Alert SouthBay Plans Regional Emergency Alert Test for January 9

Alert SouthBay, in coordination with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and FEMA's Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS), will conduct a test of the Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) capability for the South Bay Region on Tuesday, January 9, 2024, at approximately 11:20 a.m. PST.



The regional test will consist of testing WEA and registered subscribers in the Alert SouthBay Regional Program. The WEA portion of the test will be directed to consumer cell phones. While this is not the first test of the WEA system nationwide, it is the first test conducted by the Alert SouthBay Regional System and its capability.

The test aims to ensure that the systems continue to be an effective means of warning the public about emergencies taking place in the community and larger South Bay region.

The WEA portion of the test will be initiated using IPAWS, a centralized internet-based system administered by FEMA that enables authorities to send authenticated emergency messages to the public through multiple communications networks. The WEA test will be issued via a code sent to cell phones.

All wireless phones should receive the message only once. The following can be expected from the regionwide WEA test:

- At approximately 11:20 a.m. PST, cell towers will broadcast the test for approximately 30 minutes. During this time, WEA-compatible wireless phones that are turned on, within range of an active cell tower, and in a geographic area where the wireless provider participates in WEA should be capable of receiving the test message.
- For consumers, the message on their phones will read: "THIS IS A TEST of the Alert SouthBay Regional Wireless Emergency Alert System. No action is needed. For information about this alert, please visit www.alertsouthbay.com"

- Phones with the main menu set to Spanish will display: “ESTA ES UNA PRUEBA del Sistema Regional de Alerta de Emergencia. No se necesita acción.”
- Similar to when your phone receives an Amber Alert, the WEA alert tone is generally only played when the alert is initially received by the phone and, on some devices, stop as soon as the user clicks a button.
- If a phone is turned off before the test alert is sent and not turned back on until after the WEA Test expires (approximately 30 minutes), the phone should not get the test message.

WEA alerts are created and sent by authorized federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial government agencies through IPAWS to participating wireless providers, which deliver the alerts to compatible handsets in geographically-targeted areas. To help ensure that these alerts are accessible to the entire public, including people with disabilities, a unique tone and vibration will accompany the alerts.

L.A. County Rent Relief Program Accepting Applications through January 12

The Los Angeles County Department of Consumer and Business Affairs (DCBA) is now accepting applications for the [Los Angeles County Rent Relief Program](https://lacountyrentrelief.com). Spearheaded by the L.A. County Board of Supervisors and administered by The Center by Lendistry, the program will distribute over \$68 million in financial support to qualified landlords adversely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. To review eligibility requirements and apply for the L.A. County Rent Relief Program, visit lacountyrentrelief.com.

To ensure accessibility and ease throughout the application process, **the Rent Relief Call Center is open toll-free at (877) 849-0770** daily from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Free in-language technical assistance will be available in all county threshold languages. You can also learn more details at an upcoming event or webinar. Visit lacountyrentrelief.com for dates and times.

The Rent Relief Program will provide up to \$30,000 per rental unit to landlords for past-due rent and eligible expenses dating from April 1, 2022, to the present. The Program aims to curb tenant evictions and ensure the continued provision of housing.

DCBA has implemented a prioritized review process for the upcoming L.A. County Rent Relief Program applications. Applications submitted will be systematically evaluated, with priority given to those demonstrating the most substantial financial distress, those

catering to the most vulnerable tenants, and properties located in areas of highest need, as identified by the [L.A. County Equity Explorer Tool](#). Early submissions are strongly encouraged. Submission of a completed application does not guarantee funding.

The deadline to submit applications is January 12, 2024, at 11:59 p.m.



Legislation Corner

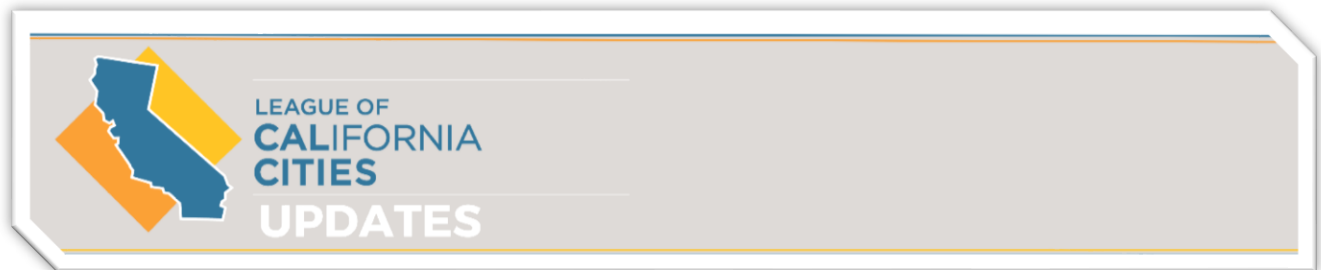
During the City Council meeting held on December 19, the City Council adopted the 2024 Legislative Platform. Annually, the City Council adopts a legislative platform to articulate policy stances, emphasize priority projects, and provide directives for both staff and lobbyists to actively monitor federal and state legislation.

