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CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

October 7, 2025 City Council Meeting Highlights

- City staff gave a status report on the Coyote Management Plan, which focuses primarily on encouraging and supporting coexistence with urban coyotes using education and behavior modification.
- So far in 2025, City staff has conducted 14 yard audits of private properties in an effort to address coyote activity, working closely with residents to identify and eliminate coyote attractants on their properties, such as fallen fruit, overgrown brush, inadequate fencing, and sources of water. No trapping has occurred in RPV this year.
- To report coyote sightings on the Peninsula, go to rpvca.gov/reportcoyotes.
- The Council received an update on wireless telecommunications facilities and efforts to improve cell service throughout the City.
- City staff has been working with wireless carriers and installers to advance existing projects, begin new ones, and identify potential changes to the municipal code that would result in improvements in service and reliability. Proposed code amendments are expected to be presented to the Council in six months.
- Finally, the Council initiated the process of updating the General Plan to reflect recently implemented development regulations prohibiting new residential development in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex.

Clearwater Project Construction Impacting Western Avenue

The Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts have begun drilling in San Pedro on Western Avenue, just north of Weymouth Avenue and across from the 5th Street cul-de-sac, requiring one southbound lane closure. Work is taking place Monday-Friday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and is expected to last 4–6 weeks. Work is also expected to take place on Saturday, October 11. Crews will drill a 6-inch bore hole to 370 feet to lower a camera into the underground tunnel, providing a look into the July 9 collapse that temporarily trapped 31 workers, all of whom were safely rescued.

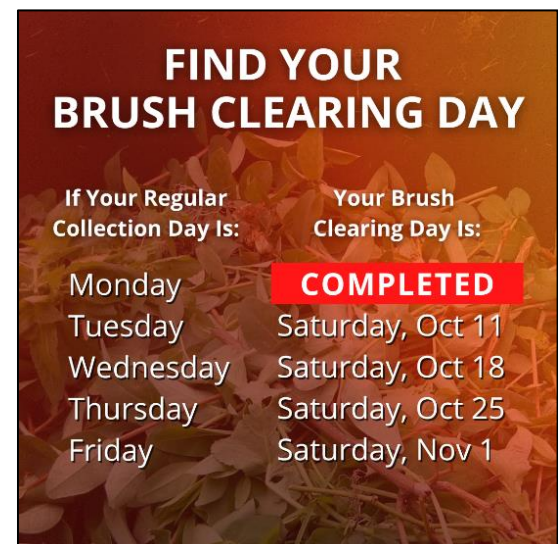

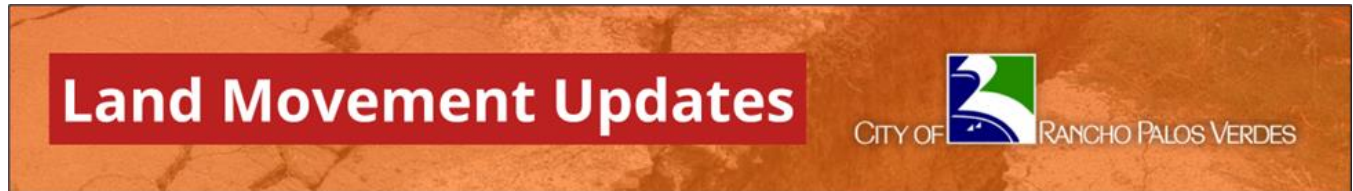

City of Rancho Palos Verdes Statement on Veto of AB 986

On October 2, Rancho Palos Verdes leaders expressed their disappointment in Governor Gavin Newsom's decision to [veto AB 986](#), legislation that would have amended the California Emergency Services Act to name landslides as a natural disaster that may be eligible for disaster assistance.

"Almost two years to the day since our City entered a state of local emergency due to unprecedented land movement that has torn apart homes and vital infrastructure, we are deeply disappointed that the Governor has vetoed a bill that would codify what anyone with common sense already knows — that drastic land movement is a natural disaster and the basis for a declaration of an emergency," said Rancho Palos Verdes Mayor Dave Bradley. "The Governor's assertion that state law already covers landslides runs counter to what has been conveyed to the City by the state as we have sought disaster assistance for the City and impacted residents, who have been left to take on the enormous costs of landslide response with little outside help. We thank Assemblymember Muratsuchi and Senator Allen for their leadership co-authoring AB 986 and are committed to continuing to work with them and the City's coalition of supporters on this issue."

