City Council Meeting Agenda Now Available

The agenda for the July 15, 2025 City Council meeting is available at rpvca.gov/agendas.

Meeting topic highlights include:

- A proposed assessment of approximately \$23.50 per parcel this fiscal year for the Citywide Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District, which funds the maintenance of landscaping, lighting, traffic signals, and other improvements in public areas.
- Potentially increasing the Abalone Cove Sewer System annual service charge by 3% to adjust for inflation.
- A permanent alternative solution to replace the temporary SCE power pole that was installed at Ladera Linda Community Park amid accelerated land movement in August 2024.

Land Movement Updates



Landslide Development Regulations Town Hall July 16

On Wednesday, July 16, 2025, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes will host a Town Hall Meeting regarding proposed Municipal Code amendments to address future development in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex. These amendments would permanently prohibit new construction in the landslide area due to the substantial change in circumstances of the land movement.

Residents are invited to learn about the proposed code amendments and share their input during the Town Hall, which will include a presentation from City staff and a question-and-answer session. The proposed code amendments will be made available in advance of the Town Hall no later than Friday, July 11, on the City website at rpvca.gov/landmovement.



Meeting Info

The Town Hall will take place on July 16, 2025 at 6 p.m. at Ladera Linda Community Park and via Zoom at rpvca.gov/participate. Refreshments will be served. Both in-person and Zoom participants will have the opportunity to submit questions to City staff.

Background Info

In September 1978, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes adopted a Landslide Moratorium Ordinance prohibiting new development in the Portuguese Bend Landslide area due to accelerated land movement. The ordinance was updated over the years to grant exceptions on a case-by-case basis.

After heavy rainstorms triggered a historic increase in land movement, in October 2023, the City declared a local state of emergency and implemented an additional moratorium prohibiting all new construction in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex. Due to state law for moratoriums, the prohibition is set to expire on October 2, 2025.

As the landslide emergency continues, and with dozens of homes now red- or yellow-tagged due to land movement, the City has been studying revising the 1978 Landslide Moratorium Ordinance to permanently address development in light of the substantial change in recent circumstances.

At its meeting on August 5, the City Council will consider amending the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code to prohibit new residential construction within the landslide complex, including home additions. Property owners would be permitted to replace, restore, and repair development within its existing footprint. Additionally, the boundaries of the landslide complex would be updated to correspond with the expanded limits of recent land movement.

The full text of the proposed code amendments will be made available in advance of the July 16 Town Hall no later than July 11 on the City website at rpvca.gov/landmovement.

AB 986 Update

On July 8, Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi's landslide legislation, [AB 986](#), was passed by the Senate Governmental Organization Committee. The legislation now heads to the Senate Appropriations Committee, which has until August 29 to hear the bill. AB 986 would amend the California Emergency Services Act to include landslides as a natural disaster that may be eligible for disaster assistance, giving affected communities, such as Rancho Palos Verdes, a clearer path to declare emergencies and take action to protect public safety and infrastructure. The City is a co-sponsor of AB 986.

L.A. Board of Harbor Commissioners Greenlights Waterfront Amphitheater in San Pedro

On June 26, 2025, the Los Angeles Board of Harbor Commissioners voted unanimously to certify the Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (FSEIR) for the West Harbor Modification Project, which involves the construction of an approximately 6,200-seat, 100,000-square-foot-amphitheater in the future West Harbor development on the site of the former Ports O' Call Village in San Pedro.

In January 2025, the City submitted comments on the project's Draft SEIR, which found significant, unavoidable impacts related to air quality, including greenhouse gases, noise and transportation. The City raised concerns about potential noise impacts to residents on the east side of RPV from approximately 100 paid events per year, as well as impacts of offshore fireworks displays. The City supported mitigation efforts including the creation of a noise complaint hotline and/or website for the amphitheater, penalties for noise violations, requirements for a noise monitoring station and sound-monitoring data reports, and a mitigation measure to replace firework displays with lighted drone

displays to the extent possible. Comments responding to the City's comment letter are available in [Chapter 2 of the FSEIR \(PDF\)](#).

