Land Movement Updates



State of Emergency Request

Since the City requested Governor Gavin Newsom declare a state of emergency in response to natural gas shutoffs in the Portuguese Bend community, the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) has requested staff submit preliminary cost estimates for damages related to the emergency. These estimates will help Cal OES determine whether a state of emergency will be declared at the state level and what potential assistance can be made available.

With help from the Portuguese Bend Community Association, City staff is finalizing the damage estimates, which include costs incurred by residents who have reported spending tens of thousands of dollars on propane and solar energy conversion projects, as well as the City's emergency expenses. The final estimates will be submitted to Cal OES today.

The City's goal in seeking a state of emergency due to a sudden and severe energy shortage is to emphasize the need for individual financial assistance for residents who have been without gas service for over two weeks. Cal OES's determination will be shared with the community as soon as it is available.

SCE Update

In case you missed it, Southern California Edison (SCE) has updated its dedicated RPV webpage with frequently asked questions about the potential of discontinuing electricity in the landslide area. Explore this new section at: sce.com/rpv.

On August 2, the City sent a letter to SCE Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer Jill C. Anderson raising serious concerns about the potential of cutting electricity to the landslide area and urging efforts to minimize any disruptions as much as possible. On August 9, Ms. Anderson provided a response, noting that SCE is "moving forward with urgency to reconfigure portions of the electric system and install devices in the area to limit the impact of potential future outages should the hazardous conditions worsen." Ms. Anderson also stated that "to the extent conditions continue to

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deteriorate, SCE may be required to temporarily de-energize some circuits or portions of circuits, and we will continue to work on alternate service options. In addition, we may further be required to permanently discontinue service to some locations if necessary to maintain public safety.”

The City remains in regular contact with SCE and has requested the earliest possible notice of any potential temporary or long-term electricity shutoffs. Copies of both letters are available on the City website:

Last week, Mayor John Cruikshank sent a letter to Tesla CEO Elon Musk seeking assistance for homeowners in the landslide area impacted by the gas shutoffs and potential electricity shutoffs. Mayor Cruikshank stated that a potential partnership to equip impacted homes with solar panels and Powerwall batteries would not only provide these residents with immediate relief, but also demonstrate the viability of clean energy solutions in a real-world scenario, further solidifying Tesla's role as a leader in the green energy revolution. New LACSD Webpage

The Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts (LACSD) is the wastewater utility provider for Rancho Palos Verdes residents. LACSD's main sewer trunk lines transport all wastewater out of the area to be processed at its treatment plants. All local resident sewer lines flow to LACSD trunk lines. The operation and preservation of these sewer trunk lines is imperative for handling wastewater and sewage appropriately to protect the health and wellbeing of residents and the environment. **Currently, LACSD's sewer lines continue to operate normally.** In the event of unforeseen land movement that severely compromises LACSD infrastructure in the Peninsula area, LACSD has created [a webpage](#) with information for residents about what to expect and what to do.

The website contains information that will be updated frequently in accordance with any major disruption. It also contains information pertaining to **potential** disruption, not current circumstances. In the event of future catastrophic land movement, residents will be directed to access the information on this page frequently for updates.

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Communications will also be sent broadly across all City and LACSD communication platforms as frequently as necessary. LACSD staff may also be active onsite depending on the severity of the situation. Follow LACSD on social media:



FINANCE DEPARTMENT

Consumer Price Index – July 2024

In July, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 0.2% over the month, after falling by 0.1% in June. The index for shelter rose by 0.4% in July and accounted for nearly 90% of the monthly increase, with the energy index remaining unchanged. Over the past year, the all items index, or CPI, increased by 2.9% and continued its downward trend.

Excluding food and energy (core CPI), the index rose by 0.2% from June to July and rose by 3.2% over the last 12 months. The latest measure of core CPI was the smallest 12-month increase in that index since April 2021.

Chart 1. One-month percent change in CPI (U.S), July 2023 – July 2024






Chart 2. 12-month percent change in CPI (U.S.)



Consumer Price Index – Los Angeles Area

As measured by the CPI, prices in the Los Angeles area increased by 0.2% in July. The monthly increase was attributed to higher prices for shelter. Over the past 12 months, CPI rose by 3.4%, following a 3.2% rise in June. Measured annually, food prices rose by 2.2%, while energy prices fell by 3.8% because of a decrease in the price of gasoline. The index for all items less food and energy increased 4.2% over the year.

