## City Council Meeting Agenda Now Available

Meeting topic highlights include:

- Considering conducting a study exploring the feasibility of creating a potential toll road along a portion of Palos Verdes Drive South within the landslide complex that would help pay for maintenance of the roadway in the landslide area.
- Whether to advocate for the introduction of state legislation requiring local grocery stores to continue offering paper coupons to ensure access for all patrons.
- Adopting the 2025 California Building Standards Code, a compilation of building standards that apply to all types of construction in the state.

## RPV Attends Cal Cities Conference

Last week, City officials attended the Cal Cities Annual Conference and Expo in Long Beach.



Established in 1898, Cal Cities is a nonprofit statewide association that advocates for cities with state and federal governments and provides education and training services to elected and appointed city officials. Cal Cities' mission is to expand and protect local control for cities through education and advocacy to enhance the quality of life for all Californians.

City Staff attended informative sessions on disaster preparedness, emergency communications, leadership, grants, and wireless facility permitting, among other topics. No General Assembly was held this year, as no conference resolutions to shape Cal Cities policy were submitted for consideration.

## San Pedro International Film Festival to Screen Documentary on DDT Dumping

The San Pedro International Film Festival, which takes place November 7-9 in RPV and San Pedro, will present a screening of an LA Times documentary about deep-water chemical dumping off the coast of the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

From the Los Angeles Times and Pulitzer Prize-finalist Rosanna Xia, "Out of Plain Sight" is a cinematic exposé of an environmental disaster lurking just off the coast of Southern California. Not far from Catalina Island, aboard one of the most advanced research ships in the world, David Valentine discovered a corroded barrel on the seafloor that gave him chills. The full environmental horror sharpens into greater clarity once he calls Xia, who pieces together a shocking revelation: In the years after World War II, as many as half a million barrels of toxic waste had been quietly dumped into the ocean – and the consequences continue to haunt the world today.




### City Council to Consider PV Drive South Toll Road Feasibility Study

On October 21, 2025, the City Council will consider conducting a study exploring the feasibility of converting a portion of Palos Verdes Drive South into a toll road that would help pay for maintenance of the roadway in the landslide area.

Establishing a toll facility on a public roadway involves multiple layers of legal, procedural, and regulatory approvals. The process is primarily governed by the California Streets and Highways Code and requires coordination among state, regional, and federal agencies.

The Council will be asked to consider these complex requirements, as well as the potential unintended consequences of establishing a toll road, before deciding whether to seek a consultant for a feasibility study, which is estimated to cost \$25,000-\$50,000. The study could provide needed information to determine whether the toll road would be economically feasible, estimating the cost of operating the toll system and forecasting a net revenue estimate under different toll schemes.

## FEMA Disaster Recovery Assistance Update – Appeals Denied

In March 2025, the City [formally appealed](#) the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) decision to deny \$37.9 million in disaster recovery funding requested by the City for costs incurred responding to the landslide emergency due to the winter storms in late January and early February 2024. On October 8, the City [was notified](#) that FEMA District 9 Administrator Robert Fenton has denied the City's appeals, upholding the agency's position that while the winter storms may have greatly accelerated land movement, what FEMA considers to be pre-existing conditions in the landslide make the City ineligible for reimbursement under the 2024 federal disaster declaration. The City believes the unprecedented land movement experienced as a result of the 2024 winter storms was not just a simple expansion of the shallower Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex, but the activation of the Altamira Landslide, a much larger and deeper landslide that had been dormant prior to the record storms. City staff is now preparing a final appeal to FEMA headquarters, which will be submitted within the 60-day deadline.

- LA County Fire Department provided free NOAA weather radios that can warn residents of local emergencies and conducted a fire extinguisher demo during the expo, teaching residents how to use a fire extinguisher and letting them try it themselves.

## FINANCE DEPARTMENT

### FAC Meeting Recap

In the latest meeting of the Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) held on October 9<sup>th</sup>, several key items were discussed.

#### Final Review of the City's Debt Management Policy.

The Committee received a report and presentation from staff detailing the final draft of the City's updated Debt Management Policy. The FAC approved the updated Debt Management Policy with a few recommended revisions to the glossary. The revised Debt Management Policy will be presented to the City Council at the November 18<sup>th</sup> meeting, with two FAC members anticipated to be in attendance and in support of the proposed revision.

#### Other FAC items

FAC also received presentations from staff on the California Public Employee's Retirement System Actuarial Valuation Report as of June 30, 2024 and a financial update on the Greater Portuguese Bend Landslide Complex.

The next FAC meeting is scheduled for November 13<sup>th</sup>, in the Community Room at the Ken Dyda Civic Center, 30940 Hawthorne Blvd. The tentative agenda will include:

- A presentation on potentially establishing a line of credit for the City;
- A presentation and update for the successor agency obligations;
- The Fiscal Year 2025-26 First Quarter Financial Report for General Fund;
- A quarterly presentation on the Treasury activities and investment reports.





