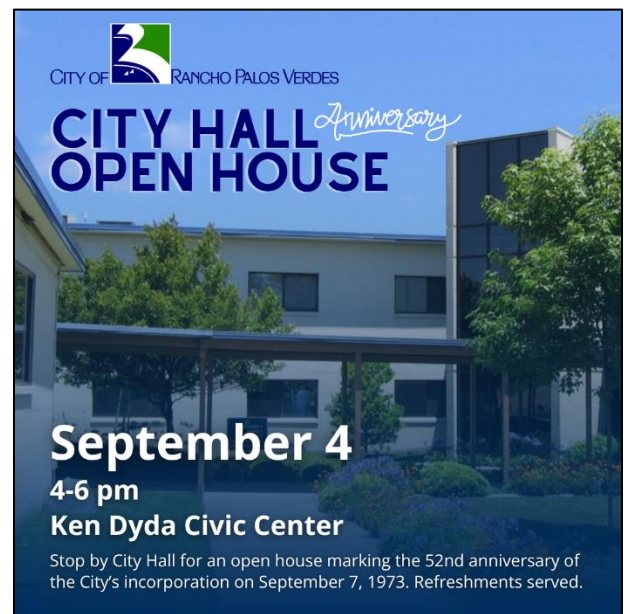

Heat is Deadly, For You and Your Pets

Excessive heat is deadly, causing more deaths than all other weather events, including floods and tornados! Heat kills by pushing the body beyond its limits, making it work extra hard to maintain a normal temperature.

During heat waves, staying indoors in locations with air conditioning, remaining cool and hydrated, and avoiding high energy activities will help keep you and your pets safe.

You should also take the following steps during warm weather to protect your pets:



- ❖ Keep pets off hot pavement and asphalt. Pavement temperatures are 40-60 degrees warmer than air temperatures. For example, on a 77 °F day, the temperature for asphalt is 125°F. If in doubt, place your forearm on the pavement, if it's too hot for you, it's too hot for your pet's paws.
- ❖ Do not leave pets in your car. Car temperatures are much higher than the temperature outside, even on a cloudy day. For example, if the temperature outside is 85 °F, the car will heat up to 118 °F in just 30 minutes.

Case-Shiller Home Price Indexes – June 2025

On August 26, 2025, data from the S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Home Price Indexes, the leading measure of residential real estate prices, was released for June 2025. This information provides insight into the housing market by highlighting monthly and annual changes reported in the National and Los Angeles Home Price Indexes.

