Declaration(s) of Emergency and Los Angeles County Disaster Management AREA G <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Brandy Villanueva confirmed with SBA that the disaster loan center is closed for in-person assistance but is accessible virtually to assist with the application process, answer questions, and provide guidance. The center will be open until the 7/16/2024 application deadline. The property damage must be a result of the winter storm that impacted the community between the winter storm declaration incident period of 1/31/2024 to 2/9/2024. Brandy will confirm eligibility requirements including income, insurance, credit score and report back. At the end of the two-year loan period, if repair costs are less than the approved amount of the low-interest loan, the excess funds need to be returned. • The SBA does not conduct town hall briefings because each application is managed on a case-by-case bases. The process is very individualized. 	Brandy Villanueva
Geotechnical Updates <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cotton Shires is still analyzing McGee's monitoring survey data from 5/29/2024. The City will publish the data by the end of this week. The report will be included in the Staff Report published one week prior to the 7/2/2024 meeting. • 41% average increase in velocity from April to May area wide. • 70% increase in velocity in the Klondike Canyon Landslide. This translates to 7-7.5 inches of land movement per week. • Abalone Cove Landslide has a slightly lower velocity increase (approximate 30% increase in velocity). • The Vanderlip area is currently moving 5-10 inches per week. Grabens have opened. • Mike Phipps investigated the landslide areas today, including the E1 drilling site. • Cotton Shires is updating their mapping and preparing it for the July City Council meeting. Coordination with the City of Rolling Hills <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The two cities' leadership are close to selecting a meeting date, which is expected to occur before 7/1/2024. 	Ara Mihranian Karina Banales
Funding Initiatives <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KCLAD: The Congressionally Directed Spending application has been submitted. To Senator Padilla, Senator Butler, and Congressman Liu. • KCLAD: For Ted Liu's funding, KCLAD is asking for \$5.4M. The actual amount will be much lower than (approximately \$1.1M) • KCLAD: KCLAD is moving forward with FEMA funding (like the BRIC funding that City of RPV applied for a couple of years ago). • KCLAD: California disaster declaration public assistance was submitted. • KCLAD: The City loan has been approved, and now KCLAD Board needs to accept the loan. ACLAD: ACLAD passed the assessment increase. They are encouraging the members to pay their assessments ASAP. ACLAD: ACLAD approved the resolution to accept the Fast Track Loan from RPV. 		
General Comments or Questions <p>Safety concerns:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> First responders are having a difficult time reaching Admirable, Exultant, and Dauntless. This is a concern for medical emergencies, as well as with the fire season starting. Ara Mihranian and other City staff have been in continuous communication with first responders. First responder agencies have been canvassing the area weekly to view accessibility to all areas/residences. Residents need to know how to turn off their gas in an emergency. SoCal Gas has a video on the procedures on their website at this link. The City and/or SoCal Gas will distribute a flyer on this as well for residents who are not computer savvy. The City Manager's report that comes out weekly also has published this. <p>Other items:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Explanation from Robert Swartz (LACPW) in the chat window: Coordinating repairs is not possible between water and sewer due to the water code. The Water code requires separation of water and sewer due to the risk of cross contamination. Work cannot be performed by the same contractor. Gas lines cannot share the same trench as a sewer. There is a minimum separation of 5 feet, which reduces the risk of a gas line leaking into the sewer and creating an explosive atmosphere in the sewer system. During sewer manhole inspection, the air inside the manhole is tested to ensure an explosive atmosphere is not present before removing the manhole cover. 		Working Group
