Coming Soon: Land Movement Door Hangers

Starting today, November 13, the City will be distributing door hangers with magnetic cards to homes in the landslide area containing key phone numbers and web links related to the land movement emergency. This includes hotlines to report utility leaks, websites and phone numbers for utility updates, the City's land movement webpage, Alert SouthBay emergency alerts, and the Los Angeles County Assessor's Office for tax relief resources. If a property is not able to be safely accessed, the door hanger will be mailed. Extra door hangers will be available at City Hall.

Practice Habits That Keep You Safe!

Read below to learn about habits you should practice to help you stay safe and navigate through any emergency, from a flat tire to a catastrophic disaster.

Get out of the path of danger by keeping gas tanks at least halfway full, cash on hand, and knowing at least two ways out of any place you enter.

Ensure you are alerted to emergencies, by keeping you phone fully charged, being aware of your surroundings, installing and maintaining smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, and signing up for emergency notifications on your phone through Alert South Bay at www.alertsouthbay.com

ALWAYS

-  **Keep phones fully charged.**
-  **Keep gas tanks at least halfway full.**
-  **Keep some cash on hand.** ATMS and credit card machines may not be accessible in an emergency.
Note: Be careful not to show large sums of money or valuables in public places.
-  **Be aware of your surroundings**, if you see something that seems wrong or dangerous let authorities know immediately.
-  **Identify at least two exits when entering a building.** Be ready to leave quickly, if needed.
-  **Backup all important documents and protect digital work with passwords**
-  **Close and lock doors before you sleep.**

Make sure you have the resources needed to handle an emergency, including making emergency supply kits and updating them frequently, having a rainy-day fund, and getting to know your community and neighbors (they will be your first line of help in a major emergency).

-  Check in with your neighbors and attend community events.
-  Stay informed about local weather and emergencies.
-  Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms at least monthly by pushing their test button.
-  Check your emergency kits and replace expired or malfunctioning items.
-  Put extra money in a rainy-day fund.
-  Wash your hands before and after eating, using the restroom, or handling money.
-  Cover your mouth when you sneeze/ cough.
-  Drink plenty of water, eat healthy, & exercise.



How to File a Police Report Online

In case you did not know, you can file a police report through the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department website.

The [Sheriff's Online Report Tracking System \(SORTS\)](#) allows you to file a specific type of crime or incident report. Once your report is reviewed and accepted, you will receive a free copy of the approved report via email for your records. All cases filed within this system will be reviewed.



If you are a victim of any of these incidents, you can file a police report using SORTS:

- Lost or stolen cell phones valued \$950 or less
- Lost or stolen property valued \$950 or less
- Vandalism, excluding graffiti, where damage is valued under \$400
- Theft from an unlocked vehicle valued \$950 or less
- Theft from an open or unsecured area valued \$950 or less
- Supplemental Loss Form (Must already have a LASD report number)

