The City of Rancho Palos Verdes was incorporated on September 7, 1973. Part of the City's neighborhood is mixed with an equine community lifestyle of trails, rolling hills, white fencing and preservation of open spaces. Living and owning horses in the Peninsula has its special wide emergencies and natural disaster challenges. This Equine Directory (subject to change) was created as a reference guide source. Any equestrian centers cited were only potential resources during evacuations. Call before going to locations.

The Emergency Preparedness Committee (EPC) advises and assists the City Council and staff to ensure that the City of Rancho Palos Verdes develops and maintains a high state of readiness to respond to a wide variety of emergencies and disasters. The Committee provides various emergency preparedness tips, brochures and resources on wildfire, earthquake, and other natural disasters to households, families, large, small and farm animals, pets, such as equine and goats on the Hill. Topics include home hardening, emergency supply kits, heat safety and alert notification systems information. Many resources come from agencies, such as Animal Care Control, County of Los Angeles and the American Red Cross which are located on the City's website.

All animal preparedness is important particularly where emergency preparedness is concerned with large animals because of their size and special transportation needs. Do not wait for the **EVACUATION ORDER**. If you are unprepared or wait until the last minute, you may need to leave your animals behind.

Are you and Your Horses Prepared for an Emergency Event?

You are responsible to have not only a family emergency plan, but if you own large animals you should include an emergency plan as well, whether you decide to evacuate or they can be safely sheltered in place. If you do plan to evacuate as part of your emergency plan, **EVACUATE EARLY!** Go as soon as you can. If you hear an Evacuation Warning—do not wait for an Evacuation Order. Being under an Evacuation order means your horses must go NOW, sometimes, in a wildfire incident, before you see flames near your area. Waiting until you get the Evacuation Order is often too late, as the roads can become too crowded to safely move a horse trailer out of harm's way.

Remember, if your horse is not trained to lead into a trailer, or will not load easily or safely, you must work in advance to make your horse's area as safe as possible to shelter in place. There are several brochures on how to prepare your horse for an emergency event on the City's website.

Are You and Your Horse Ready?

Find out how well you are ready as you navigate through these brief life-saving test questions. Check all that apply.

WHAT'S THE THREAT IN MY AREA?

Careful preparation and rapid responses are crucial for keeping your horse safe and minimizing injury and loss during disasters, such as wildfires, earthquakes, landslides and other emergencies.

Indelibly label all of your equipment, such as halters, saddles, bridles, etc., with your name. Your address may also help. Prior to evacuation, have forms prepared which will allow you to track who is removing the horse, the vehicle license number, and to what destination. If the proposed destination is not satisfactory, you may choose to delay the horse's removal. Timely evacuation is key! When Law Enforcement or Fire personnel say "LEAVE" – leave immediately and take your animals if you are prepared.

DO I HAVE A WAY TO IDENTIFY MY HORSE?

An essential identification tool is vital for all horse owners in case of trauma, theft, weather emergency, missing or loose horse, travel, etc. Take detailed pictures of your horse, such as markings, conformation, coat color, breed, sex, age. Make certain you have photographs of you with each of your horses. It will be easier for other people to identify your horse. They are especially important when filling out a police report or posting on social media. If your horse is microchipped and living in a barn, consider placing a sign on his stall door stating, *"This horse has been microchipped,"* as a potential theft deterrent. **Place your horses' Coggins tests, veterinary papers, identification photographs, and vital information—such as medical history, allergies and emergency telephone numbers (veterinarian, family members, etc.)—in a watertight envelope.** Store the envelope with your other important papers in a safe fire proof place that will be easy for you to access, so you can take them with you when you and your horses evacuate. There are various forms on the internet one can fill out.

Do I know where I am going or made earlier arrangements prior to an evacuation warning?	<p>Make sure they have plenty of fresh clean water and feed to last a week. If you are leaving your horses under someone else’s care, make sure you leave care instruction and collect their contact information. Advise local authorities and your veterinarian. Make arrangements in advance to have your horse trailered in case of an emergency. If you don’t have your own trailer or don’t have enough room in your trailer for horses, be sure you have several people on standby to help evacuate your horses. Check with local haulers for availability during emergencies. 	<p>If you have the option to evacuate, do so. Place your horses in a large, secure corral, paddock or arena made with metal pipes, not PVC or wood. Block off any access to their barn or stall. Horses will retreat to where they have previously found safety, even if the barn is burning. Have fire hoses, shovels, and ladders near corral, 7–10 days' supply feed, water, and medications. Post important information in the barn and house for immediate use.</p> <p>DO NOT turn horses loose. This is a severe hazard to first responders and horses. Remove halters once contained in the area you plan to leave them. Nylon halters can melt and burn your horse.</p>

Identification

If possible, consider microchipping your horse. Be sure to register the identity after receiving your paper work.

