Last week, Mayor John Cruikshank and Councilmember Dave Bradley joined Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi and other Peninsula leaders at a press conference

marking the installation of the Peninsula-wide network of wildfire detection cameras as we head into the fire-prone summer months.

The press conference was held at the Ken Dyda Civic Center beneath one of four sets of high-mounted, 360-degree Pano AI cameras that make up the network, which is nearly complete. Other camera stations at key vantage points covering the Peninsula include the rooftop of Terranea Resort and a monopole on Lomita Boulevard near Hawthorne Boulevard in Torrance. The fourth camera station on San Pedro Hill is expected to be installed in late August.

Supported by artificial intelligence, the ultra-high-definition cameras continuously scan the landscape to spot, evaluate, and signal wildfire activity within a 15-mile radius so first responders can be alerted to a brush fire as early as possible.

The camera network was made possible thanks to a \$1.5 million state budget allocation secured by Assemblymember Muratsuchi. The project was led by the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and will cost \$700,000 for the first five years of operation. Virtually the entire Peninsula is located within a Cal Fire-designated Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone.

Caltrans to Host a Virtual Public Meeting TONIGHT for a Multimodal Project on Western Avenue from San Pedro to Torrance

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will host a virtual public meeting on a multimodal pavement project along Western Avenue (State Route 213) from 25th Street in San Pedro to Interstate 405 (I-405) in Torrance. The project will include bike lanes, upgraded crosswalks, bicycle-oriented signboards, curb ramps and sidewalks.



Portuguese Bend Landslide Local Emergency Update

Palos Verdes Drive South Bicycle and Motorcycle Prohibition Discussion June 18

On June 18, the City Council will consider temporarily prohibiting bicycles and motorcycles on Palos Verdes Drive South in the Portuguese Bend Landslide complex due to accelerated land movement.


City Staff is recommending the Council prohibit bicyclists and motorcyclists from using an approximately 2-mile stretch of the road from Wayfarers Chapel to Schooner Drive to prevent injuries due to the poor condition of the roadway, where the land is moving at a rate of 5 to 8 inches per week. Riders would be directed to a detour route using Hawthorne Boulevard/Palos Verdes Drive North/Western Avenue. The closure would remain in effect until the land movement is significantly reduced and the roadway condition improves.

Whether or not the Council implements the prohibition, bicyclists and motorcyclists should consider voluntarily avoiding this stretch of Palos Verdes Drive South out of an abundance of caution.



Staff and Volunteers Provide Public Safety Outreach Palos Verdes Street Fair and Music Festival



Over the weekend, the Public Safety Division and volunteers represented RPV at the Palos Verdes Street Fair and Music Festival in Rolling Hills Estates.

Attendees were provided with a wealth of safety information, which included how to sign

up for Alert SouthBay emergency alerts and find your zone on the Peninsula's Know Your Zone evacuation platform. Visitors enjoyed spinning the wheel of knowledge where they were given questions related to the topics of fire, earthquake, electricity, natural gas, communication, and food/water and earned a safety prize.



This event provided a great opportunity to educate residents on how to better prepare for an emergency, how to turn off gas valves, water valves, electrical panels, and who to call for assistance. Each visitor received a packet of information containing checklist items for emergency preparedness kits, evacuation packing lists, and preparing for wildfires. Public Safety stayed committed until the very end to ensure all who were interested received this valuable lifesaving information.

Reminder: Fireworks are Illegal on the Peninsula

With the Fourth of July holiday approaching, the City reminds residents that fireworks, including those marketed as "safe and sane," are illegal year-round. This includes smoke bombs or smoke sticks that are commonly used for gender reveal parties.

Fines for illegal fireworks in RPV are \$1,000 for a first violation, \$5,000 for a second, and \$7,500 for third and subsequent violations.



With vast open space areas and canyons full of brush, virtually the entire City falls in a Cal Fire-designated Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone. It can only take one spark to ignite a catastrophic wildfire on the Peninsula, threatening lives and property in an area with limited evacuation routes. Fireworks can also trigger extreme episodes of trauma and fear in those who have post-traumatic stress disorder and in pets.

