




1. A local landmark that once held a third-order Fresnel lens.


6. To the north is Torrance and Lomita, to the south is the Pacific Ocean, to the west is Palos Verdes Estates, but what park is east of Western?





10. Where can you go to see the tide pools? This park offers bluff-top viewing areas, as well as hiking trails to the beach.