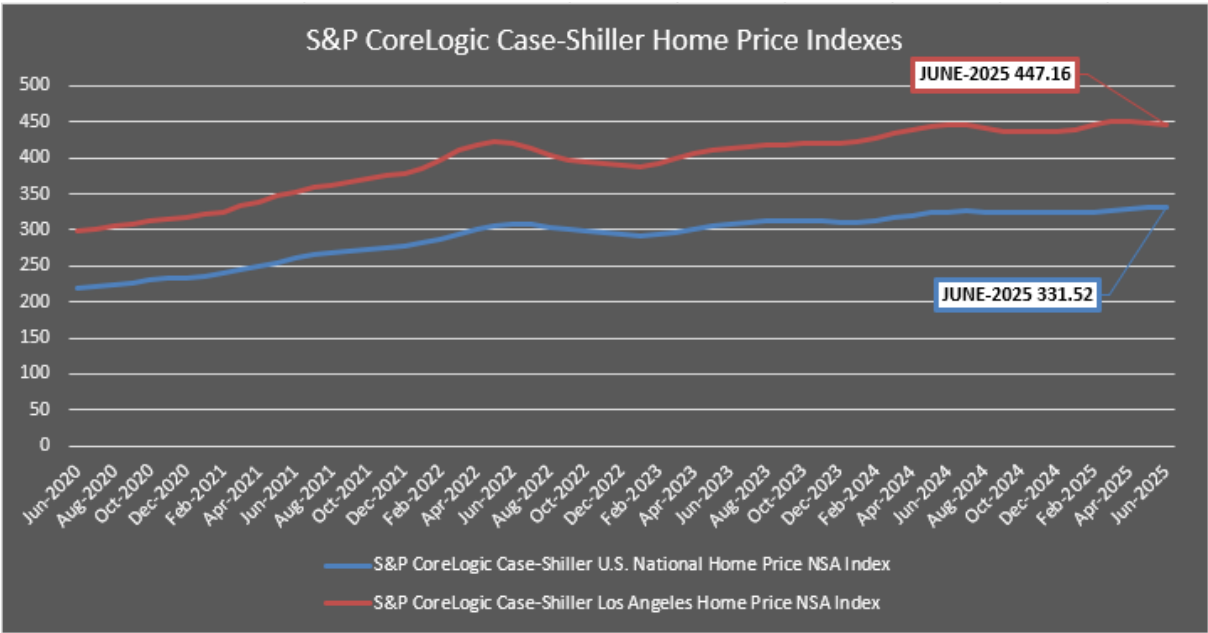
Month-over-Month

The pre-seasonally adjusted U.S. National Index reported a very small gain of 0.1%. The 10 City Composite and 20 City Composite Indexes both reported drops in June 2025, at -0.1% and -0.4%, respectively. After seasonal adjustment, the 10 City Composite and 20 City Composite posted a month-over-month decrease of -0.1% and -0.3%, respectively. After seasonal adjustments, the U.S. National Index posted a decrease of -0.3%.

Year-over-Year

The National Index reported a 1.9% annual return in June 2025, down from a 2.3% annual return in May 2025. At 0.1%, the annual gain for Los Angeles was lower than the national average. Among the 20 cities in the indexes, New York again reported the highest annual gain with a 7.0% increase in June 2025. Chicago and Cleveland also reported higher than average annual increases of 6.1% and 4.5%, respectively. Phoenix, Miami, Denver, San Diego, Dallas, San Francisco and Tampa all saw annual declines in home values for June 2025.

Landslide Emergency Stabilization

In response to unprecedented movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City installed vertical deep de-watering wells (DDWs) to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the city performed emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures/grabens, lining canyons, and improving drainage.

Status of the Deep Dewatering Wells Program

- The DDWs continue to be monitored and re-drilled or replaced as needed within the current approved budget.
- The total combined water extraction rate of the DDWs is currently at approximately **635 gallons per minute** or approximately **0.91 million gallons per day**.
- Since the start of the DDW program, approximately **318 million gallons** or **973 acre-feet** of water have been extracted from certain locations around the toe of the Landslide Complex. Weekly extraction rates are currently below average due to the reasons outlined below:
 - DDW-1 is offline due to an unknown reason. Troubleshooting is in progress.
 - DDW-5 has sheared due to land movement and is offline. Re-drilling is scheduled for the week of 9/2/2025.
 - DDW-9A re-drilling was completed last week and it was brought back into service on 8/22/2025.

Status of Winterization:

Staff, in consultation with geologists, are currently developing recommendations for emergency winterization for the 2025-2026 rainy season.

Palos Verdes Drive South in Landslide Area

This week, Wayfarers Chapel is continuing maintenance work on their slope adjacent to Palos Verdes Drive South in the landslide area. The work generally consists of removing material to stabilize the slope.



Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts - Palos Verdes Drive South Pipeline Replacement Project

The sewer service in Rancho Palos Verdes is provided by both Los Angeles County Public Works and the City. Wastewater from these systems flows into transmission pipelines operated by the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (LACSD), a regional agency serving 5.5 million residents in 78 cities. LACSD operates two above-ground 14-inch transmission pipelines along Palos Verdes Drive South, which carry sewage from across the Palos Verdes Peninsula to treatment facilities in Carson.