Mayor Bradley subsequently sent a letter to Assemblymember Muratsuchi and Senator Allen requesting they pursue a vote overriding the Governor's veto (see attached letter). While an override is highly unlikely and has not occurred in the state Legislature since 1979, the City felt it did not hurt to ask.

Rancho Palos Verdes, a small, contract city with an annual operating budget of about \$39 million, has spent over \$48 million since October 2022 responding to destructive

landslide movement that accelerated to unprecedented rates following back-to-back heavy rainy seasons. Peaking to moving about 1 foot per week in summer 2024, the natural disaster led to mass gas and electricity shutoffs, the red- and yellow-tagging of dozens of homes, major damage to infrastructure and trails, and the closure and disassembly of the historic Wayfarers Chapel. The City and impacted residents have faced difficulty securing disaster assistance, as state and federal agencies have largely deemed RPV's ancient, slow-moving Portuguese Bend Landslide ineligible under existing law and programs.

"This was a missed opportunity to clarify and strengthen state law for landslide-prone communities navigating red tape. This decision leaves us with more questions and uncertainty, which will not help our City prepare for future landslide events," said Rancho Palos Verdes City Manager Ara Mihranian. "Albeit disappointing, the City and its residents and businesses owners are resilient, and we will continue to pursue disaster recovery assistance."

Case-Shiller Home Price Indexes – July 2025

On September 30, 2025, data from the S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Home Price Indexes, the leading measure of residential real estate prices, was released for July 2025. This information provides insight into the housing market by highlighting monthly and annual changes reported in the National and Los Angeles Home Price Indexes.

Month-over-Month

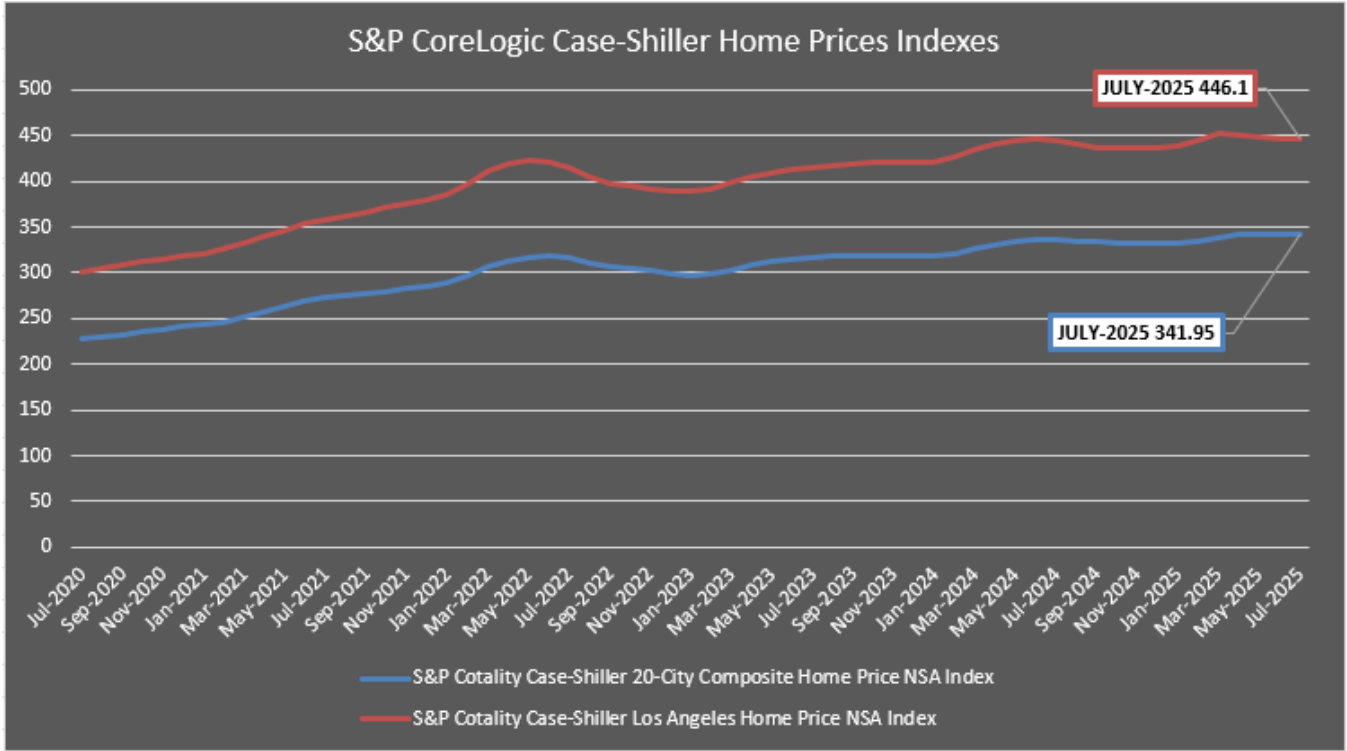
The pre-seasonally adjusted U.S. National Index reported a slight decrease of -0.2%. The 10 City Composite and 20 City Composite Indexes both reported drops in July 2025, at -0.3%, respectively. After seasonal adjustment, the 10 City Composite and 20 City

