**PERMIT PARKING**  
**FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

Question: What is defined as an “oversized vehicle”?

Answer: *An oversized vehicle is defined as a vehicle that is greater than 22’ in length, 8’ in height, 7’ in width or greater than 10,000 pounds.*

Question: After January 1<sup>st</sup>, can I park my regular vehicle on the street without a permit?

Answer: *Yes. The neighborhood permit parking program applies to neighborhoods, portions of neighborhoods or streets. Not individual residences. So, beginning January 1<sup>st</sup>, neighborhoods, portions of neighborhoods or streets MAY apply for permit parking if they are experiencing parking problems on their street.*

Question: If I am having construction work done on my home, would I need a permit for the construction trucks?

Answer: *No. The ordinance restricts the parking of oversized vehicles overnight between the hours of 2 a.m. and 5 a.m. Typically construction trucks are not left overnight on residential streets.*

Question: If my RV is stored in another City, and I bring it to my RPV residence to load up on a Wednesday and leave out of town on a Thursday, would I need a permit and how long is the permit good for?

Answer: *Yes, a permit is needed. Because the ordinance specifies no parking of oversized vehicles overnight, without a permit, a permit is needed for the Wednesday night stay. That permit is good for a year and allows up to 6 overnight stays per month during that year.*
