Partial Reopening of Parks: To provide residents with access to park space during the “Safer at Home” Order, at this time, the City has **partially** reopened six neighborhood parks on a trial basis. Only turf areas and walking paths are open in the following parks:

- Eastview Park (excluding the dog park)
- Frank A. Vanderlip Park
- Fred Hesse, Jr. Community Park
- Ladera Linda Park
- Robert E. Ryan Community Park
- Upper Point Vicente Park (excluding the Rancho Caninos Dog Park)



The City encourages residents to participate in recreational outdoor activity in their neighborhoods. If you visit these parks, please do so responsibly, be mindful of your interactions and wear a face covering. **All visitors MUST practice physical distancing**, staying 6 feet away from others not in their household. City Staff, Park Rangers and law enforcement are monitoring these areas to ensure compliance with public health directives. Pursuant to the City Council’s March 17 local emergency proclamation, **the City may close these areas if rules are not observed by the public and conditions become unsafe.**

STILL CLOSED

- Parking lots, restrooms, playgrounds, dog parks, basketball and tennis courts, baseball and soccer fields.
- Beaches, open space areas, the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve, and trails

STILL NOT ALLOWED

- Active sports or organized activities
- Group gatherings or activities

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The City is considering a comprehensive reopening plan of more of its parks and open space area over the next few weeks that is managed and responsible. To that point, the City recognizes the health and well-being of our residents and employees as a top priority, and is committed to keeping them safe. We urge all residents to follow the “Safer at Home” Order and only leave their homes for essential activities. We also urge the public to diligently practice physical distancing, as it is the most effective tool we have to fight this pandemic. We all must do our part to “flatten the curve.”

Covid-19 Cases: As of May 5, there were 27,815 confirmed cases of COVID-19 across Los Angeles County, including the South Bay, so the public should not think one location is safer than another and everyone should be aware and practice physical distancing. The total includes 67 cases in Rancho Palos Verdes, 38 in Palos Verdes Estates, 13 in Rolling Hills Estates and two in Rolling Hills. Countywide, 1,313 people have died.

According to the Department of Public Health, 10 deaths have been reported in Rancho Palos Verdes. The City extends its deepest condolences to the families of these residents.

Public Meetings and Zoom: Due to the “Safer at Home” order, over the past several weeks, all of the City’s public meetings have been conducted utilizing the Zoom teleconferencing platform. Zoom has been adopted by many organizations, groups, and municipalities as a platform of choice for their remote meetings. However, with its rising popularity came scrutiny, as several potential security holes and privacy loopholes have been found. According to several industry reports, Zoom seems to be very responsive and is staying on top of issuing security patches and making requested and necessary enhancements. The City’s IT Department is closely monitoring any security news related to Zoom and at this point and does not believe there is any significant risk. Should this assessment change, the City will reassess its approach and explore alternative platforms. At this point, the main security concern is to protect the integrity of all public meetings and preventing malicious interruptions (aka “Zoombombing”).

Zoom Security Tips:

- You can join Zoom meetings through your web browser rather than using the Zoom desktop software. The web browser version gets security enhancements faster. When you click a link to join a meeting, your browser will open a new tab and prompt you to

use or install the Zoom desktop software. But in the fine print, there's a link to "join from your browser."

- If you are using the desktop application for a full teleconference experience and features, make sure you either check for available updates manually or allow the program to update itself when prompted. It's really important to use the latest version of the client as it contains all the security updates and enhancements released by Zoom! As of writing this report, the most current version is 5.0.1, so please check if you are up to date.

Census Response Rate Challenge: Have you completed your 2020 Census? Responses to the census shape decisions about how billions of dollars in federal funds flow into communities each year for the next 10 years for critical services, including health care, emergency response, schools and education programs, and roads and bridges. The COVID-19 pandemic underscores the importance of census data and census participation.