Composite posted a month-over-month decrease of -0.1%, respectively. After seasonal adjustments, the U.S. National Index posted a decrease of -0.1%.

Year-over-Year

The National Index reported a 1.7% annual return in July 2025, down from a 1.9% annual return in June 2025. At 0.2%, the annual gain for Los Angeles was higher than the national average. Among the 20 cities in the indexes, New York again reported the highest annual gain with a 6.4% increase in July 2025. Chicago and Cleveland also reported higher than average annual increases of 6.2% and 4.5%, respectively. Phoenix, Miami, Denver, San Diego, Dallas, San Francisco and Tampa all saw annual declines in home values for July 2025.

Landslide Emergency Stabilization

In response to unprecedented movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City installed vertical deep de-watering wells (DDWs) to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure.

Additionally, the city performed emergency winterization measures in the form of filling fissures/grabens, lining canyons, and improving drainage.

Status of the Deep Dewatering Wells Program

- The DDWs continue to be monitored and re-drilled or replaced as needed within the current approved budget.
- The total combined water extraction rate of the DDWs is currently at approximately **750 gallons per minute** or approximately **1.1 million gallons per day**.
- Since the start of the DDW program, approximately **350 million gallons** or **1,076 acre-feet** of water have been extracted from certain locations around the toe of the Landslide Complex. Weekly extraction rates are currently influenced by the following circumstances:
 - DDW-9 water level continues to drop. The City's Geologists continue to monitor the well and recommend adjustments to the well's pump depth and extraction rate to reduce the risk of the pump running dry and burning out.

Status of Winterization:

Staff have finalized the scope of work for implementing winterization measures ahead of the rainy season. The work is anticipated to begin by mid-October and require approximately one month to complete.

Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts - Palos Verdes Drive South Pipeline Replacement Project

The sewer service in Rancho Palos Verdes is provided by both Los Angeles County Public Works and the City. Wastewater from these systems flows into transmission pipelines operated by the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County (LACSD), a regional agency serving 5.5 million residents in 78 cities. LACSD operates two above-ground 14-inch transmission pipelines along Palos Verdes Drive South, which carry sewage from across the Palos Verdes Peninsula to treatment facilities in Carson.

Ongoing land movement in the Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex has damaged these pipelines and



caused leaks requiring emergency repairs. In response, LACSD has launched a project to replace the existing rigid steel pipes with more flexible High-Density Polyethylene (HDPE) pipes.

The project is now complete. No further traffic impacts by LACSD's contractor are expected.

Hawthorne Boulevard at Eddinghill/Seamount Left Turn Signal Construction Update

On March 4, 2025, the City Council awarded a construction contract to install a left turn signal arrow for Hawthorne Boulevard at Eddinghill Drive/Seamount Drive. Since that time, the construction contractor has been ordering and acquiring the long lead items like the steel poles, signal heads, and the controllers. The fabrication and acquisition of those items is now nearly complete.

Last Monday, October 6, 2025 construction activities began at the intersection. The project will include the following improvements:

- Left-Turn Arrow for both northbound and southbound Hawthorne Boulevard left turns.
- Traffic signal hardware and equipment updates including a new traffic cabinet and signal controller; upgraded traffic signal mast arms to accommodate the new left turn signal heads; upgraded intersection lighting, new illuminated street name signs; and upgraded intersection accessibility curb ramps.

