Land Movement Updates



Sewer Update

Over the weekend, land movement caused an approximately 10,000-gallon sewer spill on private property along Palos Verdes Drive South near Narcissa Drive. Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts (LACSD), the agency that operates the main trunk sewers that transport wastewater out of the Palos Verdes Peninsula, quickly responded to stop the spill and make an emergency repair.

It is the City's understanding that this incident was the first significant break in LACSD's infrastructure due to ongoing land movement. We continue to work closely with LACSD to expedite permitting for repair work, as needed, as well as efforts to install an above-ground by-pass sewer pipe along Palos Verdes Drive South.

Saturday morning's incident underscores the urgent need to slow the land movement and prevent a major sewer failure, which would have a far-reaching impact across the Peninsula.

As a reminder, in the event of unforeseen land movement that severely compromises LACSD infrastructure on the Peninsula, LACSD has created a webpage with information for residents about what to expect and what to do: lacsd.org/rpv. The website contains information that will be updated frequently in accordance with any major disruption. It also contains information pertaining to **potential** disruption, not current circumstances. In the event of future catastrophic land movement, residents will be directed to access the information on this page frequently for updates. Please bookmark the link on your phone or computer.

Please report sewage overflows or sewer emergencies to LACSD by calling its 24-hour number, 562-437-6520.

September 3 City Council Meeting

On September 3, the City Council will consider extending the building moratorium that was put in place in the landslide area when a state of emergency was declared in October 2023 due to accelerated land movement. If approved, the moratorium would remain in effect through October 2, 2025.

The Council will also consider establishing regulations and procedures to help homeowners in the landslide area stabilize and level their houses. These temporary solutions include placing homes on cargo structures and other leveling systems, such as I-beams, and installing alternative foundation systems to help maintain the integrity of the structure as the land shifts.

SB 1461 Update

Senator Ben Allen's landslide legislation, SB 1461, continues to move through the state Legislature, which adjourns this weekend. The bill, scheduled for a vote in the Assembly today, would add "landslide" as a condition of constituting a state of emergency or local emergency in the Emergency Services Act. A status update will be provided in the next community update. The City continues to wait for word from the state on whether

Governor Gavin Newsom will declare a state of emergency in response to SoCalGas' shutoffs in the Portuguese Bend community, opening up the potential for funding to help address landslide impacts. The City requested a state of emergency under one of the existing conditions in the Emergency Services Act, a "sudden and severe energy shortage."

The City will continue to provide regular community updates at rpvca.gov/landmovement.

Back To School Emergency Preparedness

Now that the kids are back to school, it is a great time to make sure that everyone knows what to do if an emergency occurs. Start by asking yourself the following questions; if you don't have a family emergency plan, use the answers to these questions to make one! Make sure to review the plan with the whole family and practice it at least twice a year. Doing this can help your family stay safe and reconnect if something happens.

1. How will family members be alerted if an emergency happens?

Consider different types of emergencies, different times and dates that an emergency can occur, and where each family member may be in each scenario.

2. How should you respond during different emergencies to stay safe?

For example, during an earthquake—Drop, Cover, and Hold On. The goal is to avoid/protect yourself against anything that can fall on you, or that you can fall into.

3. How will you get in contact with family members to make sure they're okay?

Consider ways to connect if the cell phones aren't working and remember that, during disasters, text and data will work better than phone calls; in addition, out of area calls will work better than local calls.

4. Where will you meet if you can't get a hold of each other?

Schools often have emergency plans to help reunify families during school hours, but you should also consider scenarios when children are not in school. Pick a safe, familiar location where you can reunify after an emergency and make sure everyone knows how to get there from the locations they frequent the most.





Case-Shiller Home Price Indices – June 2024

This week, data from the S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Home Price Indices, the leading measure of residential real estate prices, were released for June. This information provides insight into the housing market by highlighting monthly and annual changes reported in the National and Los Angeles Home Price Indices.

Month-over-Month

The upward trends continued to decelerate from last month, with the National Index posting a month-over-month increase of 0.2% in June, before seasonal adjustments. Home prices in the Los Angeles area rose by 0.6%, down slightly compared to prior monthly gains.

Year-over-Year

The National Index reported a 5.9% annual gain in June, from a 5.9% annual gain in the



previous month. The annual gain for Los Angeles was at 8.2% and continues to remain above the national average. Although housing and inflation have both slowed, the gap between them is larger than usual, with our National Index growing at an average rate of 2.8% above the Consumer Price Index.

Palos Verdes Drive South Repairs in the Landslide Area

Emergency roadway repairs will be performed along Palos Verdes Drive South in the landslide area on August 29 from approximately 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Additionally, roadway repairs will be performed along Palos Verdes Drive South near the Wayfarers Chapel site beginning on September 3 from approximately 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. and in the landslide area from September 4 - 6 from approximately 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.



Expect delays and consider an alternate route. If you must drive through this area during this time, please proceed slowly, yield to workers, and obey traffic control at the site. Thank you for your patience. If you have questions, please call Public Works on 310-544-5252.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project Update

On May 21, 2024, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraugers with five drain arrays each. The hydraugers were preceded by test boreholes

to better understand underground conditions. Those boreholes revealed a deeper slide plane that is moving at a much faster rate than the shallow slide plane. This unprecedented movement of the deeper slip plane is resulting in a change in the landslide remediation strategy to prioritize the deeper slip plane. Test boreholes will continue in the landslide area to complete the picture of underground conditions throughout the landslide. Meanwhile, vertical dewatering wells that will penetrate the deeper slide plane to relieve water pressure are being designed as quickly as possible.

Goats Are Back for the 2024 Fuel Modification Season!

Goats are back to perform the important job of helping reduce fire loads and protecting homes in areas that were postponed due to active bird nesting activities. Although we understand many people enjoy seeing the goats, please refrain from going to see them out of respect for residents living near where the goats work.



A temporary electrified fence is used to contain the goats while they are working and attempting to approach them puts you, as well as the goats, at risk. Please avoid attempting to take selfies/pictures or trying to touch the goats, especially if you have dogs or pets with you. This will prevent stress and/or injury to you and the goats.

In addition to the goats, you may see Stay Green crews performing brush clearance in various areas of the City as part of the City's 2024 fuel modification program.



City Council to Evaluate Housing Sites Inventory of the City's 2021-2029 Housing Element

On September 3, 2024, the City Council will evaluate Staff's assessment of the Housing Sites Inventory of the City's 2021-2029 Housing Element, which was adopted on April 16, 2024. Staff's assessment identifies properties from the Housing Element Sites Inventory based on the minimal number of units (15 or fewer) that are expected to be developed on each site and their designation as 'above moderate' income level units. The assessment then evaluates if the sites are identified as part of a larger consolidation potential, if they are vacant, and the percentage of the area that could likely be developed. The purpose of the evaluation is to determine if there are sites that could reasonably be removed from the Housing Element while still addressing housing needs.
