RPV Highlights Use of AI at 24th Annual SBCCOG General Assembly

Last week, Mayor John Cruikshank, City Manager Ara Mhuranian and Staff attended the South Bay Cities Council of Governments' 24th Annual General Assembly in Carson, where this year's theme was, "Artificial Intelligence: Friend or Foe for the South Bay?"

The General Assembly is an opportunity for the region's thought leaders to gather, share ideas and discuss important issues. This year's event explored what artificial intelligence (AI)/generative AI is, the types of applications that could benefit cities, as well as red flags.

RPV's Emergency Preparedness and Public Safety Divisions hosted a booth highlighting the City's use of AI via the Pano AI wildfire detection camera network and automated license plate-reading (ALPR) cameras on the Peninsula used by the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.



RPV had the opportunity to network and interact with officials from cities and stakeholders throughout the region, including UCLA South Bay (pictured above).

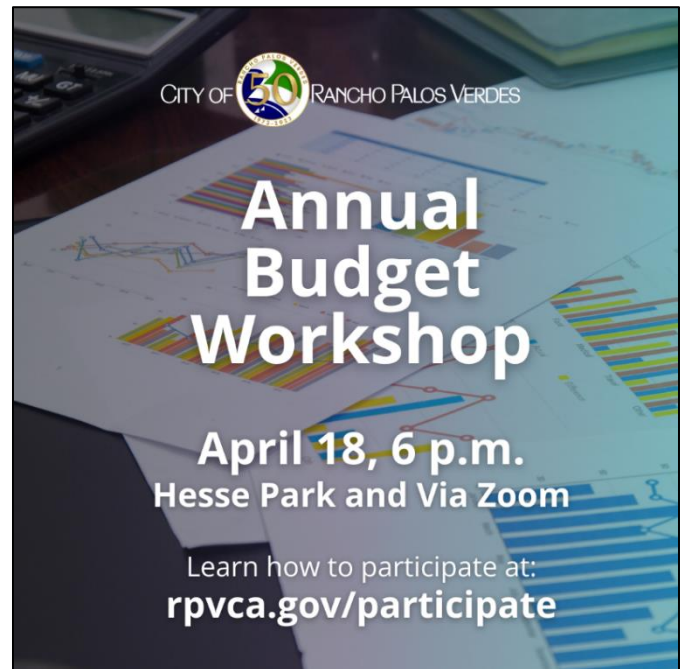
Annual Budget Workshop April 18

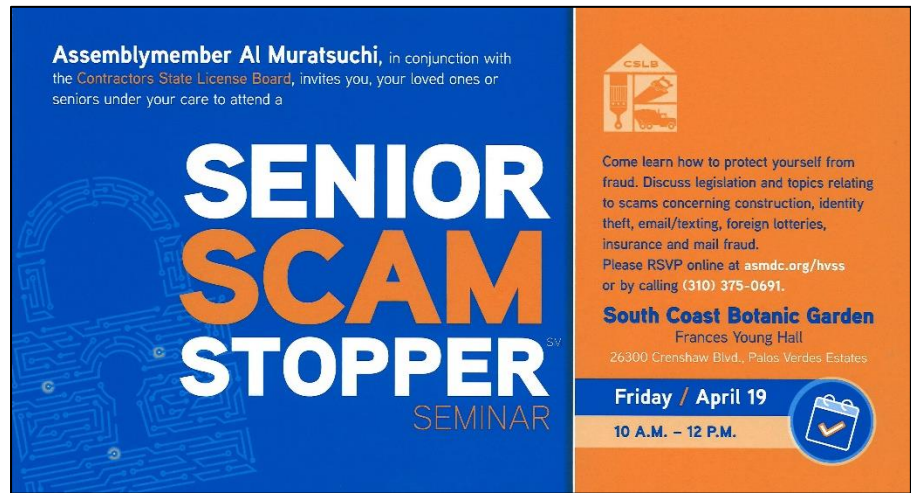

For courses sponsored by the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club, students thru grade 12 who pass their examination at a PVARC VE test session will, upon application to the Club, be eligible for reimbursement up to a maximum of \$85 to cover the cost of materials and the examination fee.

Everyone who obtains their first ham radio license through a PVARC VE test session, regardless of age, will receive a free membership in the Palos Verdes Amateur Radio Club for the remainder of the current calendar year.

April is Earthquake Preparedness Month. Are you ready?

