May 6, 2025 City Council Meeting Highlights

- After reviewing the Peafowl Census, an annual count of peacocks and peahens in RPV, the Council voted to conduct limited, humane trapping in the Portuguese Bend, Vista Grande, and Sunnyside Ridge neighborhoods.
- Limited to no trapping has occurred in RPV since 2019 due to relatively low numbers. However, this year, the City saw a 31% average population increase compared to 2024.
- Trapped peafowl will be relocated off the Peninsula to homes that have been screened by the trapping vendor and reviewed by the City to ensure the individuals adopting them have some avian experience and adequate space for peafowl to roam freely. Under no circumstances will the trapped peafowl be euthanized or treated inhumanely.
- The Council received an update on wireless telecommunications facilities and efforts to improve cell service throughout the City.
- City staff has been working with wireless carriers and installers to advance existing projects, begin new ones, and identify potential changes to the municipal code that would result in improvements in service and reliability.
- City staff gave an update on the landslide emergency and the latest land movement data showing continued deceleration.
- The Council allocated another \$500,000 toward the maintenance and operation of the City's deep dewatering wells through the end of June, as several wells have sheared or are anticipated to.
- Finally, the Council renewed for 60 days the local emergencies in the landslide area and the temporary prohibition of motorcycles and bicycles along a two-mile stretch of Palos Verdes Drive South.

Land Movement Updates



May 6, 2025 City Council Meeting Discussion Recap

At last night's City Council meeting, City Geologist Mike Phipps gave an update on movement in the landslide area. According to the latest data from April, overall, the land movement continues to decelerate or maintain a steady state in areas that are still moving. Mr. Phipps believes this is largely due to significantly below-average rainfall through April, positive effects from winterization measures implemented in the fall, and ongoing dewatering efforts by the City, the Abalone Cove Landslide Abatement District (ACLAD) and Klondike Canyon Landslide Abatement District (KCLAD).

Using a \$1.6 million loan from the City, ACLAD has installed: five deep dewatering wells that are removing approximately 158,000 gallons of water per day and two monitoring wells (wells are not operating 24/7). ACLAD anticipates activating three more dewatering wells in the coming weeks. These wells are targeting the fastest moving parts of the landslide area — in the Altamira and Abalone Cove Landslides — which are moving at a rate of about 4 inches per week. For comparison, at this time last year, the landslide was moving roughly twice as fast and was rapidly accelerating.

The City's effective deep dewatering wells at the toe of the Portuguese Bend Landslide have removed 215 million gallons of groundwater at a current rate of about 0.85 million gallons per day. The Council allocated another \$500,000 toward re-drilling several wells that have sheared or are anticipated to by June 30, 2025.

The Council directed City staff to revise the scope of work on a proposed Hydrology and Hydraulics Study that would identify the source of water, ground and subsurface, contributing to land movement, including water originating outside City limits and from upper watersheds. An updated contract for the revised study will be considered by the Council at a future meeting.

Finally, the Council renewed for 60 days the local emergencies in the landslide area and the temporary prohibition of motorcycles, bicycles and other one- or two-wheeled devices along a two-mile stretch of Palos Verdes Drive South.

Disaster Recovery Appeals Update

In March, the City [formally appealed](#) the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) decision to deny \$37.9 million in disaster recovery funding requested by the City for costs incurred responding to the landslide emergency due to the winter storms in late January and early February 2024. Earlier this week, the City [was notified](#) that the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) will not support the City's appeal. This is due to Cal OES' position that while the winter storms may have greatly accelerated land movement, what it considers to be pre-existing conditions in the landslide make the City ineligible for reimbursement under the 2024 federal disaster declaration. FEMA District 9 Administrator Robert Fenton has 90 days to consider the City's appeal, Cal OES' recommendation, and to render a decision. His decision is then appealable to FEMA's headquarters in Washington, D.C. Cal OES is also not supporting appeals submitted by ACLAD and KCLAD for their denials of disaster recovery assistances.

Grant Funding Update

Last month, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) [announced](#) it is ending the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program, a grant program aimed at helping communities across the nation build resilience against extreme weather events and proactively reduce natural hazard risks.

This is disappointing and concerning news for the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. In August 2023, the City was selected for a \$23.3 million BRIC grant to support long-term landslide mitigation work in the Portuguese Bend area, including the installation of dewatering wells and other key measures to stabilize land movement. Since being selected, City staff has been working with Cal OES and FEMA through the grant administration process, which was expected to take a few years. As the landslide accelerated and emergency measures were implemented, the grant amount was reduced to \$16.4 million, since the BRIC grant cannot be used for emergency response work.