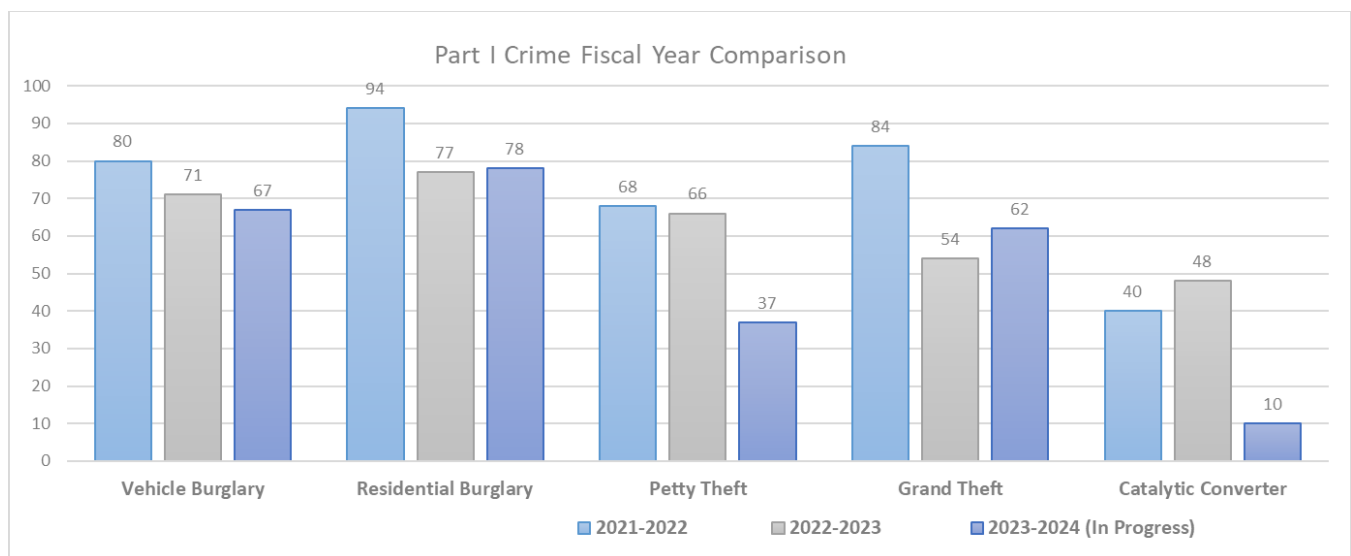

The Employment Situation – October 2024

On November 1, 2024, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) released data from the household and establishment monthly surveys. The household survey measures labor force status, including unemployment, by demographic characteristics. The

establishment survey measures nonfarm employment, hours, and earnings by industry. Notable highlights from each survey are summarized below.

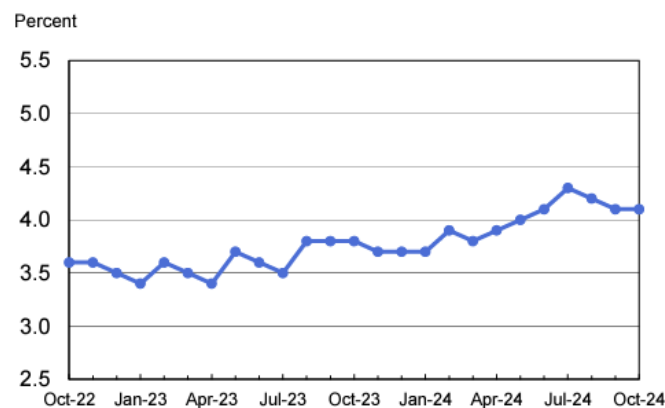
Household Survey Data

- The unemployment rate was unchanged in October from the previous month, at 4.1%.
- The number of unemployed persons was little changed at 7.0 million.
- Both measures are higher than a year earlier, when the jobless rate was 3.8% and the number of unemployed people was 6.4 million.

Establishment Survey Data

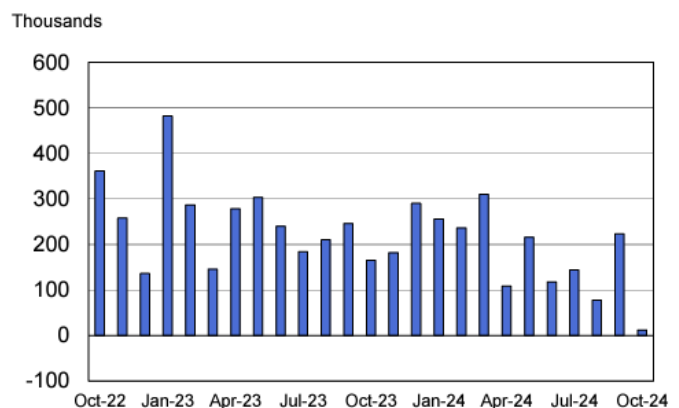
- Total nonfarm payroll employment was essentially unchanged in October at an increase of just 12,000.
- The monthly change is well below the average monthly gain of 194,000 over the prior 12 months.
- Employment continued to trend up in health care and government.
- Temporary help services and manufacturing saw a decline in employment.

