

CHOA Meets in New Ladera Linda Community Center

Last week, Councilmember Dave Bradley and City Manager Ara Mihranian participated in the Rancho Palos Verdes Council of Homeowners Associations' (CHOA) membership meeting at Ladera Linda Community Park. Organized in 1979, CHOAs mission is to

provide a forum to discuss and debate important issues affecting the City of Rancho Palos Verdes as well as its members, and to speak with one voice when influencing is appropriate.

The event on March 20 was CHOA's first membership meeting of 2024 and the first meeting ever held in the brand-new community center building. Councilmember Bradley and City Manager Mihranian joined Los Angeles County Supervisor Janice Hahn, the CHOA Board of Directors, local HOAs, and residents to discuss the Portuguese Bend Landslide complex and other priorities in RPV. Thank you, CHOA, for giving the City the opportunity to participate in this informative community event.

April 2 City Council Meeting Canceled

The April 2 City Council meeting has been canceled due to lack of quorum. The next meeting date is April 16.

Land Movement Update

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes remains laser-focused on remediating accelerated movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide complex with short- and long-term solutions.

At its most recent meeting on March 19, the City Council approved two new dewatering hydraugers (consisting of 5 arrays each) to be installed as an emergency measure to remove water that is trapped underground and contributing to movement. One hydrauger will be installed near Burma Road at the north end of the landslide complex, and the other will be installed along Palos Verdes Drive South on the south end in the turnout area formerly known as “Gateway Park.”

The Council also extended RPV’s local emergency declaration and voted to explore ways the City can provide assistance to the Abalone Cove Landslide Abatement District (ACLAD) and Klondike Canyon Landslide Abatement District (KCLAD) for their landslide stabilization efforts, such as no-interest loans, grants, and/or in-kind services.

The Council was set to consider a construction contract for the emergency wells on April 2, but the meeting has been canceled due to a lack of quorum. This will not delay emergency work, as the City Manager has authority under RPV’s local emergency declaration to sign contracts for emergency work that can be later ratified by the Council. No contracts have been signed at this time, as plans for the emergency dewatering hydraugers are still being finalized. The City Council will consider these items at its meeting on April 16.

Staff continues to work toward completion of the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the long-term Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Project, which is expected to be released in the coming weeks before going to the City Council for certification.

Palos Verdes Drive South Roadwork

Roadway repairs began last week along Palos Verdes Drive South in the landslide area and will continue through March 29. City Staff is planning a more substantial project to regrade the steep dip between Narcissa and Peppertree Drives known as the “ski jump.” This work will require a temporary closure of Palos Verdes Drive South, which the City aims to keep to a minimum to limit disruptions, as the road is used by 15,000 vehicles daily. Construction details, including a timeline and detours, will be provided as soon as they are available and shared widely to give commuters advance notice.

Gov. Newsom Requests Federal Disaster Declaration for L.A. County

On March 22, Gov. Newsom [announced he has requested](#) President Biden declare a federal disaster in response to February's storms in several counties, including Los Angeles. If the federal disaster is declared, the City could potentially utilize federal resources and funding to respond to the landslide. Staff is closely monitoring updates.



For courses sponsored by the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club, students thru grade 12 who pass their examination at a PVARC VE test session will, upon application to the Club, be eligible for reimbursement up to a maximum of \$85 to cover the cost of materials and the examination fee.

Everyone who obtains their first ham radio license through a PVARC VE test session, regardless of age, will receive a free membership in the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club for the remainder of the current calendar year.



California Tsunami Preparedness Week

March 23-31 is 2024 California Tsunami Preparedness Week. The City encourages beachgoers, visitors, and residents who live near the City's coastline to practice tsunami awareness by accessing life-saving preparedness information to support California's Tsunami Preparedness Week — a statewide campaign.

Everyone who lives, works, or plays near the coastline should know how to protect themselves from a tsunami. Tsunamis are large ocean waves generated by major local or distant earthquakes or major landslides in the ocean. Ocean waves, ranging from



several feet or much larger, can strike the coast with devastating force. Tsunamis can occur here in Southern California and impact the Peninsula and surrounding cities.

Tsunami Hazard Area maps available on the [state's tsunami website](#) illustrate how a tsunami could impact our coastline using new data and modeling developed over the past ten years, using lessons learned from the 2011 Tōhoku region event coupled with new tsunami hazard information and mapping tools. Easy-to-use [interactive web applications](#) now reflect that some areas of our coastline may have a higher tsunami hazard than previously represented in prior hazard maps.