As of May 4, Rancho Palos Verdes has a 70.6% self-response rate, 12.6% higher than the state's average self-response rate and 13.8% higher than the national average, and the second highest response rate of the Peninsula cities behind Palos Verdes Estates.

Peninsula-wide Public Safety Committees: The City of Rancho Palos Verdes continues to collaborate with the other Peninsula cities in efforts to maintain Peninsula-wide public safety and readiness. The **Regional Emergency Preparedness Committee** and **Regional Law Enforcement Committee** will be convening for their quarterly meetings on Thursday, May 14 in an online meeting format. The Regional Emergency Preparedness Committee meeting will begin at 7:30 a.m. and the Regional Law Enforcement Committee meeting will commence after its conclusion. In addition to select city council members and staff members from participating cities, the meetings are attended by personnel from the Lomita Sheriff's Station, the Los Angeles County Fire Department, and utility companies as it relates to public safety and emergency preparedness.

FINANCE

Small Business Financial Assistance Plan Update: On April 8, 2020, the City of Rancho Palos Verdes implemented the Small Business Financial Assistance Plan in an effort to provide relief and promote the general welfare of the City's small business community experiencing negative financial impacts stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic. The Small Business Financial Assistance Plan is comprised of two pieces: a one-time refund of the 2020 business license tax and a community development block grant (CDBG) stimulus.

Since the implementation on April 8, the City has received 16 requests for business license tax refunds. We encourage businesses in need of assistance to visit <http://www.rpvca.gov/1284/Financial-Assistance> for information on the program and to submit a request. Businesses that apply will receive a confirmation email from staff. If an application is approved a check will be mailed directly to the business at the address on file.

The CDBG stimulus approved by the City Council authorized the use of \$116,500 in Community Development Block Grant funds to provide loans and grants to low and moderate-income owners of businesses with five or fewer employees. These funds could be used for short-term working capital for operating expenses to retain jobs and support service delivery. In the coming weeks City staff will provide more details of the small business loan program and how to apply.

1st Quarter Home Sale Value Trends: Home sales in California fell from both the previous quarter and year in March as the coronavirus pandemic began, especially in the last weeks of the month as the state's stay-at-home order was put in place. Although all major regions experienced a sales decrease from last year, median prices increased in all regions, with the Central Valley up the most at 7.7%. As the fast-moving coronavirus continues to dominate daily lives and the economy freefalls into a recession, many potential home sellers will likely delay selling their homes, which will lead to fewer new listings on the market. On the other hand, as homebuyers put off their plans to buy due to their concerns about the pandemic and its impact on their financial well-being, sales could experience a sharp decline and likely result in a jump in the Unsold Inventory Index in the short term.

PUBLIC WORKS

EDCO Brush Clearing Event: EDCO continues its weekly brush clearing event. To date three of EDCO'S five residential routes have been serviced and their excess brush and green waste collected. This coming Saturday, May 9, the eastside of the City will be serviced. This event will end on Saturday, May 16, when the Eastview section of the City is serviced. From the quantity of excess brush collected, it appears residents have performed yard work and private property brush clearance during this time of COVID-19. The hope is this type of brush clearance will reduce the chances of summer brush fires in the area.

Catch Basin Insert Project: The Catch Basin Insert Project, a City project involving the cleaning and installation of Connector Pipe Screen Units of existing City and County owned catch basins, is concluding. Los Angeles County inspectors are reviewing all installations prior to finalizing permits.



Maintenance Activities: This week Public Works continues its regularly scheduled maintenance in City parks, medians and beaches, removing trash, debris, and tending to the landscape throughout the City. The landscape crew continued to work along Palos Verdes Drive East and Palos Verdes Drive South. Median crews also finished working along Forrestal Drive and Crest Road. The team is now working along Hawthorne Boulevard, Indian Peak

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Road, and Calle Entradero. The irrigation technician made several repairs at Vanderlip Park, Ryan Park, Hesse Park, and along Calle Entradero.