Revisions in the FSEIR include reducing the number of annual fireworks shows permitted from 25 to 13, with 10 of those events anticipated to be sponsored by West Harbor. However, during the Board of Harbor Commissioners discussion, the project developer expressed being amenable to having only five fireworks show per year. Based on the discussion, Port of Los Angeles staff intends to recommend an additional measure be included in West Harbor's lease that allows up to five tenant-sponsored firework events per year instead of the 10 events discussed in the FSEIR. The final lease will go before the Board of Harbor Commissioners at a future meeting. In addition to reducing the number of permitted fireworks shows, mitigation has been revised to prevent "salute" concussive shell fireworks that are the most disruptive to sensitive groups.

According to the [Daily Breeze](#), construction is expected to take approximately 14-16 months, and the amphitheater will be operated by the Nederlander Organization, which ran the Greek Theater in Los Angeles. West Harbor is expected to have soft openings by the end of 2025, with a grand opening celebration planned for the first or second quarter of 2026.

How to Sign Up for Alert SouthBay

Rancho Palos Verdes and 14 other South Bay cities are part of Alert SouthBay, a regional emergency notification system.

Alert SouthBay is an opt-in alert system using the Everbridge software application. Similar to Nixle alerts, Everbridge sends notifications via email, text message, cellular and landline phones. Users can subscribe to receive alerts from multiple South Bay cities. If you live in Rancho Palos Verdes, for example, but work in Torrance, you can subscribe to alerts from both cities.

Landslide Financial Assistance Grant Program Closed

On June 30, 2025, the Financial Assistance Grant program officially ended. The City received **238 applications** and disbursed payments for **223 completed** and verified applications totaling **\$2.22 million** with 2 more applications pending. No further applications will be accepted.

On October 1, 2024, the Rancho Palos Verdes City Council unanimously approved an emergency financial assistance program allocating \$2.8 million in landslide relief funding from the office of Los Angeles County Supervisor Janice Hahn to deliver immediate aid to City residents impacted by land movement and utility shutoffs. Through the program, the City provided up to \$10,000 to each eligible affected property owner applicant. During the April 17, 2025 budget workshop, the City Council approved the transfer of the remaining grant funds to the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Fund to continue supporting landslide emergency response and mitigation efforts, in accordance with the grant requirements.

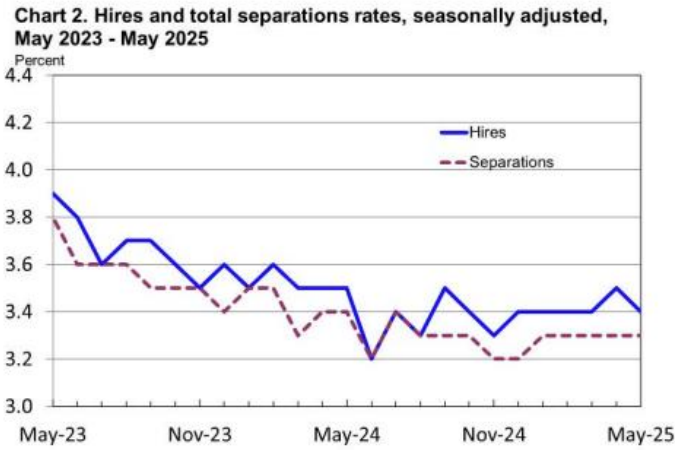
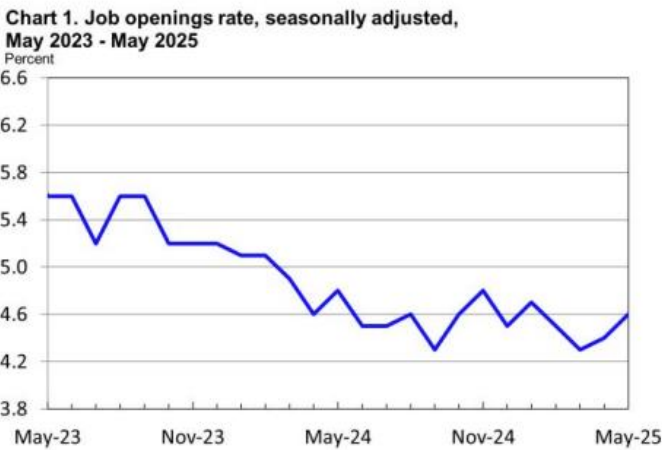
Job Openings and Labor Turnover – May 2025

On July 1, 2025, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) released the April 2025 data from the Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey (JOLTS). This monthly report includes estimates of the number and rate of job openings, hires, and separations and provides insights into the current labor market.

