E-1-1 may be drilled later, as it is located in Klondike Canyon and close to private property. The City is working with Beach Club for access. Depths vary based on previous studies to make sure that the slide planes are being reached so that proper/useful data is gathered. The data is being analyzed to determine the number of slide planes and how deep they are. The data will inform the engineers on the depth of the hydraulers and confirm their location(s). Peter Shaw requested that the test bore hole map be updated by color of test bore holes completed, in progress, and future. When water is extracted via the hydraulers, it will be tested to see how it can be used, redirected, or discharged to the ocean. <p>EIR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Still working on responding to comments for the EIR to bring to City Council for ratification.
