Update on 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19): The City of Rancho Palos Verdes is receiving regular updates from the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health regarding the circumstances around the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). The City has a [website spotlight](#) for the latest information along with reminders for good public health hygiene, and has shared this information to residents through Nextdoor.

As of February 26, there is still only one confirmed case of the coronavirus in Los Angeles County. The individual is a non-resident who presented themselves at the Los Angeles International Airport upon arrival from Wuhan City, China, was screened, isolated and taken to a hospital for medical treatment. There is no immediate threat to the general public and no special precautions are required. Residents, workers, and visitors are encouraged to engage in regular activities, not excluding anyone based on race, country of origin, or recent travel, and to practice good public health hygiene, especially as it is the height of the flu season. League Rule 20 Policy Update: Last week, the League of California Cities' Board of Directors voted to adopt the City's proposed policy calling on the California Public Utilities Commission to make it possible for more cities to put power lines underground for fire prevention. The policy reads:

"The League supports the inclusion of wildfire mitigation as an eligible project to receive the California Public Utilities' Rule 20 funds and efforts to expand funding for Rule 20."

This means the League will advocate for these changes to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), which is in the process of revising Rule 20.

For some background, Rule 20 is the state's program regulating how cities can underground overhead electric utilities. Rule 20 is still focused primarily on aesthetics, even though we know power lines are a common cause of wildfires, including recent destructive and deadly blazes that have devastated communities across the state.

In 2019, the City Council directed Staff to advocate for revising Rule 20 to include fire prevention via a conference resolution at the League's Annual Conference in October. The resolution won general support at committee hearings at the conference, but was referred back to the League's Environmental Quality, and Transportation, Communications, and Public Works policy committees so that language revisions could be worked out. In January, both policy committees unanimously recommended the League's Board of Directors adopt the policy. The policy was adopted by the board as a consent calendar item during last week's meeting in Yountville.

The City thanks the board for its support and looks forward to working collaboratively to ensure a future where it is possible for more fire-prone communities to put power lines underground.

Staff will continue to monitor this issue, including the CPUC's rulemaking process.

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

Alert SouthBay Registration - Everbridge Emergency Communication Notification System: The City of Rancho Palos Verdes is launching an emergency communication notification system

with Alert SouthBay as a multi-jurisdictional coordinated approach to emergency management with 12 other South Bay cities. Everbridge will act as the City's primary vehicle for emergency communication, as well as public-safety related messaging: ranging from road closures due to water main breaks or police activity, to critical emergency communications such as Shelter in Place or Evacuation notifications.



Everbridge will officially launch on Monday, March 2. The City encourages all residents and members of the Rancho Palos Verdes community to opt-in and register for Everbridge. There are three easy methods for registering:

- Text to 888-777 with the message “alertsb” (one word), which returns a link to register for Everbridge
- Download the free Everbridge app on an iOS or Android device from the App Store or Google Play Store

Peninsula Regional Law Enforcement Committee and Regional Emergency Preparedness Committee: The City of Rancho Palos Verdes continues to work alongside the other Peninsula cities to coordinate and improve regional law enforcement and emergency preparedness. All meetings are open to the public, and are held at Rolling Hills City Hall (2 Portuguese Bend Rd., Rolling Hills, CA 90274). At the meetings, the committees review crime statistics and trends, law enforcement and emergency preparedness programs, and other public safety related topics. The next meeting date is set for **Thursday, May 14 at 7:30 a.m.** for the Regional

Emergency Preparedness Committee, with the Regional Law Enforcement Committee meeting beginning afterwards.

Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) Training Classes: The Los Angeles County Fire Department continues to provide training for the public to develop community response to emergencies. Community Emergency Response Training (CERT) training classes start in April, and will be provided in three training courses. The sessions will be provided on Saturdays, April 4, 18, and 25 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. at Rolling Hills Estates City Hall (4045 Palos Verdes Dr. N., Rolling Hills Estates, CA 90274). These CERT classes are FREE and are crucial for improving the safety of communities through emergency preparedness. These classes provide basic training in safety and lifesaving skills for the public. If you would like to sign up, email gk1319@yahoo.com or call 310-780-6867. Information on AB 2367 (Residential Property Insurance: wildfire resilience): Assembly Bill No. 2367 (AB 2367) was introduced in the state legislature on February 18 with the support of State Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara in an effort to protect property owners by ensuring insurance coverage when certain fire-hardening standards are met. The bill, if passed, would create the Wildfire Resilience Task Force, which would include the State Insurance Commissioner, the Director of the Office of Emergency Services, and the State Fire Marshall, in order to establish minimum standards for fire-hardened homes and communities. If these standards are met, admitted insurers would be required to offer or sell residential property insurance coverage that they most commonly offer or sell. In addition, the bill would also allow the Commissioner to require admitted insurers to incentivize homeowners to make their property more fire-hardened as a part of insurance premiums.

