

# Preserve Reporting and Info Line: 310-491-5775

The Preserve Reporting and Info Line is available for the purpose of reporting misuse of the Nature Preserve and for accessing Preserve information. Callers speak with an operator who takes down concerns and questions and forwards them directly to Open Space Management or Enforcement personnel.

Enforcement personnel patrol the City's 1,400-acre Preserve an average of 160 hours per week to both educate the public on Preserve use and enforce City ordinances. While the Reporting and Info Line is a service to Preserve users, it will also serve as a helpful tool to increase the City's awareness of activity taking place in the Preserve.

Below are concerns that are anticipated to be handled by the Preserve Reporting and Info Line. If the concern or question is not handled by staff, the Hotline operator will forward the concern to the appropriate agency.

- Dogs off-leash
- Dogs/horses/animals on beach
- Hikers/cyclists/equestrians off trails
- Misuse of trails (i.e. bicycles on pedestrian only trails, horses on pedestrian only trails, etc.)
- Reckless use of Preserve trails
- Paragliders in Preserve
- Motorized vehicles/aircraft
- Homeless encampments
- Removal/destruction of flora/fauna
- Removal or destruction/modification to Preserve signage
- Illegal Dumping
- Littering
