**Construction is prohibited on December 25 (Christmas Day) and January 1 (New Year's Day)** unless a Special Construction Permit is approved by the Director of Community Development. Special Construction Permits must be requested at least 48 hours before any such work is to begin. [Permit details and application requirements \(PDF\)](#) are available on the City website

**Non-urgent code enforcement complaints** can be reported by completing a [complaint form](#) on the City website. Visit the [Code Enforcement Division page](#) for additional information. There will be no **trash collection** on Christmas Day and New Year's Day, and a one-day delay for the remainder of each week for all routes. There will be no **street sweeping** on Christmas Day and New Year's Day, and the fourth and first Monday routes will be performed the following day on December 26 and January 2, respectively.

**Parks** (except for Abalone Cove Park and all park buildings) will be open on Christmas Day and New Year's Day for their regular hours.

### PV Transit Offers Free New Year's Eve Bus Service

### **December 19, 2023, City Council Meeting Highlights**

Highlights from the December 19 City Council meeting:

- The Council voted to extend the City's local emergency declaration in the Portuguese Bend landslide complex through February 10, 2024.
- The City's geologist gave an update on ground movement, reporting continued and expanded activity. The accelerated movement is believed to be the result of the 2022-23 rainy season, which saw more than 200% of the historical average rainfall.
- Approximately 7 miles of trails have been closed in the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve due to land movement. City staff and Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy volunteers are prioritizing trail maintenance to repair fissures and erosion to keep as many trails within the landslide area open as possible.
- City staff gave an update on the next steps (Stage 2) for the proposed redevelopment of the Ken Dyda Civic Center, including soliciting proposals to bring on a project management firm and developing criteria for a design competition.
- SCE provided an update on its plan to address recurring power outages in the Grandview Estates neighborhood, including a circuitry project expected to be completed in the third quarter of 2024. SCE is being asked to return in February 2024.

- The Council adopted next year's Legislative Platform encompassing crucial areas such as landslide remediation, civic center planning, housing, public safety, community services, environmental quality, and government transparency.
- Key modifications from the 2023 platform include updates to priority projects, the inclusion of the Civic Center Master Plan, and public safety concerns related to hate incidents. Additionally, the platform opposes environmental pollutants, promotes collaborative housing solutions, underscores the importance of mental health resources, and supports regional considerations.

## Legislation Corner

On December 19, the City Council adopted the 2024 Legislative Platform.

On an annual basis, the City Council adopts a legislative platform to articulate policy stances, emphasize priority projects, and provide directives for both staff and lobbyists to actively monitor federal and state legislation for that calendar year. The collaborative development of the 2024 Legislative Platform drew input from the Legislative Subcommittee, the City's lobbyist, and Staff, building upon pre-existing goals.

This platform encompasses critical areas, including landslide remediation, civic center planning, housing, public safety, community services, environmental quality, and government transparency. Serving as a guiding document, the platform facilitates effective communication of legislative interests.

Notable modifications from the 2023 Platform include updates to priority projects, the inclusion of the Civic Center Master Plan as a priority project, and an emphasis on public safety concerns related to hate incidents. Furthermore, it expresses opposition to environmental pollutants, advocates for collaborative housing solutions, underscores the importance of mental health resources, and supports regional considerations.

## December 19, 2023 City Council Meeting

Last night, the City Council voted to extend the local emergency declaration that was put in place to bolster the City's response to accelerated movement in the landslide complex through February 10, 2024. The declaration must be renewed every 60 days to remain in effect. A moratorium on construction in the landslide complex is in place through October 2, 2024.

Last night's discussion included a presentation from the City's geologist, who reported observing continued and expanded ground movement. The accelerated activity is believed to be the result of the 2022-23 rainy season, which saw more than 200% of the historical average rainfall. The City is closely monitoring impacts from this week's storm and is on call to respond to any potential emergencies.

Within the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve, where about 7 miles of trails have been closed due to land movement, City staff and Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy volunteers are prioritizing trail maintenance to repair fissures and erosion to keep as many trails within the landslide area open as possible. ## Alert SouthBay Plans Regional Emergency Alert Test for January 9

Alert SouthBay, in coordination with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the [Integrated Public Alert and Warning System \(IPAWS\)](#), will conduct a test of the [Wireless Emergency Alert \(WEA\)](#) capability for the South Bay Region on Tuesday, January 9, 2024, at approximately 11:20 a.m. PST.



The regional test will consist of testing WEA and registered subscribers in the [Alert SouthBay Regional Program](#). Both are scheduled to begin on Tuesday, January 9, 2024, at approximately 11:20 a.m. PST.

