City Council Meeting Agenda Now Available

The agenda for the May 20, 2025 City Council meeting is available at rpvca.gov/agendas.

Meeting topic highlights include:

- Reviewing a traffic study conducted along Palos Verdes Drive East from Crest Road to Palos Verdes Drive South, with a focus on Ganado Drive, and considering proposed traffic safety measures.
- Updating sidewalk vending regulations in the City's municipal code.

AB 986 (Muratsuchi) – Landslide and Climate Change Bill

The City submitted a support letter for new AB 986 co-authored by Assemblymember Muratsuchi. Current law does not explicitly recognize landslides as qualifying events for state emergency assistance. As a result, local governments such as Rancho Palos Verdes are unable to access necessary resources to mitigate damage and protect public safety in response to land movement. The lack of financial and logistical support forces local governments to bear the full burden of disaster response and recovery, leaving communities vulnerable to further damage and economic strain. AB 986 expands the definition of disasters constituting a state of emergency or a local emergency under the California Emergency Services Act (ESA) to include landslides and conditions exacerbated by climate change. By doing so, the bill gives affected communities a clearer path to declare emergencies and take action to protect public safety and infrastructure.

As a cosponsor of this bill, Mayor Bradley and City Manager Mihranian flew to Sacramento on April 28 to testify in support of the bill with the Emergency Management Committee. The bill was approved and moved onto the Assembly Appropriations Committee where it will be heard this month. The City has submitted another support letter to demonstrate the need for this bill.

SCE Helicopter Activity and Forrestal Reserve Closure

Southern California Edison (SCE) will be using a helicopter to install and repair utility poles on May 16 beginning around 8:00 a.m. on Dauntless Drive and near Altamira Canyon northeast of Narcissa Drive. The hours of operation are 8:00 a.m. to 6 p.m. The helicopter activity should take no more than 2 hours, but the 10-hour operation window is to account for potential weather delays. Open Space and Trails staff will be closing Forrestal Nature Reserve and all of its hiking trails for the duration of the project. Ladera Linda Park will be open and operating normally for anyone looking for a space to walk their dogs. Please see the SCE flyer below for more information.

- Main Sail & Forrestal Drive passed Ladera Linda will be closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
- Pirate Trail and Conqueror Trail will be closed to public throughout the duration of helicopter work.
- Dauntless Dr will be closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic at 4369 & 4351 Dauntless.
- Exultant Dr will be closed to vehicular and pedestrian traffic at 4362 Exultant dr.
- There will be personnel at each closed off section alerting of said closures.

- Work will take place in the upper northwest section of Dauntless dr.

Congressman Robert Garcia Releases Oversight Report on Lessons From Kenneth Fire False Alerts

Earlier this week, Congressman Robert Garcia (CA-42) released a report with key findings on the causes of false evacuation warnings during the Kenneth Fire on January 9, 2025, and policy recommendations to improve emergency warning alerts.

On February 13, 2025, Congressman Garcia and thirteen Members of Congress representing Los Angeles County sent oversight letters [seeking answers](#) to why

evacuation warnings were accidentally sent to nearly 10 million L.A. County residents during the Los Angeles fires, why individuals received delayed warnings, or why individuals received multiple warnings.

Responses were received from [Genasys, Inc.](#), the software company used by the County for issuing wireless emergency alerts, [Los Angeles County](#), the [Federal Emergency Management Agency \(FEMA\)](#), and [Federal Communications Commission \(FCC\)](#).

The report's key findings noted:

- **The initial false alert was caused by a software failure in Genasys, Inc.'s system.** The correct evacuation area polygon was not uploaded to the IPAWS wireless alert channel, which Genasys believes was due to a network disruption. Genasys' system failed to warn the LA County Office of Emergency Management that the polygon was missing, and the alert was to be sent county-wide. Genasys has since added safeguards to its software to address this issue.
- **LA County responded quickly**, canceling the alert within 2 minutes and 47 seconds, and issued a corrected message 20 minutes later. The County temporarily transitioned to CalOES' On solve CodeRed alert system and resumed use of Genasys on January 30, 2025.
- **LA County could improve the wording of alert messages.** The wording of the original alert was vague and lacked geographic specificity. Improved language and inclusion of timestamps would have helped avoid confusion, especially for individuals outside the evacuation zone.
- **Duplicate and delayed alerts were not caused by downed cell towers, as initially thought, but by technical issues** such as network overload, lack of unique message identifiers, and long alert durations.

Policy recommendations included:

1. **Increase funding for IPAWS systems** – Federal support is needed for planning, equipment, training, exercises, and system maintenance.
2. **Finalize FEMA's IPAWS requirements** – Five years after Congress mandated improvements, FEMA has yet to fully implement certification programs for users and third-party software providers.
3. **The FCC should ensure mobile providers include location-aware maps by the December 2026 deadline** – Last October, the FCC passed a requirement for wireless services providers to include links to maps that show the emergency incident and your location relative to the incident by December 2026.