To minimize traffic disruptions, work hours are generally Monday – Friday from 9am to 4pm. Construction is anticipated to be complete by the end of the year.

 - Installed new playground chips throughout the play areas at Ladera Linda Community Park and Ryan Park
 - Monitoring of the recently installed sod at Eastview Park continues. The area is scheduled to reopen during late October.



STREET LANDSCAPING

- This week, ROW maintenance crews conducted landscape cleaning, weed whacking, and general landscape maintenance along medians and the public right-of-way throughout various City areas. Work locations included:
 - Montemalaga Drive center medians and right of way
 - Palos Verdes Drive East right of way from Palos Verdes Drive South to Crest Road
 - Briarhurst Drive and Purple Ridge Drive



- This week, the irrigation team completed inspections, repairs, and system upgrades at these locations:
 - Completed drip system repairs along Palos Verdes Drive South at Forrestal Drive
 - Repaired drip line on slopes and adjusted the timing of the irrigation controller at Ladera Linda neighborhood

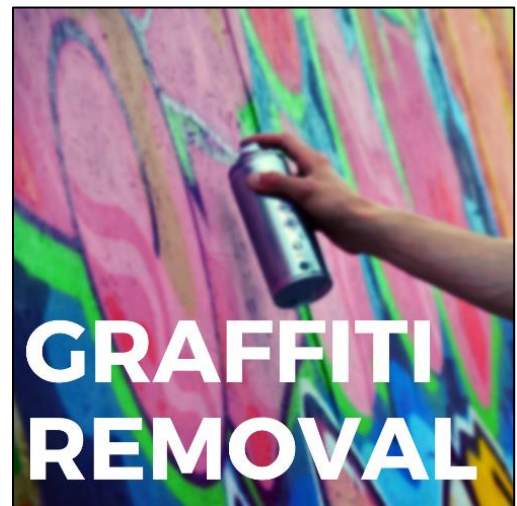

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

No Construction on Monday, October 13 (Legal Holiday)

Pursuant to Section 17.56.020(B) of the Rancho Palos Verdes Municipal Code, it is unlawful to carry on construction, grading, or landscaping activities, or to operate heavy equipment except between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. Monday through Friday, and between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. on Saturday. No such activity shall be permitted on Sundays or legal holidays (within the city's permitted construction hours), unless a Special Construction Permit is approved by the Director of Community Development. On September 26, 2025, the Community Development Department staff canvassed Western Avenue businesses to promote Round 3 of the Western Avenue Storefront Improvement Program.

As a reminder, applications are currently being accepted, and the **submittal deadline is October 31, 2025**. Grants of \$5,000-\$20,000, requiring a 50% match, are available for eligible projects that enhance or restore the physical condition or appearance of the building (must be visible from the street). Examples include new exterior paint, lighting, landscaping, signs, awnings, entry doors, outdoor seating, and resolving code violations. Storefronts must be located along Western Avenue within the boundaries of the City of Rancho



Palos Verdes (NOT in the City of Los Angeles). Learn more about how to spruce up your storefront with this grant opportunity and how to apply at rpvca.gov/storefront.

When Do I Need to Get a Building Permit?

As a public service reminder, building permits are required for all buildings or structures that are to be altered, repaired, enlarged, remodeled or converted, any change in the size of a room takes place, and when any mechanical, electrical or plumbing work is involved. Some examples of projects requiring permits include, but are not limited to:

- Room additions
- Interior remodels
- Foundation repair
- Roof replacement
- Grading & Retaining walls