The WEA portion of the test will be directed to consumer cell phones. While this is not the first test of the WEA system nationwide, it is the first test of the Alert SouthBay Regional System and its capability.

The test aims to ensure that the systems continue to be effective means of warning the public about emergencies.

The WEA portion of the test will be initiated using FEMA's Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS), a centralized internet-based system administered by FEMA that enables authorities to send authenticated emergency messages to the public through multiple communications networks. The WEA test will be issued via a code sent to cell phones.

All wireless phones should receive the message only once. The following can be expected from the regionwide WEA test:

- At approximately 11:20 a.m. PST, cell towers will broadcast the test for approximately 30 minutes. During this time, WEA-compatible wireless phones that are switched on, within range of an active cell tower, and in a geographic area where the wireless provider participates in WEA should be capable of receiving the test message.
- For consumers, the message on their phones will read: "THIS IS A TEST of the Alert SouthBay Regional Wireless Emergency Alert System. No action is needed. For information about this alert, please visit [www.alertsouthbay.com](http://www.alertsouthbay.com)"
- Phones with the main menu set to Spanish will display: "ESTA ES UNA PRUEBA del Sistema Regional de Alerta de Emergencia. No se necesita acción."
- Similar to when your phone receives an Amber Alert, the WEA alert tone is generally only played when the alert is initially received by the phone and, on some devices, stop as soon as the user clicks a button.
- If a phone is off before the test alert is sent and not turned back on until after the WEA Test expires (approximately 30 minutes), the phone should not get the test message.

WEA alerts are created and sent by authorized federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial government agencies through iPAWS to participating wireless providers, which deliver the alerts to compatible handsets in geo-targeted areas. To help ensure that these alerts are accessible to the entire public, including people with disabilities, a unique tone and vibration accompany the alerts.

# EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TIPS

## Give the Gift of Emergency Preparedness this Holiday Season

When shopping this holiday season, find a gift that truly shows those you love how much you care — the gift of preparedness. While an emergency kit may not be on any of the top 10 big-name gift lists this season, a starter kit could end up being the most important gift you give your friends and family this year. Most of us would love to be a little more prepared but have not made the time or don't know where to start. Often, just taking the first step toward getting prepared is the hardest part.

### IS YOUR VEHICLE WINTER READY?



### Build a Kit:

Help get your friends thinking emergency prep with a few key items to start their emergency kit. Pack items in a small plastic storage container or waterproof bag that can be stored easily. Be sure to include the following items:


- First aid kits
- Battery-powered or hand-crank National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) weather radios
- Flashlight or lantern with extra batteries
- Solar-powered cellphone chargers
- Combination smoke alarm and carbon monoxide detector
- Fire extinguishers
- Multipurpose tool or Swiss army knife
- Personal hygiene comfort kit: shampoo, body wash, washcloth, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.

## Emergency Kits for the Road:

For the car lovers or new drivers on your list, consider putting together a kit of [emergency supplies](#) they can keep in their car. While each type of natural disaster requires a unique strategy tailored to its severity and duration, the following items should be included in an emergency car kit.

- Flashlight, plus extra batteries (or a hand-crank flashlight)
- Jumper cables
- First aid kits
- Road flares or reflective warning triangles
- Blankets, mittens, socks, and hats
- Ice scraper and snow brush

For pets and pet lovers, remember to include pets in your emergency planning. Whether you are thinking of gifts for your furry friends or a gift for the pet lovers in your life, put together a gift of the following pet emergency kit items:



- Extra food and water for your pet, including extra water and a food bowl.
- Sturdy leash, harness, and carrier to transport pet safely. A carrier should be large enough for the animal to stand comfortably, turn around, and lie down. Your pet may have to stay in the carrier for several hours.
- A pet toy and a pet bed can easily be stored and taken if you are forced to evacuate. (Remember to always check with your local emergency shelters before a disaster to find out which shelters take in pets.)

## Make a Plan:

While exchanging preparedness gifts this holiday season, consider discussing your Family's emergency plans. A good place to begin emergency preparedness is by writing a family emergency plan. Your plan should include every member of your household and should consist of the following essential actions:

- **Identifying an out-of-state contact:** Identify someone outside of your community or state who can act as a central point of contact to help your household reconnect after a disaster.
- **Determining your evacuation routes:** Plan how you and your family will leave and where you will go if you are advised to evacuate. Once you've identified the most direct paths of exit from your home, neighborhood, and community, work to identify alternate routes of exit as well.
- **Knowing when and how to shut off utilities:** Utilities may be disrupted during a disaster. To minimize the chance of injury and property damage, you and your loved ones must know when utilities should be turned off, where to find the shut-off mechanism, and how to do so safely.
- **Know the emergency policies of schools and child care centers:** Have a plan to reconnect with kids at school or daycare. Talk to these places to see how they will communicate with families in an emergency if they have a shelter-in-place plan, where they will go if forced to evacuate, and how they plan to reunite you with your loved ones in an emergency.