Ongoing land movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex has damaged these pipelines and caused leaks requiring emergency repairs. In response, LACSD has launched a project to replace the existing rigid steel pipes with more flexible High-Density Polyethylene (HDPE) pipes. Construction began several months ago and is now expected to be completed by the end of the summer.



Staff are coordinating closely with LACSD to limit traffic disruptions along Palos Verdes Drive South.

Neighborhood Beautification Grant Program Coming Soon!

Applications for the neighborhood beautification projects will be accepted from September 2, 2025 through October 17, 2025. Beautification projects must be visible from arterial or collector streets to receive a reimbursement for 50% of the project costs, up to \$5,000.

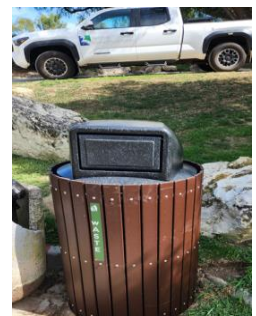

 - Avenida Classica and Ave Esplendida

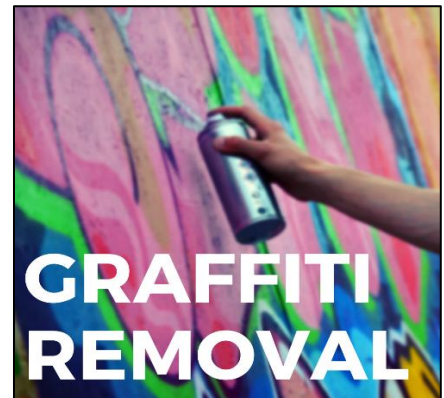




- Traffic signals and traffic lights were recently serviced at the following intersections:

The City's Community Development Department will begin accepting applications for Round 3 of the Western Avenue Storefront Improvement Program on Monday, September 8th. Grants of \$5,000-\$20,000 requiring a 50% match, are available for



eligible projects that enhance or restore the physical condition or appearance of a building (must be visible from the street). Eligible properties must be located along Western Avenue within the boundaries of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes. No Construction on Monday, September 1, 2025 (Labor Day)

Pursuant to Section 17.56.020(B) of the City's Development Code, it is unlawful to carry on construction, grading, or landscaping activities, or to operate heavy equipment except between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. Monday through Friday, and between the hours of 9:00 A.M.

and 5:00 P.M. on Saturday. No such activity shall be permitted on Sundays, or the legal holidays (within the city's permitted construction hours), unless a Special Construction Permit is approved by the Community Development Director. City of Los Angeles Notice of Preparation- Five Points Union Project

The City of Los Angeles intends to prepare an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the proposed Five Points Union project located in the Wilmington-Harbor City and San Pedro communities. The project proposes the redevelopment of the 444-acre project site through the Five Points Union Specific Plan, which would allow for approximately 400,000 square feet of commercial and recreational development on the northern portion of the site, and up to approximately 6 million square feet of industrial development on the southern portion of the site. All existing uses would be removed, and the site would be remediated prior to the construction of new buildings and site improvements.