The 2024 platform encompasses critical areas, including landslide remediation, civic center planning, housing, public safety, community services, environmental quality, and government transparency. The California legislature reconvened on January 3, 2024, and will begin hearings associated with proposed legislation next week. Residential Fire Insurance Advocacy Letter - Now Available on the City Website

Are you struggling to find adequate fire insurance for your home? In California, the increasing frequency and severity of wildfires have significantly impacted the residential fire insurance market. This has resulted in higher premiums, reduced coverage options, and in some cases, policy cancellations.

In RPV, these statewide challenges are evident, many residents have reported increased premiums and difficulty maintaining their fire insurance coverage. In response to these concerns, the City's Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC), in collaboration with City Staff, has developed a [comprehensive insurance resource letter \(PDF\)](#) (see attached letter).

This advocacy tool is tailored to help our residents and businesses communicate effectively with insurance providers. The letter highlights the extensive fire risk reduction efforts undertaken by the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and the Los Angeles County Fire Department, showcasing our commitment to minimizing fire hazards and enhancing community safety. This letter can be a powerful tool for you to advocate for maintaining your current insurance policies and potentially negotiating lower premiums. Are You Ready for the Next Big One? - Earthquake Preparedness Tips

Did you feel it? Monday morning's 4.1 magnitude earthquake occurred approximately 10 miles off the coast of Rancho Palos Verdes is a reminder to always be prepared. Earthquakes can happen at any time, often with little to no warning. You could be anywhere when an earthquake strikes: at home, at work, at school, or even on vacation. With Southern California deeply seated in "earthquake country," the City of Rancho Palos Verdes urges you and your family to always be prepared.

Here are a few tips to help you stay safe and be prepared for the aftermath of a major earthquake.

MyShake App

To receive advanced alerts seconds before a reported earthquake, download the state's MyShake App on your mobile devices available. Download on the App Store or Google Play sites.

PREPARE NOW

The key to surviving an earthquake and reducing your risk of injury lies in planning, preparing, and practicing what you and your loved ones will do when an earthquake occurs.

- [Make a supply kit that includes enough food and water for at least three days](#), 10 essential earthquake survival supplies
 - 💧 **Water for 3-10 days**
 - 🍲 **Food for 3-10 days**
 - 🩹 **First aid kit**
 - 🔦 **Flashlights**
 - 📻 **Radio**
 - 💊 **Medications**
 - 💰 **Cash and important documents**
 - 👟 **Clothing and sturdy shoes**
 - 🧰 **Tools**
 - 🧼 **Sanitation and hygiene supplies**
- [Practice Drop, Cover, and Hold On](#) with family and coworkers. Drop to your hands and knees. Cover your head and neck with your arms. Crawl only as far as needed to reach cover from falling materials. Hold on to any sturdy furniture until the shaking stops.
- [Secure items such as televisions and objects that hang on walls](#). Store heavy and breakable objects on low shelves.
- [Create a family emergency communication plan](#) that has an out-of-state contact.
- Plan where to meet if you get separated from your loved ones.

SURVIVE DURING



DROP! Wherever you are, drop down to your hands and knees and hold onto something sturdy. If you are using a wheelchair or walker with a seat, make sure your wheels are locked and remain seated until the shaking stops.



COVER! Cover your head and neck with your arms. If a sturdy table or desk is nearby, crawl underneath it for shelter. If no shelter is nearby, crawl next to an interior wall (away from windows). Stay on your knees or bent over to protect vital organs.



HOLD ON! If you are under a table or desk, hold on with one hand and be ready to move with it if it moves

- **IF YOU ARE INDOORS:** Stay there; do not run outside or inside your home since debris may fall and injure you. If able to do so, **DROP, COVER** and **HOLD ON**.
- **IF YOU ARE IN BED:** Stay in bed and turn face down and cover your head and neck with a pillow.
- **IF YOU ARE IN A VEHICLE:** Pull over and stop in a safe area away from buildings, trees, overpasses, underpasses, or utility wires. Make sure to set the parking brake so that the vehicle does not move during the shaking. Stay inside your vehicle until the shaking subsides.
- **IF YOU ARE OUTDOORS:** Move away from wires, buildings, and anything else that could fall and hurt you, but only if you can safely do so. Otherwise, stay where you are and **DROP, COVER,** and **HOLD ON** if able to do so.