Tsunamis can be catastrophic in the short and long term, affecting millions of people over wide geographical areas up to thousands of miles away from the source. Any member of the public can take these immediate preparedness steps to keep themselves, their families, and loved ones safe in the event of a tsunami:

- Take a “tsunami walk” with your family, friends, and loved ones; [get to know your zone](#) and be alert when at work, home or playing near the ocean.
- Create a personal tsunami evacuation plan. For more information on individual tsunami hazards and preparations, review the [California Tsunami Preparedness Guide](#), which explains how you can be tsunami ready.
- Next time you visit a local beach area for fun, work, or exercise, be on the lookout for local tsunami preparedness signage and identify a safe evacuation area and evacuation routes to get to higher ground quickly.
- Network with your neighbors prior to an emergency. Work together to help horse/large pet owners on your street who do not have horse trailers or who are not home during an emergency.
- Sign up for Alert SouthBay: Alert SouthBay is a multi-jurisdictional emergency notification system used by 13 South Bay cities — including Rancho Palos Verdes — to keep our communities informed about disasters and emergencies

Family Emergency Planning

Some disasters strike without any warning, and family members may not all be in the same place. How will you get in touch with each other? Where will you meet? How will you get out of your house in case of a fire? What if your neighborhood is being evacuated? It's important to make a plan now so that you will know what to do, how to find each other, and how to communicate in an emergency.

Here are a few easy steps to start your family's emergency planning:

- [Make a plan:](#) A good place to begin emergency preparedness is by writing a family emergency plan. Your family may not be together if a disaster strikes, so it is important to talk to your friends and family about how you will communicate before, during, and after a disaster. Your plan should include every member of your household, including pets. Be sure to establish a family meeting place that's familiar and easy to find.

- **Make a kit:** A disaster supply kit is any pre-assembled group of items that will improve the health and safety of your family during a disaster. Gather supplies that will last for several days after a disaster for everyone living in your home.

At a minimum, your emergency supplies should include these 10 essential items:

- Water for 3-10 days (1 gallon per person per day)
- Food for 3-10 days (including pet food)
- First aid kit and instructions
- Flashlights (and extra batteries)
- Radio (and extra batteries)
- Medications (prescription and non-prescription)
- Cash and important documents (small bills and coins, birth certificates, tax returns, deeds, titles, insurance papers, medical cards)
- Clothing and sturdy shoes
- Tools (wrench, duct tape, fire extinguisher, sturdy gloves, whistle)
- Sanitation and hygiene supplies
- **Be informed:** It is important to know what disasters and hazards could affect your area, how to get emergency alerts, and where you would go if you and your family need to evacuate. Make sure your family has a plan and practices it often.
 - Learn about natural hazards that may affect the City by reading our recently adopted and FEMA - approved [Local Hazard Mitigation Plan](#).
 - **Register for emergency notifications from Alert SouthBay:** Alert SouthBay is the City's primary vehicle for emergency communications. Users can sign up for Alert SouthBay emergency alerts by texting "alerts" to 888-777.



Spring Break Safety Tips to Protect Your Home During Spring Break

- Secure doors and windows:** Before leaving, double-check that all doors and windows are locked securely. Consider installing deadbolts or additional locks for added security.
- Set up timers:** Use timers for lights to give the illusion that someone is home, deterring potential burglars.



- 3. Inform trusted neighbors:** Let your neighbors know you will be away and ask them to keep an eye on your property. They can also collect any mail or packages to prevent buildup.
- 4. Avoid social media updates:** Resist the urge to post about your vacation plans on social media until after you return. Broadcasting your absence can make your home a target for break-ins.
- 5. Don't hide spare keys:** Avoid leaving spare keys under doormats or flowerpots. Instead, give a spare key to a trusted neighbor or friend.
- 6. Consider security cameras:** Install outdoor security cameras to monitor activity around your property. Many modern systems allow you to check footage remotely via smartphone apps. Visit the City Website for more information on the [Vacation Loaner Camera Program](#).
- 7. Stop all deliveries:** Suspend newspaper, mail, package, and other regular deliveries or arrange for a neighbor to collect them. An accumulation of packages can signal an empty house.
- 8. Maintain your yard:** Keep your lawn mowed and trimmed to maintain the appearance of an occupied home.
- 9. Be mindful of trash disposal:** Don't leave empty boxes from expensive purchases outside your home. Break them down and dispose of them discreetly to avoid advertising valuable items.
- 10. Home security system:** Consider installing a home security system with monitoring services for added peace of mind. Visit the City website to learn more about the [Public Safety Reimbursement Program](#), which provides 50% reimbursement up to \$100 for an individual or \$2,000 for a neighborhood camera system.


Public Right-of-Way/Roadway Repairs



From April 8-13, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes will conduct an annual peafowl census to assess the current peafowl population throughout six City Council-approved neighborhoods, including:

- Crestridge
- Grandview
- Monaco
- Portuguese Bend
- Sunnyside Ridge
- Vista Grande



The census is conducted on two types of observations, counting roosting peafowl in trees at sunrise, and using a systematic grid pattern in the early evening hours. The results of the census will be reported to the City Council to determine if the City will reinstate trapping for the 2024 season. 




