September 3, 2024, City Council Meeting Highlights

Highlights from the September 3 City Council meeting:

- The Council extended the building moratorium in the landslide area through October 2025 and established regulations and procedures to help homeowners in the landslide area stabilize and level their houses.
- These temporary solutions include placing homes on cargo structures and other leveling systems, such as I-beams, and installing alternative foundation systems to help maintain the integrity of the structure as the land shifts.
- The Council voted (3 yeas, 1 no, 1 abstain) to support PVPUSD's school bond measure on the November 5 ballot. If approved by 55% of voters, the measure would provide PVPUSD with \$297,800,000 to complete high priority facility improvements.
- The Council directed City staff to explore removing several sites from the inventory of properties the 6th Cycle Housing Element that are identified as available and suitable for residential development.
- City staff will draft an ordinance regulating the use of e-bikes in the City, which will be presented at a future Council meeting.

Land Movement Updates



Evacuation Warning Remains in Effect for PBCA Due to Power Shutoff

An Evacuation Warning remains in effect for the Portuguese Bend Community Association (PBCA) neighborhood, pending the continuity of sewer operation, in the following [zones](#) due to today's power shutoff:

- RPV-E0160
- RPV-E0155-A
- RPV-E0155-B
- RPV-E0150

Electricity service was discontinued indefinitely in these zones at 12 p.m. PST on September 1. The City and PBCA

have installed generators to keep the sewer system operational. **However, an Evacuation Warning remains in effect in the event of a sewer failure in the interest of public health and safety.**

Residents who choose to remain in their homes are asked to limit their use of water and plumbing, especially overnight when generators may be turned off for periods at a time. Examples of ways to limit use include taking short 3-minute showers, avoiding unnecessary flushes, turning off the tap while doing dishes, and running dishwashers and washing machines only with full loads.

Without gas and electricity service, many residents may choose to seek alternative housing arrangements for the foreseeable future. The Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department is increasing its presence and patrols in the PBCA neighborhood.

The City is identifying hotels and other accommodations that can offer discounted rates for residents. A [list \(PDF\)](#) will be updated on the City website.

SCE Shuts Off Power to Portions of Seaview Neighborhood; No Evacuation Warning in Effect

On September 1, Southern California Edison (SCE) notified the City and 105 out of 270 Seaview homes that their electricity service will be discontinued for varying lengths of time, due to the risk of utility equipment igniting a wildfire and other hazards caused by downed wires or damaged equipment impacted by landslide movement. The power shutoff started on September 2 at approximately 7 p.m. to the following:

- 47 homes will be without power for 24 hours
- 38 properties will be without power for 1 to 3 weeks
- 20 properties will be without power indefinitely

Each of the affected 105 homes has received an individual notice from SCE that identifies the length of time they will be without power. Households should carefully reference that notification for details.

At this time, there is no evacuation warning or order for Seaview. In contrast to the Portuguese Bend Community, Seaview's sewage collection system is gravity fed and operated/maintained by LA County Department of Public Works using generators. As a result, there is no imminent public health concern related to the sewer system. However, please identify your specific [zone](#), in the event authorities need to issue an evacuation notice in the future.

Governor Newsom Declares State of Emergency in RPV Amid Power Shutoffs Due to Land Movement

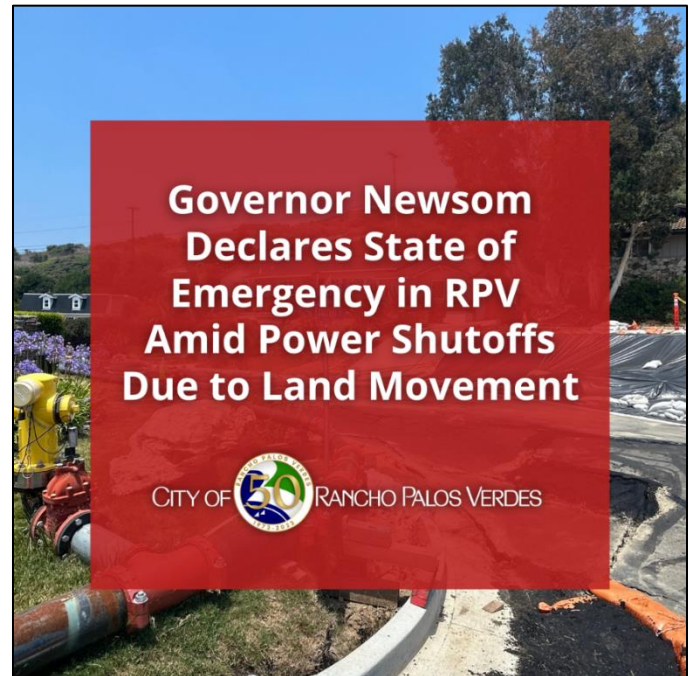
On September 3, Governor Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency in the City amid ongoing severe land movement that has disrupted utility services and prompted evacuation warnings to approximately 140 households to the Portuguese Bend Community Association (PBCA).

