June 18, 2024, City Council Meeting Highlights

Highlights from the June 18 City Council meeting:

- The City Council voted to temporarily prohibit bicycles, motorcycles, scooters, and all other two-wheeled vehicles from an approximately 2-mile stretch of Palos Verdes Drive South from Wayfarers Chapel to Schooner Drive due to land movement.
- The prohibition went into effect immediately to prevent injuries due to the poor condition of the roadway, where the land is moving at a rate of 7 to 12 inches per week.
- The Council will revisit the prohibition and consider whether to lift or extend it in six months.



- The City will continue pausing its humane peafowl trapping program in 2024 until a new count of peacocks and peahens is conducted in 2025.
- The final City budget and Capital Improvement Program were approved for Fiscal Year 2024-25. Be sure to check the City website in the coming weeks for the Budget in Brief, an easy-to-read summary of the City's \$39.4 million balanced budget. The City remains fiscally strong with healthy reserves.
- The Council also approved an over \$8.1 million Sheriff's Department contract for the next fiscal year.

City Council Recognizes Scout Troop 378

At last night's meeting, the City Council also recognized Scouts Christopher Kinoshita and Shubham Waldiya, of Scout Troop 378. Each Scout received a certificate recognizing their hard work and dedication in completing their Eagle Scout projects in the City. The Scouts worked with Open Space and Trails Staff on projects to install fencing at two



different locations in the Abalone Cove Nature Reserve and Park. These fences provide essential protection for sensitive habitat and improve trail delineation leading into the park and Reserve. Mr. Kinoshita and Mr. Waldiya, along with their troop, parents, and volunteers, totaled over 350 hours of work on each of these large and challenging projects. The City thanks them for their diligent work and great contributions to the City and community.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Local Emergency Update

Bicycles and Motorcycles Prohibited on 2-Mile Stretch of Palos Verdes Drive South Due to Land Movement

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes has temporarily prohibited bicycles, motorcycles, scooters, and all other two-wheeled vehicles from an approximately 2-mile stretch of Palos Verdes Drive South due to land movement.

On June 18, the City Council implemented the temporary ban along Palos Verdes Drive South from Wayfarers Chapel to Schooner Drive to prevent injuries due to the poor condition of the roadway, where the land is moving at a rate of 7 to 12 inches per week. The Council will revisit the prohibition and consider whether to lift or extend it in six months.

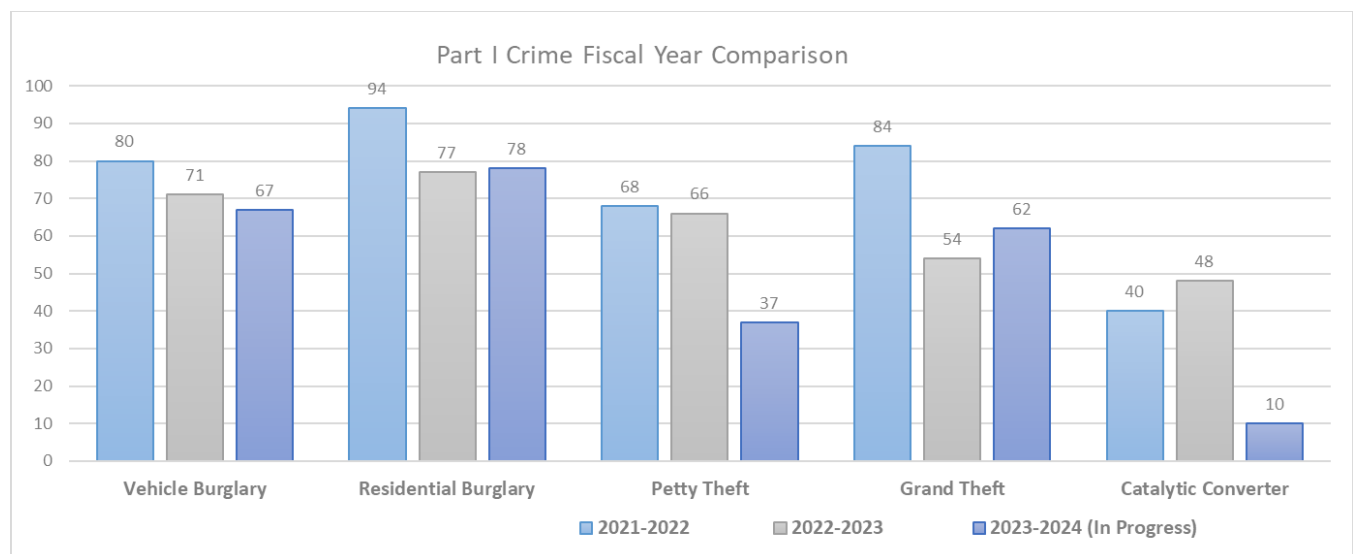

Reminder: Fireworks are Illegal on the Peninsula

With the Fourth of July holiday approaching, the City reminds residents that fireworks, including those marketed as “safe and sane,” are illegal year-round. This includes smoke bombs or smoke sticks that are commonly used for gender reveal parties.