Residents and visitors are reminded to respect their neighbors and help protect against wildfire — do not light fireworks. Enjoy the holiday safely; come celebrate with family and friends at the City's Fourth of July Celebration at the Ken Dyda Civic Center featuring a patriotic drone light show at 8:45 p.m.

Situational Awareness SATG Bulletin

The Lomita Sheriff's Station's Surveillance Apprehension Team (SAT) has been monitoring the recent reports of surveillance devices such as hidden cameras being located among natural surroundings such as leaves, bushes, and brush (see attached bulletin). Although no reports have been made in the Lomita Station jurisdiction, this bulletin



is being distributed to provide situational awareness to the surrounding communities. The South American theft group (SATG) employs covert tactics and strategically places these cameras in residential front/backyards to monitor homeowners' activities and patterns of movement. Prior to deployment, the group conducts extensive scouting to identify optimal locations for hidden camera deployment, focusing on areas with minimal visibility. The SATG operates quickly, deploying these cameras within minutes, to avoid detection by homeowners and law enforcement.

Tips

- Remain vigilant and observant of any suspicious activity in residential areas.
- Conduct regular inspections of your property, including thorough checks of outdoor areas for any signs of tampering or unusual objects.
- Enhance home security measures, such as installing motion-activated lights, perimeter fencing, and surveillance systems to deter potential threats.
- Report any suspicious findings, such as hidden cameras or unfamiliar individuals, to the Lomita Sheriff's Station.


The budget report for the public hearing will provide a comprehensive overview of the following:

Palos Verdes Drive South Repairs in the Landslide Area


Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project Update

On May 21, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraugers with five drain arrays each. The hydraugers will be used to extract and/or intercept groundwater from the landslide area as an emergency stabilization measure to reduce movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide. Following are the updates since the City Council approved the project:

- Mobilization, including the delivery and installation of a field office at the Gateway parking area was completed.
- Site security fencing was installed.
- Clearing and grubbing for access to the first three borehole sites began and is ongoing.
- Drilling equipment arrived on site, and drilling activities began at the first borehole site.
- Environmental monitoring is being conducted in conjunction with construction activities.

Borehole drilling at the first three borehole sites is expected to continue through the next few weeks.

Minor traffic delays are to be expected over the course of the next few weeks as construction materials and equipment deliveries continue to the Gateway location. If you must drive through this area during this time, please proceed slowly, yield to workers and obey traffic control at the site. Thank you for your patience. Update on FEMA BRIC Grant for the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation

In January 2023, the City applied for a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) FY22 cycle grant for the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Project (PBL Remediation Project). The City applied for funding for 70% of the cost of the project with a requirement that the balance of the cost be funded through non-federal matching funds.

On August 28, 2023, FEMA announced the PBL Remediation Project was selected, with funding allocated, not obligated, for the City's project. The project met the basic eligibility requirements and entered the next phase of the awards review process, which includes a programmatic, environmental, and historic preservation review before a final funding decision is made.

Staff continues to work with the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) and the FEMA project team to expedite the review process as much as possible.

This week, Staff responded to a set of FEMA requests for additional information on the grant application. FEMA is expected to review the responses and continue processing the application expeditiously. Further requests for additional information are likely to be received as the grant process and complexity of the project typically results in these requests.

2024 Season Brush Clearing Completed

For the past two months, you may have seen both goats and human crews performing brush clearance in our community. Their efforts help reduce fire loads and protect nearby structures. This past week, both the goats and human crews completed their task of clearing (eating for goats) vegetation of approximately 253 acres!

Additional clearing may occur during the summer, as needed.




Maintenance Activities

In addition to regularly scheduled maintenance and repairs, Public Works performed the following:

PARK MAINTENANCE

- Weekly landscape maintenance at all City parks.
- All City irrigation systems have resumed their regular watering schedule.
- At Hesse Park, crews performed the following:
 - Removed, replaced and re-painted several rotten wood planks on picnic tables.
 - Patch repaired the concrete border in the playground area and on the damaged walkway.
 - Removed damaged sections of the perimeter fencing, ground off rust from the support poles and repainted the replacement panels.
- At Ladera Linda Community Park, landscaping crews removed weeds from sloped areas to improve the view and remove dry brush.