BE SAFE AFTER

- Expect aftershocks to follow the largest shock of an earthquake sequence.
- Check yourself for injury.
 - Do not enter damaged buildings. If you are in a damaged building, go outside and quickly move away from the building. If you are trapped, send a text or bang on a pipe or wall. Cover your mouth for protection and instead of shouting, use a whistle.
 - If you are in an area that may experience tsunamis, go inland or to higher ground immediately after the shaking stops.
 - Save phone calls for emergencies.
 - Once you are safe, monitor local news reports via radio, television, social media, and cell phone text alerts for emergency information and instructions.

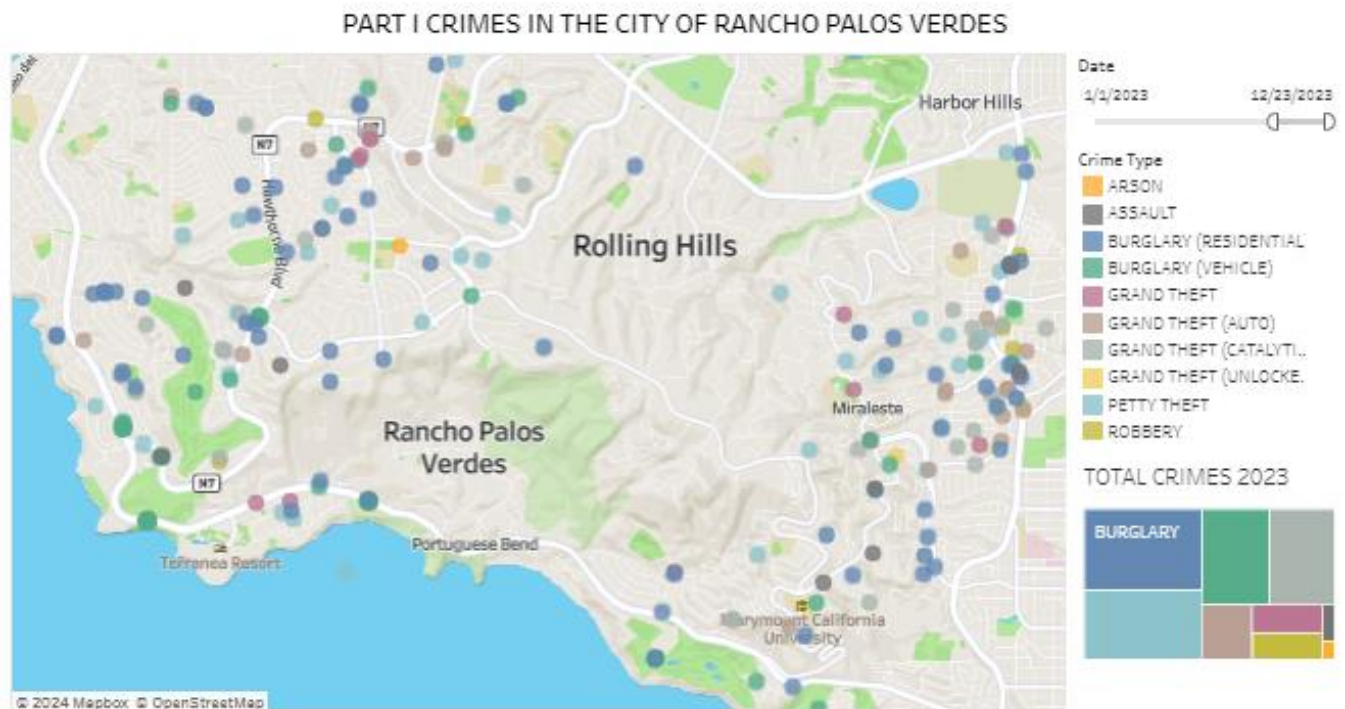


Weekly Crime Report Summaries

Remember, small actions collectively make a significant impact. Let's make 2024 a year of collective responsibility, fostering a safer and more secure environment for all!