As reported, the number of job openings totaled 7.8 million for the month ending May 2025, with little change from April’s 7.4 million job openings. At 4.6 percent, the job opening rate changed very little compared to April. Within the month of May, hires and separations both slightly decreased at 5.5 million and 5.2 million, respectively.

In May, the number of job openings decreased most noticeably in the federal government. The number of job openings increased in food services and in finance and insurance.

Public Hearing: Citywide Landscaping and Lightning Maintenance District (LLMD) Assessment

On July 15, 2025, the City Council will conduct a public hearing during the regularly scheduled meeting to consider an assessment rate for properties for the Citywide Landscaping and Lightning Maintenance District (LLMD). If approved, the revenue will be utilized for the installation, construction, operation, maintenance, and servicing of public street landscaping and associated work.

Public Hearing: Abalone Cove Sanitary Sewer Charge CPI Increase

On July 15, 2025, the City Council will conduct a public hearing during the regularly scheduled meeting to consider a Consumer Price Index (CPI) increase to the annual sewer service charge for the Abalone Cove Sewer System. The proposed CPI increase is 3%, based on the March 1, 2025 CPI for the Los Angeles-Long Beach-Anaheim Area. This charge only applies to those who are connected to the Abalone Cove sewer system and excludes red-tagged homes.

Landslide Emergency Stabilization

In response to unprecedented movement of the deeper slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City installed vertical deep de-watering wells (DDWs) to penetrate the deeper slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the City performed emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures/grabens, lining canyons, and improving drainage.

Status of the Deep Dewatering Wells Program

- The DDWs continue to be monitored and re-drilled or replaced as needed within the current approved budget.
- The total combined water extraction rate of the DDWs is currently at approximately **630 gallons per minute** or **0.91 million gallons per day**.
- Since the start of the DDW program, approximately **285 million gallons** or **859 acre-feet** of water have been extracted from certain locations around the toe of the Landslide Complex. Overall extraction rates have recently decreased due to the reasons described below:
 - DDW-7 has sheared due to land movement. Based on the relatively low production rate of this DDW, the City's geologists are advising that this DDW should not be re-drilled but rather re-located, should additional funding become available. Accordingly, DDW-7 has been decommissioned.
 - DDW-8 has sheared due to land movement. A plan is being developed to re-drill the well in the near future.
 - DDW-10 experienced an electrical malfunction. The affected equipment is being replaced, and the well is anticipated to be back in service by the end of the week.
 - DDW-11 experienced pump failure because of an insufficient water flow rate to keep the pump cooled. Due to the insufficient water flow, the City's geologists are advising that this DDW should not be re-drilled but rather relocated, should additional funding become available. Accordingly, DDW-11 has been decommissioned.

Status of Winterization

All winterization activities for the 2024-25 rainy season are completed. Plans for winterization for the 2025-26 rainy season will be developed in the coming weeks.

Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts - Palos Verdes Drive South Pipeline Replacement Project

The sewer service in Rancho Palos Verdes is provided by both Los Angeles County Public Works and the City. Wastewater from these systems flows into transmission pipelines operated by the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (LACSD), a regional agency serving 5.5 million residents in 78 cities. LACSD operates two above-ground 14-inch transmission pipelines along Palos Verdes Drive South, which carry sewage from across the Palos Verdes Peninsula to treatment facilities in Carson.

Ongoing land movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex has damaged these pipelines and caused leaks requiring emergency repairs. In response, LACSD has launched a project to replace the existing rigid steel pipes



with more flexible High-Density Polyethylene (HDPE) pipes. Construction began several months ago and is expected to be completed by the end of July 2025.

Staff are coordinating closely with LACSD to limit traffic disruptions along Palos Verdes Drive South.

Coastal Bluff Fence Repair Along Calle Entradero

Contractors have begun the repair work on the coastal bluff fence along Calle Entradero. A chain link fence has been installed to secure the work zone, and crews are actively working in the area shown. Several parking spaces will be temporarily unavailable to allow for equipment storage. The project is expected to take approximately four to six weeks to complete.