Losing this funding would jeopardize the City's long-term stabilization efforts and place additional strain on our ability to address land movement in a proactive and sustainable way. Without access to external funding resources like the BRIC grant, the City will be forced to redirect limited local funds toward short-term emergency response rather than long-term solutions.

We are currently in active discussions with FEMA to learn more about the status of the grant and determine next steps. We strongly urge our federal, state and county partners to recognize the urgency of this situation and continue to support Rancho Palos Verdes in protecting our residents and vital infrastructure.

Separately, the City continues to work with Cal OES and FEMA to administer the \$42 million [Voluntary Property Buyout Program](#) that is funded through FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. At this time, City staff has not been notified of any changes to the status of this program. Any potential updates will be shared with the community.

RPV Visits Sacramento to Advocate for Landslide Bill

Last week, Rancho Palos Verdes Mayor Dave Bradley and City Manager Ara Mihranian joined Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi at the State Capitol to testify in support of his landslide bill, [AB 986](#). The legislation would expand the Governor's power to declare a state of emergency for landslides by adding "landslide" as a condition constituting a state of emergency or local emergency in the Emergency Services Act.



Assemblymember Muratsuchi co-authored a previous version of the bill introduced by Senator Ben Allen in 2024, SB 1461, which did not advance. During Monday's Assembly Emergency Management Committee meeting, Assemblymember Muratsuchi and Mayor Bradley made the case for the inclusion of landslides, emphasizing the hardship endured by residents impacted by the City's crisis. Following discussion of potential changes to the bill, it was referred to the Assembly Appropriations Committee. The City thanks our state representatives for their continued support and advocacy. Community Health Stations Now Available

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has launched 51 Community Health Stations to provide residents with free lifesaving overdose prevention and public health supplies. The vending machines provide the following products:



- COVID-19 Self-Test Kit: One box containing two tests.
- Naloxone, a life-saving medication that can reverse an opioid overdose: One carton containing two single-use devices in blister packages and instructions for use.
- Fentanyl Test Strip (FTS) Kit: One FTS kit containing five individually-packaged strips and instructions for use.
- External Condoms (FDA standard): One package holding five external condoms and five non-spermicidal lubricants.
- Internal Condoms (FDA standard): One individually wrapped internal condom and instructions for use.

- Veterinarians Dr Sobeck, Dr. Kelly, and Dr. Giacomuzzi provided information on first aid essentials, colic, and laminitis/founder.



The event also included booths for all four cities, the Palos Verdes Estates Police Department, RPV's Emergency Preparedness Committee, the L.A. County Fire Department, Pony Club, Lomita Feed, the Palos Verdes Peninsula Horseman's Association, and the County's Equine Response Team.

Thank you to everyone who helped put this event together, our presenters, and the booth hosts! This was an informative and engaging equine event that benefited the residents who attended.



The Employment Situation – April 2025

Last week, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that total nonfarm payroll employment rose by 177,000 in April, and the unemployment rate remained unchanged at 4.2 percent with the number of unemployed people at 7.2 million.

In April, notable job gains occurred in industries such as health care, transportation and warehousing, and financial activities. Notably, job growth continued in hospitals and ambulatory health care services at an increase of 22,000 jobs and 21,000 jobs, respectively. On the other hand, employment numbers have declined in the federal government by 9,000 in April and is down by 26,000 since January, based on this latest report.

In April, the average hourly earnings for all nonfarm payrolled employees rose by 0.2 percent, to \$36.06. Private-sector production and nonsupervisory employees saw an average hourly earnings increase of 0.3 percent, to \$31.06. For a broader view, Chart 1 illustrates the trend and current unemployment rate through April 2025.

Landslide Financial Assistance Grant Program – Update

As of May 7, 2025, the City has received over **234 applications** and has disbursed payments for **222 completed** and verified applications (**\$2.21M**). Applications will continue to be reviewed and processed as they are received.

The deadline to apply for the Financial Assistance Grant Program is June 30, 2025. This grant program will officially end on July 1, 2025, and no further applications will be accepted after 5:00 p.m. on June 30, 2025. During the April 17, 2025 budget workshop, the City Council approved the transfer of the remaining grant funds to the Capital

Improvement Program (CIP) Fund to continue supporting landslide emergency response and mitigation efforts, in accordance with the grant requirements.