# FINANCE DEPARTMENT

## FY 2022-23 Year-end Unaudited Financial Report

The Fiscal Year 2022-23 year-end unaudited financial report was submitted to the City Council at the meeting on December 19, 2023. Following fiscal year end, the City's Finance Department prepares this report to compare actual revenues and expenditures to previous estimates, with an emphasis on the General Fund.

Staff previously projected FY 2022-23 year-end revenues of approximately \$38 million and \$37 million, respectively. In comparison, the unaudited year-end results for the General Fund reflected total revenues of \$39 million and total expenditures of \$35 million, including transfers. These figures resulted in a net operating surplus of roughly \$4 million by year end and are summarized below.

Additionally, year-end figures increased the fund balance by almost \$3.1 million over previous estimates. This change stemmed from unaudited actual revenues exceeding year-end estimates by \$1.3 million and expenditures coming in at \$1.8 million below earlier projections. In total, the General Fund balance ended the year at \$34.8 million, an increase of almost \$3.5 million, or 11%, over year-end estimates. After accounting for the City Council's 50% Reserve Policy, purchase order carryovers, and continuing appropriations, the unrestricted fund balance came in at \$18.2 million.

### Ladera Linda Community Park Project Update

Last week, the construction contractor completed installation of the motorized window shades, countertop, sink in Classroom #2, and ceiling tiles. Crews also completed hydroseeding on sloped areas.

This week, the contractor is scheduled to work on patching around motors of the security roll-down doors, perimeter metal panels, access panels, wood trim, trim for fire sprinklers, and wiring for video projectors. Crews are also scheduled to complete interior painting and start programming lighting controls.

To help expedite the completion of the project, the City has authorized limited construction activities for Tuesday through Friday of next week.







### Geographic Information Systems (GIS) Discussion with PVNET Students

On December 14, Planning Division Staff participated in a discussion with PVNet students regarding the City's GIS programming. The discussion included an overview of software features and a high-level tutorial of navigational tools and informational layers. As part of the discussion, Staff outlined GIS application in the City's development review and permitting process. According to the PVNET website, PVNET is an accredited nonprofit 501(c)(3) that provides a wide range of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) based educational courses to students and adults.



### REMINDER – Use of Gas-Powered Blowers Prohibited

The City's Code Enforcement Division has received an uptick in the number of complaints regarding the use (§ 8.16.020 – Prohibited Use) of prohibited gas-powered weed and debris blowers in residential neighborhoods throughout the City. In response, the City's Code Enforcement Officers have proactively engaged those observed to be in violation of the City's ordinance by handing out [informational fliers](#) to gardeners, homeowners, and/or homeowners association (HOA) representatives. The City is seeking voluntary compliance through public outreach and education.

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (AQMD) has two programs that help improve air quality in the region through the replacement of gas-powered residential lawn mowers and commercial lawn and garden equipment available. The programs are available to eligible participants who work or reside within the South Coast AQMD four-county jurisdiction, which includes the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. ## 2024 Legislative Platform

### CITY OF RANCHO PALOS VERDES 2024 LEGISLATIVE PLATFORM

**DATE ADOPTED: Resolution No. 2023-62 on December 19, 2023.**

#### **PURPOSE**

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes' 2024 Legislative Platform (Platform) outlines the policy positions of the City Council on current issues which directly or indirectly impact the City. This Platform serves as a guideline to actively engage with pending legislation, with City Council approval.

The City looks forward to working with regional, state, and federal partners to best serve residents. The statements outlined in the Platform represent the City's overarching position on legislative and regulatory issues of interest.

#### **PRIORITY CITY PROJECTS**

Through the City's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), major projects are planned for a period of five years. The list below includes important projects of regional significance listed within the CIP that do not have sufficient funding. The City is in support of legislation, policies, programs, or administrative actions that would assist in funding these priority projects.

