continue reducing the risk of wildfires in our community.



EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TIPS

Thunderstorms and Lightning Safety

Thunderstorms last an average of 30 minutes and can cause dangerous lightning, large hail, flash flooding, and strong winds. They often develop quickly and with little warning, so it is important to learn the danger signs and plan ahead. Lightning is a leading cause of injury and death from weather-related hazards. Although most lightning victims survive, people struck by lightning often report a variety of long-term, debilitating symptoms.

Understanding Severe Weather Alerts:

Do you know the difference between a National Weather Service Severe Thunderstorm Watch and a Severe Thunderstorm Warning? Check your knowledge below:

- **Severe Thunderstorm Watch:** Be Prepared! Severe thunderstorms are possible in and near the watch area. Stay informed and be ready to act if a severe thunderstorm warning is issued. The watch area is typically large, covering numerous counties or even states.
- **Severe Thunderstorm Warning:** Take Action! Severe weather has been reported by spotters or indicated by radar. Warnings indicate imminent danger to life and property. Take shelter in a substantial building. Get out of mobile homes that can blow over in high winds. Warnings typically encompass a much smaller area (around the size of a city or small county) that may be impacted by a large hail or damaging wind identified by an NWS forecaster on radar or by a trained spotter/law enforcement who is watching the storm.



Be Prepared Before a Thunderstorm Threatens

- **Be Weather-Ready:** Check the forecast regularly to see if you're at risk for severe weather. Listen to local news or a [NOAA Weather Radio](#) to stay informed about severe thunderstorm watches and warnings. Check the [Weather-Ready Nation](#) for tips.
- **Subscribe for Emergency Alerts:** Sign up for Alert SouthBay emergency notifications by texting “alertsrb” to 888-777 or visiting [alertsouthbay.com](#). Download the free MyRPV app to your devices from your app store.
- **Create a Communications Plan:** Have a family plan with an emergency meeting place and related information. Pick a safe room in your home, such as a basement, storm cellar, or an interior room on the lowest floor with no windows. Get more ideas for a plan at: <https://www.ready.gov/make-a-plan>
- **Practice Your Plan:** Conduct a family severe thunderstorm drill regularly, so everyone knows what to do if a damaging wind or large hail is approaching. Ensure all family members know to go there when severe thunderstorm warnings are issued. Don't forget pets if time allows.
- **Prepare Your Home :** Keep trees and branches trimmed near your house. If you have time before severe weather hits, secure loose objects, close windows, and doors, and move any valuable objects inside or under a sturdy structure.
- **Help Your Neighbor:** Encourage your loved ones to prepare for severe thunderstorms. Take CPR training so you can help if someone is hurt during severe weather.

Staying Safe During a Thunderstorm

- **Stay Weather Ready:** Continue to listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay updated about severe thunderstorm watches and warnings.
- **At Your House:** Go to your secure location if you hear a severe thunderstorm warning. Damaging wind or large hail may be approaching. Take your pets with you if time allows.

- **At Your Workplace or School:** Stay away from windows if you are in a severe thunderstorm warning and damaging wind or large hail is approaching. Do not go to large open rooms such as cafeterias, gymnasiums, or auditoriums.
- **Outside:** Go inside a sturdy building immediately if severe thunderstorms are approaching. Sheds and storage facilities are not safe. Taking shelter under a tree can be deadly. The tree may fall on you. Standing under a tree also put you at a greater risk of getting struck by lightning.
- **In a Vehicle:** Being in a vehicle during severe thunderstorms is safer than being outside. However, drive to the closest secure shelter if there is sufficient time.


Staying Safe After a Thunderstorm

- **Stay Informed:** Continue listening to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay updated about severe thunderstorm watches and warnings. More severe thunderstorms could be headed your way.
- **Contact Your Family and Loved Ones:** Let your family and close friends know that you're okay, so they can help spread the word. Text messages or social media are more reliable forms of communication than phone calls.
- **Assess the Damage:** After you are sure the severe weather threat has ended, check your property for damages. When walking through storm damage, wear long pants, a long-sleeved shirt, and sturdy shoes. Contact local authorities if you see power lines down. Stay out of damaged buildings. Be aware of insurance scammers if your property has been damaged.
- **Help Your Neighbor:** If you come across people that are injured and you are properly trained, if needed, provide first aid to victims until emergency response team members arrive.