This proclamation opens up State resources, including emergency personnel, equipment, services and financial assistance to the City as it responds to the de-energization of residences in PBCA and portions of the Seaview neighborhood.

“The City has been navigating this crisis for almost two years, and the skyrocketing costs of responding to this emergency are taking a toll on our coffers,” said Rancho Palos Verdes City Manager Ara Mihranian. “For months, we have been asking for public assistance from every level of government. This announcement of a state of emergency declaration brings much needed financial assistance for the City to respond to recent power shutoffs that are upending our residents’ lives. We look forward to working with Cal OES and the Los Angeles County Office of Emergency Management on the next steps in this process.”

The Governor's declaration does not open up individual financial assistance to affected residents. The City continues to strongly call on Gov. Newsom and the California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) to ask President Joe Biden to declare a federal disaster in the City, which would trigger the deployment of Federal Emergency Management (FEMA) resources and potentially individual assistance.

At a 3 p.m. special meeting on September 3, the City Council voted to amend the state of emergency declaration adopted on Aug. 6 to include the Sept. 1-2 power shutoffs and expand the covered area to include the Seaview neighborhood. As part of this action, the Council authorized the Mayor to sign a letter to Cal OES, Gov. Newsom and FEMA requesting individual assistance for residents impacted by the accelerated movement in the landslide.

Power Outage Safety

September is preparedness month, and with the current emergency our City is experiencing, it is more important than ever to prepare yourself for any emergency that can occur. Read below to learn how to prepare for power outages and shutoffs:



Be prepared for power shutoffs and outages

1. Learn how to manually operate your garage doors and gates.
2. Make emergency plans for where you will go and how you will get there if there is a long-term power outage.
3. Plan backups for medical devices that require electricity.
4. Have flashlights with extra batteries and portable chargers available for no notice power outages.
5. Consider purchasing a residential or portable generator to meet your household power needs.

GENERATOR SAFETY TIPS



1. Consult with a licensed electrician and follow manufacturer instructions when installing and operating any type of generator. For residential generators, you will also need to reach out to the City's Building & Safety Division to obtain a permit for installation.

2. Station generators at least 5 feet from any structures, in a dry location and away from any flammable landscaping. NEVER run a portable generator indoors or close to windows and doors.
3. Make sure you have carbon monoxide alarms on all levels of your home and a fire extinguisher onsite and easily accessible.
4. Inspect generators regularly to ensure there are no leaks or spills.
5. For portable generators – NEVER plug a generator directly into any electric outlets, this can create a fire!

During a power shutoff lasting more than 2 hours:

1. Carefully turn off and unplug electrical equipment to avoid power surge damage when power is restored. Leave one light on to know when power comes back on.
2. Keep freezers and refrigerators closed and remember that a full freezer will maintain its temperature for about 48 hours and a full fridge will maintain its temperature for about 4 hours.
3. Remember that power outages can impact water and sewage systems. If your power is out, check with the City before using plumbing and water facilities to avoid sewage spills.
4. If the carbon monoxide alarm sounds, there is a smell of gas or rotten eggs, or you feel sick, dizzy, or weak while using a generator, move quickly away from the area to a place with fresh air RIGHT AWAY - DO NOT DELAY.
5. Consider finding another place to stay if you will be without power for more than 48 hours.

