RPV, FEMA and Cal OES Announce \$42 Million Voluntary Property Buyout Program for Homes Impacted by Land Movement

On October 28, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES)


announced a \$42 million [voluntary buyout program](#) for property owners in the Greater Portuguese Bend landslide area whose homes have been damaged or threatened by land movement.

Established with funding from FEMA's [Hazard Mitigation Grant Program](#), the Voluntary Property Buyout Program is intended to help eligible homeowners relocate to safer areas by offering a fair market value for their properties based on pre-disaster appraisals. Properties acquired by the City through this program will be permanently converted to open space and deed-restricted, protecting the community from future redevelopment risks in these vulnerable areas.

Slow-moving, ancient landslides in the City have significantly accelerated since 2023 following two consecutive heavy rainy seasons that caused damage to homes, roads, and utilities, resulting in indefinite gas and electricity shutoffs for hundreds of residents.

"For the past two years, our residents have endured extraordinary hardships as a result of this landslide, with some facing the real prospect of losing their homes entirely," said Rancho Palos Verdes Mayor John Cruikshank. "This buyout program provides a viable pathway forward for our most vulnerable community members, offering the opportunity to relocate and rebuild with meaningful compensation. On behalf of the entire City, I express my deep appreciation to FEMA and Cal OES for working with the City to establish this program. We understand the complexity and emotional weight of this for our residents and are committed to making the process as transparent and compassionate as possible."

The Rancho Palos Verdes City Council announced the program at a special town hall meeting on Oct. 28, sharing program details and answering resident questions with support from FEMA and Cal OES representatives in attendance. FEMA has allocated funding for this program based on the federally declared California disaster for the winter storms between Jan. 31 and Feb. 9, 2024. Additional program cycles may become available in the future.

Monday evening's announcement represents the largest grant amount in the City's history and comes as the City continues to see promising signs that the unprecedented land movement is slowing. The deceleration is the result of dewatering efforts by the City, the Abalone Cove Landslide Abatement District, and the Klondike Canyon

Landslide Abatement District, in combination with drier weather conditions.



Property owners interested in applying for the buyout program must request a voluntary property inspection from the City by **Monday, Nov. 4 at 5:30 p.m.** and submit a completed program application by **Friday, Nov. 8 at 4:30 p.m.** The City and Cal OES will review all applications to ensure they meet FEMA's eligibility criteria. Properties will be prioritized for selection based on factors such as safety concerns, structural condition, and utility statuses.

If selected for a grant under the program, the City will purchase the property for a price determined by an appraisal that is based on the fair market value of the land on Dec. 1, 2022, prior to the acceleration of the landslide. The FEMA grant will pay for 75% of the sale, and property owners will contribute the remaining 25% through a reduction of the fair market value payment. Property owners who have been selected to proceed with the purchase of their property may withdraw at any time prior to sale closing. At closing, the property will be deed restricted as open space, and the City cannot sell it to private individuals or develop it.

CSU Channel Islands Students Visit RPV

Last week, students from CSU Channel Islands visited RPV to learn about the City's complex of ancient, slow-moving landslides, which have long been the subject of academic study.

RPV was selected for the Marine Coastal Management class field trip so students could witness firsthand the environmental and community impacts of the landslide and gain a deeper understanding of its causes, the local response, and the current efforts aimed at relief and mitigation. City Manager Ara Mihranian gave a presentation to the students and answered their thoughtful questions. The field trip helped them link classroom concepts to real-world coastal management issues and policy responses, giving them a more comprehensive view of how environmental science intersects with local governance and community action.

Update on Voter Turnout for One-Day Vote Centers at City Hall (Ken Dyda Civic Center) and Ladera Linda Community Park

On Tuesday, October 29, the City hosted two One-Day Early Vote Centers at City Hall (Ken Dyda Civic Center) and Ladera Linda Community Park. At City Hall there were a total of 155 voters that turned out to vote in person or to drop off their sealed mail-in ballots with the election officials. At Ladera Linda Community Park there were 28 in person voters and 19 sealed mail-in ballots that were dropped off in person with the election officials.



Caltrans Releases Environmental Document for Vincent Thomas Bridge Deck Replacement Project

Caltrans has released the Final Environmental Impact Report and Environmental Assessment (EIR/EA) for the Vincent Thomas Bridge (State Route 47) Deck Replacement Project, which includes results from technical and environmental studies. Additionally, the document identifies the single-stage construction staging option to fully close the bridge as the preferred construction alternative.

Public comment on the Draft EIR lasted 90 days, ending on July 15, 2024. Caltrans received 267 comments throughout the circulation period from residents and stakeholder groups, including the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. The Final EIR can be found online by visiting the project [website](#).

As part of construction, a full closure of the Vincent Thomas Bridge will take place for approximately 16 months for crews to remove the current bridge deck and install a pre-cast bridge deck. The department's selection of the single-stage option allows for the shortest construction time, is the safest construction alternative, most cost-efficient alternative, and provides opportunities to improve construction schedule.

The purpose of the Vincent Thomas Bridge Deck Replacement Project is to preserve the bridge's structural integrity and to enhance its overall safety. Construction, which is anticipated to begin in late 2025 or early 2026, will impact travel along State Route 47 (SR 47), state highways, and local streets.

Caltrans will be hosting open houses prior to construction to inform the community on construction and its impacts on neighborhoods and commutes. Individual meetings will be held in person in San Pedro and Wilmington and virtually as well. Additionally, Caltrans will create a Traffic Management Plan Task Force to receive input and develop its plan to detour traffic around the closure and divert traffic onto freeways.