Fines for illegal fireworks in RPV are \$1,000 for a first violation, \$5,000 for a second, and \$7,500 for third and subsequent violations.

With vast open space areas and canyons full of brush, virtually the entire City falls in a Cal Fire-designated Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone. It can only take one spark to ignite a catastrophic wildfire on the Peninsula, threatening lives and property in an area with limited evacuation routes. Fireworks can also trigger extreme episodes of trauma and fear in those who have post-traumatic stress disorder and in pets.

Residents and visitors are reminded to respect their neighbors and help protect against wildfire — do not light fireworks. Enjoy the holiday safely; come celebrate with family and friends at the City’s Fourth of July Celebration at the Ken Dyda Civic Center featuring a patriotic drone light show at 8:45 p.m.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Fiscal Year 2024-25 Adopted Budget

On June 18, the City Council unanimously adopted the Citywide FY 2024-25 budget. This includes total revenues of over \$59 million and expenditures of roughly \$72 million, including transfers and Improvement Authorities. The adopted budget represents the culmination of a meticulous development process and highlights the City's financial plan and priorities for the upcoming fiscal year.

FY 2024-25 General Fund Budget

The adopted General Fund budget includes revenues and expenditures each reaching close to \$40 million, including transfers.

General Fund revenues, excluding transfers, are expected to exceed the FY 2023-24 year-end estimates by almost \$0.9 million, or 2.3%. This is largely due to property tax, which represents 45% of total revenues and continues to demonstrate stable growth of about 4% year-over-year. TOT revenue is the second largest revenue source in the General Fund and accounts for 17% of total revenues. General Fund expenditures, including transfers, exceed FY 2023-24 year-end estimates by approximately \$2 million or 6%.



Overall, Staff anticipates an ending fund balance of \$34.5 million as of June 30, 2025. After applying the City Council reserve policy and additional transfers, the General Fund is estimated to end the year with an unallocated fund balance of \$14 million. This is a decrease of approximately \$1.1 million or 7.5% from the prior year's budget, primarily due to additional transfers out from General Fund to the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Fund.

Palos Verdes Drive South Repairs in the Landslide Area

Western Avenue Beautification Project Update

For many years, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes has considered ways to enhance the aesthetics along Western Avenue from Peninsula Verde Drive to Summerland Street/Summerland Avenue, which is owned and maintained by Caltrans and lies in both the City of RPV and the City of Los Angeles. Over the past two years, City Staff has been working to develop and implement the Western Avenue Beautification Project to make the vision a reality.

The Western Avenue Beautification Project envisions a transformation of the cityscape through strategic improvements that will be implemented over time and will include:

landscape improvements in the parkways; replacement of street furniture (bus shelters, benches, trash receptacles); landscape improvements within medians; and enhanced crosswalks. Such improvements on Western Avenue and adjacent areas would enhance the appeal of the City's only commercial corridor and surrounding area, bolster commerce, foster local business activity, and reflect positively on the entire City, particularly the adjacent neighborhoods.

Community input has played a vital role in shaping the final design concept by incorporating the preferences and concerns of our residents and ensuring the project aligns with the community's vision, including using multiple types of native plants along significant stretches of the medians. On August 1, 2023, the City Council directed Staff to proceed with the final design.

It is important to note that the final design is contingent upon approval from Caltrans, and among other things, Caltrans has requested that the City of Rancho Palos Verdes obtain concurrence from the City of Los Angeles on the proposed plan. Staff has worked with representatives of the City of Los Angeles and recently secured a letter of support from Los Angeles City Councilmember Tim McOsler outlining our shared goals of promoting sustainable development and enhancing the overall quality of life for our communities. RPV Staff is also engaging in discussions to ensure the project aligns with Caltrans' proposed multimodal roadway project.

The City continues to work diligently to secure necessary approvals and funding to bring this vision to life. Continued engagement with partner agencies and adherence to community preferences will guide the final design.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraulics Project Update

On May 21, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraulics Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraulics with five drain arrays each. The hydraulics will be used to extract and/or intercept groundwater from the landslide area as an emergency stabilization measure to reduce movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide. Following are the most recent activities:

- Mobilization, including the delivery and installation of a field office at the Gateway parking area, was completed.
- Site security fencing was installed.
- Clearing and grubbing for access to the first five borehole sites is complete.

- Drilling of the first borehole is complete reaching approximately 225 feet in depth. Drilling of the second borehole has started and is anticipated to be completed this week. Drilling of the third borehole will start thereafter.
- Instrumentation to gauge land movement was installed at the first borehole. Instrumentation at the second borehole is anticipated to be installed this week.
- Environmental monitoring is being conducted in conjunction with construction activities.
- A total of 20 boreholes are anticipated to be installed over the course of the next several weeks.