Did you know that April is National Earthquake Preparedness Month? It is important to think about what you will do to protect yourself, wherever you are when the earth begins to shake. Disasters can strike at any time and we must always be prepared. However, the time to start thinking about what to do in an emergency is before it happens.

By following some simple guidelines, you can help prepare your family, neighborhood, business, or school to be better prepared and self-sufficient after the next disaster.

Have a plan: Create a family emergency communications plan with an out-of-state contact. Establish a family meeting place that is familiar and easy to find.

⇒ **Keep supplies:** Gather supplies that will last for several days after a disaster for everyone living in your home. Don't forget to consider the unique needs each person or pet may have in case you have to evacuate quickly. **At a minimum, your emergency supplies should include these 10 essential items:**

- ☐ Water for 3-10 days (1 gallon per person per day)
- ☐ Food for 3-10 days (including pet food)
- ☐ First aid kit and instructions
- ☐ Flashlights (and spare batteries)
- ☐ Radio (and extra batteries)
- ☐ Medications
- ☐ Cash and important documents
- ☐ Clothing and sturdy shoes
- ☐ Tools (wrench, duct tape, fire extinguisher, sturdy gloves, whistle)
- ☐ Sanitation and hygiene supplies

⇒ **Practice drop, cover, and hold on:** Get prepared for an earthquake before it happens by practicing DROP, COVER, and HOLD ON.



DROP where you are, onto your hands and knees. This position protects you from being knocked down and also allows you to stay low and crawl to shelter if nearby.



COVER Cover your head and neck with your arms. If a sturdy table or desk is nearby, crawl underneath it for shelter. If no shelter is nearby, crawl next to an interior wall (away from windows). Stay on your knees or bent over to protect vital organs.



HOLD ON If you are under a table or desk, hold on with one hand and be ready to move with it if it moves. If seated and unable to drop to the floor, bend forward, cover your head with your arms and hold on to your neck with both hands.

⇒ **Be informed:** Know what disasters and hazards could affect your area, how to get emergency alerts, and where you would go if you and your family need to evacuate. Make sure your family has a plan and practices it often.

- **Learn about natural hazards that may affect the City** by reading our recently adopted and FEMA approved [Local Hazard Mitigation Plan \(PDF\)](#).
- **Register for emergency notifications from Alert SouthBay.** Alert SouthBay is the City's primary vehicle for emergency communications. Sign up for Alert SouthBay emergency alerts by texting "alertsb" to 888-777
- Be sure to stay connected and get updates from the City by following RPV on [Nextdoor](#), [Facebook](#), [Twitter](#), and [Instagram](#).












⇒ **Get involved:** After preparing yourself and your family for possible emergencies, take the next step and get involved in preparing your community.

- Become a member of the [Palos Verdes Peninsula Community Emergency Response \(CERT\) Team](#) and get trained on basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.
- During a disaster, donate to a reputable organization of your choice through the [National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disasters \(NVOAD\)](#), and volunteer to respond to disasters and help your community.


- Promote preparedness online by sharing preparedness tips on your social media account with [Ready.gov's online social media toolkit](#) or [public service announcements](#).
- Take a free online independent study course through [the Federal Emergency Management Agency's \(FEMA\) Emergency Management Institute](#) and gain more knowledge to help your community become more prepared.

Job Openings and Labor Turnover (JOLTS) – February 2024

On April 2, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that the number of job openings changed little at 8.8 million on the last business day of February. The number of hires and separations totaled 5.8 million and 5.6 million, respectively. A summary of the latest release is provided below.

Job Openings

- The 8.8 million job openings figure is down by 12% year-over-year and marks a notable decline from the high of 12.2 million measured in March 2022.
- Job openings increased in finance and insurance, state and local government

(excluding education), and in arts, entertainment, and recreation.