Public Works continues to respond to emergency calls during regular business hours and after hours. With the local emergency still in place, Public Works has performed its biannual test of its emergency generators that serve key facilities, including Hesse Park, City Hall, Point Vicente Interpretive Center and the Abalone Cove Sewer Station. No significant issues were found, and units are operating correctly.

The following emergency service requests were reported to the Public Works Department:

- On Crest Road, a resident's privately owned tree nearly fell into the roadway. Public Works responded and coned off the area for safety. Public Works worked with the resident to coordinate the removal of the tree. The roadway was cleared within 24 hours.



- Los Verdes Golf Course experienced a major irrigation leak on its grounds impacting Ryan Park. Public Works contacted Cal Water and helped mitigate the leak while repairs were made.



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- An emergency pothole repair occurred along Palos Verdes Drive South. Several deviations and potholes formed in recent days and Public Works filled in newly formed potholes to keep the roadway as smooth as possible. Major repairs are expected to be completed this week.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control (DACC) Operational Effectiveness Assessment Meeting for Contract Cities: On May 6, 2020, Code Enforcement Staff participated in a virtual webinar workshop conducted by DACC to discuss the completion of a draft report related to their operational effectiveness assessment. The DACC report discusses a number of topics including an assessment of services it provides to contract cities and an evaluation of alternative service models. The report also discusses leveraging technology where feasible, and identifying areas where operating costs can be reduced. Code Enforcement Staff will use this opportunity to express concerns regarding the County's final draft report procedures related to barking dog complaints and the effectiveness and review of customer care improvements. A copy of the report will be available and provided to contract cities within 7- 10 business days. Additional updates will be provided as more information becomes available.

Planning Division Monthly Activity Report: Attached is the Planning Division's Monthly Activity Report for April 2020. The report contains a brief summary of the Division's activities during this last month regarding: 1) New applications received and 2) Staff, Director, Planning Commission and City Council decisions rendered. As indicated in the report, the Division received 26 new applications and rendered decisions on 25 applications for the month of April 2020.

Building and Safety Division Monthly Activity: Attached is the Building and Safety Division's Monthly Activity Report for April 2020 reporting on: 1) A summary of the new cases received broken down by application type; 2) The number of permits issued; 3) The amount of fees collected; 4) The number of inspections performed and; 5) The number of new plan checks submitted. As indicated in the report, the Division issued 107 permits and performed a total of 324 inspections for the month of April 2020.

View Restoration Division Monthly Activity: Attached is the View Restoration Division's Monthly Activity Report for April 2020 and year-to-date information on: 1) New view cases; 2) Pre-application meetings; and 3) Cases resolved by mediation. The Division received 6 new cases in the month of April 2020.

Code Enforcement Division Monthly Activity: Attached is the Code Enforcement Division's Monthly Activity Report for April 2020 reporting on: 1) Violations by category 2) Number of closed cases by violation with median processing times; and 3) Illegal sign abatement. As indicated in the report, the Division conducted 30 field inspections and brought 9 cases to closure for the Month of April 2020.

RECREATION & PARKS

Partial Park Reopening Prompts Public Participation: The City of Rancho Palos Verdes has partially re-opened walking paths and turf areas at six select parks for passive activities (see list below). The majority of park amenities, including buildings, playgrounds, dog parks, parking lots, restrooms, game courts, and ballfields, continue to be closed until at least May 15th.

- Eastview Park (excluding the dog park)
- Frank A. Vanderlip Park
- Fred Hesse, Jr. Community Park
- Ladera Linda Park
- Robert E. Ryan Community Park
- Upper Point Vicente Park/Civic Center (excluding the dog park)

What's Happening in Open Space Management?:

Activity Summary: April 23rd – May 3rd

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Open Space Management (OSM) staff are currently working with the PVPLC to obtain an assessment of trail conditions in the Preserve in preparation for a plan to re-open the Preserve to the public. Common unsafe trail conditions City and PVPLC staff are finding include vegetation overgrowth and erosion. Department staff are also in communication with the Los Angeles County Recreation and Parks Department to coordinate the City's reopening plans within the larger County.