4. **The FCC should establish performance standards** – The FCC should develop measurable goals and monitoring for Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) performance, including reliability, accuracy, and speed.


By addressing these challenges, emergency alerting can become more accurate, reliable, and effective in future crises.

California Launches New AI-Powered Chatbot that Provides Wildfire Resources in 70 Languages

As California marked Wildfire Preparedness Week last week, Governor Gavin Newsom announced CAL FIRE has launched a new artificial intelligence-powered chatbot on its website, fire.ca.gov. The tool is designed to help Californians more easily access critical fire prevention resources and near-real-time emergency information—offering support in 70 languages.

The chatbot, “Ask CAL FIRE,” provides quick, reliable answers to commonly asked questions using information already available on CAL FIRE’s website and helps guide users to the appropriate pages for more detailed information. It also serves as a two-way tool – providing real-time insights to CAL FIRE on what information Californians are looking for.



Whether looking for home hardening strategies, defensible space guidance, or the latest on wildfire incidents over 10 acres across the state, users now have a simpler, more accessible way to get the answers they need—any time, day or night.

Fire Extinguisher Types

There are five primary types of fire extinguishers, each designed to put out different kinds of fires.

-  **A** For use with *ordinary materials like cloth, wood and paper*
-  **B** For use with *combustible and flammable liquids like grease, gasoline, oil and oil-based paints.*
-  **C** For use with *electrical equipment like appliances, tools or other equipment that is plugged into an outlet.*
-  **D** For use with *flammable metals.*
-  **K** For use with *vegetable oils, animal oils and fats in cooking appliances.*

There are also multipurpose fire extinguishers that might be labeled "B-C" or "A-B-C" that can be used on most types of home fires. Most home improvement stores carry multipurpose fire extinguishers that cover Class A through Class C.

Always look for the "UL Listed" or "ULC Listed" label on a fire extinguisher to ensure it is certified for use by a nationally recognized testing laboratory.

Fire extinguishers vary in size and weight, but it is recommended to select the largest fire extinguisher that a user can safely and comfortably operate.

Fire Extinguisher Use

Only attempt to put out a fire if it is no larger than a wastebasket, you have a clear escape route, you are safe from fire smoke, and you are physically able to do so.

When operating a fire extinguisher, remember the word PASS:

Pull the pin. Hold the extinguisher with the nozzle pointing away from you and release the locking mechanism.

Aim low. Point the extinguisher at the base of the fire.

Squeeze the lever slowly and evenly.

Sweep the nozzle from side-to-side.




Job Openings and Labor Turnover – March 2025

On April 29, 2025, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) released the March 2025 data from the Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey (JOLTS). This monthly report includes estimates of the number and rate of job openings, hires, and separations and provides insights into the current labor market.

As reported, the number of job openings totaled 7.2 million for the month ending March 2025, with little change from February's (revised) 7.5 million job openings. At 4.3 percent, the job opening rate changed very little compared to February. Within the month of March, hires and separations held at 5.4 million and 5.1 million, respectively.

At 1.6 million, the number of layoffs and discharges was little changed for the month of March. Layoffs and discharges decreased in retail and in federal government. However, layoffs and discharges did increase in state and local government, excluding education.

Chart 1. Job openings rate, seasonally adjusted, March 2023 - March 2025





Chart 2. Hires and total separations rates, seasonally adjusted, March 2023 - March 2025

Landslide Financial Assistance Grant Program – Update

As of May 14, 2025, the City has received over **234 applications** and has disbursed payments for **222 completed** and verified applications (**\$2.21M**). Applications will continue to be reviewed and processed as they are received.

The deadline to apply for the Financial Assistance Grant Program is June 30, 2025. This grant program will officially end on July 1, 2025, and no further applications will be accepted after 5:00 p.m. on June 30, 2025. During the April 17, 2025 budget workshop, the City Council approved the transfer of the remaining grant funds to the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Fund to continue supporting landslide emergency response and mitigation efforts, in accordance with the grant requirements.

PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS

Landslide Emergency Stabilization

In response to unprecedeted movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City installed vertical deep de-watering wells (DDWs) to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the city performed emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures/grabens, lining canyons, and improving drainage.

Status of the Deep Dewatering Wells Programs

- Work is complete for all DDWs as well as the associated test boreholes and monitoring wells funded by the City Council. The DDWs continue to be monitored and re-drilled or replaced as needed within the current approved budget.
- The total combined water extraction rate of the DDWs is currently at approximately **390 gallons per minute or 0.56 million gallons per day**.
- Since the start of the DDW program, approximately **220 million gallons or 676 acre-feet** of water have been extracted from certain locations around the toe of the Landslide Complex.
- Overall extraction rates have been decreasing in recent weeks due to land movement impinging on several wells.
- DDW Nos. 9A and 10 were re-drilled last week and are expected to resume groundwater extraction within 1-2 days once their pumps have been re-installed.