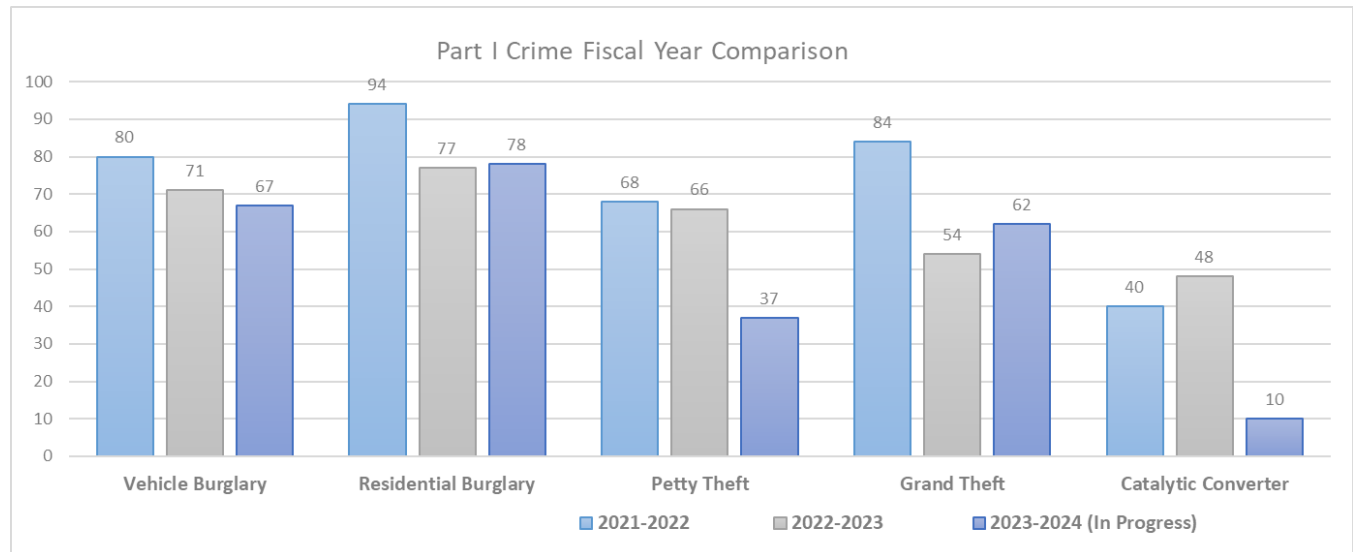

2024 Assessment Roll

Los Angeles County Assessor, Jeffrey Prang, recently announced the final Assessment Roll (Roll) figures for calendar year 2024. The Assessment Roll is the annual inventory of all taxable real and business property in the County from which property taxes are calculated and collected. The total 2024 Roll net value for Rancho Palos Verdes is \$17.1 billion, a \$705.45 million or 4.3% increase over the prior year.

Countywide, the 2024 Roll reflects a total net value of \$2.094 trillion, representing the 14th year of consecutive property value growth; a \$97 billion increase or 4.85% growth

over 2023. That total value will generate over \$20 billion to be allocated for vital local public services, such as public safety, public schools, roads, hospitals, and librarians, to name just a few.

Locally, Rancho Palos Verdes includes 15,078 single-family homes, 44 apartment complexes, and 217 commercial-industrial parcels for a grand total of 15,339 taxable properties. Palos Verdes Drive South Repairs in the Landslide Area

Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project Update

On May 21, 2024, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraugers with five drain arrays each. The hydraugers were preceded by test boreholes to better understand underground conditions. Those boreholes revealed a deeper slide plane that is moving at a much faster rate than the shallow slide plane. This unprecedented rate of movement of the deeper slip plane is resulting in a change in the landslide remediation strategy to prioritize the deeper slip plane. Test boreholes will continue in the landslide area to complete the picture of underground conditions

throughout the landslide. Meanwhile, vertical dewatering wells that will penetrate the deeper slide plane to relieve water pressure are being designed as quickly as possible.

