Happy Fourth of July, RPV!

City Hall Closed on Independence Day

City Hall will be closed on July 4 in observance of Independence Day, but parks will be open for their regular hours. (Please note that the Rancho Caninos Dog Park will be closed all day due to the City's Fourth of July Celebration at the Ken Dyda Civic Center)

There will be no trash/recycling collection or street sweeping on July 4, and a one-day delay for trash service for the remainder of the week. Streets swept on the first Thursday of the month will be swept on July 3.

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Please obtain a Special Construction Permit by July 2 if you're planning to do construction work on the holiday. [Permit details and application requirements \(PDF\)](#) are available on the City website.

Please note that minor repairs, maintenance and landscaping activities (i.e., work that does not otherwise require a building permit) are not prohibited on legal holidays. For additional information, please contact the Community Development Department at 310-544-5228 or planning@rpvca.gov.

Finally, **fireworks are illegal on the Palos Verdes Peninsula**. Fines for illegal fireworks in RPV are \$1,000 for a first violation, \$5,000 for a second, and \$7,500 for third and subsequent violations. Fireworks pose a significant fire danger, cause injuries, scare pets and may trigger a response in those with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Respect your neighbors and obey the law. DO NOT light fireworks. Call the Lomita Sheriff's Station to report fireworks at 310-539-1661.



Reminder: Fireworks are Illegal on the Peninsula

With the Fourth of July holiday approaching, the City reminds residents that fireworks, including those marketed as "safe and sane," are illegal year-round. This includes smoke bombs or smoke sticks that are commonly used for gender reveal parties.

Fines for illegal fireworks in RPV are \$1,000 for a first violation, \$5,000 for a second, and \$7,500 for third and subsequent violations.

With vast open space areas and canyons full of brush, virtually the entire City falls in a Cal Fire-designated Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone. It can only take one spark to ignite a catastrophic wildfire on the Peninsula, threatening lives and property in an area with limited evacuation routes.



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Fireworks can also trigger extreme episodes of trauma and fear in those who have post-traumatic stress disorder and in pets.

Residents and visitors are reminded to respect their neighbors and help protect against wildfire — do not light fireworks. Enjoy the holiday safely; come celebrate with family and friends at the City's Fourth of July Celebration at the Ken Dyda Civic Center featuring a patriotic drone light show at 8:45 p.m.

Case-Shiller Home Price Indices – April 2024

This week, data from the S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Home Price Indices, the leading measure of residential real estate prices, were released for April. This information provides insight into the housing market by highlighting monthly and annual changes reported in the National and Los Angeles Home Price Indices.


Month-over-Month

The upward trends decelerated from last month, with the U.S. National Index posting a month-over-month increase of 1.2% in April, before seasonal adjustments. Home prices in the Los Angeles area rose by 1.3%, down slightly compared to March's monthly gain. Despite slower growth, 2024 is mirroring the strong start seen last year with March and April showing the largest rise before a summer and fall slowdown.

Year-over-Year

The National Index reported a 6.3% annual gain for April, down from the previous month. The annual gain for Los Angeles was at 8.6% and continues to remain above the national average. As summer approaches, the market is at an all-time high, once again testing its resilience during the historically more active season.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project Update

On May 21, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraugers with five drain arrays each. The hydraugers will be used to extract and/or intercept groundwater from the landslide area as an emergency stabilization measure to reduce movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide. Following are the most recent activities:

- Mobilization, including the delivery and installation of a field office at the Gateway parking area, and installation of site security fencing was completed.
- Clearing and grubbing for access to the first five borehole sites is complete and continues to progress ahead of vertical borehole drilling as planned.
- Drilling of the first and second vertical boreholes is complete. Drilling of the third and fourth boreholes has started and is anticipated to be completed by the second week of July.
- Instrumentation to gauge land movement continues to be installed in each borehole.
- Environmental monitoring is being conducted in conjunction with construction activities.
- A second drill rig is being mobilized to accelerate drilling of the remaining vertical boreholes. The second drill rig is anticipated to arrive by the second week of July.
- A total of 20 boreholes are anticipated to be installed over the course of the next several weeks.

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Minor traffic delays are to be expected over the course of the next several weeks as construction materials and equipment deliveries continue to arrive at the location. If you must drive through this area during this time, please proceed slowly, yield to workers and obey traffic control at the site. Thank you for your patience. Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) Honors Three Outgoing Members

Three TSC members were honored during the last TSC Special Meeting held on June 24, 2024, in the Community Room at City Hall.

- Ms. Crystal Slaten was first appointed on March 16, 2021, and has served the committee since that time until her term ends on June 30, 2024.
- Mr. James Guerin, a multi-term TSC member, was last appointed on February 1, 2022, and has served the committee since that time until his term ends on June 30, 2024.
- Mr. David Tomblin was first appointed on March 16, 2021, and has served the committee since that time until his term ends on June 30, 2024.

Public Works Staff and the TSC thank Ms. Slaten, Mr. Guerin and Mr. Tomblin for their

service to the committee and to the RPV community. The City of Rancho Palos Verdes plans to confer recognition of the outgoing TSC members dedicated service to the City during the regular City Council meeting (date to be announced).

Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) Recommends STOP Sign at Shorewood Road and Indian Peak Road

During the June 24, Special TSC Meeting, the TSC recommended the installation of a STOP sign at the intersection of Shorewood Road and Indian Peak Road based on the recommendation from an engineering study based on the California Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Device (CAMUTD) STOP sign guidance. The new STOP sign at Shorewood Road will address sight distance issues at the intersection as identified in the engineering study. The sign is scheduled to be installed in the next several weeks.



Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) to Develop a Framework for Processing Traffic Requests

During the June 24 special meeting, TSC formed an ad hoc subcommittee consisting of two TSC members to develop a framework for processing and prioritizing traffic requests (Framework). The TSC will collaborate with Public Works Staff in the development of the Framework. The Public Works staff's goal is to address constituent requests in a responsive and timely manner with excellent customer service and satisfaction. Staff also recognize that the sheer volume of requests necessitates prioritization to realistically make progress, and that the TSC is best positioned to develop processing and prioritization criteria.



Infrastructure Management Advisory Committee (IMAC)


Public Right-of-Way/Roadway Repairs

- Replaced six trash receptacles along Palos Verdes Drive East.

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
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Graffiti Removal

- **Nineteen** graffiti incidents were reported and removed this week.

EMERGENCY ISSUES

Emergency Response

- The Public Works Department completed permanent repairs on the corroded sewer line near Figtree within the Abalone Cove Sewer District. They installed a new section of pipe, ensuring that all local area sewer services remained uninterrupted.



- On June 18, the Public Works team responded to multiple sewer-related issues in the Abalone Cove Sewer District. They quickly conducted CCTV camera inspections and discovered several deviations caused by land movement in three main sections: Vanderlip Road, Ginger Root Lane, and Narcissa Road. Crews worked throughout the week, both during and after hours, to implement temporary repairs and bypasses to maintain sewer services for the entire neighborhood. This week, Public Works continues to make repairs and monitor the situation in preparation for permanent solutions.

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COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Status Update - Former Marie Callender's Restaurant (29051 S. Western Avenue)

City Staff have been in communication with representatives of the former Marie Callender's restaurant site located at 29051 S. Western Avenue regarding the potential remodel of the building into a financial institution. The Canterbury Retirement Community Proposed CUP Revision

The Canterbury Retirement Community is requesting a revision to Conditional Use Permit (CUP) No. 41 to allow for an updated Master Plan. The proposed improvements include 20,418 square feet of new development, reorganization of the existing building interior spaces to better serve the resident population with centralized circulation, amenities and services and the reconfiguration of existing residential units. No Construction on 4th of July Holiday (Thursday, July 4, 2024)

Pursuant to Section 17.56.020(B) of the City's Zoning Code, it is unlawful to carry on construction, grading or landscaping activities, or to operate heavy equipment on legal holidays, unless a Special Construction Permit is approved by the Director of Community Development. A Special Construction Permit must be requested at least 48 hours before any such work is to begin. **Keep Your Pets Safe and Protected This Independence Day!**

With the 4th of July approaching, the County of Los Angeles Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC) would like to remind pet owners that extra precautions are necessary in order to protect pets during celebrations.

To ensure the safety of your pets, here are a few tips:

- Make sure your pet has a collar and tags with contact information. Include a phone number where you can be reached.
- Do not take your pets with you when going to see fireworks displays. The noise and other activities at these events can easily frighten and overwhelm your dog or cat.

- Keep your pets indoors in a cool, comfortable place with some “white noise” distraction.
- Your pets may want to hide; allow them access to a room away from windows.
- If your dog is outside, make sure all gates are closed and locked and fencing is secure. Your dog may try to escape if they become startled.
- If you are leaving town for the weekend and cannot take your pets with you, make sure you leave them with someone who will be cautious and keep them secure during the Fourth of July celebrations.
- Talk to your veterinarian if you feel your pet may need additional support through medication.

If your pet gets out or if you find a pet, we encourage you to report and search on Petco Love Lost. Petco Love Lost, the nation's largest nonprofit lost and found pet database, utilizes patented image-recognition technology, and includes pets from nearly every animal shelter in the Los Angeles area, privately reported lost and found pets, and even pets posted on social media.

Landslide Watering Restrictions Still in Place

Due to the continued local landslide emergency, the City continues to strongly recommend that property owners in the Greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex turn off sprinkler/irrigation watering systems for the foreseeable future to minimize additional water being absorbed into the ground in the vicinity.

Additionally, for those properties with swimming pools, if there is more water loss than occurs due to evaporation, the property owner is being asked to consider refraining from refilling the pools at this time and consider emptying the pool to prevent water entering the ground. A Mandatory Restrictions notice was initially issued in October 2023 for information on pool draining (Attachment).

Abalone Cove Reserve

On June 21, Park Rangers received a report of a deceased coyote on Palos Verdes Drive South across from Abalone Cove Reserve. Park Rangers confirmed the presence of deceased coyote on the roadway and notified Los Angeles County Animal Care and Control.