The City will continue to track this legislation, as it may impact our residents and potentially assist residents with wildfire mitigation efforts and to retain appropriate and affordable insurance coverage. To view the legislation as introduced, please visit the link below:

FINANCE

PUBLIC WORKS

Comments on the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC) proposed guidelines for Public Safety Power Shut-Offs (PSPS): The City has submitted comments on the proposed guidelines as part of the public comment period established by the Administrative Law Judge in proceeding number R.18-12-005. Comments were due by February 19, with replies due by February 26. The City's comments were submitted to ensure that community concerns are acknowledged, and hopefully addressed, as additional and modified de-energization guidelines are considered.

CalRecycle Notice to Improve Recycling: California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) notified the City that our efforts to implement AB 341 (Mandatory Commercial Recycling), and AB 1826 (Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling) were deemed insufficient. The City was given 30 days to prepare and submit a formal plan of action outlining how we intend to achieve maximum participation from businesses and multi-family residential complexes. Approximately 80 other jurisdictions in Southern California have received or will be receiving similar 30-day notices. The City's response is due on February 28. To improve compliance and the City's "good-faith effort," the City will be evaluating options including an ordinance requiring businesses and multi-family dwellings to sign up for mandatory commercial recycling and commercial organics recycling. Extensive public outreach and education will be provided by the haulers and the City, and compliance will be monitored closely. The ordinance could also include fines and penalties for non-compliance. The ordinance is tentatively agendized for the April 7 City Council meeting.


Storm Water Quality News: The Palos Verdes Peninsula Water Management Group met at their monthly meeting on February 25 to discuss a number of items regarding storm water quality matters in the Peninsula. A representative of the City of Torrance attended to update the group of the status of the Torrance Airport Project. Other potential projects that would comply with the State Water Board's requirements were also discussed. These included a Harbor City Park Project and an Eastview Park Project, which is tentatively agendized for the March 17 City Council meeting.

Installation of an All-Way Stop at Crestridge Road and Middlecrest Road: The stop signs on all approaches at the intersection of Crestridge Road and Middlecrest Road have been installed. The City Council approved this item at the February 18 meeting. The stop signs were recommended at this intersection due to the inadequate sight distances. Installation of an all-way stop was chosen as the only option that eliminates all conflicting movements and assigns right-of-way without creating confusion at this intersection.

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Maintenance Activities: This week, Public Works maintenance continues its regularly scheduled maintenance in City parks, medians and beaches. PW focused this week on median maintenance on Crenshaw Boulevard from Crest Road to Indian Peak Road. The median vegetation was trimmed and cleared of debris. PW landscape right-of-way crews continued working along Palos Verdes Drive South and completed working along Palos Verdes Drive West. The irrigation crew made several repairs in Vanderlip Park, and applied fertilizer as well. Irrigation technicians also made repairs along Silver Spur Road and Calle Entradero. Pest control also continues to focus on reducing the gopher population at Hesse Park, Ryan Park, PVIC and City Hall.

In the right-of-way, PW installed several signs throughout the City. Locations include Crestridge Road and Middlecrest Road, where new stop signs were installed. Also, on Hawthorne Boulevard and Granvia Altamira, “No Turn on Red” signage was added to help reduce traffic incidents. PW also replaced missing or damaged signage on Indian Peak Road, Shorewood Drive, Hawthorne Boulevard and Peppertree Lane. The right-of-way crew also made repairs to sidewalks on Shoreview Drive and performed parking lot maintenance paint striping at Ladera Linda Park. In the *Pacific View* community surrounding Hesse Park, PW deployed a mobile speed radar to help curb speeding in that neighborhood. PW deploys speed radar as needed and requested by residents.

Lastly, the PW Department continues to respond to emergency calls during regular business hours and after hours.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Point View Master Use Plan Update (6001 Palos Verdes Drive South): On April 14, 2020, the Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing related to proposed development on the Point View property. As part of this proposal, the Planning Commission will be considering the following:

- An Annual Compliance Review of the Point View Master Use Plan;
- Revisions to the an existing Conditional Use Permit related to attendance levels and parking for the event center; and
- Development of a new 7,375ft² two-story residence with attached garages, a 611ft² detached single-story accessory dwelling and grading to accommodate the proposed improvements.