Landslide Emergency Stabilization

In response to unprecedented movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the city installed vertical deep de-watering wells (DDWs) to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the city performed emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures/grabens, lining canyons, and improving drainage.

Status of the Deep Dewatering Wells Programs

- Work is complete for all DDWs as well as the associated test boreholes and monitoring wells funded by the City Council. The DDWs continue to be monitored and re-drilled or replaced as needed within the current approved budget.
- The total combined water extraction rate of the DDWs is currently at approximately **455 gallons per minute** or **0.66 million gallons per day**.
- Since the start of the DDW program, approximately **216 million gallons**, or **662 acre-feet** of water have been extracted from certain locations around the toe of the Landslide Complex.
- Overall extraction rates have been decreasing in recent weeks due to land movement impinging on several wells. The most affected wells are being evaluated for re-drilling, and include DDW Nos. 2, 6 and 9A.
- DDW No. 10 is currently being re-drilled due to land movement impinging on the well.

- DDW No. 11 experienced pump failure because of an insufficient water flow rate to keep the pump cooled. Based on the low production rate of this DDW, the City's geologists are advising that this well should not be re-drilled, but rather re-located, should additional funding become available.

Status of Winterization

All planned winterization activities are completed. Monitoring of winterized areas will continue, including assessments after rain events, and adjustments made in preparation for future rain events, to the extent possible within the current approved budget.

Update on the Hesse Park Community Center Roof Replacement Project


Work is nearing completion on the Hesse Park Community Center Roof Replacement Project. This week, crews are finishing installation of the new roofing system and roof edging material. Work will then pause until late May to allow for the manufacturing and delivery of the replacement skylights. The project will be complete once the skylights are installed.

The project remains on schedule, and park operations and public access continue to be maintained without disruption.

The project will replace the aging roof and skylights at the Hesse Park Community Center. During the winter storms in early 2024, sections of the roof leaked and damaged interior areas of the building, including sensitive equipment used to facilitate public meetings and events. Public Works staff made temporary repairs to the building and further determined through a detailed assessment that the roof, including all 17 skylights, was nearing the end of its useful service life; and a full replacement would be needed soon. Subsequently, a heavy wind event in January 2025 damaged some of the temporary repairs made in 2024, as well as some skylights.



LA County Proposes Increase to Sanitary Sewer Rates



Los Angeles County Public Works (County) provides sanitary sewer services to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and other communities throughout Los Angeles County. The County has determined that due to rising costs from inflation and new regulatory requirements, their current sewer rates do not cover the cost of providing those services. Therefore, the County is proposing to increase their sewer rates over the next 5 years. The cost to an average single-family home is expected to increase from the current rate of \$50.50 per year to a new rate in 2029 of \$96.23 per year. The last time the County increased their sewer rates was in 2014.


In the coming weeks, the County will be mailing out an official Proposition 218 Notice of their proposed sewer rate increase. The notice will include background information and

instructions for how to submit a written protest opposing the rate increase. The County will make a final decision on the rate increase following a public hearing scheduled for Tuesday, June 24, 2025, at 9:30 a.m., in their Board Hearing Room, 381B, located at 500 West Temple St., Los Angeles. Written protests must be received by the close of the public hearing.

The Goats Have Returned for the 2025 Fuel Modification Season!

Goats have resumed their important role in reducing fire hazards and protecting homes. While we understand that many people enjoy seeing the goats, we ask that you avoid visiting them out of respect for nearby residents.

To ensure safety, a temporary electrified fence is in place to contain the goats while they work. Approaching them puts both you and the goats at risk. Please refrain from taking selfies, attempting to touch them, or bringing pets near the area, as this can cause stress or injury to both you and the goats. In addition, human crews are performing brush clearance throughout the City as part of the 2025 fuel modification program.

- In addition to routine weekly landscape maintenance at all City parks, the following repairs were completed:
 - Repaired the large dog park gate at Eastview Park.
 - Repainted and power washed the retaining wall at Ryan Park.
 - Repaired a leaking spigot at Ryan Park.
 - Repaired sprinkler and irrigation lines at Hesse Park and Ryan Park.



STREET LANDSCAPING

- The landscape team is dedicated to improving both the appearance and safety of the city's main arterial streets and right-of-way areas. Crews focused on weed removal and trimming in the following center medians and right-of-way sections:
 - Silver Spur Road from the City limits near Bart Earle Way to Montemalaga Drive.
 - Palos Verdes Drive West from Hawthorne Boulevard to City limits
 - Palos Verdes Drive South from Barkentine Road to Peppertree Drive.
 - Whitley Collins from Crest Road to Highridge Road.