Minor traffic delays are to be expected over the course of the next few weeks as construction materials and equipment deliveries continue to the Gateway location. 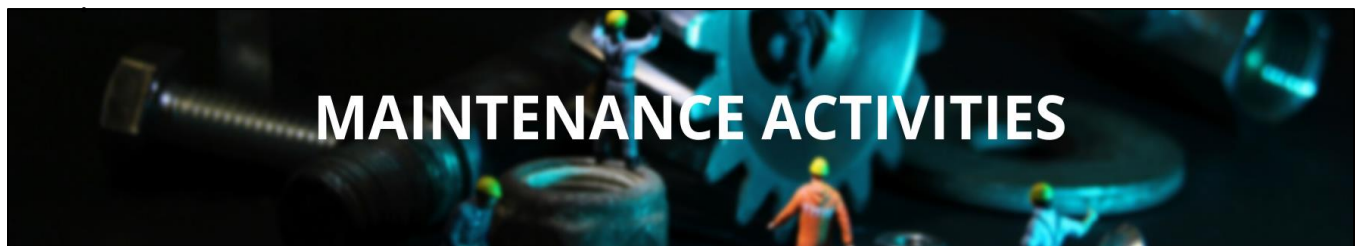


Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) Special Meeting

- Replaced the irrigation controller on Hawthorne Boulevard near the Ken Dyda Civic Center to maintain optimal conditions for the large turf area.

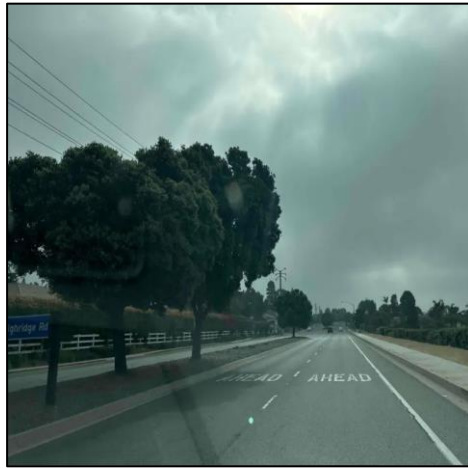

- Continued crack fillings curbs, gutters, and streets in the Seaview neighborhood at Admirable Drive and Dauntless Drive.

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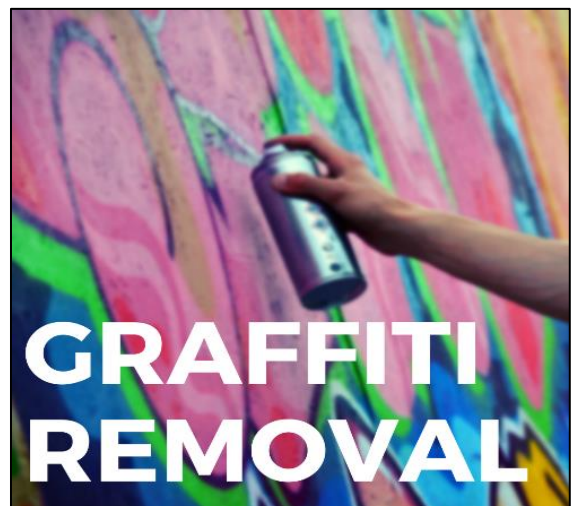
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- Damaged section of fencing on Calle Entradero was re-secured with barricades and cables.

Graffiti Removal

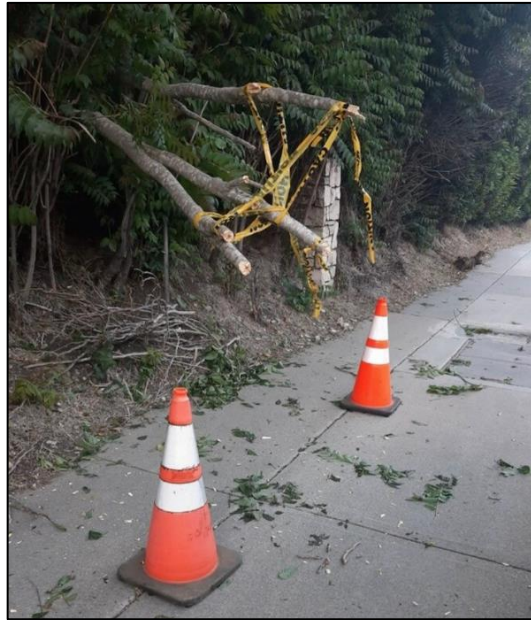
- **Twenty-two** graffiti incidents were reported and removed this week.