Green Hills Memorial Park Minor Modification No. 1: On February 20, 2020, the Interim Director of Community Development approved, with conditions, Minor Modification No. 1 to the Planning Commission-approved Site Plan Review permit (Case No. PLRV2019-0005). The Minor Modification is for minor changes to a previously approved retaining wall and grading within the Vista Del Ponte area, and to a previously approved water feature within the Inspiration Slope area. The original project was approved by the Director in 2016, and appealed to the Planning Commission, who denied the appeal, and approved the project in 2017 (Case No. ZON2016-00332). A Notice of Decision with a 15-day appeal period has been sent to the applicant and all interested parties who commented on the original permit, and a listserv has been sent to all subscribers as well. South Bay Cities Council of Governments (SBCCOG) - 21st Annual General Assembly: As a reminder, on March 19th, the SBCCOG will host their 21st Annual General Assembly at the Juanita Millender-McDonald Community Center in the City of Carson. The theme of the General Assembly is, **'Intersections: Mobility, Land Use, Technology, and Finance,'** and **will focus** on how to eliminate silos and address issues in the community holistically. RECREATION & PARKS

Landslide Surveying in the Portuguese Bend Reserve: The Public Works Department works with McGee Surveying Consulting to monitor the land movement within the Portuguese Bend landslide area using GPS monitoring points. Movement is monitored twice each year, with one monitoring period usually following the rainy season, and the second monitoring period in the fall.

The February 2020 landslide monitoring survey at Portuguese Bend Reserve will be conducted the week of February 24-28. McGee Surveying Consulting will be setting up GNSS (GPS) instruments (satellite receivers) on 6-foot tripods and poles at various established locations in the Reserve to collect survey measurements. They will be driving a grey truck with a company logo that also has amber warning lights on top and will be abiding by speed limits and safety procedures. Trails will remain open during this survey period. On February 24, a notice was posted on the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve listserv regarding this activity.

Enforcement of New Special Event Ordinance: Hash House Harriers: The City Council approved updates to the Special Events Ordinance in September 2019. One specific update strengthens the Recreation and Parks Department's ability to enforce open space management regulations pertaining to organized groups in the Nature Preserve. The Recreation and Parks Department's Open Space Management staff monitors local recreational and fitness social media groups, and proactively reaches out to notify groups of Preserve rules and protocols. As a result of this procedure and strengthened ordinance, Staff was able to discover two Hash House Harrier running events planned in January and February of this year in and near the City, and successfully deterred the groups from entering the City and breaking Preserve and special event rules. In the past, this group has left marking substances/materials on City rights-of-way and trails, set up kegs/alcoholic drinking stations along the run route, run on the trails while intoxicated, and been a nuisance to Preserve neighbors.

Hesse Park: The facilities are rented this week for twelve indoor recreation classes, three non-profit group rentals, four Peninsula Seniors activities, two City meetings, one City-sanctioned event, one scout meeting and one youth sports rental. On Thursday, February 27, Cox Communications will host a customer open house at Hesse Park from 3 p.m.-5 p.m. and 6 p.m.-8 p.m. Drop-ins are welcome.

Ladera Linda Park: The facilities are rented this week for one indoor recreation class, one contract class, and one non-profit rental. Flutterby Storytime was held on Tuesday, February 25 from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m. Starting Saturday, February 29, the Ladera Linda Community Center will serve as a four-day voting center.

Ryan Park: This week we have 9 indoor classes.

PVIC/Docents: The Whale of a Day poster judging contest took place Tuesday afternoon. Winning entrants will be notified within the coming weeks. The students will be recognized at the April 7 City Council meeting.

The Junior Docent class will meet for training Saturday Morning. The Sunset Room is reserved for a private event on Saturday, February 29.

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Little Fish Tales by the Sea met on February 20. Attendance included 38 children and 31 adults for a total attendance of 89. Families arriving early enjoyed coloring pages and visiting the museum. The librarian from PVPLD read stories about ABC's and 123's.

1) ANNUAL COMPLIANCE REVIEW NO. 7 OF THE POINT VIEW MASTER USE PLAN CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT (CASE NO. ZON2010-00087):

On January 8, 2013, the Planning Commission approved the Point View Master Use Plan, allowing 25.5-acres of agricultural uses; a golf course composed of 5 tee locations, 2 greens with 9 holes, and sand traps; a paved internal driveway; other ancillary site improvements; and up to 30 events at the "Event Garden" located on the subject property. The Planning Commission will conduct the seventh review of the project's compliance with and adequacy of the Conditions of Approval. The compliance review will include, but not be limited to, the operation (including hours), lighting, noise, and any other concerns raised by the public. Pursuant to Condition 6.b of P.C. Resolution No. 2015-19, the Planning Commission may add, delete, or modify any condition of approval to address concerns raised by Staff, the Commission, the property owner, and/or interested parties, or may impose more restrictive standards and conditions to mitigate any impacts associated with the operation.