The City of Los Angeles is collecting public comments regarding the proposed project through September 12, 2025. 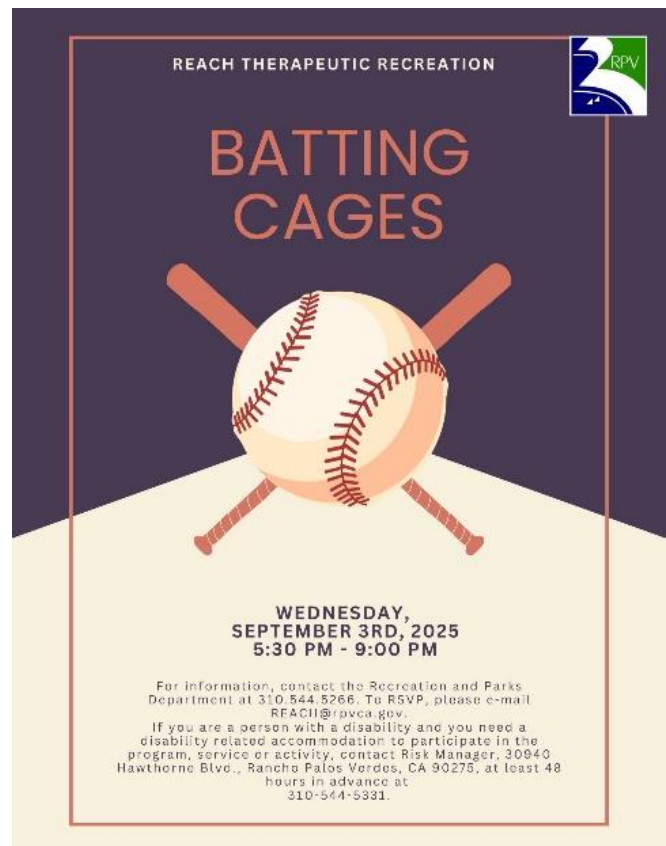
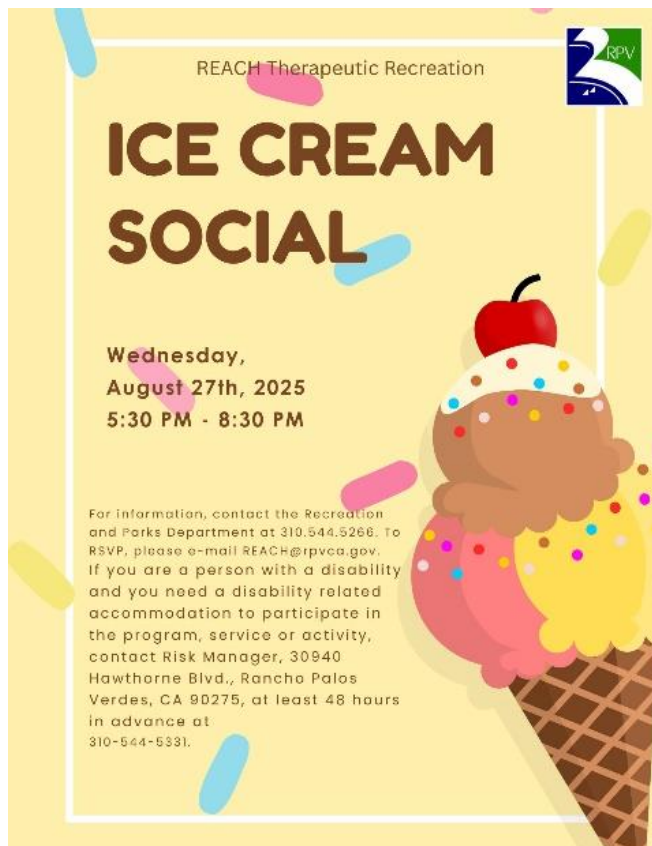

On August 20, Staff made improvements to the temporary closure at the Ishibashi Farm Trail and Gateway area.

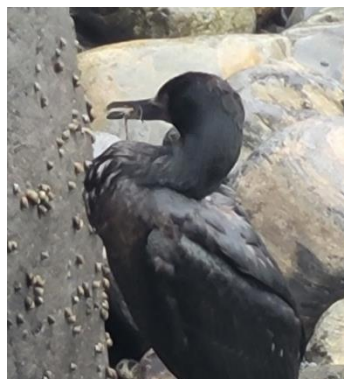


Vicente Bluffs Reserve

HEAT SAFETY

During hot days, make sure to take steps to stay safe.

Remember, excessive heat is deadly, causing more deaths than all other weather events, including floods and tornados! Heat kills by pushing the body beyond its limits, making it work extra hard to maintain a normal temperature.