##### **A. Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Project**

**Total Cost:** \$33 million

**Status:** Environmental analysis and documentation

**Funds Committed:** \$2.3 million plus \$21.3 million eligible for FEMA's BRIC Grant  
The Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex (PBLC) is one of the largest active landslides in the continental United States, encompassing two of the City's roughly 14 square miles, directly impacting Palos Verdes Drive South, a major arterial street providing transportation for the wider region, including neighboring cities of Palos Verdes Estates, Rolling Hills, and the City of Los Angeles (San Pedro). Continued land movement poses a catastrophic environmental threat to the California coastline due to an above-ground sewer trunk line located adjacent to the Pacific Ocean at severe risk of rupture. The project seeks to protect life, public health, safety, and the environment through mitigation of land movement in the PBLC area.

### B. Civic Center Campus Master Plan

**Total Cost:** \$105.9 million

**Status:** Preliminary Conceptual Site Plan complete (Stage I). Moving into Master Plan Design Development Stage (Stage II)

**Funds Committed:** The approved financial plan for the project includes a maximum amount of \$45.4 million, which is a combination of both cash on hand and a long-term loan, with the opportunity to fund the funding gap through means, in no particular order, charitable donations (philanthropy), partnerships, lease revenue, and bonds. The development of the approximately 19-acre Civic Center Campus into a modern and functional community hub has been a long-standing goal of the city. The project's current preliminary conceptual site plan includes a new City Hall, parking improvements, a Council Chambers, improved site amenities including an amphitheater, village green, public plaza, and parking and access enhancements. The plan also includes the following public safety components: An emergency operations center, emergency supply storage and staging area, an emergency evacuation area, a helipad and helopod, a Sheriff drop-in station, and park ranger facilities.

- C. Support measures that provide funding to local agencies for training, effective disaster preparedness, law enforcement infrastructure, fire department infrastructure, and emergency planning.
- D. Support legislation, regulations, or administrative actions that ensure equal access to public safety funding, including contract cities.
- E. Support legislation which maintains law enforcement's ability to utilize automatic license plate reading (ALPR) cameras and/or other surveillance camera devices as a preventive and an investigative tool.
- F. Support legislation that provides tools to deter catalytic converter theft.
- G. Support legislation or other methods that provides tools to deter organized and serial retail theft.
- H. Support legislation to accelerate the development and implementation of enhanced electrical utility infrastructure, including the undergrounding of utility

equipment to ensure reliable utility service and public safety and thereby reduce the need for public safety power shutoffs.

- I. Support legislation or other methods that protects insurance coverage for properties within and adjacent to very high fire zones and geologic hazard abatement districts.
- J. Support legislation that increases the accountability of those responsible for the sale and distribution of fentanyl, public awareness of the crisis, resources to law enforcement to address the impacts and treatments and services for those addicted.

### 3. COMMUNITY SERVICES

- A. Support legislation and local, state, and federal programs that employ evidence-based strategies to reduce the number of unhoused people or individuals with housing insecurity; promoting mental health and substance abuse services; providing emergency and transitional housing; expanding permanent affordable housing; and promoting self-empowerment through counseling, job training, and other wrap around supportive services.
- B. Support legislation and local, state, and federal programs that aim to provide mental health services, including youth and young adult programs, community resource centers, and education in accessing mental health care.
- Potential Coalition Partners: Cal Cities, SBCCOG, CCCA, Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority, Los Angeles County, CARE Court, Allcove and Beach Bay Health District, Palos Verdes Peninsula cities, Palos Verdes Peninsula Unified School District

### 4. ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY

- A. Support legislation, regulations, or administrative actions to remediate the harmful effects of dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (DDT), Per-and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS), and other chemicals in coastal waters, especially near Santa Catalina Island and the Palos Verdes Peninsula.
- B. Support legislation that provides rebate programs, tax credits, and other financial incentives to encourage property owners to invest in water efficient systems and landscaping, and energy efficiency, including renewable energy systems.

### 5. GOVERNMENT TRANSPARENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS

- A. Support legislation that grants full cost reimbursement to local agencies by the state and federal government for all mandated programs.
- B. Support legislation that ensures the retention of existing local revenue sources, including the City's share of property taxes, sales and use taxes, transient occupancy taxes, etc.
- C. Support legislation modernizing the methods by which a local agency may comply with the Brown Act. Support legislation that allows for the continued use of teleconferencing platforms to hold hybrid public meetings outside of a declared state of emergency, thus increasing access to public meetings and promoting greater transparency.
- D. Support legislation which allows for regional considerations within Los Angeles County, particularly at the council of governments (COG) level, in relation to public health, homelessness, and sustainability, among other areas of regional significance.
- E. Oppose legislation that would prohibit or limit local governments' ability to contract out for the provision of services.