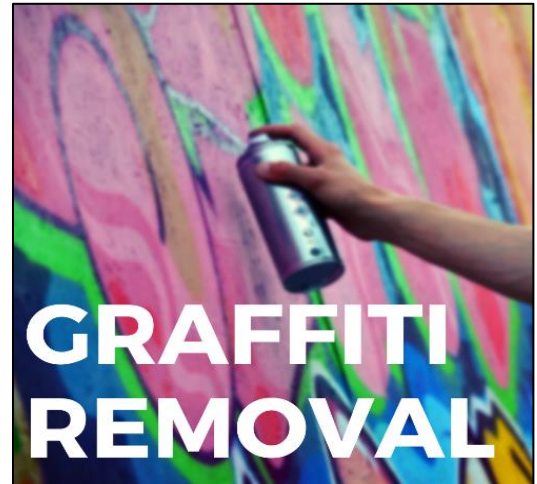


- Filled a pothole on Miraleste Drive

2021-2029 Housing Element Update

On September 4, the City Council considered Staff's assessment of the Housing Sites Inventory of the adopted 2021-2029 Housing Element, which identified properties that could be removed from the inventory list while remaining in compliance with State Housing Laws. Based on an evaluation of the information, the City Council directed Staff to prepare a revised draft of the City's 2021-2029 Housing Element to remove three sites from the Housing Element's Housing Sites Inventory. The three sites include:

- No. 16- APN: 7573-006-024 (Southeast of Clipper Road and PVDS)
- No. 18- APN: 7564-024-001 (West of UCLA South Bay Site)
- No. 19- 30800 Palos Verdes Drive East

The City Council also directed Staff to submit the revised draft to the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) for formal review with compliance with State Housing Law. If HCD deems the document compliant, Staff will proceed to prepare the necessary documents and conduct the required public hearings to reflect draft revisions. Planning Division Monthly Activity Report

The Planning Division's Monthly Activity Report for August 2024 summarizes the division's activities during this past month regarding new applications received and Staff, Planning Commission, and City Council decisions rendered. Building and Safety Division Monthly Activity

The Building and Safety Division's Monthly Activity Report for August 2024 reports on 1) a summary of the new cases received delineated by application type; 2) the number of

Code Enforcement Division Monthly Activity

The Code Enforcement Division's Monthly Activity Report for August 2024 reports on 1) violations by category; 2) the number of closed cases by violation with median processing times; and 3) illegal sign abatement. As indicated in the attached report, the division conducted 278 field inspections and brought 104 cases to closure.

The Planning Commission's regular meeting scheduled on September 10, 2024 has been canceled. The next regularly scheduled meeting is Tuesday, September 24, 2024.

What is a cooling center?
Cooling centers are designed to provide relief and protection during extreme heat. During extreme heat events, the City will provide free, indoor, air-conditioned locations where you can cool down, especially if you do not have access to air conditioning, are older, have very young children, or have certain health conditions

When are Cooling Centers open?
The City Manager or their designee may open cooling centers when the temperature is forecast to exceed 85 degrees for a period of 24 hours or more, when the temperature exceeds 85 degrees and the City experiences a power outage, or when a heat warning, excessive heat advisory, or excessive heat watch is issued.

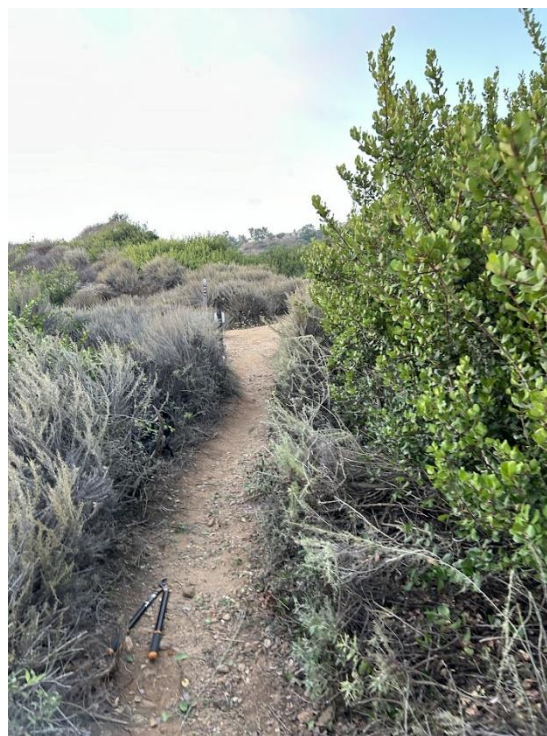