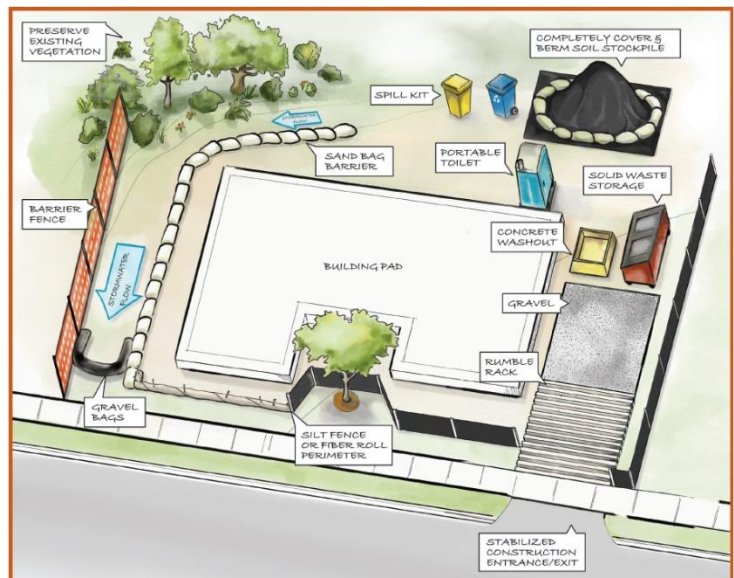

Practices include, but are not limited to, preserving existing onsite vegetation, installing permitter fencing and sandbag barriers as well as maintaining onsite solid waste storage.

The REACH program serves the social and recreational needs of youths and adults with developmental disabilities and is back at Hesse Park for in-person activities.

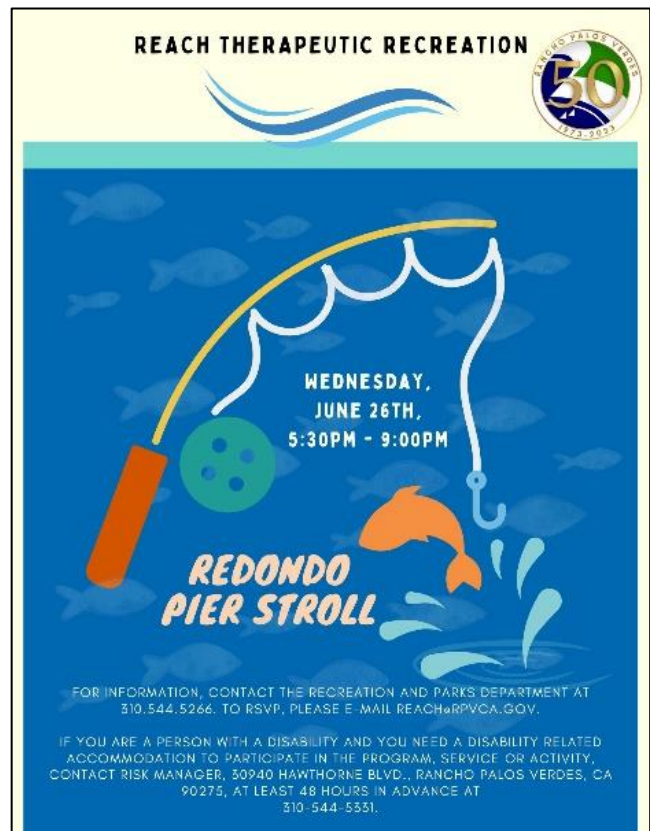

Abalone Cove Reserve

On June 15, Los Angeles County Lifeguards will begin staffing two lifeguards 7 days a week through Labor Day to monitor activity as beach use increases over the summer.

Alta Vicente Reserve

On June 15, Staff worked on re-delineation of North Spur Trail by scraping debris off trail. Rocks were reset to establish trail width and several palm fronds hanging onto the trail have been trimmed and removed. Lemonade berry was trimmed back to improve access on the multi-use trail. Lastly, the stairs were hand-weeded to remove bristly oxtongue and a few steps were reset.

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On June 14, Staff removed an exposed root from the trail tread at Nike Trail.

