Sewer Lines	LACSD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There was a sewer line break in a main transport line at the “T” at PVDS and Narcissa. Crews determined it was the underground trunk line. Land movement separated the coupling joint 6’ below ground. Crews diverted flow and repaired the coupling. This was the first major trunk line to experience a break/leak. An estimated 10,000 gallons was released but was quickly contained. The line is back online and remains in service and functional. LACSD’s intention is to keep the lines functional and in service. During the work along PVDS, it was discovered that one manhole was severely affected by land movement. Emergency bypass repairs are currently being conducted. A resident called the 24-hour hotline to report the breakage. LACSD’s lines are gravity fed. 	Ongoing
Sewer Lines: Seaview Neighborhood	LACPW: Mains Homeowners: Laterals	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> LACPW have found that some sewer laterals are disconnected. The City advises residents to have their laterals inspected by a plumber to make sure that they are still connected to the system. They are looking to get contractors involved. The repairs should take two weeks once scheduled. It is expected that the locations are on Exultant, Admirable, and PVDS. Residents in these areas request that they be informed on outages as early as possible. 	Ongoing
Sewer Lines: Portuguese Bend Community	City	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There was one repair in conjunction with LACSD, as discussed above. 	Ongoing
Power Poles Repairs	Southern California Edison (SCE)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A pole replacement off Admirable Drive is occurring today. SCE has safety concerns for sectionalization in the Seaview neighborhood. SCE and the City are committed to quickly finding a short-term solution, with a longer-term solution to follow. If an acceptable and safe solution cannot be found, SCE may need to consider de-energization. Safety concerns include where the land is moving significantly near Dauntless/Exultant and poles are pulling apart. Nearby areas are also connected to the grid at this point. SCE is working with their engineers to determine the area and number of residents this may affect, as well as some procedures. 	Ongoing

Portuguese Bend Landslide EIR, Final Engineering, and E1/E2	City	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The City's contractors and consultants are continuing with boreholes and design work for deep dewatering wells. Initially, we will start with one deep dewatering well. If the technique is successful, more will be implemented. The City's team is working through a plan for additional boreholes through the entire slide; this includes Altamira Canyon. The City is also working on the winterization plan. Crews are doing reconnaissance in the area for critical fissures and drainage solutions. City crews identified drainage pipe under PVDS have damage and are not conveying water and require repairs. The City is looking at trenchless technology. If trenchless contractors are not available, the City will consider an open cut. 	October 2024

KCLAD Dewatering Wells	KCLAD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KCLAD had success with wells this week. • At the two shallow wells; one is crushed, the other's vault is broken, but it has a new pump and pumping 20-30 gpm. • The new well is pumping 80 gpm. • The older well is pumping 48 gpm. • The power system was upgraded for all pumps. • On Friday, the new well was in place and was pumping 200 gpm. The pump wiring needs to be upgraded. KCLAD hopes that upgraded wiring will increase the volume to 400 gpm. • During drilling for the next/fifth well, the rig had problems. It should be back the week after next to start drilling again. • The water table is down about 10 feet. This should be easier to monitor with the new wells online. • Monitoring data will be published when it's ready. 	Ongoing