TURN ON MULTIFACTOR AUTHENTICATION



It provides **extra security** by confirming your identity when logging into accounts, like entering a code texted to a phone or generated by an authenticator app.

RECOGNIZE AND REPORT PHISHING

Common signs of a phish include:

- Urgent/alarming language
- Requests for personal or financial info
- Poor writing or misspellings
- Incorrect email addresses or links

Spot a phish? Report it to your organization or email provider, then delete it.




Retail Headlines – October 2024

Retail news this month includes stories about retail sales, department store struggles, Federal Reserve cut interest rates and more.

Retail Sales Growth Reported for September 2024

An October report from the Commerce Department shows retail sales increased 3% year over year in September. However, it does not compare to the 7.6% increase in e-commerce over the same period. Despite the overall increase, some retail segments reported steep declines. Home goods fell 5.3%, electronics fell 6.6% and sporting goods and hobby stores fell by 7%. The information from the government report suggests that consumer spending in retail is competing with experiences like dining and entertainment, in addition to e-commerce.

Difficulties and Struggles for Department Stores

Famous for their seasonal windows, department stores are preparing for a historically busy fourth quarter. However, net sales growth declined for many famous department stores in the first 2 quarters of 2024. Macy's Inc saw net sales decline by \$9.8 billion.

Kohl's reported a decline of \$6.7 billion. And JC Penney saw a decline of \$2.8 billion. Conversely, off-price retailers continue to experience net sales growth. Popular retailers with TJX Companies experienced net sales growth of \$26 billion in the first half of 2024.

Federal Reserve Cuts Interest Rates by a Half Point

On September 18, 2024, the Federal Reserve cut the benchmark rate by half a percentage point or 50 basis points. This is the first interest rate cut enacted by the Federal Reserve, since the early days of the Covid-19 pandemic. The federal funds rate now range between 4.75%-5%. These rates set short-term borrowing costs for banks, but the effects spill over into multiple consumer industries, including home mortgages, auto loans and credit cards.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Emergency Stabilization Project Update

In response to unprecedented movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City has been installing vertical deep de-watering wells to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the City has been performing emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures and lining canyons including Altamira, Kelvin, Portuguese, Ishibashi, Paintbrush, and Klondike Canyons. Additionally, the City will be lining the graben at the intersection of Exultant Drive and Dauntless Drive, and filling the fissures on Exultant Drive, Admirable Drive, and Palos Verdes Drive South Service Road.

The following work has been complete to date:

Deep Dewatering Wells

- 16 instrumented vertical test boreholes to characterize subsurface conditions and support the execution of dewatering operations have been installed.
- Six deep dewatering wells (DDWs 1-6) have been installed west of the Portuguese Bend Beach Club community (PBBC) and are currently discharging water at a combined rate of approximately 600 gallons per minute (GPM).
- Two DDWs (7&8) have been installed near Palos Verdes Drive South- one east of Peppertree Drive and one near the entrance to the South Bay Archery Range, with a combined discharge rate of approximately 100 GPM.
- Two DDWs (9&10) have been installed along the coast of Abalone Cove. These DDWs are discharging water at a combined rate of approximately 160 GPM.

- The total combined water extraction rate of DDWs 1 through 10 is currently over 850 gallons per minute or approximately 1.25 million gallons per day.
- Since the start of the DDW program; approximately 28 million gallons, or approximately 85 acre-feet, of water have been extracted from certain locations of the toe of the Landslide Complex.
- Access is being developed for a third DDW (11) in the Abalone Cove area.
- The Contractor will mobilize a drill rig this week to the Portuguese Bend Community Neighborhood to install another test borehole.
- Deceleration of land movement in the areas of the installed DDWs continues to be observed, based on a sampling of points from GPS monitoring data (Attachment E).
- Four sample points in the Seaview and PBBC have shown no movement for two consecutive surveys (October 13, 2024 and October 20, 2024).

Winterization

- Fissure filling of Altamira Canyon and nearby areas is ongoing and is expected to be completed by the end of this week. A protective pond liner will be installed at the base of the canyon starting next week.
- Mobilization for fissure filling and lining of Kelvin, Portuguese, Ishibashi, Paintbrush, and Klondike canyons is expected to start next week.
- Construction crews have mobilized to the Seaview Neighborhood and have begun winterization of the Exultant & Dauntless intersection, as well as sections of Admirable and Exultant Drives. The work is expected to be completed within the next two to three weeks.

The fall season brush-clearing event begins on Saturday, October 5, and will continue for four consecutive Saturdays. Each week a different area of RPV is serviced. The goal of the event is to assist homeowners' dispose (free of charge) excess brush, shrubs, hedges, tree branches, and bushes to comply with the Los Angeles County Fire Department's fire safety guidelines.  - Eastview Park






- Weed removal, brush clearance, and debris removal continued throughout the City at medians and various right of way locations.




- Concrete patch repairs were completed on the curb and gutter at Ravenspur Drive.

- Repaired a broken sign in the median of Sea Cove Drive and Palos Verdes Drive South




Graffiti Removal

- Staff were alerted to an emergency sewage issue at 20 Narcissa Drive, where crews identified a deformed fitting near the roadway as the source of the problem. Public Works and partner contractors promptly completed repairs, effectively preventing any spillage.




