Emergency Supply Checklist

After an emergency, you may need to survive on your own for several days. Being prepared means having your own food, water and other supplies readily on hand. You should have emergency supplies for your household next to your bed and/or in your car

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and to take with you if you must evacuate. Update your emergency supply kits every six months, and make sure to replace expired and malfunctioning items, along with changing alarm and flashlight batteries.

As you read the emergency supply checklists below, consider what [unique needs](#) your family might have, such as supplies for [children, seniors, or pets](#).

NEXT TO YOUR BED

- Sturdy shoes
- A flashlight or light stick
- A whistle and/or help sign with tape
- Protective clothing such as a helmet and N95 mask



IN YOUR CAR

- Jumper cable
- Tow rope
- Map
- Tire and Jack
- Phone chargers
- Flashlight with batteries or light sticks
- A fully charged phone (doesn't need to be activated just usable to call 911)
- At least half a tank of gas



EVACUATION SUPPLIES

Put supplies in one or two easy-to-carry containers such as plastic bins, duffel bags, or backpacks. Consider what you will need if you must evacuate and can't return home.



- 3-day supply of non-perishable food, water, and medicine/medical supplies
- First aid kit
- Extra clothes
- Protective gear (ex. mask, gloves)
- Flashlight with batteries or light sticks
- Important devices with portable chargers
- Hygiene items (ex. hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes, feminine supplies)
- Important documents (insurance policies, identification, bank account records, etc.) saved electronically or in a waterproof, portable container
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person
- Cash (ATMs may not work if the power is out)

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- Local maps
- Non-electronic entertainment (books, games, puzzles)
- Comfort items and extra supplies for animals and children (ex. diapers for babies, carriers for pets, favorite toys)

Household emergency supplies

Your household emergency supplies are similar to those in your evacuation kit; however, this time you are preparing for what you will need if you must shelter at home during an emergency.



- Water for drinking and sanitation (one gallon per person per day for 2 weeks – don't forget to count your animals!)
- Food (2 week supply of non-perishable food)
- Prescription medications and extra medical supplies (ex. Glasses, walker)
- Manual can opener (for food)
- Portable chargers
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Dust mask (to help filter contaminated air)
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter in place during a hazardous material event)
- Hygiene items
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties (for personal sanitation)
- Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities)
- Important documents
- Non electronic entertainment
- Fire extinguishers, carbon monoxide alarms, and fire alarms on every level of the home
- A generator (ensure you speak to an electrician and follow the generator's instructions before installation and use to avoid fires and carbon monoxide poisoning)



Apply for a Public Safety Reimbursement from the City

The City of Rancho Palos Verdes offers reimbursements for half the cost of a new doorbell or neighborhood camera system, up to \$2,000 for neighborhoods/HOAs, and up to \$100 for individuals. The City aims to encourage the use of cameras and other public safety tools to strengthen neighborhood vigilance and security.

Retail Headlines – September 2024

Retail news this month includes stories about off-price retailers' growth, used vehicle sale increases, strong performances by ecommerce sales, and more.

Unexpected Retail Sales Growth for August 2024

A report from the Commerce Department in September showed retail sales were stronger than initially predicted during summer 2024. Retail sales increased by 0.1% last month, following a revised increase of 1.1% in July. Polled economists had originally predicted a 0.2% drop in retail sales, following the surge in July. Sales at sporting goods, hobby, musical instruments and bookstores increased by 0.3%.

Other industries that saw increased retail sales include: building material, garden equipment, and health and personal care outlets. Industries that saw decreased retail sales include: furniture stores, electronics and appliance outlets, clothing, motor vehicle parts, and department stores. Some of the decline in sales may be due to lower prices rather than decreased volume of sales, as prices for some goods have been on a downward trend.

Off-Price Retailers Take the Lead from Other Department Stores

Off-price retailers like TJ MAXX, Ross, and Burlington have experienced growth in the second quarter of 2024. While online sales for apparel and footwear have plateaued, shoppers have been more inclined to purchase retail items from stores like TJ Maxx, whose net sales rose 5.6% for the second quarter of 2024 in the United States, Canada, Europe, and Australia. Analysts have attributed some of the success of off-price retailers to a real estate advantage with most located in small centers with convenient parking.