Landslide Financial Assistance Grant Program – Update

As of November 13, 2024, the City has received over **215 applications** and has disbursed payments for **190 completed** and verified applications (**\$1.9M**). An additional 10 - 12 grant checks are expected to be disbursed in the next week. Applications will continue to be reviewed and processed as they are received.

Portuguese Bend Landslide Emergency Stabilization Project Update

In response to unprecedented movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City has been installing vertical deep de-watering wells to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the City has been performing emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures and lining canyons including Altamira, Kelvin, Portuguese, Ishibashi, Paintbrush, and Klondike Canyons. The City will be lining the graben at the intersection of Exultant Drive and Dauntless Drive and filling the fissures on Exultant Drive, Admirable Drive, and Palos Verdes Drive South Service Road.

The following work has been completed to date:

Deep Dewatering Wells

- 17 instrumented vertical test boreholes to characterize subsurface conditions and support the execution of dewatering operations have been installed.
- Six deep dewatering wells (DDWs 1-6) have been installed west of the Portuguese Bend Beach Club community (PBBC) and are currently discharging water at a combined rate of approximately 570 gallons per minute (GPM).
- Two DDWs (DDWs 7 & 8) have been installed near Palos Verdes Drive South- one east of Peppertree Drive and one near the entrance to the South Bay Archery Range, with a combined discharge rate of approximately 110 GPM.

- Two DDWs (DDWs 9 & 10) have been installed along the coast of Abalone Cove. DDW 9 operated for approximately 2 weeks until it sheared due to land movement and was decommissioned. A replacement well, called DDW 9A is being installed this week approximately 600ft southwest of DDW 9. DDW 10 is discharging water at a rate of approximately 115 GPM.
- The total combined water extraction rate of DDWs 1 through 10 is currently over 795 gallons per minute or approximately 1.15 million gallons per day.
- Since the start of the DDW program; approximately **40 million gallons**, or approximately 125 acre-feet, of water have been extracted from certain locations of the toe of the Landslide Complex.
- Access is being developed for a third DDW (DDW 11) in the Abalone Cove area.
- Deceleration of land movement in the areas of the installed DDWs continues to be observed, based on a sampling of points from GPS monitoring data.
- Four sample points in the Seaview and PBBC neighborhoods have shown no movement for four consecutive surveys (October 13, 2024, October 20, 2024, October 29, 2024, and November 5, 2024).

Winterization

- Fissure filling of Altamira Canyon and nearby areas is complete. A protective pond liner is being installed at the base of the canyon and should be completed by next week.
- Fissure filling and lining of Klondike canyon started last week and is anticipated to be completed in two weeks.
- Mobilization for fissure filling and lining of Kelvin, Portuguese, Ishibashi, and Paintbrush canyons is expected to start within the next two weeks.
- Construction crews have mobilized to the Seaview Neighborhood. Grading and paving of sections of Exultant Drive is expected to complete this week, followed by grading and paving of sections of Admirable Drive, which is expected to be completed within a week. Winterization of the Exultant and Dauntless Drive intersection has started and is expected to be completed by the end of November.
- All winterization work is expected to be complete by the end of December.

Environmental and cultural monitoring is being conducted in conjunction with the above construction activities.

Western Avenue Improvements

Caltrans is making ongoing improvements along Western Avenue from 25th Street to Carson Street, spanning the Cities of Rancho Palos Verdes, Los Angeles, Lomita, and Torrance. These upgrades include reconstructing existing curb ramps and building new ones to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards in designated locations. The project will also replace existing push buttons with Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS) and relocate various elements such as pull boxes, street lighting, transformers, power poles, traffic signals, roadside signs, and conduits to align with the modified or new curb ramps.

The project will also require the reduction and reconstruction of medians and narrowing of the travel lanes to accommodate the installation of Class II Bike Lanes within the roadway cross-section. The construction activities may require intermittent lane closures, temporary roadway striping and traffic signal timing adjustments.