- Weed removal, brush clearance, and debris removal throughout the City at medians and various right-of-way sections at the following locations:
 - Highbridge center medians and right-of-way between Hawthorne Boulevard and Crest Road.
 - Whitley Collins Drive center medians between Highridge Road and Crest Road.
 - Crest Road center medians from Hawthorne Boulevard to Crenshaw Boulevard.
 - Palos Verdes Drive South center medians from Schooner Drive to Klondike Canyon.
 - Alvarez Drive and Hawthorne Boulevard


Public Right-of-Way/Roadway Repairs

- Continued crack fillings on curbs, gutters, and streets on Admirable Drive and Dauntless Drive. Sidewalk deviations were also repaired.
- Approximately 800 feet of decomposed granite (DG) was replaced on the trail at Palos Verdes Drive West near the Golden Cove shopping center and Via Vicente. The trail had been significantly affected by recent storms, resulting in washouts and rutting. These repairs aim to restore the integrity of the trail while providing a smoother and more even walking surface for pedestrians.



Graffiti Removal

- **Twenty-four** graffiti incidents were reported and removed this week.
- The RPV graffiti reporting app can be downloaded for Android and Apple devices under the name of **RPV Clean**. Residents can help keep RPV looking great by downloading the app and reporting graffiti.



Emergency Response

- This week, Public Works landscape crews responded to a Cal Water request for vegetation removal near Kelvin Canyon. Cal Water requested vegetation removal to access critical water lines and make emergency repairs due to land movement.

- On Narcissa Drive, crews responded to calls of sewer issues and found several pinched lines due to land movement. Crews promptly removed the damaged section of sewer lines and installed a new sewer line.



- Crews performed comprehensive camera inspections and jetting on the sewer lines at the lift station on Sweetbay Road. This proactive maintenance ensures the integrity of the sewer system, identifying any potential issues and clearing blockages to prevent future disruptions. Our commitment to regular inspections and upkeep helps maintain optimal functionality and reliability for Abalone Cove sewer area infrastructure.

Palos Verdes Peninsula Association of Realtors (PVPAR) Presentation

On June 5, Staff in the Community Development Department provided an informational presentation to representatives of the PVPAR. The presentation provided background and resource information about the City of Rancho Palos Verdes including development applications and processes that are of interest to Realtors and their clients. As part of the presentation, Code Enforcement Division Staff also outlined code requirements related to the posting of real estate signage both on private and public property.



This outreach effort provided an opportunity to educate and inform interested parties about the importance of code complaint signage and practices throughout the City. Consideration of Code Amendments to Establish a Penalty Fee Waiver

On July 2, 2024 the City Council will conduct a first reading of a Code Amendment update to RPVMC §15.18.040 (Administrative code amended – Violations and penalties) to establish penalty fee waiver options for properties with prior code violations that occurred unknowingly to new property owners. 

Southern California Rescue Centers Concerned by Illness, Deaths Among Sea Lions as Facilities Fill

In the midst of a \$16 million renovation of its facilities, the Pacific Marine Mammal Center in Laguna Beach is nearing capacity with large numbers of rescued sea lion pups. There are currently large numbers being found around islands where marine animals are known to breed. The alarming numbers of injured, sick and dying sea lions hasn't been seen in almost seven years, where the last large die off was between 2013 and 2016.



As of now, a temporary field hospital to house the injured and sick marine mammals is being held in a nearby park in the City of Long Beach, comprise of two trailers housing veterinarians, volunteers and staff who prepare medications, food and perform medical treatments and surgeries. About 25,000 pups are born each year in rookeries on the Channels Islands.

Since January, the San Pedro Marina Mammal Care Center has received more than 1,000 reports of beached marine mammals and is at capacity, while the Pacific Marine Mammal Center has responded to 200 rescues. Their dedicated team of scientists, veterinarians, volunteers, and staff are working tirelessly to care for the affected marine mammals. By staying informed and contributing to rescue and rehabilitation efforts, we can all play a part in protecting these vital marine species and ensuring a healthier future for our oceans.