Used Vehicle Sales See Noticeable Increase for August 2024

A total of 1.7 million used vehicles were sold from franchised and independent dealers during August 2024. This is an increase of 13.6% year over year and up from less than 1.3 million in June. According to analysts, the sales increase is partly attributed to the

change in inventory. Notably, there was an increased rise in units sold priced under \$15,000 in August. However, there was a decrease in Certified Pre-Owned sales in August, down 3.3% year over year. It is noted that the decrease is likely due to a lack of supply, with fewer trade-in units.

U.S. eCommerce Sales Mark the Third-Highest Sales in a Quarter

The second quarter of 2024 saw the third highest sales of a quarter, behind Q4 2023 and Q4 2022. The second quarter of 2024 recorded \$282.289 billion in online retail sales. Historically, Q4 is always the best performing for eCommerce sales, due to the holiday shopping season. No other quarters have broken past the \$282 million threshold, until now. U.S. eCommerce first crossed the \$100 billion mark back in Q4 2015.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project Update

On May 21, 2024, the City Council approved the Portuguese Bend Landslide Remediation Emergency Hydraugers Project, which consists of the installation of two hydraugers with five drain arrays each. The hydraugers were preceded by test boreholes to better understand underground conditions. Those boreholes affirmed a deeper slide plane was activated recently and is moving at a much faster rate than the shallow slide plane.

The unprecedented rate of movement of the deeper slide plane changed the landslide remediation strategy to first address the deeper slide plane. This is being done by installing vertical deep de-watering wells to penetrate the deeper slide plane and relieve water pressure (artesian pressure).

Four deep dewatering wells have been installed, with a combined dewatering rate of approximately 450 gallons per minute. Drilling of the fifth dewatering well has started and is expected to be complete by this Thursday or sooner. Three boreholes with instruments to measure water pressure (piezometers) are being installed near the dewatering wells to collect data on water pressure reduction. The first instrumented borehole was completed last week and the second is expected to be completed by the end of this week.


Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) Adopts Traffic Request Framework

On September 23, the Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) adopted the Traffic Request Framework for processing traffic requests. The Public Works Department (PW) receives numerous service calls and a variety of requests that range from responding to utility/infrastructure emergencies, routine maintenance, to issues that involve detailed evaluation/analysis or engineering studies. A very high proportion of these calls and requests involve issues related to traffic. Despite the engagement of on-call traffic consultants acting as technical advisors and as an extension of City Staff, the sheer volume of these calls has resulted in a backlog of issues waiting to be resolved, which could take years to complete. Therefore, PW requested that the TSC develop a framework for processing and prioritizing traffic requests.

On June 24, 2024, the TSC created an ad hoc Framework Subcommittee comprised of two TSC members, Chair John Tye and Member Mark Crossman. The Framework Subcommittee collaborated with Staff to develop and refine a proposed Framework.

The adoption of the Framework is the culmination of the effort to develop an efficient and systematic processing and prioritizing procedure for traffic request.

With the adopted Framework in place, Staff is currently conducting a comprehensive review of the Traffic Request Master Spreadsheet maintained by Public Works to identify where in the process each request stands. Once this review is complete, the results will be shared with the TSC for use in conjunction with the processes outlined in the Framework.



Two Neighborhood Streets Slated for Implementation of Traffic Calming Measures

During the regular Traffic Safety Committee meeting held on September 23 at the Ken Dyda Civic Center's Community Room, the TSC heard Staff recommendations and

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community input on proposed traffic calming measures for two residential streets with speeding concerns. Key TSC traffic calming recommendations are as follows:

Abbottswood Drive Traffic Calming

- Place a new temporary speed feedback trailer at location proposed for permanent speed feedback trailer.
- Request additional enforcement from the Sheriff's Department during drop off and pickup.
- Coordinate with Vista Grande Elementary School and PVPUSD to educate parents about speeding.
- Invite the community to a TSC meeting in six months to provide feedback.