FAC Meeting Recap

In the latest meeting of the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) held on August 8, several key items were discussed. As a first order of business, the Committee unanimously appointed Member John MacAllister as Vice Chair for the duration of the current committee's tenure. The meeting went on to include an overview of the City's financials provided by Staff, a review of options to reduce the Unfunded Accrued Liability (UAL), and a discussion regarding procedures for requesting a Nexus Study. A notable outcome of the meeting was the formation of an ad hoc subcommittee tasked to review Additional Discretionary Payment (ADP) scenarios and available strategies to proactively manage the City's UAL. The subcommittee will review these items in greater detail to help develop optimal recommendations for the City Council's consideration. Lastly, after discussing the Nexus Study, the FAC recommended to seek City Council consideration for developing a Nexus report related to development impact fees.

PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS

Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project Update

On May 21, 2024, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraugers with five drain arrays each. The hydraugers will be used to extract and/or intercept groundwater from the landslide area as an emergency stabilization measure to reduce movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide. Following are the most recent activities:

- Drilling of the vertical boreholes landward of Palos Verdes Drive South (PVDS) for Emergency Hydrauger E-1 is complete.
- Three of four boreholes seaward of PVDS for Emergency Hydrauger E-1 have been completed. Access to the recently relocated fourth borehole is being prepared, followed by drilling by the end of this week.
- Instrumentation to gauge land movement and further validate the final hydraugger design continues to be installed in each borehole.
- Mapping of the depths and shapes of underwater terrain ([bathymetry](#) survey) is underway to obtain more information about the lower section of the landslide located along the coast.
- Environmental, archaeological and paleontological monitoring is being conducted in conjunction with construction activities.
- A second smaller drilling rig is being mobilized to complete the balance of boreholes landward of PVDS within the Portuguese Bend Reserve.

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Minor traffic delays are to be expected over the course of the next several weeks as construction materials and equipment deliveries continue to arrive at the Gateway location. If you must drive through this area during this time, please proceed slowly, yield to workers, and obey traffic control at the site. Thank you for your patience. To ensure their safety and effectiveness, a temporary electrified fence is in place to contain them while they graze. Please respect the boundaries and avoid attempting to take selfies, pictures, or touch the goats, especially if you have dogs or other pets with you. This helps prevent unnecessary stress or injury to both you and the goats.



Additionally, Stay Green crews will be active in various areas of the city, performing brush clearance as part of the City's 2024 fuel modification program.

- Completed grinding of the sidewalk deviations along 2,000 ft of sidewalk on Hawthorne Boulevard between Locklenna Lane and Crest Road.

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
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Graffiti Removal

August Issue of Turtle Talk Now Available

No Construction on Monday, September 2, 2024 (Labor Day)

Pursuant to Section 17.56.020(B) of the City's Development Code, it is unlawful to conduct any construction, grading, or landscaping activities, or to operate heavy equipment except between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. Monday through Friday, and between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on Saturday. No such activity shall be permitted on Sundays, or the legal holidays (within the city's permitted construction hours), unless a Special Construction Permit is approved by the Community Development Director. Carbon Monoxide Alarm Preparedness

Carbon monoxide alarms are designed to provide warning of any unusual build-up of carbon monoxide in a home. Higher levels of carbon monoxide may occur from improperly maintained, installed, or used fuel-burning appliances, back-drafting appliances or fireplaces, or idling cars in garages. Carbon monoxide alarms are required for existing buildings and new construction, where the two conditions exist:



- 1) The dwelling unit contains a fuel-fired appliance or fireplace.
- 2) The dwelling unit has an attached garage with an opening that communicates with the dwelling unit.

RESPONSE TO NOTICE OF POTENTIAL SERVICE SHUT OFF DUE TO LAND MOVEMENT

Dear Ms. Anderson:

On behalf of the City Council and residents of Rancho Palos Verdes, I am writing this letter in my capacity as City Manager. On July 30, 2024, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes received your community update regarding the potential shut off of power in the landslide area if conditions warrant. The City understands that, over the past 18 months, land movement within the Greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex has been considerable. However, we are very concerned that the consequences of deenergizing neighborhoods within the landslide will result in deenergizing neighborhoods outside of the landslide and are not unduly impacted by the land movement.