This work is part of Phase 1 of the Complete Streets initiative, which focuses on enhancing pedestrian and bicycle mobility and safety through features like upgraded and new infrastructure, bike lanes, sidewalks, and improved crossings. 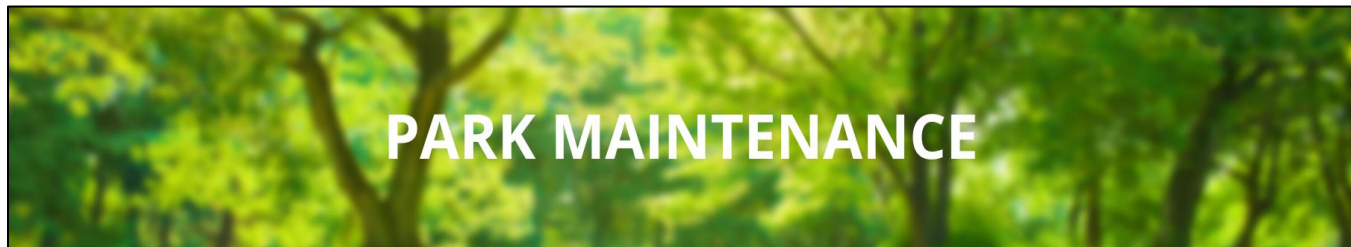


Traffic Safety Committee (TSC)

In addition to regularly scheduled maintenance and repairs, Public Works performed the following work:



- Prep work has continued for the steps at Hesse Park to prepare them for painting with non-slip red paint for added safety and visibility
- All city irrigation systems are currently up to date, with functionality and maintenance checks completed across all areas. Recent irrigation repairs include:
 - 1 ½" valve replaced at Eastview Park.
 - Drip system repaired at Ladera Linda Community Park



- Weed removal, brush clearance, and debris removal continued throughout the City at medians and various right of way locations.
 - Hawthorne Boulevard from Silver Spur Road to Granvia Altamira
 - Palos Verdes Drive South from Narcissa Drive to Barkentine Road
 - Western Avenue from Peninsula Verde to City limit

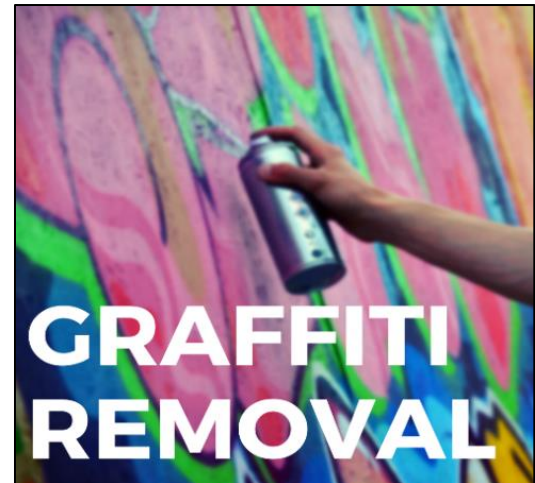
- Repaired three downed reflector signs
- Repaired downed sign at the intersection of Admirable Drive and Schooner Drive
- Repaired downed "Permit Parking" sign at 6150 Arrowroot Lane
- Installed "No Trespassing" signs at City Hall
- Completed asphalt patch repairs on Palos Verdes Drive East and Rhone Road, with roadway crack filling applied to maintain the asphalt walkway.





Graffiti Removal

- 19 graffiti incidents were reported and removed this week.
- Residents can help keep RPV looking great by downloading the **RPV Clean** app to report graffiti to City staff.



This week, several Public Works staff attended risk management training provided by the City's insurance provider, the California Joint Power Authority (CJPIA). Through this training, City staff learned how to better identify and mitigate risks associated with public spaces, roadways, City facilities, contracting, and the City fleet.





- Emergency crews responded to 3 Cinnamon Lane to repair a clogged line, working through the night to clear the obstruction and restore proper function.