In some cases, certain improvements also require approval from the City's Planning Division prior to any permit issuance. 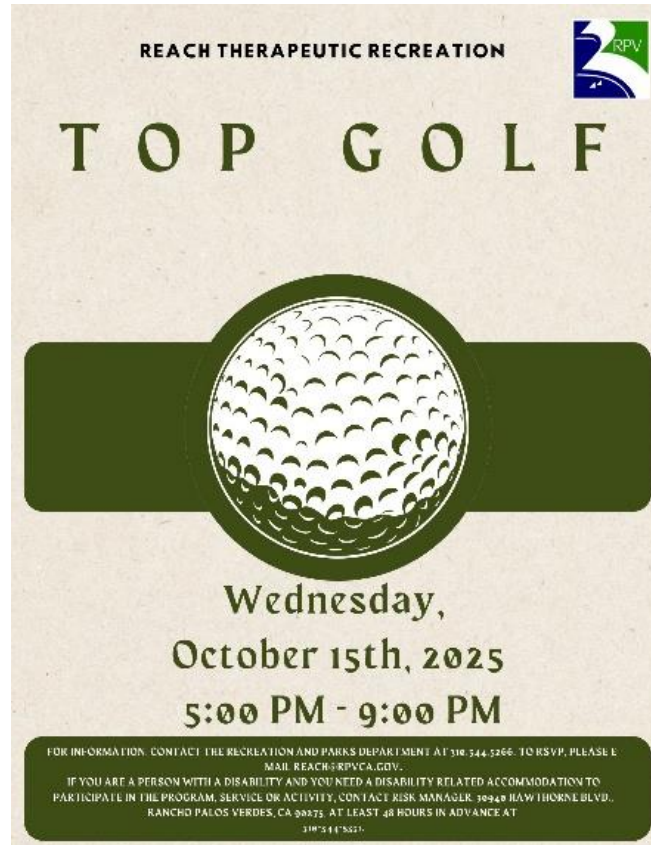
The REACH Bocce Bowl: Final Showdown

Dorothy and Allen Lay Reserve

On October 7, Staff removed several Russian thistle plants, commonly known as tumbleweed, a non-native plant that grows in disturbed areas. The plant was removed along the Plumtree Trailhead.

RE: Request to Vote to Override Governor's Veto on AB 986

On behalf of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes, I am writing to respectfully urge you to vote to override the Governor's recent veto of AB 986, legislation that you authored to amend the California Emergency Services Act (ESA) to name landslides associated with climate change as a natural disaster that may be eligible for disaster assistance.

While the Governor's veto message states that existing law already provides the Governor with sufficient authority to respond to landslides under the California's ESA, your bill would have provided valuable clarity and assurance to communities, local governments, and first responders. The specific inclusion of "landslides" in the ESA ensures there is no ambiguity during times of crisis and reinforces the State's commitment to protecting public safety in the face of increasingly frequent natural disasters. Moreover, it equates landslides, whether new or pre-existing, to wildfires in high fire prone areas, earthquakes along known faults, and extreme weather as a result of climate change to name a few natural disasters.

Rancho Palos Verdes, a small, contract city with an annual operating budget of approximately \$39 million, has spent over \$48 million since October of 2022 responding to destructive landslide movement that accelerated to unprecedented rates following heavy rain seasons, and anticipates spending an additional \$18 million this fiscal year. Peaking to moving about 1 foot per week in summer 2024, the natural disaster led to mass gas and electricity shutoffs, the red – and yellow-tagging of dozens of homes, major damage to infrastructure and trails, and the closure and disassembly of the historic

Wayfarers Chapel. The City and impacted residents have faced difficulty securing disaster assistance, as state and federal agencies have largely deemed Rancho Palos Verdes ancient, slow-moving Portuguese Bend Landslide ineligible under existing law and programs because it is mapped as an existing landslide.

The bill has received strong support from both the Assembly and Senate that support the recognition of landslides as true emergencies that pose serious threats to municipalities and residents across the State. For these reasons, I strongly urge you to sponsor voting to override the Governor's veto.

(2) Prior to removing an individual, the presiding member or their designee shall warn the individual that their behavior is disrupting the meeting and that their failure to cease their behavior may result in their removal. The presiding member or their designee may then remove the individual if they do not promptly cease their disruptive behavior. This paragraph does not apply to any behavior described in subparagraph (B) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b)(1) means engaging in behavior during a meeting of a legislative body that actually disrupts, disturbs, impedes, or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting and includes, but is not limited to, one of the following: (A) A failure to comply with reasonable and lawful regulations adopted by a legislative body pursuant to Section 54954.3 or any other law. (B) Engaging in behavior that constitutes use of force or a true threat of force. (2) "True threat of force" means a threat that has sufficient indicia of intent and seriousness, that a reasonable observer would perceive it to be an actual threat to use force by the person making the threat.

Time Estimates:

The time noted next to an agenda item is only an estimate of the amount of time that will be spent during the meeting on that particular item. Accordingly, these estimates should not be relied on in determining when a matter will be heard, especially since agenda items are often re-ordered during a meeting and may be discussed

at any time.