It is my understanding that the affected circuit serves upwards of 525 properties in Seaview, Portuguese Bend Community, and Portuguese Bend Beach Club, as well as Sea Cliff Hills, a neighborhood that lies outside the landslide. My concern is that in the event of an electricity shut-off for safety reasons due to the land movement, Sea Cliff Hills will be impacted for an indefinite timeframe, potentially displacing thousands of residents whose public utilities remain intact for the most part. With this in mind, I strongly urge SCE to begin the process to split the circuit immediately so that the impact of any landslide related shut-off is minimized and does not expand into unaffected areas.

Additionally, SCE should know and take into account that a power shut-off in the landslide area will directly impact critical services such as important communication lines, as well as de-energize the City's and hazard abatement districts' much needed dewatering wells that are used to remove groundwater to decelerate land movement. Furthermore, the City has been diligently working to install hydraulers that will penetrate below the slip plane to alleviate artesian pressure, and needs power to pump water out. I emphasize that SCE's decision to shut

off power can have significant adverse effects on City efforts to slow the landslide, and I implore SCE to study the grid and to separate the circuit to minimize service disruption.

Finally, as SCE is well aware, there are a number of vulnerable residents within SCE's service area. While SCE has a number of resources available to provide alternative sources of power, I urge you to directly reach out to the community to identify which households have such residents and begin working with them now to prepare for the eventuality of a deenergization event.

I am writing in response to your letter dated August 2, 2024, which addresses the pressing situation in Rancho Palos Verdes. I deeply appreciate your concern for the safety and well-being of the residents and businesses affected by the land movement. We are aligned on prioritizing the safety of the community, our employees, and the vulnerable customers that we serve.

Southern California Edison (SCE) is committed to providing our customers with reliable and safe electric service. We have been working closely with the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and other stakeholders to monitor and mitigate the impact of land movement on our infrastructure and operations. We are communicating regularly with our customers to inform them of the potential risks of outages and contingency plans.

We want to reassure you that we are working proactively to maintain service where it is safe and feasible to do so. We are moving forward with urgency to reconfigure portions of the electric system and install devices in the area to limit the impact of potential future outages should the hazardous conditions worsen. We appreciate the City's support in these efforts, as additional poles and overhead conductor will need to be installed in the coming months.

We are expediting the interconnection process for customers who choose to install self-generation systems, offering rebates or loans for backup batteries or generators, and where possible, providing connection points for the city to power its critical facilities. We will continue to collaborate with other utility providers to support the continuity of essential services where and when it is safe to do so, which includes communications service, dewatering wells and others you mentioned in your letter.

As the City knows, the situation continues to evolve and is unpredictable. To the extent conditions continue to deteriorate, SCE may be required to temporarily de-energize some circuits or portions of circuits, and we will continue to work on alternate service options. In addition, we may further be required to permanently discontinue service to some locations if necessary to maintain public safety.

We appreciate your support and cooperation in this matter and will continue to update you through our Liaison Officer assigned to the Incident Management Team or through Celina Luna.

I hope this letter finds you well. I am writing to you as the Mayor of Rancho Palos Verdes (RPV), a coastal community in Los Angeles County known for its commitment to sustainability and innovation. Recently, a significant challenge has arisen that I believe Tesla, with its visionary leadership in renewable energy, can help us address.

Rancho Palos Verdes is a small community with a major infrastructure problem on its hands. It is working against one of the largest landslides in North America. Reactivated in 1956, the ancient Greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex has been slowly moving for decades, damaging homes, utilities, and roads along the way. However, historic rainstorms in 2023 and 2024 accelerated its movement to an unprecedented rate of 9-12 inches per week.

In particular, the landslide has significantly damaged utilities including gas, power, sewer, and communication lines. On July 29, 2024, SoCalGas abruptly cut natural gas service to 135 homes, with no indication it will be restored in the future; on July 30, Southern California Edison notified over 500 homes that power may also be discontinued if conditions warrant. Since then, residents have been scrambling to find alternate means of heating water, cooking meals, and warming homes in preparation for a potentially rainy winter season.

While our community is resilient, this situation presents a unique opportunity to turn a setback into a showcase of sustainable living. Given Tesla's advancements in solar technology and energy storage solutions, we see a potential partnership to equip these homes with solar panels and Powerwall batteries. This initiative would not only provide these residents with immediate relief, but also demonstrate the viability of clean energy solutions in a real-world scenario, further solidifying Tesla's role as a leader in the green energy revolution.

By working together, we can turn this challenge into a powerful statement on the future of energy, showing the world that sustainability is not just an ideal, but also a practical solution to the problems of today.