Eddinghill Drive Traffic Calming

- Request additional enforcement from Sheriff's Department.
- Install appropriate curve warning signage and/or reflectors in both directions.
- Install additional speed limit signs and/or pavement markings in both directions.
- Install permanent speed feedback signs in both directions.
- Conduct research into gateway treatments for the Hawthorne Boulevard, Eddinghill Drive and Lomo Drive
- Consider a petition for potential deployment of botts dots within 500 ft in both directions at select locations contingent upon a 60% affirmative support from the affected residents.



Infrastructure Management Advisory Committee (IMAC) Meeting

The regularly scheduled meeting for September 16 has been cancelled. The next regular meeting is scheduled for Monday, October 21, at 6:00 p.m. at the Ken Dyda Civic Center.

MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES

In addition to regularly scheduled maintenance and repairs, Public Works performed the following work:

PARK MAINTENANCE

- Weekly landscape maintenance at all City parks.
- Repaired a damaged chain link fence at Ryan Park.
- Repainted the handrails at Ryan Park.
- Began the repairs to the drinking fountain at Hesse Park.
- Replaced the wooden parking logs at Point Vicente Interpretive Center.
- Installed wood brackets to block wall for display board at Hesse Park.
- All City irrigation systems are continuously monitored and repaired for proper operation. This week's irrigation work included the following:
 - Repaired three drip lines that were damaged by wildlife at Ladera Linda Community Center. All irrigation lines are now working properly.
 - Repaired 20 feet of lateral line at Point Vicente Interpretive Center.





- Weed removal, brush clearance, and debris removal continued throughout the City at medians and various right of way locations.
 - Hawthorne Boulevard from Vallon Drive to Palos Verdes Drive West.
 - Palos Verdes Drive East from Miraleste Drive to Crest Road East.
 - Rue Langlois from Rue Beaupre to Rue de la Pierre.
- Hawthorne Boulevard from Indian Peak Road to Granvia Altamira.




- Made asphalt patch and crack repairs on Dauntless Drive and Admirable Drive.

Expediting Solar Improvements via Solar APP+ Now Available

The City's Building & Safety Division is expediting permitting of solar improvements via Solar APP+, which is short for Solar Automated Permit Processing. Solar APP+ is an online web portal that automates the plan review and process for issuing permits to qualified businesses or individuals to install code-compliant residential photovoltaic (PV) systems. The new expedited permit process is a State mandated requirement of the Solar Access Act (SB 379-Wiener). A new Solar APP+ [homepage](#) is now available on the City's website and includes a comprehensive Q&A on the new permitting system and a step-by-step guide to submitting a solar project to the City. When Do I Need to Get a Building Permit?

As a public service reminder, building permits are required for all buildings or structures that are to be altered, repaired, enlarged, remodeled or converted, any change in the size of a room takes place, and when any mechanical, electrical or plumbing work is involved. Some examples of projects requiring permits include, but are not limited to:

- Room additions
- Interior remodels
- Foundation repair
- Roof replacement
- Grading & Retaining walls



In some cases, certain improvements also require approval from the City's Planning Division prior to any permit issuance. 

Abalone Cove Park / Reserve

On September 24, Staff removed graffiti on a black pipe on Sacred Cove View Trail.



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On September 24, Staff completed removal of spiny holdback vegetation adjacent to park trails. This is a non-native and thorny plant found along the perimeter of the park.

Agua Amarga Reserve

On September 23, Park Rangers trimmed back several overgrown areas, composed mainly of lemonade berry along Lunada Canyon Trail.



Filiorum Reserve

On September 24, Staff removed graffiti on a concrete slab located near Kelvin Canyon Trail.

Forrestal Reserve

On September 23, Staff replaced a damaged t-post on Fossil Trail.

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Portuguese Bend Reserve

On September 20, Staff performed maintenance on several grade dips on Burma Road Trail. The work included removing vegetation, raking out and removing larger rocks, and redefining the tread of the trail to allow water to divert off trail.



San Ramon Reserve

On September 18, Park Rangers found a small chick near Marymount Trail. The chick did not have visible signs of injury. Staff contacted Los Angeles County Animal Control who came and picked up the chick.

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On September 19, Park Rangers hauled out a debris including a boxing heavy bag left on Wanderer Trail.