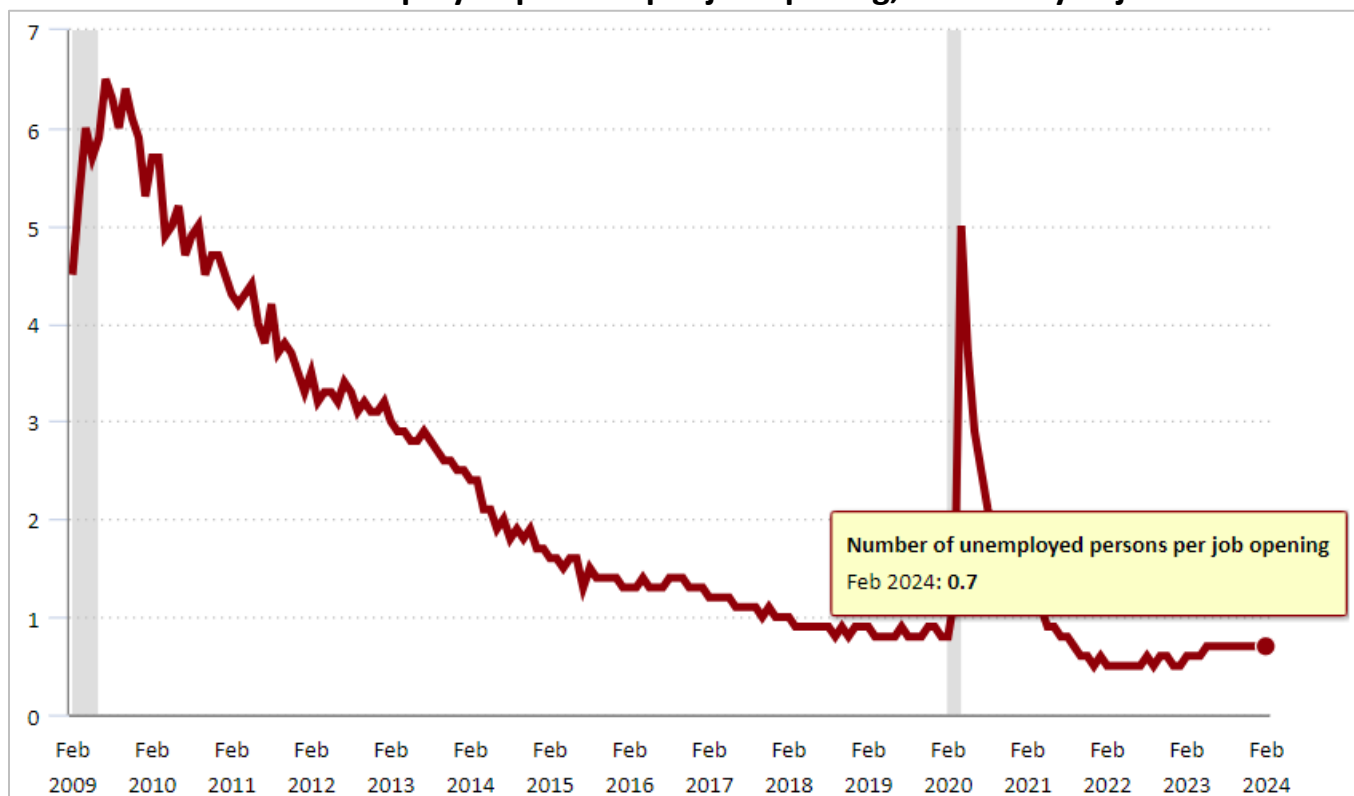
- Notable job decreases occurred in information and in federal government.

Hires and Separations

- The total number of hires in February fell slightly to 5.8 million, a decrease of 240,000, or 4% compared to February 2023.
- The total number of separations in February fell slightly to 5.6 million, a decrease of 274,000, or 5% compared to February 2023.
- Total separations include quits, layoffs and discharges, and other separations.

As a result of the current labor market activity, the ratio of unemployed persons to job openings rose to 0.7 as of February.

The Goats Are Back for the 2024 Fuel Modification Season

Goats are back to perform the important job of helping reduce fire loads and protecting homes. Although we understand many people enjoy seeing the goats, please refrain from going to see them out of respect for residents living near where the goats work.



A temporary electrified fence is used to contain the goats while they are working and attempting to approach them puts you as well as the goats at risk. Please avoid attempting to take selfies/pictures or touch the goats, especially if you have dogs or pets with you. This will prevent stress and/or injury to you and the goats.

In addition to the goats, you may see Stay Green crews performing brush clearance in various areas of the City as part of the City's 2024 fuel modification program.

Our next paper/document shredding event will be on April 6 from 8-11 a.m. The event will be held at the Ken Dyda Civic Center overflow parking lot and will be free to all Rancho Palos Verdes residents. During the event, electronic waste will be collected for recycling, and mulch will be available to residents.

