City Council Meeting Agenda Now Available

The agenda for the August 5, 2025 City Council meeting is available at rpvca.gov/agendas.

Meeting topic highlights include:

- Considering lowering the speed limit along the stretch of Palos Verdes Drive East known as the “Switchbacks” from 40 mph to 35 mph.
- Proposed Municipal Code amendments that would permanently prohibit new construction in the landslide complex.
- Potentially initiating the process to form a new geological hazard abatement district to help mitigate the Portuguese Bend Landslide, the largest of RPV’s ancient landslides.






Save the Date: National Night Out August 5

Bells of Nagasaki on August 3

The Urakami Cathedral in Nagasaki, Japan was built in 1925 but destroyed during the nuclear bombing on August 9, 1945. About 8,500 of the City's 12,000 Catholics perished and only the cathedral's walls remained. The new Urakami Cathedral was built in 1959, and a surviving bell was installed in one of the church's two new towers.

American Catholics have raised funds to create a bronze bell that will be installed in the second tower of the Cathedral and will be rung this August 9 at 11:02am to mark the 80th year since the bombing.

Touched by a personal desire for world-wide peace and to bring awareness of the cathedral bell restoration project, pianist Anli Lin Tong has put together a classical musical program at St. John Fisher Church on 5448 Crest Road. on Sunday, August 3, 2025 at 2:30pm. She will be joined by Trumpetist Grant Hungerford, Violinist Yutong Sharp, Cellist Catherine Biagini, and the St. John Fisher Church Music Guild Singers.

Case-Shiller Home Price Indexes – May 2025

On July 29, 2025, data from the S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Home Price Indexes, the leading measure of residential real estate prices, were released for May 2025. This information provides insight into the housing market by highlighting monthly and annual changes reported in the National and Los Angeles Home Price Indexes.

Month-over-Month


The pre-seasonally adjusted U.S. National, 10 City Composite and 20 City Composite Indexes all reported gains in May 2025. The 10 City Composite and 20 City Composite

posted a month-over-month increase of 0.4% before seasonal adjustments. After seasonal adjustment, the 10 City Composite and 20 City Composite both posted a month-over-month decrease of -0.3%. After seasonal adjustments, the U.S. National Index posted a decrease of -0.3%, as well.

Year-over-Year

The National Index reported a 2.3% annual return in May 2025, down from a 2.7% annual return in April 2025. At 3.01%, the annual gain for Los Angeles was higher than the national average. Among the 20 cities in the indexes, New York again reported the highest annual gain with a 7.4% increase in May 2025. Chicago and Detroit also reported higher than average annual increases of 6.1% and 4.9%, respectively.

Landslide Emergency Stabilization

In response to unprecedeted movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City installed vertical deep de-watering wells (DDWs) to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the city performed emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures/grabens, lining canyons, and improving drainage.

Status of the Deep Dewatering Wells Program

- The DDWs continue to be monitored and re-drilled or replaced as needed within the current approved budget.
- The total combined water extraction rate of the DDWs is currently at approximately **670 gallons per minute** or **0.96 million gallons per day**.
- Since the start of the DDW program, approximately **301 million gallons** or **907 acre-feet** of water have been extracted from certain locations around the toe of the Landslide Complex. Overall extraction rates have recently decreased due to the reasons described below:
 - DDW-5 has been shut down for pump maintenance and is expected to be back in service by the end of the week.
 - DDW-8 has sheared due to land movement. Bids for re-drilling this well are being reviewed and work is expected to start within a week.
 - DDW-9 required repairs to its pump last week is now back in service.

Status of Winterization

Field reconnaissance by geologists is scheduled over the next two weeks to develop winterization plans for 2025-2026.

Palos Verdes Drive South in Landslide Area

This week, Wayfarers Chapel is continuing maintenance work on their slope adjacent to Palos Verdes Drive South in the landslide area. The work generally consists of removing material to stabilize the slope.



Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts - Palos Verdes Drive South Pipeline Replacement Project

The sewer service in Rancho Palos Verdes is provided by both Los Angeles County Public Works and the City. Wastewater from these systems flows into transmission pipelines operated by the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (LACSD), a regional agency serving 5.5 million residents in 78 cities. LACSD operates two above-ground 14-inch transmission pipelines along Palos Verdes Drive South, which carry sewage from across the Palos Verdes Peninsula to treatment facilities in Carson.

Ongoing land movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex has damaged these pipelines and caused leaks requiring emergency repairs. In response, LACSD has launched a project to replace the existing rigid steel pipes with more flexible High-Density Polyethylene (HDPE) pipes. Construction began several months ago and is now expected to be completed by the end of the summer.

Staff are coordinating closely with LACSD to limit traffic disruptions along Palos Verdes Drive South.



City Council Meeting: Palos Verdes Drive East Traffic Update – August 5

On August 5, 2025, the City Council will receive an update on traffic measures along Palos Verdes Drive East from Crest Road to Palos Verdes Drive South and speeding enforcement on the stretch of the roadway known as the “switchbacks.” The Council will also consider whether to adjust the speed limit on Palos Verdes Drive East in the subject area.



REMINDER: Landslide Area Development Regulations

On August 5, 2025, the City Council will consider the proposed amendments to address future development in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex. The proposed amendments would permanently prohibit new construction in the landslide area due to the substantial change in circumstances of the land movement. However, it would permit property owners to replace, restore, and repair development within the same general location. Additionally, the boundaries of the Landslide Complex would be updated to correspond with the expanded limits of recent land movement. 




Del Cerro Park
