Power Poles Repairs	Southern California Edison (SCE)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We have no new updates with regards to de-energizations in RPV or surrounding areas. • We are working on the Marymount Substation soil removal project, which will go through next week. • SCE is participating in today's resource fair. • SCE is going out to the homes that were de-energized and removing the secondary lines to reduce the risk of back feeding, which is when a generator installation could re-energize the power lines. This could create unsafe conditions. SCE would also like to request the locations of homes that have installed generators, and secured City permits, so that they can prioritize those locations for this work. • Residents reported that trees appear to be affecting the power lines. Photos will be sent to the City and SCE. • Solar installations are being delayed due to the grid de-energizing. Specific installation methods need to be implemented that are not required if the grid is up. 	Ongoing

Portuguese Bend Landslide EIR, Final Engineering, and E1/E2	City	<p>E1/E2</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Started drilling the first deep dewatering well today and it is expected to be completed by Sunday. • The contractor is mobilizing another drill rig to start the second well, which takes a few days to set up. • There will be a total of five deep dewatering wells. • Instrumentation will be installed in one well. This will measure: 1) water pressure, and 2) reduction in water pressure. • The City expects the wells to shear. They hope that the first well(s) don't shear before the fifth well is drilled. The wells will be redrilled as they shear and the City expects that as more wells are drilled that the movement will slow and the wells will last longer (not shear as fast). • Additional GPS monitoring points will be installed near the deep dewatering wells, which will serve as the key metric for movement in those locations. KCLAD Dewatering Wells	KCLAD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Doing well with well with drilling. • Production at the 1 shallow and 4 deep wells are pumping a total of 375 gpm. • Looking for a fuel company for the generators. • The water table is coming down and is currently at 29-30 feet. • The new well is producing between 200-250 gpm; the water table is about 5 feet but dropped 2 feet in the last week. • As previously discussed, KCLAD lost the original shallow artesian well. • The other shallow well is operating at 20 gpm. • Well #3 with pump #1 is pumping at 75 gpm. • For reporting, KCLAD will be providing an average for each week. • For the newest well, it will be drilled 165 feet and should be completed tomorrow. Then it will need to be developed. • The new 3-phase electrical system is helping to increase production. 	Ongoing