On June 23, Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy Volunteer Trail Crew performed minor adjustments to the retaining wall that was built by Trail Crew and City Staff on Abalone Cove Trail. It is estimated that one of the sections had moved about 6 inches due to land movements in the two weeks since initial installation. The lower section was dismantled and rebuilt and then reestablished the support bed. Volunteers and City Staff continue to monitor this trail and others impacted by land movement to assess and make repairs as able.



On June 24, Abalone Cove Trail and a segment of Beach school Trail were temporarily closed while Southern California Edison performed maintenance on a power pole located on Abalone Cove Trail. The work was completed before the end of the day and trails were reopened for public use.

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Alta Vicente Reserve

On June 20, Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy and Contractors began work on non-native Acacia removal near Nike Trail and Prickly Pear Trail. Temporary trail closures are in effect during crew hours between 7am and 4pm through the end of Friday, June 28.



Filiorum Reserve

On June 19, Park Rangers performed minor trail maintenance to clear overgrowth on Gary's Gulch Trail. This trail remains temporarily closed due to land movement. Clearing overgrown trails, including those impacted by land movement, helps the City continue to access these areas to monitor changes on the trail and maintain infrastructure in adjacent areas.



On June 21, Staff continued to trim back native vegetation on Rattlesnake Trail.



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On June 21, Staff trimmed several overhanging branches on Pony Trail blocking one of several carsonites which provides vital information to trail users.



On June 21, Park Rangers trimmed several overhanging branches blocking part of Zote's Cutacross Trail. This also improved visibility of one of several Walk Your Bike zones signs in this Reserve.



On June 24, Staff removed graffiti on one of the several trail counters used to monitor patterns among user groups that access Rattlesnake Trail.

Portuguese Bend Reserve

On June 24, the City coordinated with Contractors to perform minor trail maintenance to clear overgrowth on Ishibashi Trail, Paintbrush Trail, Rim Trail and Grapevine Trail. These trails remain temporarily closed due to land movement. Clearing overgrown trails, including those impacted by land movement, helps the City continue to access these areas to monitor changes on the trail and maintain infrastructure in adjacent areas.

Vicente Bluffs Reserve

Mandatory Restrictions

Based on the recent land movement activity, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes has declared a local state of emergency and accordingly is mandating that property owners turn off sprinkler/irrigation watering systems for the foreseeable future to minimize additional water being absorbed into the ground in the vicinity. Additionally, for those properties with swimming pools, if you experience more water loss than occurs due to evaporation, you must refrain from refilling the pools at this time, and consider emptying your pool to prevent water entering the ground. See the next page for the information on pool draining. Note that your pool must comply with all fencing requirements when it is empty as well.

The health and safety of the public and the protection of property, infrastructure, and the environment are our top priorities. We are committed to keeping the community informed. What's the right way to drain my swimming pool?

To Safely drain your swimming pool, you must direct the water into the sewage system. Pool water should never be directly emptied into storm drains, streets, or yards.

By draining to the sanitary sewer system, the drained water would be sent through a treatment plant.

Why can't I empty pool water into the yard or street?

The concern for the cause of the landslide is ground water.


Draining Water into the yard may add to the ground water and worsen the situation. Additionally, pool water may be contaminated by bacteria, chlorine and other chemicals that can harm humans, wildlife, and vegetation.

How do I access the sanitary sewer to drain my pool?

There are 2 Ways to reach the Sewer Lines: 1. Pools should have a main drain at the deepest point of the pool. Pool Equipment can be used to drain the lines to the sewer line, please reach out to a Pool Contractor or other Pool Professional.

2. A hose can be used to drain to a Sanitary Sewer Cleanout. Sanitary sewer cleanouts provide access to sewage lines. To find your sanitary sewer cleanout look for the end of a pipe sticking out of the ground near your house or along the sewer line. Modern cleanouts normally are capped with a small lid. Sewer vents have a circular grate on top.

To access the sanitary sewer, hold the raised square on the lid of the cleanout and unscrew the cap. Place a hose between your swimming pool and the cleanout. To prevent backflow, do not touch the hose to the bottom of the sewer pipe while draining.



Tools and Materials

It is recommended to contact a Pool Contractor for the draining of a pool as to not damage any of the equipment. Some tools used could be a fully submersible pump, enough garden hose to reach from pool to drainage point, large pliers for accessing the cleanout.

How to Drain an In-ground Pool

1. Turn off or disable the pool pump, lights, auto-leveler, and any automatic timers. Many of these pieces of equipment are liquid-cooled, which means that if left on they will overheat as the water level drops.
2. Attach enough garden hose to get from the pool to the drain point (sewer cleanout line, the road, downhill, or wherever else you're legally allowed to discharge water).
3. Attach the hose to the submersible pump and lower it into the deepest section of the pool.
4. Plug the pump into the pool's GFCI outlet (do not use extension cords). You should hear the pump running.
5. Check the hose to make sure the water's draining properly.
6. Check on the pool periodically throughout the day.
