July 16, 2024, City Council Meeting Highlights

Highlights from the July 16 City Council meeting:

- Rather than spending over \$5 million on a major regrading project that would involve closing Palos Verdes Drive South for several weeks, the Council opted to continue making regular asphalt repairs to the steep section of the roadway between Narcissa and Peppertree Drives, also known as the “ski jump” while continuing to explore alternative engineering options.
- The ski jump spans two sub-slides in the Portuguese Bend Landslide complex that are pulling away from each other, causing cracks that have made the roadway more difficult to traverse and in need of frequent repairs.
- The City will continue to regularly repair the roadway while awaiting landslide mitigation measures to significantly slow the landslide movement.
- The Council also voted not to charge property owners an assessment this year for the Citywide Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District due to sufficient funds and to provide relief to residents at a time when prices in various areas of the economy continue to rise.

Cory's open-door policy and generosity of spirit was extended to all, from the most seasoned City Councilmember to a newly hired Recreation Leader. He will be missed by everyone who crossed his path during his memorable and meaningful tenure with the City. Ski Jump Update

At last night's meeting, the City Council considered options for the repair and maintenance of the "ski jump" — the steep section of Palos Verdes Drive South between Narcissa and Peppertree Drives that frequently cracks due to accelerated land movement.


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
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The ski jump was most recently repaved yesterday. Roadwork is scheduled to continue on Palos Verdes Drive South in the landslide area next week on July 22-26, from approximately 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. daily. Expect delays.

The ski jump spans two sub-slides of the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex that are pulling apart from each other and moving at different speeds, resulting in a recurring large crack running across the roadway. While the west side of the ski jump is rising at a rate of about 1.4 feet per year, the east side is subsiding at about 1.5 feet per year.

The City Council previously directed City staff to research the possibility of completely re-grading the ski jump using innovative materials such as geofoam blocks. However, at last night's meeting, after hearing staff's analysis that this work would likely exceed \$5 million, necessitate roadway closures for several weeks, and require significant maintenance due to the risk of the ski jump continuing to pull apart, the Council decided against regrading the ski jump.

Instead, the City will continue to regularly perform asphalt repairs while exploring additional engineering strategies and awaiting landslide mitigation measures to significantly slow the landslide movement. This work is now expected to cost \$500,000 to \$1 million over the course of a year.

A [roadway closure to bicycles, motorcycles, and all other two-wheeled vehicles](#) remains in effect on Palos Verdes Drive South from Wayfarers Chapel to Schooner Drive for public safety due to the poor condition of the roadway. The Council is expected to revisit this prohibition in December and consider whether to lift or extend it.

The Council is scheduled to receive its next comprehensive landslide update and consider renewing the City's local emergency declaration on August 20.

Wildlife Agencies Tour Landslide Complex

Earlier this week, City staff and the consultant team working on the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraulers Project met with representatives from the California Department of Fish and Wildlife and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service for a tour of the project site. The group received an update on the progress of the project, viewed the test boring sites and proposed hydrauger locations, and discussed impacts to habitat and wildlife, with a focus on avoidance measures and precautions for sensitive habitat and species, such as the Palos Verdes blue butterfly.



Consumer Price Index – June 2024

In June, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) fell by 0.1% over the month, after being unchanged in May. The index for gasoline and energy prices overall decreased on a monthly basis, which offset the monthly increase in shelter. Over the past year, the all items index, or CPI, was measured at 3%, continuing the downward trend.

Excluding food and energy (core CPI), the index rose by 0.1% in June after rising by 0.2% the preceding month. The all items less food and energy index, or core CPI, rose by 3.3% over the last 12 months, reflecting the smallest annual increase since April 2021.

Chart 1. One-month percent change in CPI (U.S), June 2023 – June 2024






Chart 2. 12-month percent change in CPI (U.S)



Consumer Price Index – Los Angeles Area

As measured by the CPI, prices in the Los Angeles area fell by 0.2% in June. The June decrease was influenced by lower prices for gasoline and was the first month of deflation since November 2023. Prices remain elevated when measured over the past 12 months, with CPI rising by 3.2% in June. Measured annually, food prices are up by 3.1%, while energy prices are down by 1.2%. After removing food and energy, core CPI rose by 3.6% over the year, down slightly from the annual increase of 3.8% in May.