1. Stay indoors on hot days, in a place with air conditioning

- ✓ Keep your home cool. Cover windows with shades and set your air conditioning thermostat between 75 -80 degrees!
- ✓ DON'T use electric fans when the temperature outside is 95+ degrees. Fans at this temperature create air flow and a false sense of comfort, but do not reduce the temperature in extreme heat.



If you don't have A/C, Find a place to get relief from the heat during the warmest part of the day like the mall or library.

If you must go outside,

- ✓ Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing and a hat!
- ✓ AVOID high energy activities or reschedule to the coolest time of the day (usually 4-7 a.m.)

2. Stay cool and hydrated

- ✓ Drink plenty of water, especially if exercising or working.
- ✓ Eat small, easy to digest meals (ex. fruits or salad)
- ✓ Avoid alcohol, caffeine, hot & heavy meals, and salt tablets. (unless recommended by a physician)
- ✓ Take a cool bath/shower or put wet towels on your head/ body.
- ✓ Avoid extreme temperature changes (ex. air out a hot car before entering).



3. Avoid heat related illness

- ✓ Check yourself, family, and neighbors for signs of heat related illness.
- ✓ Cool down anyone showing signs of heat related illness. Call 911 if you suspect heat stroke.
- ✓ Never leave a person or animal alone inside a vehicle on a warm day, it is illegal and can be lethal. Call 911 if you see a child or animal that's left alone in a car on a warm day. *Parked car's interior can reach over 120 degrees in less than 5 minutes, even with the window partially open, & a shady spot or foggy day can quickly turn into direct, hot sunlight*
- ✓ Ensure that your animals' needs for water and shade are met. *Remember that asphalt, concrete, and truck beds can become very hot to the touch. Paw pads can be burned on these surfaces.*

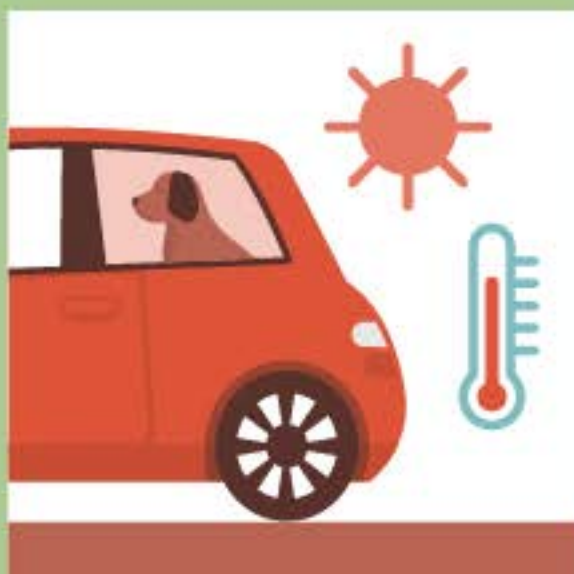

Why You Should Never Leave Your Pet in a Hot Car

We love bringing our pets everywhere with us. But with warm weather just around the corner, you may not be aware of the dangers of leaving your furry pal in a hot car.



Inside Car Temperature vs. Outside Temperature

The temperature inside of a car is significantly higher than the temperature outside, and continually increases with time. For example:

If it's 85 degrees outside, the car temperature can increase to...

- 🔥 104 degrees in just 10 minutes.
- 🔥 114 degrees in just 20 minutes.
- 🔥 118 degrees in just 30 minutes.

That would be *too hot* for us, let alone our pets!

It's *Never* Just a Few Minutes

You never know when you might get held up in a store, or any situation where you think leaving your pet in the car will be okay.



Did you know that *it only takes 5-10 minutes* for a heatstroke to affect your pet?



Keep 'em *Inside!*

When it gets too hot outside, don't risk bringing your fur baby along for the ride. The best place for your pets when it's warm outside is home!

If you see a pet inside of a hot car, *call your local police station or animal control*, and stay by the vehicle until help arrives!