OSM staff include the City's new Ranger Program and the part-time staff that operate the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve (Preserve), including Abalone Cove Reserve and park. The majority of OSM staff time has been enforcing the COVID-19 closures in the Preserve and open space areas. Staff time is currently concentrated on weekends, when enforcement of closures are needed most. These statistics reflect that staffing pattern.

- OSM Public Contacts: 6,035
 - Notice to Appear citations Issued: 35
 - Closed Area (COVID-19): 33
 - Dog off Leash: 1
 - Protection of Flora and Fauna: 1
- Parking citations issued: 37
 - Includes cars parked in Residential Parking Permit areas, posted no parking anytime areas, red zones/fire lanes, and temporary COVID-19 no parking zones.
- Rules Violations Observed (usually enforced): 1,290
- Visitors turned away due to closure signs/staff presence: 2,968
- Trailheads and associated parking areas closed, together with Public Works staff, and daily maintained/restored: 45

Below are observations during this reporting period:

- Staff has been in contact with the California Fish and Game Warden. The warden indicated they will be at City beaches more often and can cite for violators on the beach. OSM staff has also observed excellent LA County Sheriff Department presence assisting with open space closures.
- Staff has been in communication with businesses, agencies and HOA's impacted by COVID-19 closures including Trump National Golf Course, Terranea Resort security, Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy, Ocean Front Estates HOA, Vanderlip HOA, Del Cerro HOA, and Park Place HOA.
- Violations and aggressive behavior noticeably increased this past weekend (May 2-3) in all reserves, but especially the coastal reserves.
- Staff has noticed an increase in cars parking illegally along Palos Verdes Drive South and scenic vistas on Palos Verdes Drive East and Hawthorne. More recently, cars and

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motorcycles are observed canvassing the coast and stopping at sites to experiment with public access. Rangers work together with LA County Sheriff deputies to move cars along as appropriate.

- Rangers have observed an increase in people parking in residential areas (including residential permit parking areas) to illegally access the coastal parks and reserves.
- Illegal paragliding activity has picked up near Ocean Trails Reserve, and has resulted in habitat loss at the take off/landing site. Rangers are working with local homeowners to locate the individuals and enforce the RPVMC.
- Rangers assisted in wildlife rescue of injured wildlife in Portuguese Bend Reserve.
- OSM staff received 16 calls to the Preserve Information and Reporting line. Most calls were members of the public reporting COVID-19 closure violations in the Preserve.
- Staff coordinated Preserve access and/or project assessment for the following high priority projects:
 - LARICS repeater installation near Vista Del Norte Reserve
 - SBCCOG fiber optic cabling project at Alta Vicente Reserve
 - Southern California Edison utility maintenance at Portuguese Bend Reserve
 - PVPLC Abalone Cove Reserve Habitat Restoration Project
 - Endangered Species Reintroduction Project at Alta Vicente and Filiorum Reserves
 - Public Works Bluff Top Fence Replacement Project
 - Public Works Landslide Monitoring operations
 - Public Works erosion repair within Preserve trails
 - Recreation, Parks and Open Space staff would like to extend their appreciation for the PVPLC's Volunteer Trail Watch, who have been an enormous help manning closed trailheads and reporting closure vandalism and trespassing during the COVID-19 closures.





Department funding is impacted by declining contributions from UA licensing, which is down ~20% from past peaks.





Even as license numbers have been relatively stable over time, greater revenue offsets for Contract Cities may exist.








Even as the updated cost methodology is recommended, it is not a “cure-all” for DACC or Contract City challenges.


A BLUEPRINT FOR A STRONGER PARTNERSHIP EXISTS