Palos Verdes Drive South Repairs in the Landslide Area

Roadway repairs will be performed along Palos Verdes Drive South in the landslide area beginning from July 22 to July 26 from approximately 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Expect delays and consider an alternate route. Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project Update

On May 21, 2024, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraugers with five drain arrays each. The hydraugers will be used to extract and/or intercept groundwater from the landslide area as an emergency stabilization measure to reduce movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide. Following are the most recent activities:

- Drilling of the first five vertical boreholes is complete. Drilling of the sixth vertical borehole has started and is anticipated to be completed by early next week.
- Site preparation ahead of successive vertical borehole drilling continues within

the Portuguese Bend Reserve. Site preparation for the four boreholes on the seaward side of Palos Verdes Drive South is anticipated to start within the next two weeks, pending finalization of the access agreement between the City and the Portuguese Bend Community Association.

- Instrumentation to gauge land movement and further validate the final hydrauger design continues to be installed in each borehole.
- Environmental monitoring is being conducted in conjunction with construction activities. A site visit with the CA Department of Fish & Wildlife and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service was held on July 16.
- A total of 20 boreholes are anticipated to be installed over the course of the next several weeks.

Minor traffic delays are to be expected over the course of the next several weeks as construction materials and equipment deliveries continue to arrive at the Gateway location. 


- Weed removal, brush clearance, and debris removal continued throughout the City at medians and various right-of-way locations.

 - Palos Verdes Drive South

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
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Graffiti Removal

Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) Runway Closure Impacts July 2024

The Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) staff published an aircraft noise advisory due to planned LAX runway closures throughout July. As a result, the community may temporarily experience more aircraft noise than usual. Ground based airport operation disruptions tend to cause an increase in aircraft departure demand before the runway closure occurs. LAX tower controllers may then have the tendency to rush aircraft for takeoff and allow the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) air traffic controllers to organize spacing between aircraft while the aircraft is airborne. When FAA air traffic controllers are spacing out passenger jets, some aircraft will be diverted from their pre-planned offshore routes to a route that flies over the City of Rancho Palos Verdes for safety and/or operational efficiency purposes. July Issue of Turtle Talk Now Available





Abalone Cove Reserve

On July 16, Park Rangers removed graffiti on an orientation panel and fencing located near Rattlesnake Trailhead.



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
On July 16, Park Rangers removed invasive star thistle found along a section of Rattlesnake Trail. This also helps to reduce foot traffic on daylight edge.

Park Rangers will continue to monitor these closures.

LOS ANGELES INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (LAX) Schedule of Upcoming Runway Closures July 2024



The Planning Commission may limit the public input on any item based on the number of people requesting to speak, the length of the agenda, or the business of the Planning Commission.

Conduct at the Planning Commission Meeting:

Pursuant to GC 54957.95: (a)(1) In addition to authority exercised pursuant to Sections 54954.3 and 54957.9, the presiding member of the legislative body conducting a meeting or their designee may remove, or cause the removal of, an individual for disrupting the meeting. (2) Prior to removing an individual, the presiding member or their designee shall warn the individual that their behavior is disrupting the meeting and that their failure to cease their behavior may result in their removal. The presiding member or their designee may then remove the individual if they do not promptly cease their disruptive behavior. This paragraph does not apply to any behavior described in subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b)(1) means engaging in behavior during a meeting of a legislative body that actually disrupts, disturbs, impedes, or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting and includes, but is not limited to, one of the following: (A) A failure to comply with reasonable and lawful regulations adopted by a legislative body pursuant to Section 54954.3 or any other law. (B) Engaging in behavior that constitutes use of force or a true threat of force.(2) "True threat of force" means a threat that has sufficient indicia of intent and seriousness, that a reasonable observer would perceive it to be an actual threat to use force by the person making the threat.

Time Estimates:

The time noted next to an agenda item is only an estimate of the amount of time that will be spent during the meeting on that particular item. Accordingly, these estimates should not be relied on in determining when a matter will be heard, especially since agenda items are often re-ordered during a meeting and may be discussed at any time.

Continuation of Meeting:

Brown Act, “a person may not disclose confidential information that has been acquired by being present in a Closed Session . . . to a person not entitled to receive it, unless the legislative body authorizes disclosure of that confidential information.” (Gov. Code § 54963(a).) “[C]onfidential information” means a communication made in a Closed Session that is specifically related to the basis for the legislative body of a local agency to meet lawfully in Closed Session . . .” (Gov. Code § 54963(a).) Please be further advised that any “violation of [Government Code § 54963] may be addressed by the use of such remedies as are currently available by law, including, but not limited to: (1) injunctive relief to prevent the disclosure of confidential information prohibited by this section; (2) disciplinary action against an [public or city official] who has willfully disclosed confidential information in violation of this section; (3) referral of a member of a legislative body who has willfully disclosed confidential information in violation of this section to a grand jury.” (Gov. Code § 54963(c).)