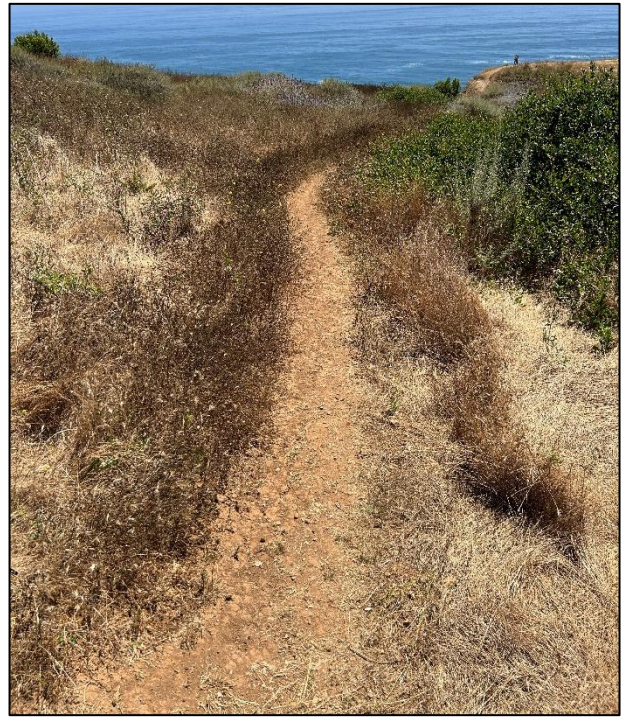


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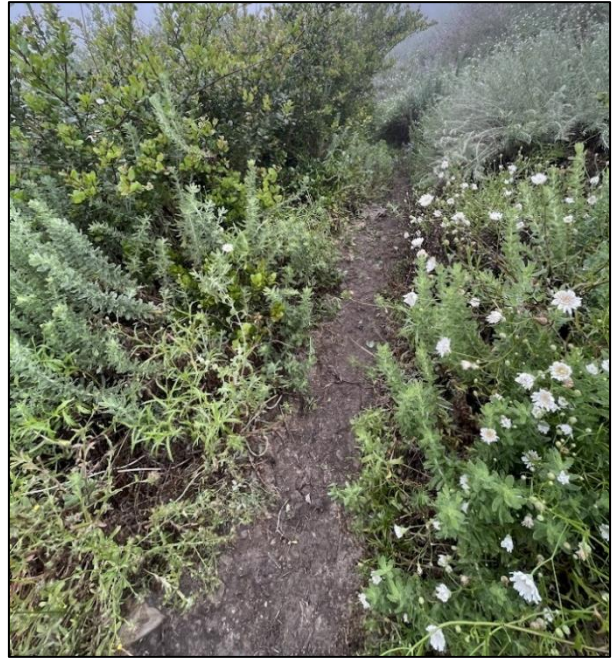
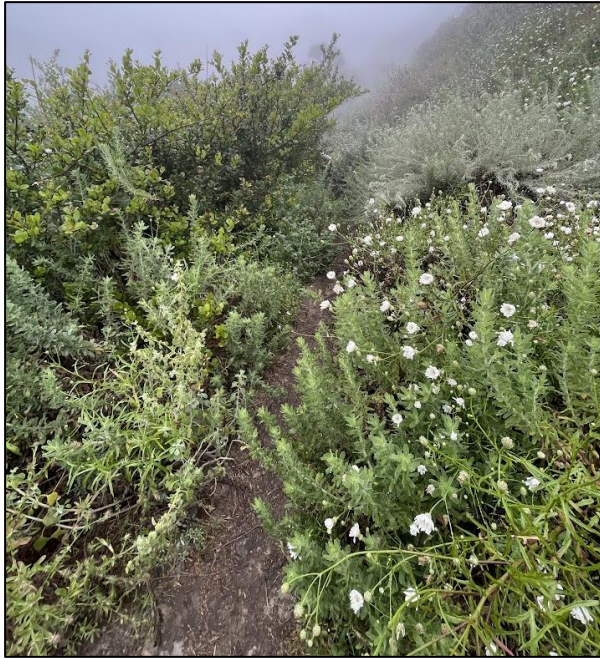
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On June 15, Park Rangers performed non-native vegetation removal and trimming on Alta Vicente Trail.



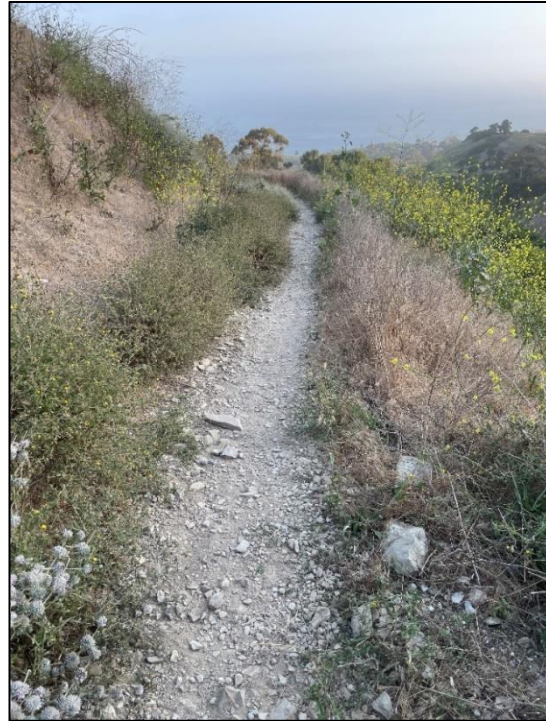
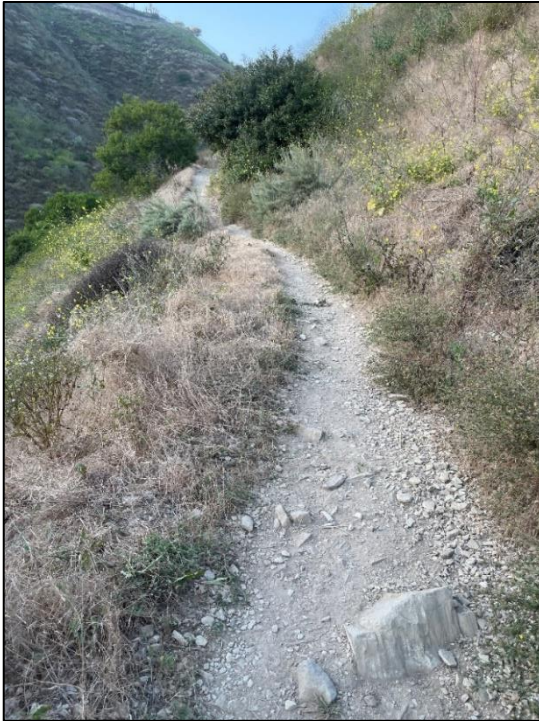
Filiorum Reserve