The spring season brush clearing event begins on Saturday, April 6, and will continue for four consecutive Saturdays. Each week, a different area of RPV is serviced. The goal of the event is to assist homeowners dispose (free of charge) excess brush, shrubs, hedges, tree branches, and bushes to comply with the Los Angeles County Fire Department's fire safety guidelines. 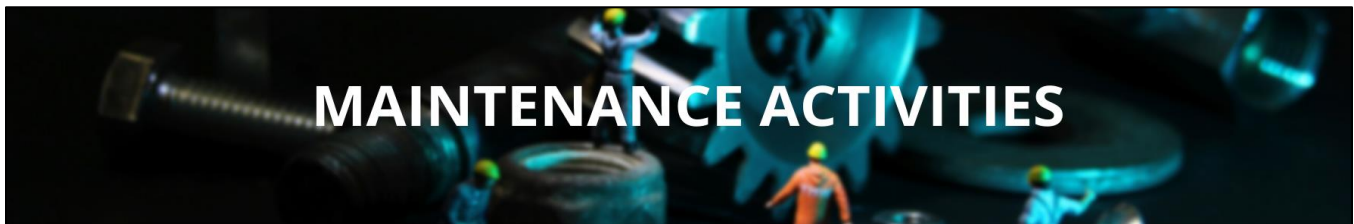

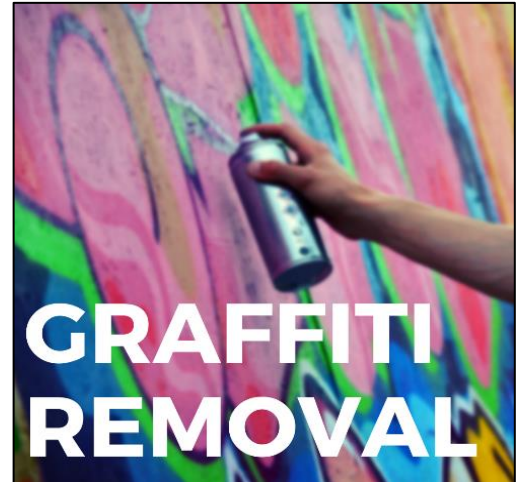
Public Right-of-Way/Roadway Repairs

- In preparation for regular rain events, maintenance crews have been routinely performing the following:
 - Clearing and cleaning out storm drains.
 - Placing sandbags in various locations to prevent and reduce the likelihood of flooding and water damage.
 - Placing tarps to protect high priority landslide fissure areas from rain.
- Prepped the area near Exultant Drive and Dauntless Drive for the latest storm cell.
- Repaired and patched the asphalt on Palos Verdes Drive South near Wayfarers Chapel.



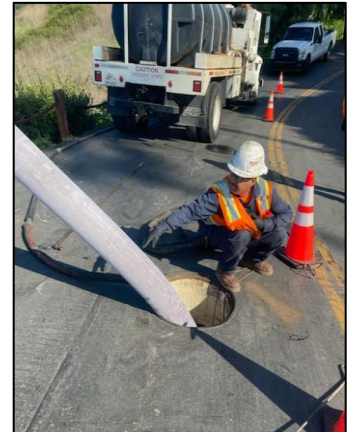
Graffiti Removal

- **Forty** graffiti incidents were reported and removed this week.
- The RPV graffiti reporting app can be downloaded for Android and Apple devices under the name of **RPV Clean**. Residents can help keep RPV looking great by downloading the app and reporting graffiti.



Emergency Response

- On March 27, crews repaired 400 feet of sewer pipe on Narcissa Drive which was compromised due to land movement in Portuguese Bend. The Public Works team worked with its contractors to get the section replaced. There were no interruptions to services.



- On March 31, Los Angeles County Fire Department reported a suspicious 10-gallon container of liquid left at Pelican Cove. Public Works responded and had environmental vendors properly dispose of the item.