Update on the Hesse Park Community Center Roof Replacement Project

The work for the Hesse Park Community Center Roof Replacement is substantially complete. The construction contractor will be fully moved off site within the next couple of weeks after some minor adjustments and detailing are completed.

The project provides a full replacement for the facility's roof and skylights. During the winter storms in early 2024, sections of the roof leaked and damaged interior areas of the building, including sensitive equipment used to facilitate public meetings and events. Public Works staff made temporary repairs to the building and further determined through a detailed assessment that the roof, including all 17 skylights, was nearing the end of its useful service life; and a full replacement would be needed soon. Subsequently, a heavy wind event in January 2025 damaged some of the temporary repairs made in 2024, as well as some skylights.





Traffic Safety Committee (TSC) Recommendations for Traffic Calming Implementation and Studies

During the June 30, 2025, Special Meeting, the TSC received staff reports and heard comments from the public on several items. The TSC recommended the following:

Avenida Classica Traffic Circles

Following is a summary of the TSC recommendations:

- Extend red curbing on the northbound approach of the intersection of Avenida Classica and Avenida Esplendida for an additional 30 feet beyond the existing 45 feet of red curb to improve sight lines.
- Add a “Pedestrian Ahead” sign at the start of the red curb (W11-2 sign and AHEAD) to notify uphill vehicles of pedestrians crossing.
- Install a directional arrow (R6-4 series) signs and/or “ONE WAY” (R6-1R or R6-2R) signs to indicate the travel direction at the existing pilot traffic circles.
- Modify the striping along Avenida Classica to enhance the entry to the traffic circle to discourage errant left turns.
- Increase the diameter of the existing 20-foot diameter pilot traffic circle at the intersection of Avenida Classica and Avenida Esplendida to a 22-foot circle footprint diameter.
- Considering supplemental advanced warning signage based on traffic engineering guidelines.

Trudie Drive Speed Humps

In response to a petition for speed humps on Trudie Drive from Highmore Avenue to Bayend Drive, the TSC recommended that staff commission a traffic study to assess speed humps and/or other speed reduction measures for the segment of roadway identified in the petition.

Hawthorne Boulevard Guardrail Evaluation

In response to a petition for a block wall/guardrail for Hawthorne Boulevard along the curved segment between Ridgeway Drive and San Nicolas Drive, the TSC recommended that staff commission a traffic study for the installation of guardrail in the parkway between the curb and sidewalk.



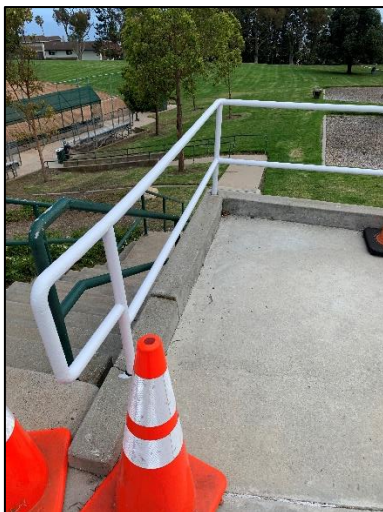
Hawthorne Boulevard between Ridgeway Drive and San Nicolas Drive

 - Hesse Park



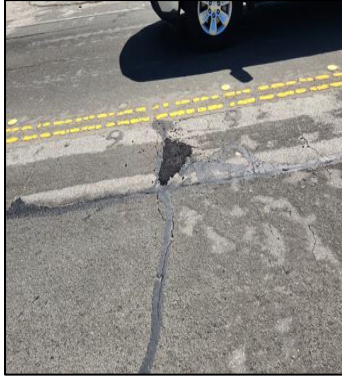

 - Potholes on Palos Verdes Drive East between Bronco Drive and Roan Road

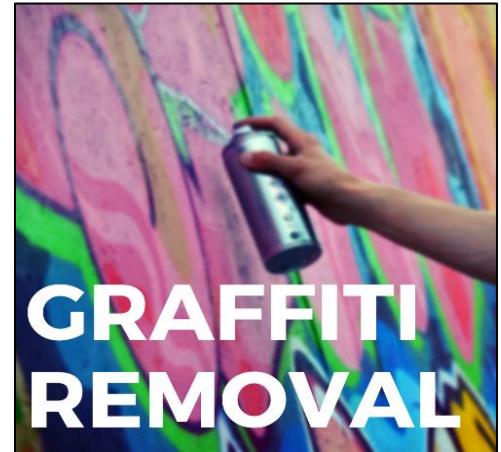
- Roadway deviations and asphalt patched at Crenshaw Boulevard and Park Place.