On June 12, Staff performed hand pruning of native vegetation including lemonade berry and California sagebrush.

On June 13, Staff repaired a broken retaining wall. The wall, constructed of two layers of 8-foot-long and 4-inch-wide peeler core had come loose, in part due to impacts from trail users, weather, and rotting woods. The peeler cores were reset, and Staff replaced rotted wood and installed u-posts along the wall for support.

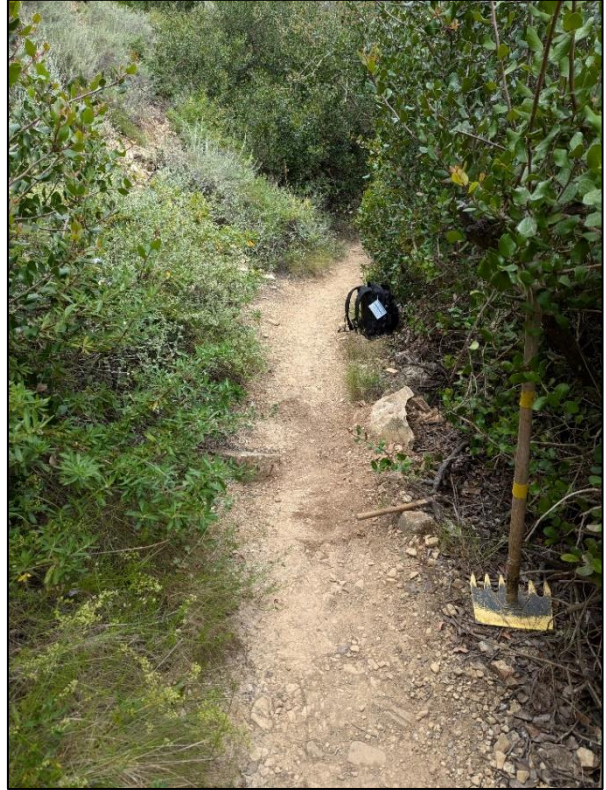
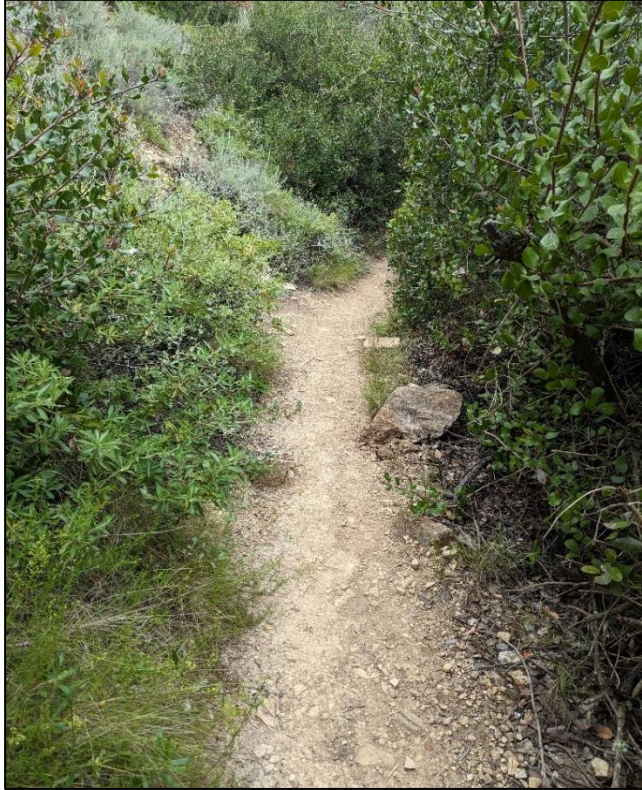




On June 17, Staff covered up an unauthorized spur trail on Mariposa Trail. Areas such as these cut through preserved native habitat. The City works with the Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy to identify and maintain these areas to minimize use and protect native habitat.



On June 17, Staff repaired trail tread on Mariposa Trail to reset loose rocks and secure daylight edge of the trail for stability.