REMINDER: Applications Open for a Western Avenue Storefront Improvement Grant

Businesses and property owners in RPV's Western Avenue Commercial Corridor are invited to apply for a storefront improvement grant from the City! Grants of \$5,000 to \$20,000, requiring a 50% match, are available for eligible projects that enhance or restore the physical condition or appearance of the building (must be visible from the street). Examples include new exterior paint, lighting, landscaping, signs, awnings, entry doors, outdoor seating, and resolving code violations. Storefronts must be located along Western Avenue within the boundaries of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes (NOT in the City of Los Angeles).

No Construction on Thursday, November 28 (Thanksgiving Day) and Friday, November 29

Pursuant to Section 17.56.020(B) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code, it is unlawful to carry on construction, grading, or landscaping activities, or to operate heavy equipment except between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. Monday through Friday, and between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on Saturday. No such activity shall be permitted on Sundays, or the legal holidays (within the city's permitted

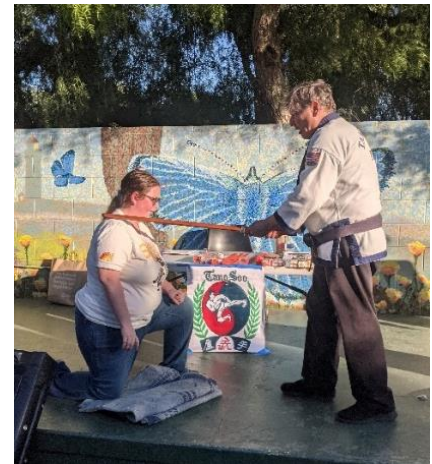
REACH Update

On November 11, Staff trimmed back branches of a pepper tree extending over Alta Vicente Trail.



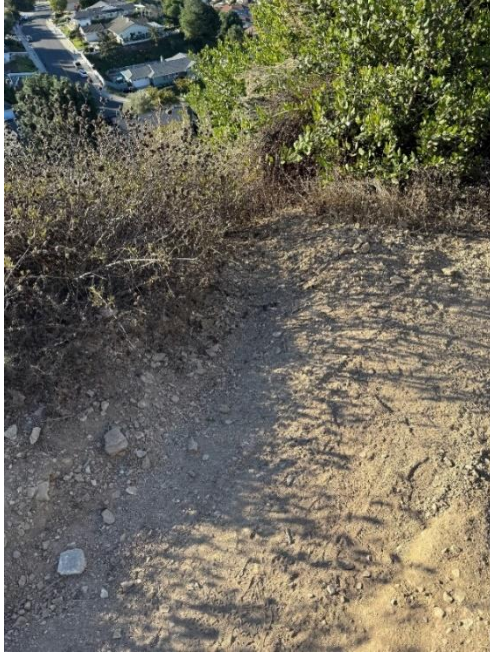

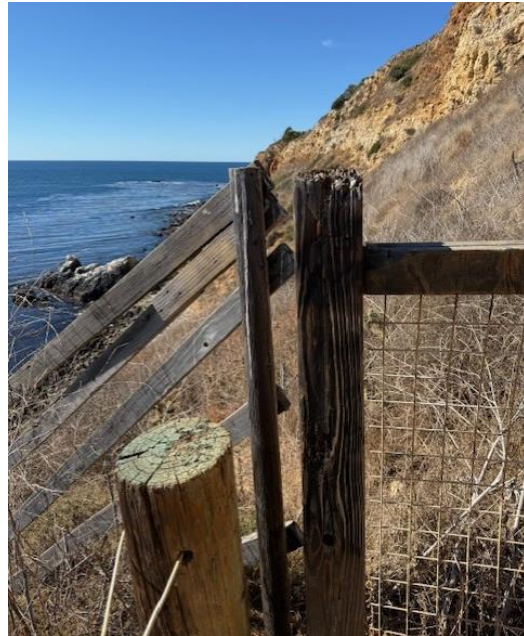
