<p>Geotechnical Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cotton Shires (Mike Phipps) continues to map the data collected. • The margins of the landslide have expanded, specifically in the Klondike Canyon area near Dauntless, Admirable, and Exultant. Portuguese Bend Landslide EIR, Final Engineering, and E1/E2	City	<p>E1/E2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Test bore hole drilling continues. The second bore hole (E1-5a) should be completed tomorrow. Perched water was found in the landslide mass at 154 feet. Instrumentation has been dropped into E-1-5a. The contractor is mobilizing an additional drilling rig. Findings so far show that the base of land sliding is 70-80 feet deeper than anticipated. This makes the beach club location more desirable than the gateway location. This will be decided once all the data comes in. There are two slide planes on E-1-10. There are multiple slide planes on E-1-5, but the total will be reported once that bore hole is completed. A map of the bore hole locations is shown below this table. Bore hole E-1-5a has been added and is not on the map yet. It is 15 feet away from E-1-5. Four bore holes off Yacht Drive for the Beach Club location are shown on the map as E-1-1, E-1-4, E-1-4, and E-1-6. There are two kinds of underground water: artesian (underground water under pressure) and perched (above the slide plane, adds weight and gets trapped above the slide plane due to impermeable clay soils). The hydraulers can drain both the artesian and perched water. The artesian water has the most impact on the landslide and land movement. 	October 2024
