Declaration(s) of Emergency <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The City’s letter was submitted to CalOES. CalOES shared the letter with California Governor Newsome. Governor Newsome responded that RPV is covered under the eight-county wide declaration of emergency for the winter 2024 storms; however, we are waiting on a letter back from the Governor. The City met with CalOES Director Nancy Ward. Our desire is to meet with FEMA about the BRIC grant to see if they will consider specific project components implemented in certain areas be allowed. If President Biden declared a federal disaster, there could be two types of relief: public assistance and individual assistance. Public assistance comes with relief for public agencies and non-profit organizations. Expenses need to focus on stabilizing the landslide based on the rainfall event (storm) If President Biden does not declare a federal state of emergency, it goes back to Governor Newsome. California does not typically fund landslides. There are couple of paths the City can take and the outcomes are very different. 	Ara Mihranian Ramzi Awwad

Geotechnical Updates <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Mike Phipps looked at Wayfarer’s Chapel and Narcissa above Wayfarer’s Chapel. He observed the area breaking into chunks; the drainage pattern has been changed due to tension cracks and dropping. He suggested that PBCA try to keep the road passable. There is movement up Narcissa at the hairpin. Wayfarer’s Chapel buildings were not moving in the past, but the ancient slide seems to be reactivated there. Mike Phipps also looked at Beach School Road at the Abalone Cove Landslide. Mike Phipps did additional mapping above Vanderlip and Kelvin Canyon. Gordon Leon stated that it was dry at the top. Mike Phipps provided input to McGee on survey points to be closely monitored. The next round of surveys needs to wait in certain areas until the soil dries to be able to access them.