Place an ID tag on your horse's halter. This should include the horse's name and your phone number.

Take photographs of your horse, including close up images of identifying features and a photograph with you, the owner, and horse together.

Email these items to yourself and a friend to ensure you can access a copy when needed.

Use multiple methods of identification. Your horse may be microchipped, however, using a tagged halter and a livestock crayon will also be beneficial.

Barn Fires - Preventative Measures

- Maintain and check electrical panels, wiring and junction boxes. Make repairs as necessary.
- Light fixtures should always have bulb covers.
- Keep cobwebs and dust off of wiring and lights.
- Only use and keep appliances, such as heaters and radios, plugged in while people are present.
- No Smoking inside or near the barn.
- Remove and monitor for wet hay. Moist hay can spontaneously combust.
- When feasible, store hay in a separate, covered structure, away from horses.
- Build a defensible space around animal housing by removing any vegetation, combustible items such as outdoor furniture, planters and clutter. Use hardscape like gravel, decomposed granite, pavers but no bark or mulch.
- Use designated areas, away from barn to fuel and start tractors and equipment.
- Store fuel and other flammable materials in appropriate containers and away from barn area.
- Fire extinguishers should be available in or near barn area. Train how to use this equipment annually.
- Make sure that driveways are well marked and and well maintained for emergency vehicles.

What To Do In The Event Of A Barn Fire

- Call 911.
- If barn is on fire, do not enter.
- Evacuate horses starting with the most accessible ones first.
- Put halter and lead rope on.
- Do not turn horses loose where they can return to the barn area. Horses will go back into a burning barn because it's the place they associate with feeling safe.
- Additionally, do not turn horses loose as they can be a very dangerous hazard for emergency responders.
- Evacuate horses from a barn starting with the closest, most accessible ones first.
- Move horses to an arena or turn out that's away from the flames and smoke.
- Once the fire is out, contact your veterinarian to check for respiratory issues.



Shelter in Place

- If you have the option to evacuate, do so. Many well-meaning individuals stay for the sake of their animals and do not survive.
- Place your horses in a large, secure corral, paddock or arena.
- Block off any access to their barn or stall. Horse will retreat to where they have previously found safety, even if that barn is on fire.
- DO NOT let your horses run free. This is a severe hazard to first responders and emergency service personnel as well as the horses.
- Remove halters once contained in the area you plan to leave them. Halters can melt and the burn your horse.

Evacuation

Know Your Zone and Sign Up for Alert SouthBay: Visit PVPready.gov and look up the zone number for your home and barn location.

Also, text 'ALERTSB' to 888-777 to register for alerts.

Gather your Equine Emergency Kit.

Evacuate when you hear an evacuation warning. Do not wait for an evacuation order. Horses need extra time.

If you find yourself using an unknown horse hauler make sure that you gather their contact information and photograph the driver, their drivers license, vehicle identification and license plate. There have been many cases of stolen horses during recent evacuations.

Prepare now!

Partner with a barn on the opposite side of the Peninsula. Arrange ahead of time to help transport horses and use one another's facilities if needed and safe to do so.

Also, start a conversation with an alternate barn that is further away from Palos Verdes, in case the entire hill should evacuate. Understand what vaccinations and documents that facility requires before they can shelter your horse.

Following any health updates/vaccinations, take a picture of the health record and email it to yourself. Also, make hard copies and keep in your Equine Emergency Kit.

Practice loading your horse into a trailer often. This is very important. A horse that can't load may have to be left behind.

Keep trucks and trailers well-maintained, fueled up and ready to go.

Regularly check that stall locks and latches are functional and easy to open in an emergency.

Update any faded address markers or driveway signs so that emergency services can easily identify your home or barn.

Always keep a halter (with contact info), lead rope and stall card outside of your horse's stall.

Routinely keep barn area free of debris and garbage.

Maintain a buffer between structures and green space. Remove dead vegetation from roofs and gutters and create an ember-resistant zone around your barn.

Place hazardous materials all in the same area away from your barn.