- DDW-2 is scheduled for re-drilling this week. DDW-6 is also being evaluated for re-drilling in the immediate future.
- DDW-11 experienced pump failure, because of an insufficient water flow rate to keep the pump cooled. Based on the low production rate of this DDW, the City's geologists are advising that this well should not be re-drilled, but rather re-located, should additional funding become available.

Status of Winterization

All planned winterization activities are completed. Monitoring of winterized areas will continue, including assessments after rain events, and adjustments made in preparation for future rain events, to the extent possible within the current approved budget.

Update on the Hesse Park Community Center Roof Replacement Project

Work is nearing completion on the Hesse Park Community Center Roof Replacement Project. This week, crews are completing roof detail work and performing general site cleanup. Beginning next week, work is expected to pause until late May at which time the replacement skylights will be delivered and installed. The project will be complete once the skylights are installed.

The project remains on schedule, and park operations and public access continue to be maintained without disruption.

The project will replace the aging roof and skylights at the Hesse Park Community Center. During the winter storms in early 2024, sections of the roof leaked and damaged interior areas of the building, including sensitive equipment used to facilitate public meetings and events. Public Works staff made temporary repairs to the building and further determined through a detailed assessment that the roof, including all 17 skylights, was nearing the end of its useful service life; and a full replacement would be needed soon. Subsequently, a heavy wind event in January 2025 damaged some of the temporary repairs made in 2024, as well as some skylights.



LA County Proposes Increase to Sanitary Sewer Rates

Los Angeles County Public Works (County) provides sanitary sewer services to the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and other communities throughout the region. The County has determined that due to rising costs from inflation and new regulatory requirements, their current sewer rates do not cover the cost of providing those services. Therefore, the County is proposing to increase their sewer rates over the next 5 years. The cost to an average single-family home is expected to increase from the current rate of \$50.50 per year to a new rate in 2029 of \$96.23 per year. The last time the County increased their sewer rates was in 2014.

In the coming weeks, the County will be mailing out an official Proposition 218 Notice of their proposed sewer rate increase. The notice will include background information and instructions for how to submit a written protest opposing the rate increase. Additional

The County will make a final decision on the rate increase following a public hearing scheduled for Tuesday, June 24, 2025, at 9:30 a.m., in their Board Hearing Room, 381B, located at 500 West Temple St., Los Angeles. Written protests must be received by the close of the public hearing.

The Goats Have Returned for the 2025 Fuel Modification Season!

Goats have resumed their important role in reducing fire hazards and protecting homes. While we understand that many people enjoy seeing the goats, we ask that you avoid visiting them out of respect for nearby residents.

To ensure safety, a temporary electrified fence is in place to contain the goats while they work. Approaching them puts both you and the goats at risk. Please refrain from taking selfies, attempting to touch them, or bringing pets near the area, as this can cause stress or injury to both you and the goats.



In addition, human crews are performing brush clearance throughout the City as part of the 2025 fuel modification program.



City Council Meeting

A City Council meeting is scheduled for May 20 at 7 p.m. in Fred Hesse Community Park, McTaggart Hall. The Palos Verdes Drive East from Crest Road to Palos Verdes Drive South Traffic Study will be presented to the City Council and will be asked to consider the following key recommendations:

1. Establish a new speed limit of 35 miles per hour for Palos Verdes Drive East (PVDE) from Crest Road to Palos Verdes Drive South;
2. Replace the existing landscaping in the median between PVDE and the spur road;
3. Upgrade the signs and pavement markings on PVDE from Crest Road to PVDS; and
4. Approve 5-foot wide bicycle lanes on PVDE from Crest Road to Vista Del Mar as part of the next PVDE roadway slurry sealing/re-paving CIP project; and
5. Direct Staff to prioritize traffic law enforcement on PVDE between Crest Road and PVDS to the extent allowable by enforcement resources and competing priorities.

 - At Ladera Linda Community Park, Public Works' team inspected and repaired a water fountain near the tennis courts. The fountain is now working correctly.







Right of Way Traffic and Pole Light Repairs




- Inspected and serviced the traffic light timer at Crenshaw Boulevard and Crestridge Road

Coastal Hearings Officer Public Hearing

On June 2, 2025, the City's Coastal Hearings Officer of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes will conduct a public hearing for a requested Coastal Development Permit and Major Grading Permit (Case No. PLGR2019-0031) on the vacant lot with Assessor Parcel Number 7582-002-025. The project site is located south of Palos Verdes Drive West and north of Marguerite Drive. The proposed project involves:

- 204 yd³ of after-the-fact (ATF) grading (71 yd³ of cut and 133 yd³ of fill) and construction of supporting retaining walls up to 3 feet in height; and
- ATF construction of a 64 ft² patio area with accessory decorative columns.