## Job Openings and Labor Turnover – August 2025

On September 30, 2025, the Bureau of Labor Statistics released the August 2025 data from the Job Openings and Labor Turnover Survey (JOLTS). This monthly report includes estimates of the number and rate of job openings, hires, and separations and provides insights into the current labor market.

As reported, the number of job openings totaled 7.2 million for the month ending August 2025, with no change from July's 7.2 million job openings. At 4.3 percent, the job opening rate did not change from July. Within the month of August, establishments with one to nine employees and establishments with 5,000 or more employees showed little or no change in job openings, hires and separation rates.

In August, the number and rate of total separations had little change at 5.1 million and 3.2 percent respectively. The number of total separations decreased in accommodation and food services and in arts, entertainment and recreation at -113,000 and -48,000 respectively. The total separations increased in state and local government, excluding education, at +27,000.

# PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS

### Landslide Emergency Stabilization

In response to unprecedeted movement of the deep slide plane in the Greater Portuguese Bend-Ancient Altamira Landslide Complex (Landslide Complex), the City installed vertical deep de-watering wells (DDWs) to penetrate the deep slide plane and relieve water pressure. Additionally, the City introduced an emergency winterization program in the form of filling fissures/grabens, lining canyons, and improving drainage.

#### Status of the Deep Dewatering Wells Program

- The DDWs continue to be monitored and re-drilled or replaced as needed within the current approved budget.
- The total combined water extraction rate of the DDWs is currently at approximately **670 gallons per minute** or approximately **1.0 million gallons per day**.
- Since the start of the DDW program, approximately **357 million gallons** or **1,097 acre-feet** of water have been extracted from certain locations around the toe of the Landslide Complex. Weekly extraction rates are currently influenced by the following circumstances:
  - DDW-9 is currently offline due to low water level. The City's Geologists are studying how quickly its water level rises and will then recommend adjustments to the pump's operation to minimize the risk of it running dry and burning out.

Status of Winterization:

Construction work began this week on winterization measures. The work is expected to take approximately one month to complete.

## Hawthorne Boulevard at Eddinghill/Seamount Left Turn Signal Construction Update

On March 4, 2025, the City Council awarded a construction contract to install a left turn signal arrow for Hawthorne Boulevard at Eddinghill Drive/Seamount Drive. Since that time, the construction contractor has been ordering and acquiring the long lead items like the steel poles, signal heads, and the controllers. The fabrication and acquisition of those items is now nearly complete.

On Monday, October 6, 2025, construction activities began at the intersection. The project includes the following improvements:

- Left-Turn Arrow for both northbound and southbound Hawthorne Boulevard left turns.
- Traffic signal hardware and equipment updates including a new traffic cabinet and signal controller; upgraded traffic signal mast arms to accommodate the new

left turn signal heads; upgraded intersection lighting, new illuminated street name signs; and upgraded intersection accessibility curb ramps.

To minimize traffic disruptions, work hours are generally Monday – Friday from 9am to 4pm. Construction is anticipated to be complete by the end of the year.

  - Palos Verdes Drive East right of way from Crest Road to Miraleste Drive
  - Highridge Road and Crest Road center medians



  - Capeswood Drive- 1 Tree




- The Public Works Department performed the following infrastructure repairs and replacements in the public right-of-way:


## EMERGENCY ISSUES

## Building Code Update

On October 21, the City Council will consider introducing, by title only, an ordinance to adopt the 2025 California Building Standards Code. This update is in response to the California Building Standards Commission (CBSC), which updates the Uniform Codes governing construction practices in the State of California every three years. As part of this effort, the City's Building official is proposing local amendments to the code to establish more stringent standards deemed reasonably necessary due to local conditions, including seismic activity, soil instability, and other geotechnical factors that pose potential risks to life and property. If the ordinance is introduced by the City Council, the first reading of the ordinance will be considered by the City Council as part of a public hearing at its meeting on November 18. ## REMINDER: Applications for the Western Avenue Storefront Improvement Program Closing Soon

As a reminder, applications are currently being accepted for participating in the Western Avenue Storefront Improvement Program. **The submittal deadline is October 31, 2025.** Grants of \$5,000-\$20,000, requiring a 50% match, are available for eligible projects that enhance or restore the physical condition or appearance of the building (must be visible from the street). Examples include new exterior paint, lighting, landscaping, signs, awnings, entry doors, outdoor seating, and resolving code violations. Storefronts must be located along Western Avenue within the boundaries of the City of Rancho Palos Verdes (NOT in the City of Los Angeles). 





## Trick or Treasure: REACH's Pirate Candy Cove
