LADERA LINDA COMMUNITY PARK GRAND OPENING!

It's not every day the City opens a new park, in fact it's not every decade, so when it does happen it calls for a celebration. On February 23, hundreds of people celebrated the ribbon cutting of the Ladera Linda Community Park. Attendees enjoyed speeches, good food and company, self-guided tours of the facility, and so much more. After 10 years of planning, outreach, design, and construction, the brand new Ladera Linda Community Park was ready for its closeup.



But after the giant scissors are put away, the banners rolled up, and the speeches have faded into memory—what is left? The answer is something much bigger and more important than any talking point or celebration; the answer is a park that will be there for generations, proudly serving local residents, visitors, and the whole community just as the former school site and previous park each did for decades.

Attendees at the grand opening got a first taste of what park users will enjoy for years to come, namely a brand-new building, paddle tennis and basketball courts, a naturalistic playground, grass fields, and walking paths. You could see and hear the future sights and sounds of yoga and art classes, birthday parties, parents throwing frisbees to their children, dusky strolls along the walkway (6 laps equals a mile, btw), an elderly couple on a park bench enjoying a vibrant sunset, lively HOA meetings, scouts and school kids holding million-year old fossils, old friends and rivals playing paddle tennis for the first time in years, children quenching their thirst at a water fountain after clambering over faux rocks, three pointers whistling through the air, and so much more—so much more. A park is the community and the community is the park and the hills of Ladera Linda have never been prettier. Don't believe me? Come and see for yourself!

Thank you to all of the community members, staff, elected officials, consultants, and contractors who made this dream a reality.

LAND MOVEMENT UPDATE

The City continues to closely monitor the landslide complex and implement short-term mitigation measures to slow the movement and address its impacts, while working toward making progress on the long-term Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Project.

As we go through another heavy rainy season, keep in mind that it can take weeks or even months after rainfall for the land to shift. The City's geologist has expressed concerns about how recent record rainfall will further accelerate movement and impact infrastructure, especially roads, sewer lines, and water lines.

SPOTLIGHT ON LUKASZ BUCHWALD, IT MANAGER

Lukasz has been the IT Manager for the City of Rancho Palos Verdes since 2018. He took some time out of his busy schedule to answer some questions about current and future IT issues and challenges facing the City.

What does an IT Manager do?

In a small IT Division like ours, the IT Manager does a little bit of everything. It starts with managing and overseeing the strategy of the Information Technology program for the City, but also includes troubleshooting hardware issues or moving equipment when needed. Despite its relatively small size, our City has a complex IT infrastructure that has to be maintained, monitored, and kept secure.

Tell our readers about your background and what led you to the IT field.

I got my first computer when I was 14 (a sweet 486DX4-100 with 4 MB of RAM!) and right then I knew that this was what I wanted to do. I spent a lot

of time playing with it and upgrading and repairing the hardware. I fell in love with technology early and always wanted to learn more. I remember skipping church every Sunday in the early 1990s and going to my friend's house to browse the dial-up Internet. After high school, I got my master's degree in information science and the rest is history!

IT is a big and evolving field. What skills and personal qualities does an IT Manager need to be successful in such a dynamic and rapidly expanding arena?

The IT field has experienced exponential growth since the early days. Back then, an experienced IT

Members of the YAC serve either a one-year term if they're transitioning between middle and high school or are graduating seniors, or a two-year term for all other members. 

- In an emergency, check the zone map at PVPreddy.gov to see if your zone is under a shelter-in-place or evacuation order.



TAKE YOUR FOOT OFF THE GAS-GAS POWERED LEAF BLOWERS THAT IS!

Gas-powered weed and debris blowers have been prohibited in all residential neighborhoods in RPV since 2019.

Only standard electric-powered blowers — hand-held, corded, and cordless — are allowed.

Using a blower to blow cuttings, refuse, or debris onto a neighboring property or into a street, gutter, or drain is also prohibited.

The City is not issuing citations for violations, but is requesting voluntary compliance.

The use of electric-powered blowers is permitted:

- Monday – Friday between 8 am – 5 pm.
- Saturdays between 9 am – 4 pm

The use of electric-powered blowers is NOT permitted on Sundays or legal holidays.

- For urgent matters or observation of any sudden shifts on your property, please call 9-1-1.

About 8 miles of trails in the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve remain temporarily closed at the recommendation of the City's geologist. We ask members of the public to please stay off trails that have been closed, and we thank them for their patience and cooperation. In hiking areas that remain open to the public, our Park Rangers continue to monitor trail conditions for public safety, perform maintenance, and fill fissures. Check rpvca.gov/trailalerts for the latest trail updates, including anticipated rain-related closures.

The City's webpage for all things related to the landslide complex, rpvca.gov/landmovement, has a new look. The redesigned webpage is easier to read and navigate, with an expanded FAQs section and an embedded search box for the landslide GIS map. This one-stop shop is where you can find the latest news, plus landslide survey data, background information, updates from the RPV Landslide Complex Working Group, and information on how to get in touch with the City. SOMEONE'S GOT TO TAKE OUT THE TRASH SPRING TRASH COLLECTION SCHEDULE



March and April 2024:
No Changes.

May 2024: No service on Memorial Day-May 27. Services for all routes (Monday through Friday) will be delayed by one day.

June 2024: No changes.

The City's Municipal Code (Section 8.20.330) has regulations on when trash, recycling and green waste carts can be left at the curb for collection. Carts can be placed at the curb after 4 pm the day

before collection day and empty carts must be removed no later than 10 pm on collection day. Empty carts cannot be left on the street overnight. Containers have to be stored on the side or back of the property, at a location that is substantially screened from view. Please help keep your neighborhood attractive and aesthetically pleasing.

BACKYARD SERVICE: EDCO provides backyard service to customers at an additional monthly charge. If you have temporary or permanent physical or medical limitations or travel frequently, call EDCO and inquire about this service. Questions? Call EDCO at 310.540.2977 or www.rpvrecycles.com. Leave all containers at the curb no later than 7 am on collection day.

NOT A SHRED OF WASTE! FREE DOCUMENT SHREDDING AND ELECTRONIC WASTE EVENT



Want to free up space in your garage? Bring your personal and private documents and unwanted electronics such as TVs, computer monitors, CPS, printers and DVD players to the upcoming Document Shred and E-waste Event on **Saturday, April 6** at the Ken Dyda Civic Center (RPV City Hall) in the overflow parking lot, 30940 Hawthorne Blvd., from 8 am to 11 am.

Certified shredding trucks will be on-site during this event. No household hazardous waste material (e.g., no paint, no fluorescent light bulbs, etc.) will be accepted. Love gardening? Free compost will be available to residents while supplies last. This is a self-service and self-haul event. Please bring your own trashcans or sturdy yard bags, gloves and a shovel. Limit of 3 cans/bags per vehicle. If you plan to haul your compost in an open truck or trailer, please remember to bring a tarp to cover your material.
