Preserve Visitor Contacts

- January 01, 2017 to March 31, 2017
- 2 Deputies patrolled the Palos Verdes Nature Preserve during this period (~992 hours of active patrol)
- Activity based on calls/reports for service, field observations, and PVPLC (Volunteer Trail Watch) reports in the Preserve with the following results:

Portuguese Bend Reserve

The fall and winter rains caused mudslides, eroded trails and altered habitat, forcing entire reserve and trail closures. Despite the closures, increasing numbers of people continue to make use of the Portuguese Bend Reserve. During the last quarter of 2016, most of our patrols continued to be within this Reserve. We accessed the reserve primarily via the following locations:

- The gate off Crenshaw Boulevard (near Del Cerro Park)
- Gateway, The gate on Palos Verdes Drive South, West of Schooner Drive

Three Sisters Reserve

Although we conducted a few visual checks of this area, we did not see any hikers, nor did we conduct any foot patrols of the trails.

Vista Del Norte Reserve

We monitored the trailheads off Indian Peak Road for a limited amount of time, but saw no hikers. The subject cited and warned for being off trail and camping in the reserve has since been taken into custody for unrelated matters.

Agua Amarga Reserve

A hiker reported juveniles in the reserve after dark, possibly lighting a fire. A foot patrol of the entire main trail was conducted, but there was no sign of the juveniles or evidence of a fire. Infrequent checks for reserve users and/or violations met with negative results.

PRESERVE OVERVIEW

During the first quarter of 2017, we contacted numerous preserve users and continued to warn or cite people for violating Preserve rules and regulations. We provided information to trail users on how to access resources from the City of Rancho Palos Verdes and Palos Verdes Peninsula Land Conservancy websites; including but not limited to trail maps, trails information, the preserve mission, etc.

We continued to adapt to the role of wilderness preserve law enforcement. The majority of the people we contact for violations or near-violations do not believe they are doing anything wrong.

We are also seeing a large increase in the number of people we encounter in most of the reserves. Based on contact interviews, the increase appears to be related to the use of the computer internet and websites that people use to get recommendations for goods, services and places of interest. Those websites include (but are not limited to) Facebook, YouTube, Yelp! And Twitter.

Although there have been many noticeable improvements to the trails in regards to trail borders and markings, there is still room for improvement, particularly regarding the Portuguese Bend Reserve. This

reserve has numerous official and unofficial entrances that are not clearly marked. This makes enforcement of the rules and regulations extremely difficult.