RE: City of Rancho Palos Verdes' 6th Cycle (2021-2029) Adopted Housing Element

Thank you for submitting the City of Rancho Palos Verdes' (City) housing element update adopted on April 16, 2024 and received for review on April 19, 2024. Pursuant to Government Code section 65585, subdivision (h), the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) is reporting the results of its review. Our review was facilitated by a telephone conversation on May 6 and 30, 2024 with you, Octavio Silva, Deputy Director, Jessica Bobbett, Senior Planner and the City's consultant Matt Kowta. In addition, HCD considered comments from Shahzad Khaligh and Anthony De Clue pursuant to Government Code section 65585, subdivision (c).

HCD is pleased to find the adopted housing element in substantial compliance with State Housing Element Law (Gov. Code, § 65580 et seq) as of the date of this letter. The adopted element addresses the statutory requirements described in HCD's April 5, 2024 findings letter. Furthermore, the City has completed actions in the City's housing element Program 1 (Zoning Amendments to Increase Housing Development Potential) to rezone sites to accommodate the regional housing needs allocation (RHNA) pursuant to Government Code section 65583.2, subdivision (c) as demonstrated by Ordinance Number 680U.

Additionally, the City must continue timely and effective implementation of all programs including but not limited to the following:

- Program 4: Accessory Dwelling Unit Ordinance Amendments
- Program 7: Accessory Dwelling Unit Assistance Program
- Program 15: Place-Based Strategies to Support Areas Targeted for Lower-Income
- Program 18: Zoning Ordinance Amendments to Remove Governmental Constraints
- Program 19: Transparency in Housing Standards and Fees
- Program 20: Implement Development Review Process Improvement
- Program 21: Housing Site Development Assistance
- Program 23: Housing Conservation and Rehabilitation

The City must monitor and report on the results of this and other programs through the annual progress report, required pursuant to Government Code section 65400. Please be aware, Government Code section 65585(i) grants HCD authority to review any action or failure to act by a local government that it determines is inconsistent with an adopted housing element or housing element law. This includes failure to implement program actions included in the housing element. HCD may revoke housing element compliance if the local government's actions do not comply with state law.

Several federal, state, and regional funding programs consider housing element compliance as an eligibility or ranking criteria. For example, the CalTrans Senate Bill (SB) 1 Sustainable Communities grant; the Strategic Growth Council and HCD's Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities programs; and HCD's Permanent Local Housing Allocation consider housing element compliance and/or annual reporting requirements pursuant to Government Code section 65400. With a compliant housing element, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes meets housing element requirements for these and other funding sources.

HCD appreciates the cooperation and responsiveness the housing element team provided in preparation of the City's housing element. HCD wishes the City success in implementing its housing element and looks forward to following its progress through the General Plan annual progress reports pursuant to Government Code section 65400. We are committed to assist the City in addressing all statutory requirements of State Housing Element Law. SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

SOUTH AMERICAN THEFT GROUPS (SATG) - RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES



LASD Lomita's Surveillance Apprehension Team (SAT) has been monitoring the recent reporting's of surveillance devices such as hidden cameras being located amongst natural surroundings such as leaves, bushes, and brush. Although no reports have been made in the Lomita Station jurisdiction, this bulletin is being distributed in order to provide situational awareness to the surrounding communities. The SATG employs covert tactics and strategically places these cameras in residential front/back yards in order to monitor homeowner's activities and patterns of movement. Prior to deployment, the group conducts extensive scouting to identify optimal locations for hidden camera deployment, focusing on areas with minimal visibility. The SATG operates quickly, deploying these cameras within minutes, to avoid detection by homeowners and law enforcement.

TIPS:

- Remain vigilant and observant of any suspicious activity in residential areas.
- Conduct regular inspections of your property, including thorough checks of outdoor areas for any signs of tampering or unusual objects.
- Enhance home security measures, such as installing motion-activated lights, perimeter fencing, and surveillance systems to deter potential threats.
- Report any suspicious findings, such as hidden cameras or unfamiliar individuals, to the Lomita Sheriff Station.