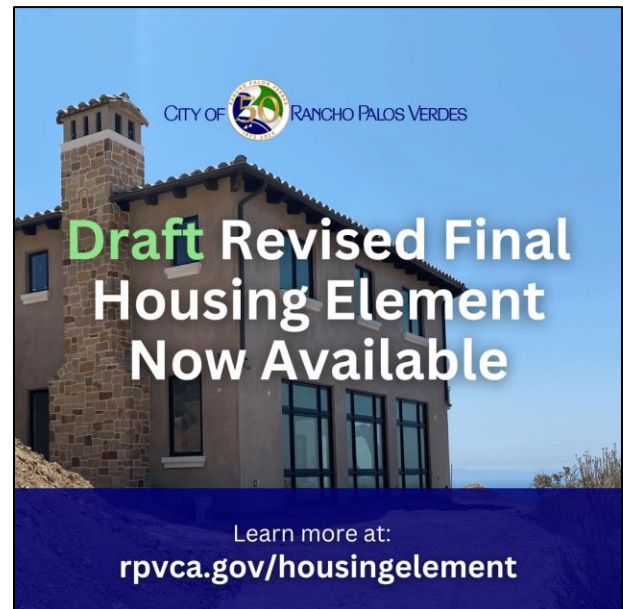

On April 23, the Planning Commission will consider an update to the City's Antenna Code (on private property), which includes a proposal to repeal Section 17.76.020 (Antennas) of Chapter 17.76 (Miscellaneous Permits and Standards) of Title 17 (Zoning) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code and replace it with Chapter 17.85 (Wireless Telecommunications Facilities on Private Property) and Chapter 17.87 (Amateur Radio Facilities and Over-the-Air Reception Devices). This update is being proposed to bring the City's Antenna code into compliance with federal telecommunications law. On April 4, a [public notice \(PDF\)](#) will be published regarding this proposed Code Amendment. 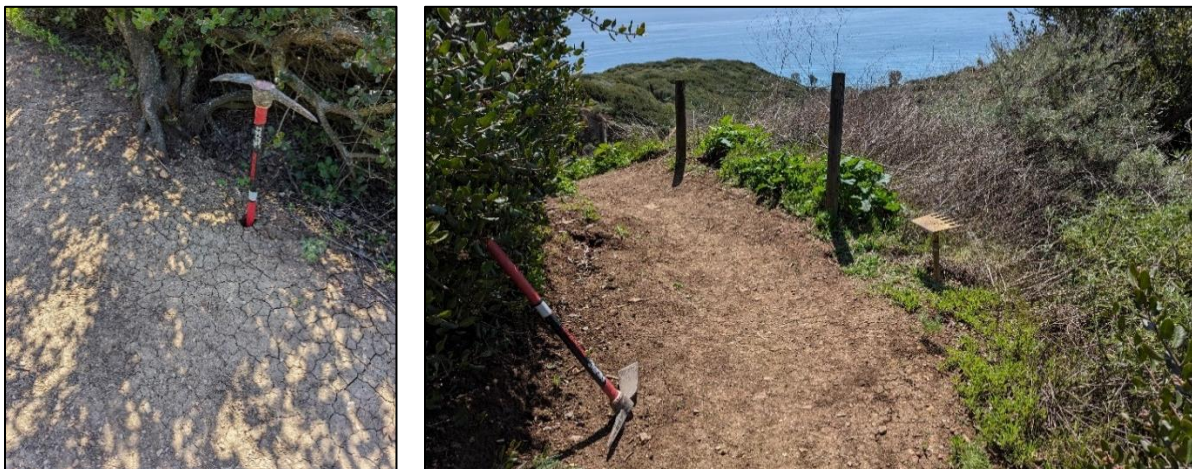

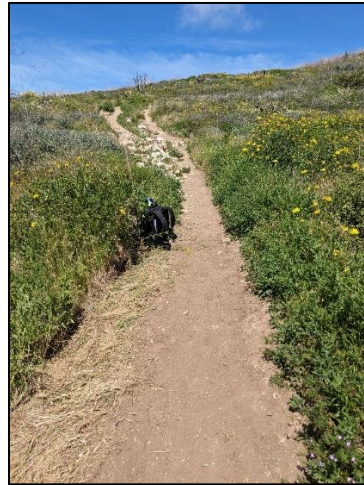

(2) Prior to removing an individual, the presiding member or their designee shall warn the individual that their behavior is disrupting the meeting and that their failure to cease their behavior may result in their removal. The presiding member or their designee may then remove the individual if they do not promptly cease their disruptive behavior. This paragraph does not apply to any behavior described in subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b)(1) means engaging in behavior during a meeting of a legislative body that actually disrupts, disturbs, impedes, or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting and includes, but is not limited to, one of the following: (A) A failure to comply with reasonable and lawful regulations adopted by a legislative body pursuant to Section 54954.3 or any other law. (B) Engaging in behavior that constitutes use of force or a true threat of force.(2) "True threat of force" means a threat that has sufficient indicia of intent and seriousness, that a reasonable observer would perceive it to be an actual threat to use force by the person making the threat.

Time Estimates:

The time noted next to an agenda item is only an estimate of the amount of time that will be spent during the meeting on that particular item. Accordingly, these estimates should not be relied on in determining when a matter will be heard, especially since agenda items are often re-ordered during a meeting and may be discussed at any time.