- The Public Works Department performed the following infrastructure repairs in the public right-of-way:

No Construction on Memorial Day Holiday (Monday, May 26, 2025)

Pursuant to Section 17.56.020(B) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code, it is unlawful to carry on construction, grading, landscaping activities, or operation of heavy equipment except between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday, and between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Saturday. No such activity shall be permitted on Sundays, or the legal holidays (within the city's permitted construction hours), unless a Special Construction Permit is approved by the Director of Community Development. Green Hills Memorial Park Vietnam Veteran's Memorial Approved

On May 5, 2025, the Director of Community Development issued a Notice of Decision (NOD) (click [here](#) to view), conditionally approving a Site Plan Review Permit (Case No. PLSR2025-0047) to construct a Vietnam War Veteran's Memorial within the Medal of Honor Flagpole area of Green Hills Memorial Park. The memorial will include the construction of a 10-foot-high free-standing stone Vietnam War Veteran's Memorial



monument and the installation of a 4,963 ft² decorative hardscape memorial with 8.2 yd³ of associated grading to accommodate the proposed improvements. Building and Safety Division Monthly Activity

The Building and Safety Division's Monthly Activity Report for April 2025 reports on 1) a summary of the new cases received delineated by application type; 2) the number of permits issued; 3) the amount of fees collected; 4) the number of inspections performed; and 5) the number of new plan checks submitted. 

REACH Sends off Angela With a Home Run



Public Comments:

The Planning Commission may limit the public input on any item based on the number of people requesting to speak, the length of the agenda, or the business of the Planning Commission.

Conduct at the Planning Commission Meeting:

Pursuant to GC 54957.95: (a)(1) In addition to authority exercised pursuant to Sections 54954.3 and 54957.9, the presiding member of the legislative body conducting a meeting or their designee may remove, or cause the removal of, an individual for disrupting the meeting. (2) Prior to removing an individual, the presiding member or their designee shall warn the individual that their behavior is disrupting the meeting and that their failure to cease their behavior may result in their removal. The presiding member or their designee may then remove the individual if they do not promptly cease their disruptive behavior. This paragraph does not apply to any behavior described in subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b)(1) means engaging in behavior during a meeting of a legislative body that actually disrupts, disturbs, impedes, or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting and includes, but is not limited to, one of the following: (A) A failure to comply with reasonable and lawful

regulations adopted by a legislative body pursuant to Section 54954.3 or any other law. (B) Engaging in behavior that constitutes use of force or a true threat of force.(2) "True threat of force" means a threat that has sufficient indicia of intent and seriousness, that a reasonable observer would perceive it to be an actual threat to use force by the person making the threat.

Time Estimates:

The time noted next to an agenda item is only an estimate of the amount of time that will be spent during the meeting on that particular item. Accordingly, these estimates should not be relied on in determining when a matter will be heard, especially since agenda items are often re-ordered during a meeting and may be discussed at any time.

Continuation of Meeting:

The Planning Commission will adjourn its meetings on or before 11:00 p.m. and will not consider new business items after 10:15 p.m., unless a majority of the Planning Commission members who are present affirmatively vote either to extend the meeting after 11:00 p.m. or to consider new business after 10:15 p.m. If the meeting ends before all items listed on the agenda are completed, any unfinished business will be continued to the next succeeding day that is not a holiday, at a location to be determined.

Closed Session:

Please be advised that, pursuant to the Ralph M. Brown Act, "a person may not disclose confidential information that has been acquired by being present in a Closed Session . . . to a person not entitled to receive it, unless the legislative body authorizes disclosure of that confidential information." (Gov. Code § 54963(a).) "[C]onfidential information" means a communication made in a Closed Session that is specifically related to the basis for the legislative body of a local agency to meet lawfully in Closed Session . . ." (Gov. Code § 54963(a).) Please be further advised that any "violation of [Government Code § 54963] may be addressed by the use of such remedies as are currently available by law, including, but not limited to: (1) injunctive relief to prevent the disclosure of confidential information prohibited by this section; (2) disciplinary action against an [public or city official] who has willfully disclosed confidential information in violation of this section; (3) referral of a member of a legislative body who has willfully disclosed confidential information in violation of this section to a grand jury." (Gov. Code § 54963(c).)