Planning Division Monthly Activity Report

The Planning Division's Monthly Activity Report for June 2025 summarizes the Division's activities during this past month regarding new applications received and Staff, Planning Commission, and City Council decisions rendered. As indicated in the attached report, the division received 55 new applications and rendered decisions on 29 applications for June 2025.

Building and Safety Division Monthly Activity

The Building and Safety Division's Monthly Activity Report for June 2025 reports on 1) a summary of the new cases received delineated by application type; 2) the number of permits issued; 3) the amount of fees collected; 4) the number of inspections performed; and 5) the number of new plan checks submitted. As indicated in the attached report, the division issued 200 permits and performed 735 inspections.

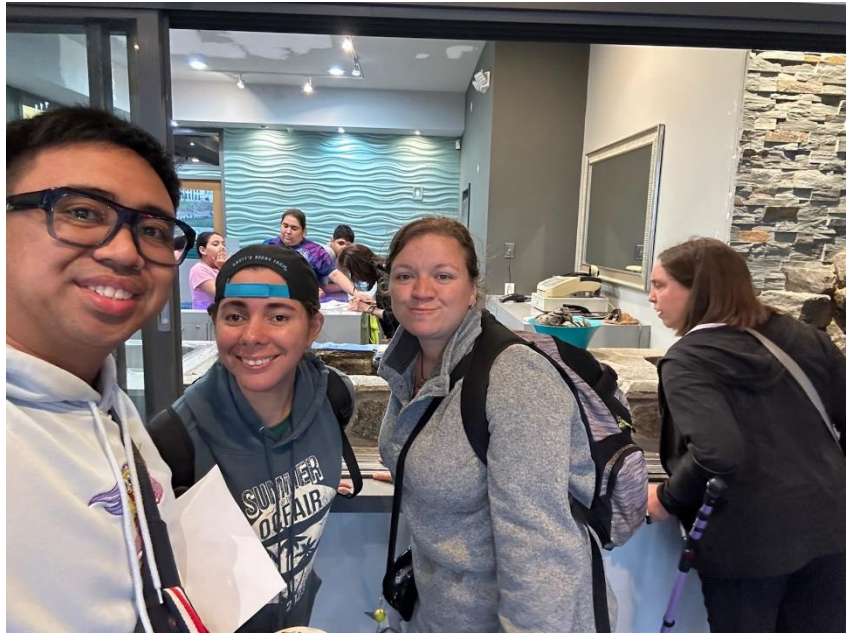

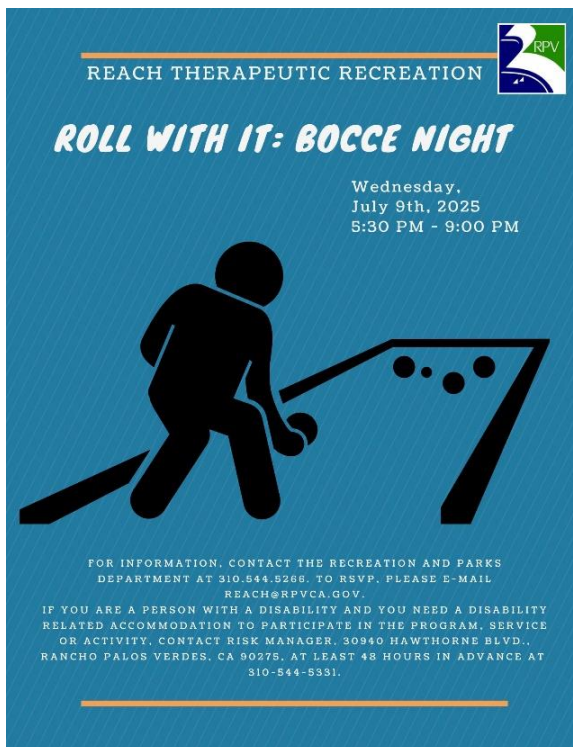