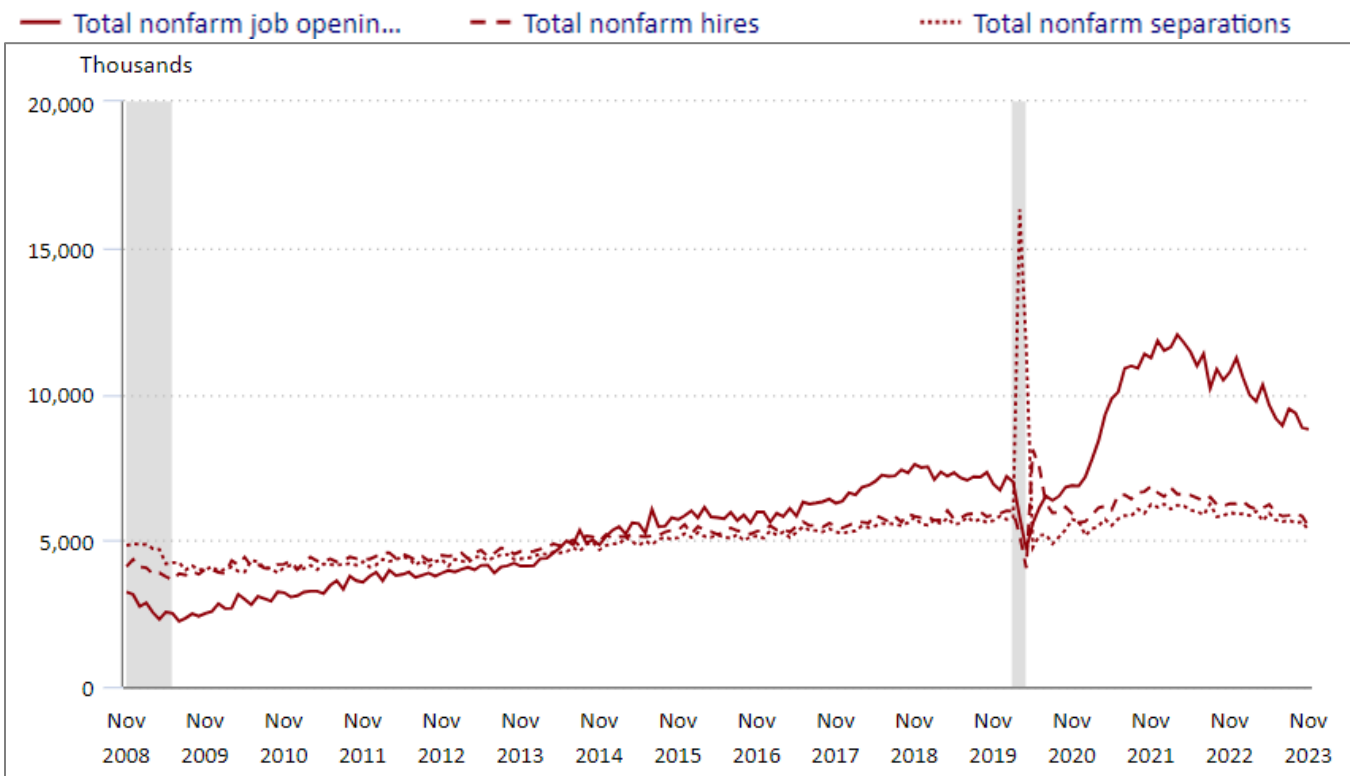

Job Openings and Labor Turnover – November 2023

Today, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) released the November data from the Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey (JOLTS). This monthly report estimates the number and rate of job openings, hires, and separations to provide insight into the labor market.

As reported, the number of job openings totaled 8.8 million for the month ending November, declining slightly below October’s figures. The job openings rate remained unchanged at 5.3% compared to October. Since November 2022, total job openings have declined by almost 2 million, or 1.2%. Additionally, the number of hires fell slightly to 5.5 million over the month. Total separations in November also decreased to 5.3 million. The chart below further illustrates these overall trends, which are indicative of a cooling labor market.

During 2023, the Public Works Department Completed the Following:

Ladera Linda Community Park Project Update

The construction contractor performed limited construction work Tuesday through Friday of last week to help expedite the completion of the project. Crews installed appliances in the kitchenette, electrical floor outlets, and exterior metal panels.

This week, the contractor is scheduled to program lighting controls, install finish cover plates for fire sprinklers, and complete casework shelving in storage areas.



Various final inspections have begun, and the construction crews will begin addressing corrections that are required.

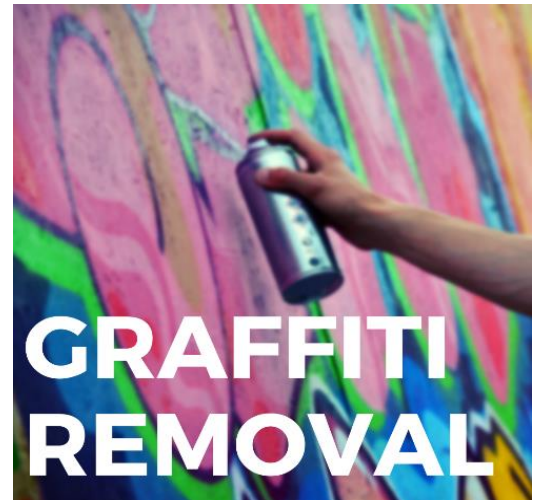

Planning Division Monthly Activity Report

Building and Safety Division Monthly Activity