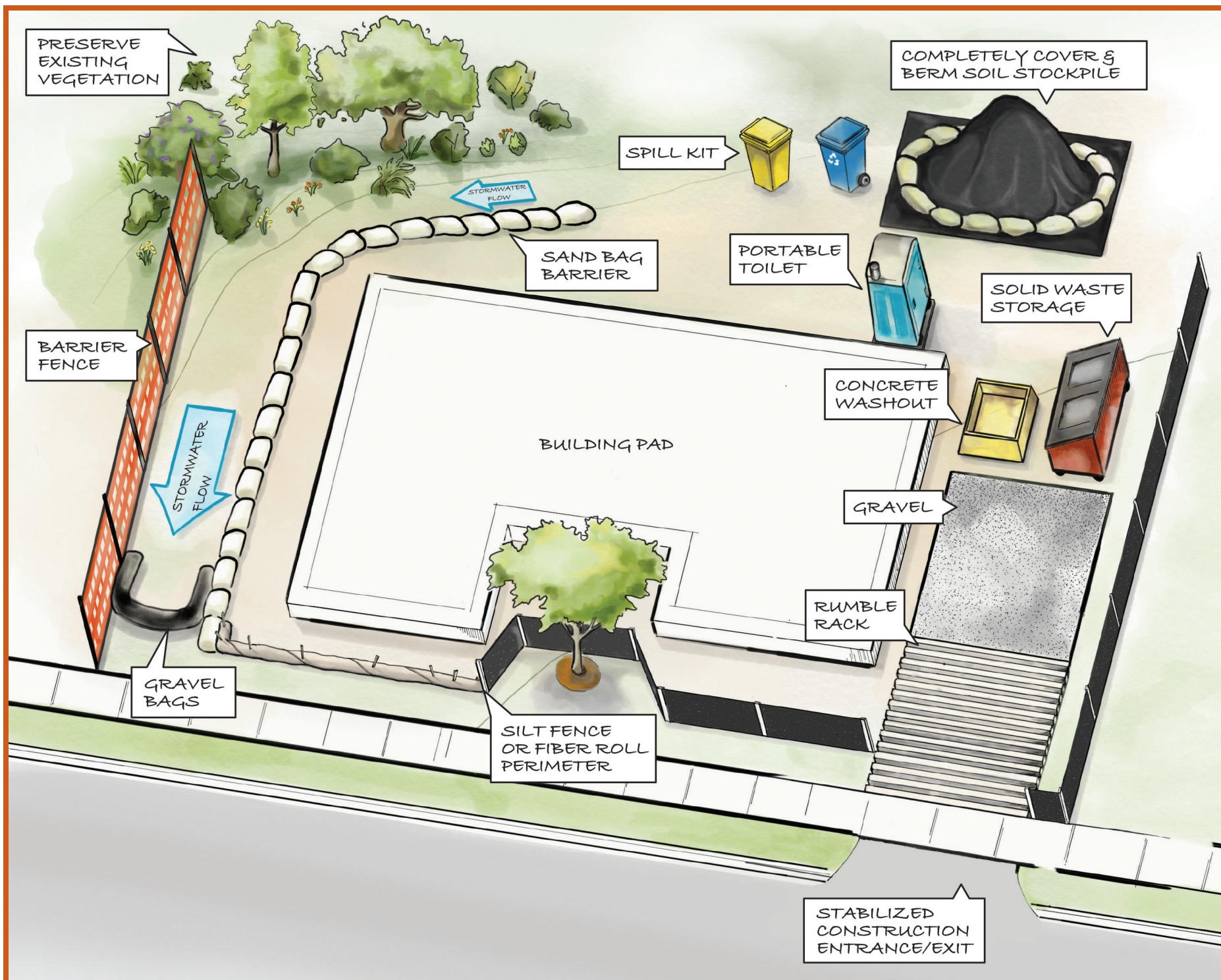

KEEP IT ONSITE!

Best Management Practices for Construction Sites

Our beaches, coastal streams and wetlands are precious to our coastal communities, but human activity such as construction work can pollute these natural treasures unless contractors use effective best management practices (BMPs).

This brochure outlines the minimum required BMPs for construction projects of any size.*

* Construction projects that disturb one acre or more of soil must also comply with the Statewide Construction General Permit: waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/stormwater/construction.html

BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES FOR CONSTRUCTION SITES

An effective combination of the following 14 minimum BMPs must be implemented and maintained on all construction sites to comply with the Clean Water Act. Local agencies may have additional requirements.

EROSION CONTROLS

Schedule construction to minimize the area and duration of soil disturbance/exposure, especially during the rainy season.

- Deploy all construction BMPs before beginning construction and maintain frequently.
- Monitor weather forecasts and check BMPs before and after rain and wind events.
- Schedule grading for non-rainy season whenever possible (May – September).
- Stabilize inactive areas of exposed soil.
- At the end of the job, stabilize all exposed soil with sod, seed, vegetation or mulch.

Preserve and Protect Existing Trees and Vegetation for shade, habitat and natural erosion control.