Public Safety Committee Meeting Recap

The Peninsula Public Safety and Regional Contract Law Committee met last week. The agenda packet for this and past meetings are available on the [City website](#). Here is a quick recap on important topics covered in the November 9, 2023 meeting:

- Los Angeles County Fire Department: Annual Inspection reports, emergency response times, and third quarter incident overview.
- Peninsula-wide emergency communication: a staff report was included in the agenda packet that goes into detail regarding each Peninsula city and its use of social media platforms, websites, Alert SouthBay, newsletters, and emergency messaging.
- Wildfire camera update from Jesse Villalpando, Emergency Services Coordinator from Rancho Palos Verdes.
- LiDAR/radar equipment purchase request: The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department (LASD) requested approval for the purchase of new handheld LiDAR/radar equipment with a camera function. Cost-sharing details were discussed, and the motion to approve the purchase was unanimously carried.
- Los Angeles County Sheriff: Traffic report and crime statistics were reported and are available in the agenda packet on the City website. Response times and concerns: On average, the emergency response times on the Peninsula are better than LASD's targets.
- Catalytic converter etching event: Staff provided an update on the July 2023 event, which resulted in the etching of 158 vehicles.

Consumer Price Index – October 2023

Consumer Price Index (U.S.)

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) was unchanged in the month of October after rising by 0.4% in September. Compared annually, all items CPI rose by 3.2% over the past 12 months. The CPI for all items less food and energy (core inflation) grew by 0.2% in the month of October, down slightly after rising by 0.3% in September. Core inflation increased by 4% as measured over the past 12 months ending October. Charts 1 and 2 below illustrate the monthly and yearly percent changes in CPI for both measures.

Chart 1. U.S. One-month Percent Change in CPI (seasonally adjusted)





Chart 2. U.S. 12-month Percent Change in CPI (not seasonally adjusted)

In summary, the index for shelter continued to rise in October, offsetting a decline in the gasoline index and resulting in no net change over the month. Indexes which increased in October include rent, motor vehicle insurance, medical care, recreation, and personal care. The indexes for lodging away from home, used cars and trucks, communication, and airline fares were among those that decreased over the month.

Consumer Price Index (Los Angeles)

Prices in the Los Angeles area, as measured by CPI, declined by 0.1% in October. On an annual basis, prices have advanced by 2.4% over the past 12 months. Core inflation declined by 0.2% in October and was up by 2.7% when measured annually.


Locally, the monthly decrease in October was primarily influenced by the recreation and shelter indexes. Annual changes in CPI include a 1.1% decline in energy prices largely attributed to a decrease in the price of gasoline. In contrast, food prices remained elevated, rising by 3% when compared to one year ago. The annual percentage changes in CPI for both indexes are illustrated in Chart 3 below.


Ladera Linda Community Park Project Update

Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) Meeting

The next TSC meeting will be conducted on November 27 at 6 p.m. The public is invited and encouraged to participate and provide input. The agenda will be available on the City's website at rpvca.gov/agendas by November 24 at 4:30 p.m.

The TSC agenda will consider the following items in the vicinity of the intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard at Eddinghill Drive/Seamount Drive:

- Consideration of left-turn arrow signal for the northbound and southbound approaches of Hawthorne Boulevard at Eddinghill Drive/Seamount Drive
- Consideration of no-right-on-red for Eddinghill Drive approaching Hawthorne Boulevard and for Seamount Drive approaching Hawthorne Boulevard
- Consideration of additional signs and pavement markings in the intersection area



Maintenance Activities

In addition to regularly scheduled maintenance and repairs, Public Works performed the following:

PARK MAINTENANCE

- Weekly landscape maintenance at all City parks
- Repaired six irrigation lines
- Secured and anchored several in-ground logs at Del Cerro Park
- Repaired the men's restroom at Hesse Park

STREET LANDSCAPING

On November 10, several City median trees located on Crest Road and Highridge Road were illegally cut. These trees were vandalized to where structural failure was imminent. For the safety of nearby motorists and the public, the trees were removed.