- Flag or fence trees and vegetation to be protected prior to construction.
- Place temporary fencing at the edge of the tree canopy/dripline to protect roots from compaction.
- Keep trenching outside of tree canopy and cover any exposed roots with soil.
- Consult an arborist for advice on protecting valuable trees.
- Do not cut trees or brush along banks of a natural drainage course without permit(s).

Wind Erosion Controls deployed when wind advisory is forecast.

- Cover erodible stockpiles.
- Limit vehicle speeds onsite.
- Implement dust suppression without causing site runoff.

SEDIMENT CONTROLS

Perimeter Controls, e.g., silt fence, sandbag or fiber roll barriers to keep sediment on site.

- Silt fence trenched and keyed in to filter sediment-laden sheet flow.
- Sandbag or fiber roll barriers placed on a level contour to intercept sheet flow and settle out sediment.
- Gravel bag barriers may be used for flow-through sediment filtration.

Stabilized Construction Entrance/Exit (required if vehicles will enter the site) to prevent tracking of dirt and mud onto street and must include:

- Crushed aggregate at least 3 inches in diameter placed at least 12 inches deep over filter fabric.
- Rumble racks (manufactured steel plates with ribs).
- Site control to limit vehicle access only to stabilized entrance/exit.

WATER USE AND MANAGEMENT

Water Conservation Practices to prevent illegal construction discharges include:

- Dry sweeping and/or vacuuming paved areas.
- Use of quick-release nozzles on hoses.
- Prompt repair of leaks from water trucks, irrigation, hydrant connections, etc.
- Reuse of water generated onsite for dust control.

Dewatering Operations If dewatering of groundwater during construction and/or from a permanent sump pump will be discharged to the storm drain or street:

- 45 days prior to discharge, a separate permit must be obtained under Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board Order No. R4-2023-0429, waterboards.ca.gov/losangeles/board_decisions/adopted_orders/general_orders/R4-2023-0429.pdf.
- Implement and maintain treatment as specified by approved permit.
- Keep the flow path of the discharge to the storm drain clean, i.e., sweep up dirt, debris, leaves, and trash.
- Dewatering discharges must not cause soil erosion.

MATERIAL AND WASTE MANAGEMENT

Material Delivery and Storage Management

- Limit the number of different types of solvents and materials to reduce waste.
- Select less toxic or hazardous products when feasible.
- Store liquids or toxic materials in double-walled tanks or watertight containers under covered areas away from drainage-ways.
- Locate material storage away from vehicle traffic and drainage pathways.
- Keep Safety Data Sheets onsite and train workers to review before using hazardous materials.

Stockpile Management and Protection

- Cover erodible stockpiles during non-active periods to protect from wind-blown dispersion.
- Locate stockpiles away from street or onsite drainage pathways.
- Provide perimeter sediment barrier.
- Place asphalt-based cold-mix stockpiles on plastic and cover prior to rain.

Spill Prevention and Control Measures

- Keep spill absorbent and clean-up supplies readily at hand.
- Utilize spill prevention/containment measures such as drip pans.
- If equipment fueling or maintenance must be performed onsite, designate a specific area on level ground away from drainage-way or street.
- Stop, safely contain and clean up spills promptly.
- Properly dispose of spill cleanup materials.
- Keep emergency response contact numbers readily available onsite.

Solid Waste Management

- Follow local demolition/debris management, recycling and disposal requirements.
 - Maintain an organized/segregated waste storage area.
 - Dispose of hazardous waste in a lawful manner.
 - Control litter such as empty food and beverage containers and cigarette butts.
- Do not:*
- ↓ Bury or dispose of waste materials onsite.
 - ↓ Dispose of liquids in dumpster.

Concrete Waste, including concrete washout, tile, stucco and any cementitious waste:

- Provide designated containment area lined or designed to prevent the release of liquids onto or into the ground.
 - Properly dispose of waste.
- Do not:*
- ↓ Rinse concrete vehicles or equipment into the street or catch basin.

Sanitary/Septic Waste Management

- Follow local requirements for placement and service of portable toilets.
- Locate away from catch basins and vehicular traffic.
- Anchor in areas subject to vandalism or when strong winds are forecast.
- Require spill prevention measures during service.

SITE MANAGEMENT

Housekeeping practices must be implemented throughout construction.

- Inspect and maintain BMPs regularly.
- Keep site neat and organized.
- Train all site workers on BMP maintenance.
- Keep documentation onsite at all times, e.g., SWPPP, Safety Data Sheets.
- Schedule material deliveries to minimize storage space and weathering.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS AND ADDITIONAL PERMITS

Asbestos: work with or removal of asbestos-related materials requires special handling and containment practices under Title 8 of California Code of Regulations.

Lead-Based Paint Renovation, Removal and Painting Program Rule: Rule requires that contractors that work on pre-1978 dwellings and child-occupied facilities be trained and certified to use lead-safe work practices.

Lake and Streambed Work: Additional permits may be required if construction work will be conducted along a lake, stream, wetland or ocean. These include:
